**Energy and Environmental Programme Workshop
The Greenhouse Effect: Science, Economics and Policy**

Thursday 27 June 1991

Aims The aim of the workshop is to consider the greenhouse effect in the light of scientific arguments that state its existence with varying degrees of certainty, to consider the impacts that it could have globally and the costs of adapting various remedial policy options. The workshop aims to bring together a relatively small group of people from industry, government, NGOs and academic institutions for participatory discussion.

Provisional Outline: The workshop will be split into four sessions, each including time for discussion. (John Houghton of the Meteorological Office will chair).

1 Science and Uncertainties

The findings of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (science working group) will be summarised (Dr Geoffrey Jenkins of the Meteorological Office). Two shorter presentations will then outline alternative views (Jeremy Leggett, Greenpeace and Prof Richard Lindzen, MIT have agreed to speak).

2 Impacts

This session will look at the possible impacts that the greenhouse effect could have on societies. Possibly results of the greenhouse effect will be expounded by one speaker followed by two views of how these could impact on global life. Relevant findings from work for the IPCC impacts working group will be summarised. Two shorter presentations will offer differing interpretations.

3 Responses

What options are available to direct the way we respond to any likely impacts? How will responses affect economics? Non-energy and technical responses in the energy domain will be considered, as will the area of decision-making under uncertainty. (Dr Norman Myers, Consultant, Dr Michael Grubb, Royal Institute of International Affairs, have agreed to speak. One more speaker to be approached)

4 Final Discussion and Review

The Royal Institute of International Affairs

Origins and purpose

The Royal Institute of International Affairs is an independent, self-governing body which aims to promote the study and understanding of all aspects of international affairs through lectures, discussions, research and publications. It is located in Chatham House, a historic building which takes its name from William Pitt, Earl of Chatham, one of three British prime ministers who have lived there (the others were the Earl of Derby and William Gladstone).

The Institute was set up in 1920 as the result of discussions between British and American delegates at the Paris Peace Conference of 1919. In 1926 it received its Royal Charter from King George V. This charges the Institute with providing and maintaining 'means of information upon international questions'. At the same time the Charter precludes the Institute from expressing an opinion of its own on any aspect of international affairs; thus, views expressed at Chatham House meetings or in its publications are those of the speakers and authors concerned. The Institute is financed by the subscriptions of its individual and corporate members, by its own investments, and by research grants. It does not owe allegiance to any political party.

Meetings programme

General meetings, addressed by distinguished speakers from a wide range of countries, present a forum for a broad spectrum of viewpoints and ideas on all aspects of international affairs; they are open to all Institute members. Discussion meetings on more specialized topics are by invitation only and may be held privately. Programmes giving details of general meetings, normally held at least once a

week during the lunch hour, are sent to all members and associates of the Institute.

Conferences and briefings

For those working in business and industry, the Institute holds fee-paying conferences and briefings with expert analysis of issues of special interest to the business world; these are also open to non-members.

The Library and Press Library

The Chatham House Library is the leading specialist collection in Britain of material dealing with international affairs. It contains more than 160,000 books and pamphlets in the main European languages, including Russian, and covers the period since the end of the First World War, with main emphasis on the period since the Second World War. Some 650 periodicals from the world over are regularly received and the most recent 15 years are available to library users. The reference section holds an international collection of *Who's Who*, as well as dictionaries, yearbooks, atlases and economic reports issued by governments, international organizations, banks, economic institutes and other research bodies. The Library enjoys depository status for United Nations publications and also receives EC documents. There is a subject index to important articles in periodicals, and card catalogues by author and subject for books and documents.

The Institute's Press Library offers a unique collection of British and foreign newspaper cuttings, classified and cross-referenced for quick access to information on international and foreign affairs and backed by an index of speeches made by leading international and public figures. Cuttings for 1924-1939 and 1972 onwards are currently at Chatham House.

In addition over fifty newspapers and bulletins from many parts of the world are currently available, along with microfilm copies of *The Times* and *The New York Times* and their respective indexes.

Members and associates have the library resources at their disposal and borrow books and consult reference periodicals, cuttings and newspaper Library and Press Library reading room. All employees of corporate subscribers call on the libraries for information; they consult material in the reading room. Books may be borrowed only by the nominees or through their libraries.

Readers' tickets, at a separate fee each library, are available to recommended and genuine research work scholars not eligible for membership. Postgraduate students registered at universities which pay a Press Library subscription are granted readers' tickets without further payment.

Research programme

The research programme is at the heart of the Institute's work. It covers the fields of International Security, International Economics, Energy and Environment, Western Europe, Soviet Foreign Policy, East Asia, and the Middle East. The Institute is also undertaking work on America and Southern Africa. The research staff form the core of the Institute's activities, commissioning work from outside collaborators as well as conducting research in-house. Visiting fellows from different countries and professional backgrounds also contribute to the Institute's research and publication.

Chatham House publications

The Institute sponsors books written in-house, research staff, by visiting fellows and by authors commissioned from

outside. These studies, published under the Chatham House imprint, are expected to contribute substantially to the field of international affairs.

Chatham House Papers, are designed to give concise and timely information and analysis on current foreign policy issues. The series has gained a reputation for providing imaginative and lucid studies on some of the most crucial foreign policy debates of the day.

International Affairs, the quarterly journal of the Royal Institute of International Affairs, is one of Britain's leading journals in the field of world affairs. Its articles, by both practitioners and academics, discuss a range of topics in contemporary history and current world issues, and its review section presents unrivalled coverage of new books on international affairs. It has a worldwide circulation among readers requiring well-informed analysis and opinion on international questions.

The World Today, the monthly journal of the Institute, contains topical analyses of current world problems and first-hand reports on the internal politics and economics of individual countries as they relate to the world outside. Leading authorities contribute a broad variety of articles for the interested layman, student, teacher and businessman.

Membership

The Institute is primarily a working body and candidates for election are usually active in, or have special knowledge of, international issues.

Corporate members: Almost 350 organizations pay an annual subscription to Chatham House in order to take advantage of the unique facilities and services offered. The size of the subscription is determined by the number of persons

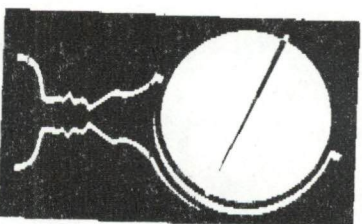
members. These nominated members are kept informed of all activities in Chatham House and have full access to the Library, the Press Library, and all other facilities, as well as receiving complimentary copies of *International Affairs*. Nominated members may be changed at the discretion of the organization during the course of the year.

Elective members and foreign associates: Full membership of the Institute is open to British and Commonwealth citizens, while other nationals are eligible to become foreign associates. Candidates for full membership or associateship must be proposed and seconded by a member of the Institute to whom they are personally known. There are no formal residential qualifications for foreign associateship, but it is not normally granted to foreign students staying only temporarily in Britain; they can obtain access to library facilities on payment of a fee.

Junior associateship: This level of membership is available to British and Commonwealth citizens between the ages of 21 and 30 for a maximum of three years, beyond which application for full membership is expected.

Arrangements can be made for a joint family membership/foreign associateship for suitably qualified couples.
