Welcome to the Fourth Annual Meeting of the David and Lucile Packard Fellowships Program. Enclosed is a copy of the agenda for the meeting in September.

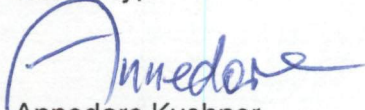

NATIONAL OPERATIONS SECURITY AWARDS PROGRAM

The National Operations Security (OPSEC) Awards Program provides non-monetary awards to U.S. Government and supporting contractor organizations and individuals in recognition of excellence in the field of Operations Security. The awards criteria were developed by an independent interagency Awards Board, in coordination with the Interagency OPSEC Support Staff (IOSS).

Nominations for awards, including those for supporting contractor organizations and individuals, may be made only by or through the heads of Executive departments or agencies (as identified in the United States Government Manual) assigned or supporting national security missions. Each department or agency may submit only four candidates (one U.S. Government and one supporting contractor in each of the two categories - Individual and Organizational). Any number of Audio-Visual submissions will be accepted this year. (See Attachment 3 for details.) Procedures within components should be established to ensure both compliance with this constraint as well as for providing suitable internal recognition of those nominated but not chosen as winners. Negative responses are requested to help ensure the equity of the program.

The Awards Board will evaluate the nominations and select the winners. The decisions of the Board are final. The winners will be announced and honored by presentation of the awards at a ceremony during the National OPSEC Conference.

NATIONAL OPERATIONS SECURITY
INDIVIDUAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

The National Operations Security (OPSEC) Awards Program provides non-monetary Individual Achievement Awards to U.S. Government and supporting contractor individuals in recognition of excellence or outstanding achievements or initiatives in the field of operations security. To be considered, the accomplishments being recognized must have occurred in whole or in part between 1 October 1991 and 30 September 1992. Examples of contributions to be considered include, but are not limited to:

- Identification or solution of significant OPSEC problems, threats, or vulnerabilities; or the implementation of significant or innovative measures to reduce or eliminate OPSEC threats or vulnerabilities.
- Development of innovative or singularly improved OPSEC awareness, education, and training programs, objectives, or resources.
- Demonstration of personal knowledge, leadership, ingenuity, or creativity of outstanding professional caliber in areas which add to the general state of OPSEC methods or techniques; or which lead to meaningful improvements in the national OPSEC posture.
- Involvement with initiatives leading to identifiable improvements in the OPSEC of an element or component of an organization; or for which the individual's peers have recognized him/her as a subject matter expert on OPSEC.

Nominations may only be made by or through the head of the Department or Agency. Each Department and Agency may submit one nomination in each of the following two categories: a) U.S. Government employee; AND b) supporting contractor employee. The contractor employee nomination should include only contributions made for the submitting organization, not for any other government organizations. Negative responses in each category are requested to help ensure the equity of the Program. Nominations must be submitted with two (2) copies, and include:

- A narrative, not to exceed two single-spaced pages, describing the specific accomplishments of the nominated individual. It is preferred that the narrative be unclassified, but it may be classified up to and including SECRET.
- Identification and location of the nominating organization, and the name and commercial telephone number of an individual, knowledgeable about the material submitted, who can provide additional information if needed. This individual should be prepared to provide a short briefing to the Awards Board if required.

Participating Departments and Agencies are encouraged to establish and promulgate their own local procedures for these selections and nominations, as well as suitably rewarding those individuals nominated but not chosen as the winner.

The National OPSEC Awards Board will evaluate the nominations and select the winners. The decision of the Board, an interagency group whose deliberations are independent and private, is final. The winners will be notified in advance, and will be announced and honored by presentation of awards at a ceremony during the annual National OPSEC Conference.

NATIONAL OPERATIONS SECURITY
AUDIO-VISUAL AWARDS

In addition to the Individual and Organizational Awards, the National Operations Security (OPSEC) Awards Program is being expanded to provide non-monetary Audio-Visual Achievement Awards. As with the other two categories, this award will apply to U.S. Government agencies and supporting contractors, recognizing excellence or outstanding achievements or initiatives in the field of operations security education and awareness.

This expansion into the Audio-Visual field is designed to stimulate development and distribution of worthy OPSEC-related educational audio-visual materials. This year will feature exhibitions only -- no awards -- to better handle the expected large number of submissions. Next year will provide for competition and selection of winners in a manner similar to the Individual and Organizational awards. Details will be announced later.

This year, only posters and videotapes will be accepted. They will be evaluated on the validity of the OPSEC message, the artistic value of the item, and its visual impact. To be considered, the products being nominated must:

- Have an educational or informative OPSEC theme, not necessarily identical to that of the current National OPSEC Conference;
- Have been produced in whole or in part during the fiscal years of 1988 through 1992;
- Have been produced for in-house purposes (neither produced nor used commercially);
- Be unclassified; and
- Be accompanied by a short letter, with the following data:
 - Name and address of the nominating organization;
 - Name and phone number of the point of contact involved (generally the OPSEC manager);
 - Information (title or other identification) that pertains to the entry; and
 - A certification that the products are for in-house use, and contain no copyrighted material.

