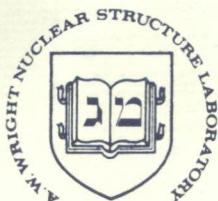

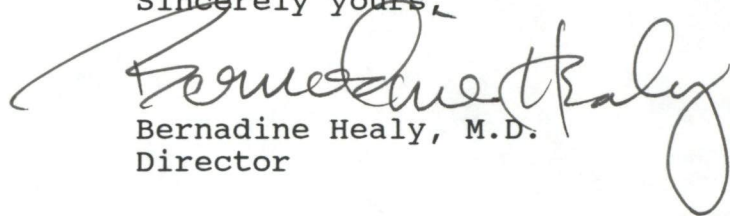

Dear Dr. Bromley:

Thank you for your invitation to participate in the Ad Hoc Working Group on Scientific and Technical Information (WGSTI). I believe that the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) can both gain from and contribute to the efforts of the WGSTI.

NARA's concerns with the proper management of Federal records and with the preservation of records with enduring value encompass records containing scientific and technical information. In fact, we attach such importance to this area that we have recently signed an agreement with the National Research Council (NRC) asking NRC to advise NARA on the long-term value for science of data resulting from large-scale Federal scientific programs. Participation in the WGSTI will help to broaden our perspective and deepen our understanding of the issues related to scientific and technical information. While NARA is not an R&D agency, we can bring to the Working Group a broad perspective and extensive knowledge and experience in managing diverse forms of recorded information, over both the short and long term.

I will serve as the NARA representative on the WGSTI, and I am naming Raymond A. 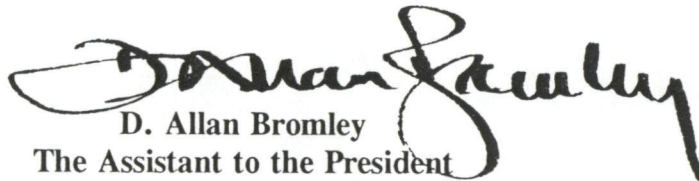
As I am sure you are aware the management of OSTP will soon change and for that reason all I can do is to make your letter of November 3 available to my successor as soon as that individual is designated.

Dear Dr. Bromley:

I write on the recommendation of Roland Schmitt and Chuck Larson to explore whether my background and my motivation are such that I may be effective in an organization such as that which you currently head. They suggested that I write directly to you.

Of my 28 years of professional experience, about 50% have been spent in the management of R&D, 25% in the management of business operations, and 25% in individual contributor roles.

I consider now doing something different where I can draw properly on my industrial and academic experience, where I can make a difference, and where I can be engaged in activities I think important. I am concerned about industrial competitiveness, about science and technology, and about education (especially math and science). As one possibility, I consider working with a foundation. As another possibility, I consider a government public policy activity.

Recent discussions with Ralph Gomory strongly encourage me to pursue these lines of interest. While it is evidently not so common for persons with industrial and R&D management experience to participate as foundation or public policy officers, I believe and would argue that broad technical literacy and industrial operations management background equip me well to address the national issues to which I referred.

In 1984, after 19 years with AT&T and Bell Laboratories, where I held a series of management positions in research, development, engineering, operations, and business planning, I became President of Philips Laboratories. Following that, I spent two years as an expatriate executive in Holland to oversee the worldwide industrial activities of a Philips high growth business and to participate actively as an agent of change within the senior management of the Company.

I recently left Philips to return to the United States. I carry the endorsement and the personal support of Jan Timmer who is prepared to write on my behalf.

I wish to explore possibilities with a group such as the one which you head and I am prepared to visit with you in Washington if you would be willing to make time available. Alternatively, a telephone conversation would be useful. I will be in Washington on November 16 and could extend that visit.

As a prelude to discussion and to further introduce myself, I enclose a CV and a narrative.

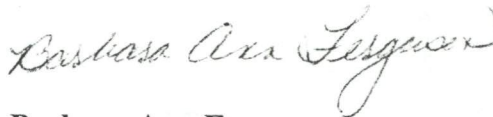

To Whom It May Concern:

This is to inquire about employment opportunities in your department. I am interested in teaching, promoting, and researching, as appropriate, the use of logic in scientific and engineering investigations.

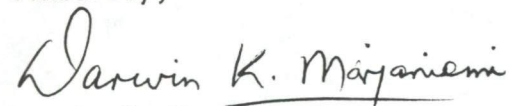
These are some of the reasons I am interested in the logic of scientific and engineering investigations; and why I say that "logic is the single most important means of improving the efficiency and responsiveness of scientific and engineering investigations":

1. Two of this country's premier research organizations, the U.S. Bureau of Mines and U.S. Geological Survey, conduct investigations that cannot be related logically to the titles of reports they generate (mineral resource assessment).
2. The U.S. Department of Energy cancels its Basalt Waste Isolation Project (after ten years of work and one-half billion dollars in expenditures) because it is non-responsive to the needs of the Federal Government and regulatory agencies.
3. Multiple national corporations, the U.S. Department of Energy, and the National Laboratories vanish from the realm of mineral exploration/mineral resource assessment in the 1980's because they fail to adhere to the single surviving goal of such activities: discovery.
4. NASA collects data in its Apollo Program that will never be used. Apollo was heavily discipline-oriented, and that is the most inefficient way of collecting and utilizing scientific information.

Logic took a back seat in the 1970's and 1980's to: information gathering, information processing, technology applications, and the discipline approach to scientific and engineering investigations. I would like to see logic returned to a preeminent position in such investigations.
