At our last meeting, you invited me to continue suggesting candidates for federal science and technology positions. Accordingly, I would like to suggest that Dr. Bernadine Healy be considered for Science Adviser to the President.

Dr. Healy is currently President of the American Heart Association, a member of the White House Science Council, and Chairman of the Research Institute of the Cleveland Clinic Foundation, a well-known and respected center for both medical research and treatment. Prior to her current position, Dr. Healy was the Deputy Director of the Office of Science and Technology Policy under President Reagan. She would bring to the position experience in the Office and the White House as well as a leadership role in the medical and biological communities.

Further benefits that she would bring include her experience with medical technology and care delivery that today make up the fastest rising component of the federal budget. She would also bring a familiarity with environmental issues and risk/benefit analysis that would lend strong support to President Bush's initiatives.

Finally, Dr. Healy is a diplomatic and cooperative professional, who would work well with the President's team. She has my strongest recommendation.

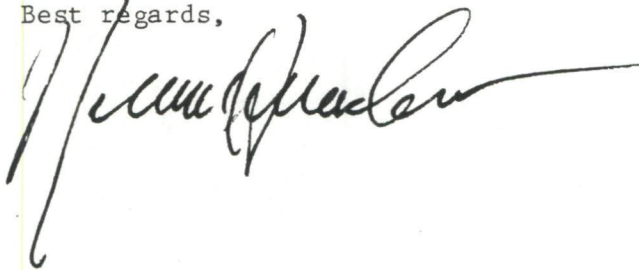

A member of the National Academy of Sciences and National Academy of Engineering, he has chaired a number of important space panels including the Academy group that has advised NASA on the technical modifications to the solid rocket motor and the Academies' Committee on Space Policy.

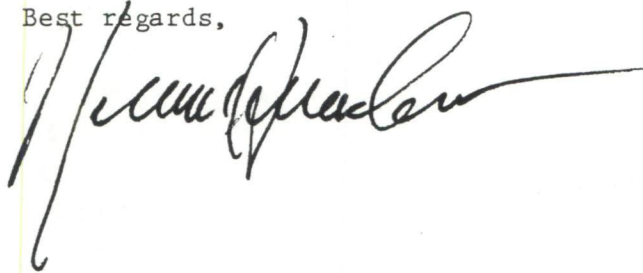

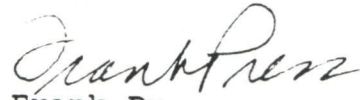
