Each panelist will address the topic "Keys to leadership: What to do and what to avoid."

- **James R. Jones**, Chairman of the American Stock Exchange.

Jones, who served as an Oklahoma Congressman for 14 years, was also Special Assistant to President Johnson and went on to become White House Chief of Staff. During his years in Congress, he served as chairman of the House Budget Committee.

- **Donald T. Regan**, President of Regdon Associates.

Regan served as Secretary of the Treasury and White House Chief of Staff under President Reagan. Before he began his service in the Reagan Administration, Regan worked for Merrill Lynch & Co. for thirty-five years, and was appointed as Chairman and CEO in 1971.

- **Donald H. Rumsfeld**, Chairman and CEO of General Instrument Corp.

Rumsfeld served as Chairman of the transition team to President Ford, as his White House Chief of Staff and as Secretary of Defense. He began his political career as a Congressman from Illinois, resigning in 1969 to serve as Director of the Office of Economic Opportunity, Assistant to the President, Counsellor to the President and Director of the Economic Stabilization Program under Nixon. Rumsfeld also served as U.S. Ambassador to NATO. After more than 20 years of public service he began lecturing at Princeton's Woodrow Wilson School of International Affairs and Northwestern's Kellogg Graduate School of Management. He also served as Chairman and CEO of Searle.

- **Jack H. Watson, Jr.**, Senior Partner, Long, Aldridge & Norman.

Watson served as Secretary to the Cabinet, Assistant to the President and White House Chief of Staff under President Carter. In 1976, he directed the transition of the administrations from Ford to Carter. In 1983, he resumed practicing law.

Panel II- "The President as Domestic Changemaker"

- **Moderator- Richard Kirkland**, Board of Editors, *Fortune*

- **John L. Clendenin**, Chairman and CEO of BellSouth.

"Educational Reform- A case for Presidential leadership."

Clendenin began his telephone career with Illinois Bell, moving to Pacific Northwest Bell and then to American Telephone and Telegraph. In 1981, he was elected president of Southern Bell and became CEO of BellSouth in 1984. Clendenin is a past chairman of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce and the National Alliance of Business. He served as a pilot in the U.S. Air Force Strategic Air Command.

- **Stuart E. Eizenstat**, Partner, Powell, Goldstein, Frazer & Murphy.

"Domestic Policy: The democratic view."

Eizenstat served as Assistant to the President for Domestic Affairs and Executive Director, Domestic Policy Staff under President Carter. He also served as a Member of the Council on Wage and Price Stability and as an ex-officio member of the the White House Economic Policy Group. Eizenstat served as a speechwriter and researcher for President Johnson. He is also an adjunct lecturer at the JFK School of Government at Harvard University.

- **Andrew S. Grove**, President and CEO of Intel Corporation.

"Can we afford to leave technology to laissez-faire?"

Dr. Grove participated in the founding of Intel Corporation, America's leading independent computer chip manufacturer. He has written over 40 technical papers and holds several patents on semiconductor devices and technology. For six years, Grove taught graduate courses at the University of California, Berkeley.

- **Paul H. O'Neill**, Chairman and CEO of ALCOA.

"Rethinking healthcare: Our biggest domestic threat."

O'Neill was president of International Paper Company, and an engineer with Morrison-Knudsen, Inc. He has also worked as an analyst for the Veterans Administration and as deputy director of the Office of Management and Budget.

- **Roger B. Porter**, Assistant to President Bush for Economic and Domestic Policy.

"Domestic Policy: The republican view."

Porter served as Deputy Assistant to President Reagan and Director of the White House Office of Policy Development. He also served as Executive Secretary to the Economic Policy Council and as Counselor to the Secretary of the Treasury.

Panel III- "The President as Commander in Chief"

- **Moderator- Lee Smith**, Board of Editors, *Fortune*.

- **Norman R. Augustine**, Chairman and CEO of Martin Marietta Corporation.

"The next Iraq: Will America be ready?"

Augustine served as Assistant Secretary of the Army for Research and Development and Under Secretary of the Army. He also served as vice president for advanced programs for the Vought Missiles and Space Company and was an engineering executive with Douglas Aircraft Company. Augustine served as Chairman of the Advisory Committee on the Future of the U.S. Space Program.

- **Frank C. Carlucci**, Vice Chairman of the Carlyle Group.

"The American military: Defining a new role."

Carlucci's service in the Executive Branch spans four administrations and includes the posts of: Secretary of Defense, Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs, Deputy Director of Defense, Deputy Director of the CIA, Ambassador to Portugal, Under Secretary of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare and Deputy Director of the Office of Management and Budget. He also served as President and CEO for Sears World Trade, Inc.

- **Malcolm R. Currie**, Chairman and CEO of Hughes Aircraft Company.

"How to make defense spending affordable."

Currie served as president and CEO of Delco Electronics, and vice president of research and development and corporate planning at Beckman Instruments, Inc. He also served as Under Secretary of Defense Research and Engineering at the Department of Defense, and Chairman of the Intelligence Research and Development Council. Currie has been awarded numerous patents for his work with microwave tubes and lasers.

