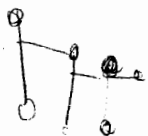

Dear Mary Kate:

Per our conversation yesterday, I am requesting an official greeting on Sunday, January 22nd, to a pro-life gathering by then President Bush. We will be meeting in an open park in downtown Lexington, Kentucky. The constituency will be made up of several educational and service (help for women with problem pregnancies) pro-life groups including Eagle Forum, Women For Life (service group), Right To Life, and Committee For Life. Our message will be twofold: first, to continue to state that abortion is nothing more than "infanticide in utero", and second (and more importantly), we are going to challenge the people of Central Kentucky to roll up their sleeves and help these women have genuine life-saving alternatives to abortion. These are law abiding citizens of concern.

I recommend the greeting be "generically" worded, something like "Dear Lexington Citizens For Life". I suggest it be mailed to my home to arrive by Thursday, January 19th.

American Collegians for Life will hold its second annual conference at Trinity College in Washington, D.C. on January 21-23, 1989. The A.C.L. Conference will be held in conjunction with the annual March for Life which is scheduled this year on Monday, January 23. Over 200 students from across the country are expected to attend.

Last year's conference was very successful. About 150 students participated in the educational workshops, heard such impressive speakers as Dr. Bernard Nathanson and Dr. Jack C. Willke, and attended a briefing at the White House on the Administrations's pro-life activities.

A.C.L. hopes to have some of last year's favorite speakers back but has already confirmed new guests such as teen expert Molly Kelly and writer Joseph Sobran.

There will be workshops on Post-Abortion Syndrome and the advantages of chastity, and training sessions in the techniques of pro-life activism including fund-raising, membership recruitment, public relations, and how to sponsor successful activities.

"We hope to teach pro-life students about the nuts and bolts of campus activism," says A.C.L. President Mike Pauley, a senior at Georgetown University. "There is too much 'reinventing the wheel' in college pro-life activism because we aren't teaching each other what strategies and tactics will work, and which ones will not. The more we share information, the more effective our pro-life groups will be."

Registration for the three-day conference is \$30 before December 20, and \$40 after that. This includes all workshops, materials, meals, housing if needed, and the final banquet and dance party.
