HEALTH REFORM IDEAS

- o Limit excludability of employer provided insurance to 90% of the amount over \$100 per employee per month.
- o Require employers to include the amount spent on health insurance on the employee's W-s.
- o Auction the right to serve Medicare beneficiaries in hospitals:
 - by procedure
 - by locality
- o Auction the right to provide radiology, anesthesiology and pathology (RAP) services.
- o End treatment-application research at NIH
- o Change part B premium to link the size of the premium to the size of the Social Security benefit
- o Charge the non-aged disabled Medicare beneficiary a premium that reflects their higher use of Medicare services.
- o Give (some) private payers access to Medicare's payment rates.
- o Replace financing of physician graduate medical education (GME) through the general Medicare programs with an excise tax on physician income.
