THE SECONDARY SCHOOL TEACHER'S AWARDS

I wanted you to know that the 112 mathematics and science teachers have been ecstatic about their meeting with you and Mrs. Bush and the Vice President in the Rose Garden Tuesday morning. It was particularly gracious of Mrs. Bush to remain and shake the hand of each and every one present -- and very much appreciated.

The contrast with prior years has been noted repeatedly. Last year, for example, President Reagan chose to meet with the members of the Los Angeles Dodgers instead of the teachers. This group of teachers will spread the word about your very concrete interest in education and their work effectively and enthusiastically.

Many of them have asked if they might have copies of your remarks at the Rose Garden ceremony. They would, of course, appreciate receiving them from your office but if it would be more convenient, I shall be contacting each awardee soon in a follow-up letter and would be more than happy to forward a copy of your remarks, if you approve, with that letter.

I believe that we can consider that both the Medals of Science and Technology and the Excellence in Teaching Award activities to have been highly successful. Your generous participation was critical to that success and on behalf of all the awardees I want to thank you and Mrs. Bush for it.
