founded: 1906

parent: Bon Homme

present name: Riverside Colony

When Huron Colony abandoned this site in 1918, they had occupied this colony for 12 years. A daughter of Bon Homme, the old colony has three surviving structures, all landmark. In 1949 Riverside Colony resettled this land. Riverside is a great grand daughter of Bon Homme.

The colony is located atop the western banks of the James River. Laid out on a north-south axis, the long houses form an inner square, while the school, residences and shops form an outer tier. The square-shaped residential core has only pedestrian traffic. On the northeast section of the square, the three historic structures are clustered in their own imperfect square. Outbuildings are located across the vehicle path, parallel to, but apart from, the domestic structures. Site plan, photo 106.

A. Kitchen - Dining Hall, c. 1910

Built with the characteristic construction technique of Bon Homme Colony buildings, (closely spaced slabs of fieldstone), this building measures 32 by 50 feet. A cement block addition, measuring 40 by 72 feet was attached in the 1950s.

B. Dwelling, c. 1910

This 32 by 92 foot stone structure is one-and-one-half stories in height. Gabled dormers give light into the second floor. Although built of stone, the arched frames over doors and windows are made of brick. The long house has four apartments.

C. School and Church, 1916

As in Maxwell Colony, this colony chose a popular American form for its school building. Two-stories in height, the stone structure measures 40 by 40 feet and is surmounted by a pyramidal roof. Plumbing has been added in a shed addition.

Verbal Boundary: The site forms a large rectangle sited parallel to the section road. The west boundary line lies 30 m. from the west wall of the westernmost buildings. The south boundary lies 10 m. south of the south wall of the southernmost buildings and intersects the crestline of the bluff above the pond, as well as the northwest edge of the pond. The eastern boundary line extends from the north edge of the pond to the crestline line of the bluff and lies 30 m. from the east wall of the easternmost building. The north boundary lies 20 m. from the north wall of the northernmost building and intersects the east and west boundary lines.

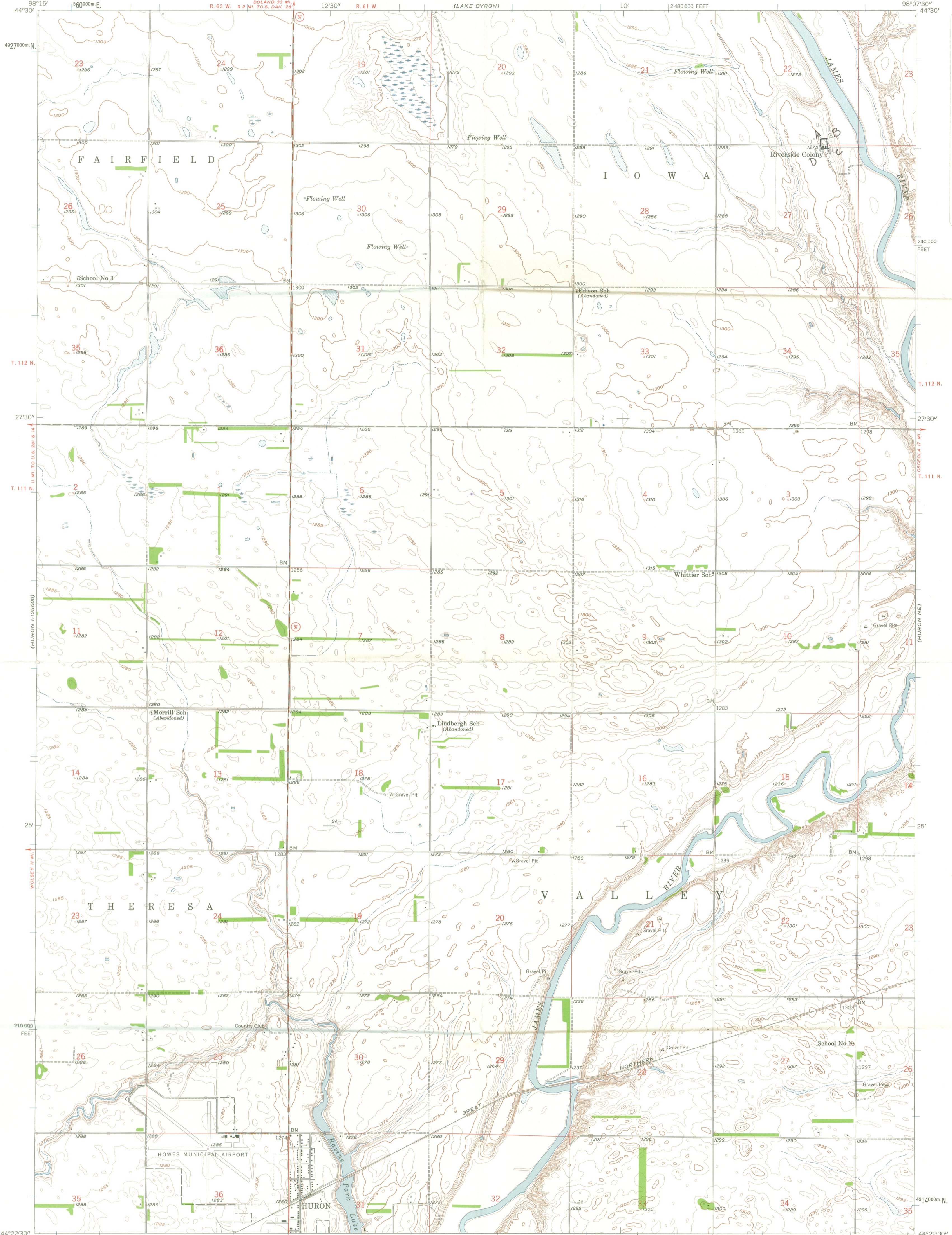

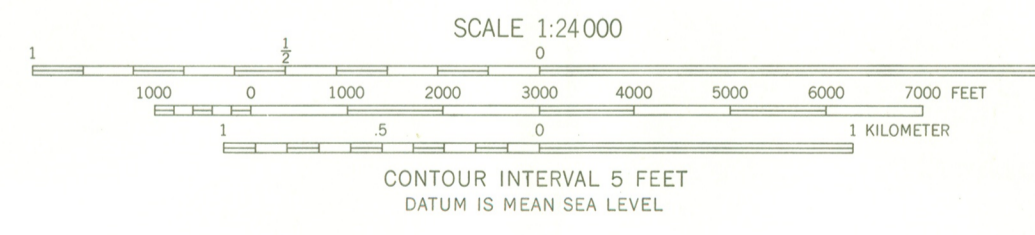