- **General Alfred M. Gray**, USMC, Commandant of the Marine Corps.

"The Chain of Command: A military perspective."

General Gray became the 29th Commandant of the Marine Corps on July 1, 1987; having begun his career as an enlisted Marine in 1950. His emphasis on warfighting education, training and preparedness resulted in the outstanding Marine Corps performance in Operation Desert Shield/Storm and other operations around the world. He previously served as Commanding General of the Fleet Marine Force Atlantic/II Marine Amphibious Force, Fleet Marine Force Europe, and the 2d Marine Division. Earlier tours included service as commanding officer of a variety of units in the United States, Korea, Viet Nam, Guantanamo Bay and Okinawa, Japan.

- **Robert H. Malott**, Chairman and CEO of FMC Corporation.

"A new approach to arms export"

Malott joined FMC Corporation in 1952. In 1972, he was elected president and in 1973 he became Chairman and CEO. He also served as Assistant to the Dean at Harvard University Graduate School of Business.

The Center for the Study of the Presidency is pleased to present its Distinguished Public Service Medal to General Colin Powell, Secretary Clayton Yeutter and Senator Charles Robb for their outstanding contributions and service to the office of the Presidency.

The Center's publications and programs focus primarily on the organization and operations of the American Presidency, its relations with the Congress and the Courts, and public policy issues, both foreign and domestic. The Center emphasizes the importance of an historical perspective on the office of the Presidency.

In 1974, the Center established its Distinguished Public Service Awards and designed a medal to be presented to each recipient. Previous honorees have included President Gerald Ford, James Baker III, Elizabeth Dole and Donald Regan.

This year's honorees are recognized for dedication and service in their respective roles to the office of the Presidency:

• **General Colin Powell, USA**, Chairman, Joint Chiefs of Staff.

General Powell was appointed the twelfth Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff by President Bush on October 1, 1989. Prior to his current assignment, Powell served as Commander in Chief of Forces Command and Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs from December 1987 to January 1989. He was also selected to be a White House Fellow and served his fellowship as Special Assistant to the Deputy Director of the Office of the President.

General Powell went to Vietnam in 1962 and served as an Advisor to a Vietnamese Infantry Battalion. In 1968, he returned to Vietnam as an Infantry Battalion Executive Officer and Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3, 23rd Infantry Division (Americal). In 1973, he assumed command of the 1st Battalion, 32nd Infantry in Korea. Upon completion of the National War College in 1976, he assumed command of the 2nd Brigade, 101st Airborne Division at Fort Campbell, Kentucky.

In 1977, General Powell returned to Washington to serve in the Immediate Office of the Secretary of Defense. He also served as Senior Military Assistant to the Deputy Secretary of Defense. In 1981 he became the Assistant Division Commander for Operations and Training, 4th Infantry Division. He returned to Washington again in 1983 to serve as assistant to Secretary of Defense Caspar Weinberger and he assumed command of the V U.S. Corps in Germany.

• **The Honorable Charles Robb**, United States Senator (D) Virginia.

Senator Robb was elected to the Senate in November 1988 and serves on the Foreign Relations Committee and the Committee on Commerce, Science Technology & Space. He is also chairman of the Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee. Robb served as Governor of Virginia from January 1982 to January 1986 and Lieutenant Governor from January 1978 to January 1982.

Following his service as Governor, Robb became a partner with the law firm of Hunton & Williams. Prior to attending law school, Robb served in the Marines and was Class Honor Graduate. His military service included a command of an infantry company in Viet Nam and serving as a social aide at the White House. His ten decorations and awards include the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry with Silver Star and the Bronze Star with Combat V. He remains a Lieutenant Colonel in the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve.

• **The Honorable Clayton Yeutter**, Chairman, Republican National Committee.

Yeutter was elected chairman of the Republican National Committee in January 1991 and began his official duties in March 1991. He served as Secretary of Agriculture under President Bush from February 1989 through February of 1991. His previous USDA posts include: assistant secretary for international affairs and commodity programs, assistant secretary and administrator for marketing and consumer services.

During the Reagan Administration, Yeutter served as U.S. Trade Representative from July 1985 until the beginning of the Bush Administration. He also served as president and CEO of the Chicago Mercantile Exchange from July 1978 through June 1985. Yeutter earned a law degree as well as a Ph.D. in agricultural economics, while simultaneously operating a 2,500-acre farm, which he still owns.

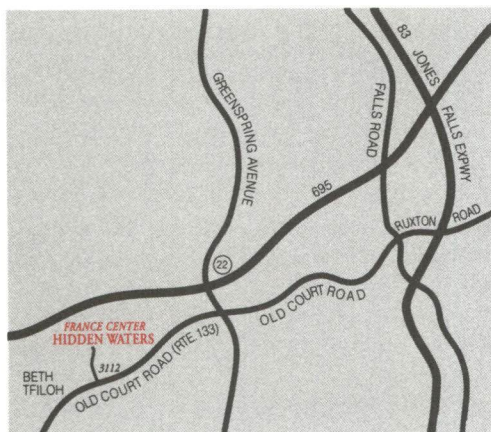