NATIONAL OPERATIONS SECURITY
ORGANIZATIONAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

The National Operations Security (OPSEC) Awards Program provides non-monetary Organizational Achievement Awards to U.S. Government and supporting contractor organizations in recognition of excellence or outstanding achievements or initiatives in the field of operations security. To be considered, the accomplishments being recognized must have occurred in whole or in part between 1 October 1991 and 30 September 1992. Examples of accomplishments to be considered include, but are not limited to:

- Identification or solution of significant OPSEC problems, threats, or vulnerabilities; or the implementation of significant or innovative measures to reduce or eliminate OPSEC threats or vulnerabilities.
- Development of innovative or significantly improved OPSEC awareness, education, and training programs, objectives, or resources.

Nominations may only be made by or through the head of the Department or Agency. Each Department and Agency may submit one nomination in each of the following two categories: a) U.S. Government organization; AND b) one supporting contractor organization. The contractor being nominated must have a viable OPSEC program which stands on its own; they may not be nominated for OPSEC work performed as part of a government contractual service. Negative responses in each category are requested to help ensure the equity of the Program. Nominations must be submitted with two (2) copies, and include:

- A narrative, not to exceed two single-spaced pages, describing the specific accomplishments of the nominated organization. It is preferred that the narrative be unclassified, but it may be classified up to and including SECRET.
- Identification and location of the nominating organization, and the name and commercial telephone number of an individual, knowledgeable about the material submitted, who can provide additional information if needed. This individual should be prepared to provide a short briefing to the Awards Board if required.

Participating Departments and Agencies are encouraged to establish and promulgate their own local procedures for these selections and nominations, as well as suitably rewarding those components nominated but not chosen as the winner.

The National OPSEC Awards Board will evaluate the nominations and select the winners. The decision of the Board, an interagency group whose deliberations are independent and private, is final. The winners will be notified in advance, and will be announced and honored by presentation of awards at a ceremony during the annual National OPSEC Conference.

Tyler Prize

Eligibility

Citizens of all nations are invited to nominate living individuals or institutions of any nation.

Nominees may be associated with any field of science.

Persons eligible to make nominations include, but are not limited to:

Scientists in fields such as biology, oceanography, geology, chemistry and physics; engineers in fields such as civil, environmental, petroleum and chemical engineering; and social scientists in fields such as geography, political science, economics and law;

National academies of science, engineering or their equivalent, and their members;

Universities, research institutions and their members;

National and international science, health, environment and development organizations.

Self-nominations are discouraged.

Deadline for Nominations

Nominations for the 1993 Tyler Prize must be received no later than October 1, 1992. Related credentials, supporting material and letters of reference must be received no later than October 15, 1992.

Selection Criteria

Prizes are awarded for any one of the following:

- (a) the protection, maintenance, improvement or understanding of ecological and environmental conditions anywhere in the world; or
- (b) the discovery, further development, improvement, or understanding of known or new sources of energy.

Tax Provisions:

Individual recipients will have the following options pursuant to the applicable provisions of the Tax Reform Act of 1986: (a) receive all of the Prize money; (b) designate one or more charitable institutions appropriately qualified by the Internal Revenue Service to receive the money; or (c) a combination of the above. Any funds retained by an individual recipient and not transferred to a charitable institution as referred to in (b) above will be subject to federal income tax in the United States, under provisions of the Tax Reform Act of 1986.

Awards to non-exempt corporations pursuant to U.S. tax laws, will be used for student scholarships to benefit universities as chosen by such non-exempt honored corporations.

Nomination Procedures

Nominations should be submitted in the English language and include the following information:

1. *Identification of Nominee*

Include a person's name, professional or home mailing address, present occupational title, and institutional affiliation. Enclose a vita or resume.

If an institution or corporation is nominated, identify the administrative officer of the organization or subgroup responsible for the accomplishments cited.

2. *Summary of Accomplishment*

Provide a brief statement (1-2 pages) of the individual's or institution's discoveries, improvements, or other contributions in one or both fields for which the award is proposed. Be clear and succinct.

3. *Detailed Description of Contributions*

Provide a detailed explanation of the contributions and explain why each is unique. Describe how each was accomplished. Mention any significant involvement of others.

4. *References*

Have three or more letters of recommendation mailed directly to us from individuals who are able to assess the nominee's contributions. Identify three to five additional references who might be contacted by the Executive Committee.

5. *Evidence of Contributions*

The Tyler Prize Executive Committee reserves the right to request examples of publications, or other evidence, which best represents the candidate's contributions. Materials will be retained unless otherwise requested.

Length of Candidacy

Nominees will be considered for three years. A new letter of nomination will be required after three years.
