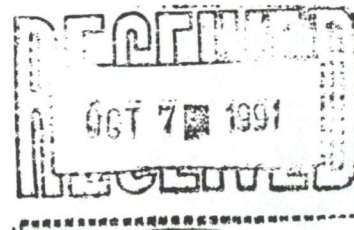

Dear Allan:

In response to your recommendation to revise the Medals of Science and Technology awards, I endorse your proposal to limit the number of medals in each category to six. This will significantly enhance the honor of receiving the award.

For two reasons, I would prefer to provide publicity to recipients in ways similar to what the Department of Commerce plans, rather than to make larger awards to each. I believe there should be parallelism in the award amounts and honorary activities for science and technology. It would be possible but extremely difficult and onerous for the Foundation to afford the \$1.2 million in FY 1992 that would be required to provide a \$200,000 award to each recipient. Also, Allan, I am not sure it is appropriate--especially in this economic climate--to give such large awards to people who have mostly passed the peak of productivity.

We would like to develop a distinguished lecture series and other public appearance opportunities for our awardees both as a feature of our annual National Science and Technology Week and in connection with the public outreach efforts that are part of our Education and Human Resources programs. These activities will benefit NSF as well as expand the public recognition for medal recipients.

Our staff is very enthusiastic about initiating these efforts once the recipients are known. I would like to discuss this further with you at your convenience.

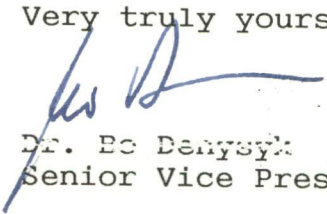

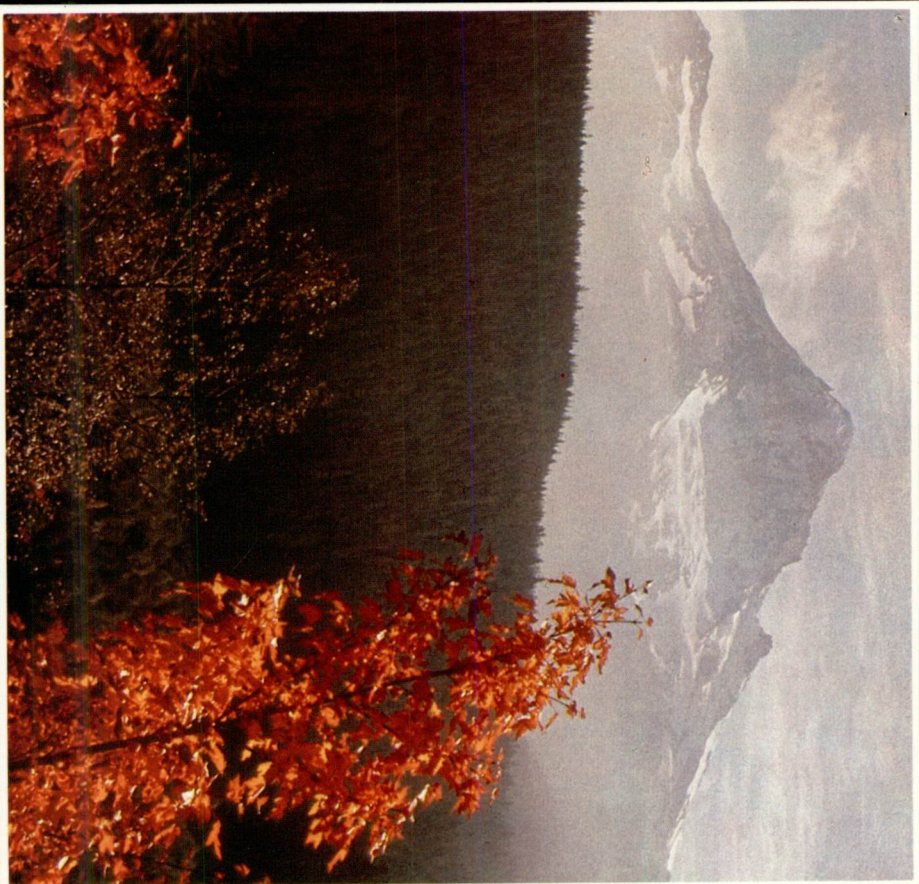

It was an honor to receive the National Medal Of Science from President Bush last week, and I particularly appreciate the fact that all who contributed to the success of the Voyager mission to the outer solar system can share in this notable recognition.

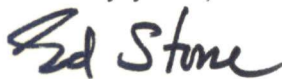
I understand that the President will be in Hawaii for the fiftieth anniversary of Pearl Harbor Day. On behalf of the California Association for Research in Astronomy, I would like to suggest that he consider a short trip to the Big Island to visit the Keck Observatory on Mauna Kea.

When the ten-meter (400") Keck Telescope becomes fully operational next year, it will have four times the power of the 200" Palomar telescope and will be the first and largest of a new generation of optical telescopes that will allow astronomers to study galaxies as they appeared in the early Universe only a few billion years after the Big Bang. In 1996, the power of the Keck Observatory will be doubled again with the completion of a twin ten-meter telescope.

Shortly after your visit last November we achieved first light, demonstrating that the novel segmented mirror could produce sharp astronomical images. We have recently resumed segment installation and I expect that at least eighteen of the thirty-six will be installed by December, making that an excellent time for the President to visit the observatory. The enclosed Keck Foundation Annual Report may serve as a preview for the visit.

Please let me know if you would like further information about possible arrangements for such a visit.

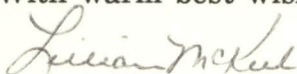

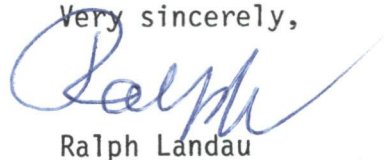
