REGIONAL INSTITUTES FOR
GLOBAL CHANGE RESEARCH

ISSUE: Advance the concept of a Western Hemisphere institute (either a single center or a network of affiliated centers) for global change research to promote regional cooperation in the natural, physical, and social sciences.

BACKGROUND: At the White House Conference on Science and Economics Research Related To Global Change, President Bush endorsed establishment of regional research institutes to broaden understanding of the science and economics of global change. The Western Hemisphere Institute, which could consist of a single center or a network of affiliated centers, would:

- o promote regional global change research in the natural, physical, and social sciences, with a particular emphasis on interdisciplinary studies;
- o enhance cooperation and strengthen ties among and between the Hemispheres;
- o improve the scientific and technological capability of countries within the region;
- o establish linkages between global change research and the policy process;
- o improve overall regional understanding of global change.

Dr. D. Allan Bromley, the Science Adviser to the President, solicited views from his counterparts in a number of countries with respect to possible establishment of such an institute for the Western Hemisphere. Several countries, including Canada, Brazil, Mexico, Venezuela, Chile, Argentina and Uruguay were then contacted for more formal governmental comment and ideas. All expressed interest in the concept and several offered to host such an institute. Presidents Salinas, Collor and Lacalle are likely to raise the issue with President Bush.

The President should promote support for the initiative but should avoid a commitment to establish such an institute in any particular country. The U.S. is prepared to host the first planning meeting to advance this concept early next year, with the venue yet to be determined. Discussions will focus on the scientific focus, structure and management, and location of an institute.

TALKING POINT:

- o I am pleased that Mexico has expressed interest in helping develop a Western Hemisphere Institute for Global Change Research. In keeping with our desire to make this a true hemispheric effort, the United States is prepared to host an initial regional meeting to define and plan the scope of the proposed Institute's work and operations.

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
