Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Krumm Residence, 975 South High Street, is a 21/2 story 6 bay X 8 bay stretcher bond brick structure of Italianate character built c.1885. It sits on a coursed stone foundation with limestone watertable and basement openings. The rear (west) foundation is random coursed, more shallow and minus the watertable. The building's hip roof is covered with original imbricated slate and projects out over an impressive entablature with frieze windows, string course, double scroll wooden brackets and dentils. The rear is, once again, void of these details. Additional facade detailing includes a partial cutstone stringcourse running near top of the 1st story openings; shaped, carved stone lintels with labels and lug sills with carved labels running under the 1/1 light double hung windows. Some openings on the north and west sides are 2/2 light double hung.

Lintels on the south side of the house are more simplistic than those on facade, but are shaped and have a carved "quilted" detail. LIntels on rear (west) and north side are plain cut stone. Other original highlights are the 4 ornamental chimneys (which include corbeling in exterior walls beneath them) and a cast iron fence which rens along the frontage of the property and continues up street to end of block.

There is a small addition th to south side of the house and 2 rear (west) common bond brick additions. The easternmost of these two is 2 x 2 bay, gable roofed with 2 chimneys, slate shingles and has a window in gable end. The other attaches to the west side of the previous one and is only $1\frac{1}{2}$ stories, 2 x 2 bays and has gable roof with slate shingles, 1 chimney and 2 entrances on the southside with cement step approaches. exterior gutter extends down on the west wall from the box gutters at the eaves and merges at the center of the wall, extending straight dwon from that point, perhaps originally leading to a cistern. There are also two semi-circular arched windows with vertical board shutters on this wall.

The residence was converted into double units in 1918. At this time the southside addition became a front entrance & stairway to the second story. Other changes to the property at the time of that conversion include 1) an exterior frame stairway (fire escape) with paneled door and enclosed frame entrance on the north side of house, 2) the enclosure of a double story frame porch on the south side of the easternmost rear addition which today has cutout railing and square posts with carving atop on second story, and enclosed, horizontal-siding with aluminum windows on first story. 3) and a no-longer-existing single story frame porch on facade. The central staircase in the entry was also removed. As many as two garages were previously located to the rear of the house, but none are there now.

The interior was remodeled with the conversion into a double in 1918. Interesting features remaining include: interior folding, louvered shutters in some of the rear windows, (others are stored in the attic space), period mantels (both late 19th c., and early 20th c.); ceiling medallions and woodworking, and original stenciling was uncovered beneath layers of later wallcoverings.

Later cosmetic additions (traditionally insensitive and intended to be removed in proposed rehabilitation to the facade) include aluminum shutters, a painted metal hood overwithe entranceway with cement steps approach, Permastone on facade foundation and porch/planter addition on front, ornamental iron railings along porch, up steps and

porch/planter addition on front, ornamental iron railings along porch, up steps and detailing second story openings (one of which is a multi-paned single door) and wooden screen doors at main entrance. (The proposed removal of the hood over door will expose original carved lintel over doorway.

In recent years, by previous owners, the exterior surfaces visible from the street (facade and south walls) were cleaned, presumably sandblasted.

This property is one of few remaining late 19th c. residential structures scattered along the once prominant S. High St. corridor of Columbus. All remaining elements of this residential corridor have been seriously compromised by strip-type development in recent years.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Krumm Residence is significant for its affiliation with Alexander W. Krumm, Columbus' City Solicitor for 2 terms from 1878 - 1883. Mr. Krumm, a Columbus native and prominent attorney began his practice in partnership with John H. Heitmann, then Mayor of Columbus. After Mr. Krumm's political involvement, he was committed to establishing his own very successful law firm, still in existence today as "Krumm, Schwenker, Fisher, and Hartshorn." Mr. Krumm was the original owner and occupant of the house and his family remained in the property until 1954. The residence is also significant as one of the few remaining late 19th c. residential structures scattered along the once prominent South High Street residential corridor in Columbus.

The property has Italianate features and reflects the German influence which predominates in the adjacent Gernam Village Historic District. Significant exterior architectural details include an impressive entablature with freize windows, string course, double scroll brackets and dentils (metal); shaped carved stone lintels, four ornamental exterior chimneys, an imbricated slate roof and an iron ornamental fence. The frame enclosed porch on the south side is also an unusual feature. The interior was remodeled in 1918 when the house was converted into a double unit. Remaining 19th c. details inloude interior shutters, ceiling medallions, woodwork, period mantels and stenciling (disclosed beneath layers of later wallcoverings). 20th c. details, primarily on the second floor, include narrow wood strip flooring, period mantels and woodwork.

The Krumm Residence has been listed on the Columbus Register of Historic Properties for its local historical and architectural significance.







Enclosed are ten new National Register nominations and one resbumission. All the appropriate notification procedures have been followed for the new submissions.

We are recommending that four of the nominations receive a substantive review: the Krumm House, Franklin County; the Miller House, Franklin County; the Wright House, Hamilton County; and the Ropes Building, Hamilton County. Questions arose on the Krumm House, Ropes Buildings, and Wright House during the ERTA Part 1 certification process which we feel have been addressed in the nomination form.
