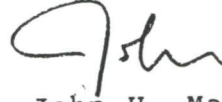
I recently returned from a trip to Korea where Stony Brook has a number of alumni in prominent governmental, scientific and university positions. Korea is an extremely interesting country from the point of view of future collaborations on a wide range of science, technology and higher education issues. It is one of the countries from which we had expected support for the SSC.

It is therefore a mystery to me why the United States has not been more forthcoming in cooperating with a venture important to the Korean government. Next year, starting in August 1993, Korea will host an internationally recognized Exposition in Taejon devoted to technology. Many countries have agreed to participate, but the U.S. still has not signed up. It does not appear to me that the necessary investment would be very large. In my opinion, U.S. participation in the Taejon Expo would have a beneficial effect on future efforts to establish cooperative ventures.

I am writing to urge your interest in this matter. The decision to participate in the Taejon Expo rests with the USIA. The Ambassador to Korea has apparently indicated that the U.S. would participate, but nothing has happened and time is passing. While I do not represent the entire research university community, I am in a better position than most to be aware of the advantages of participation. A letter from you to the USIA Director indicating the importance of a prompt declaration of U.S. participation in Taejon Expo '93 would probably help.

Undoubtedly many people in the State Department know much more about these matters than I do, but I would be glad to discuss my observations further for whatever they are worth. I am greatly impressed by what I see happening in South Korea and fear that U.S. policy there may be too past-oriented. Thanks for whatever interest you may take in this issue.
