The President today announced his intention to appoint the following individuals to be Members of the President's Committee on the National Medal of Science for the terms indicated:

FRANCE ANNE-DOMINIC CORDOVA, of Pennsylvania, for a term expiring December 31, 1993. She would succeed Samuel F. Conti. Currently, Dr. Cordova serves as Head of the Department of Astronomy & Astrophysics at Pennsylvania State University in University Park, Pennsylvania.

MILDRED DRESSELHAUS, of Massachusetts, for a term expiring December 31, 1992. She would succeed Willie J. Nunnery. Currently, Dr. Dresselhaus serves as a Professor in the Department of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science and the Department of Physics at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in Cambridge, Massachusetts.

RITA RICARDO-CAMPBELL, of California, for a term expiring December 31, 1993. This is a reappointment. Since 1968, Dr. Ricardo-Campbell serves as a Senior Fellow at the Hoover Institution in Stanford, California.

HERBERT H. WOODSON, of Texas, for a term expiring December 31, 1992. He would succeed Roger D. Hartman. Since 1988, Dr. Woodson has served as Dean of the College of Engineering at The University of Texas at Austin in Austin, Texas.

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
