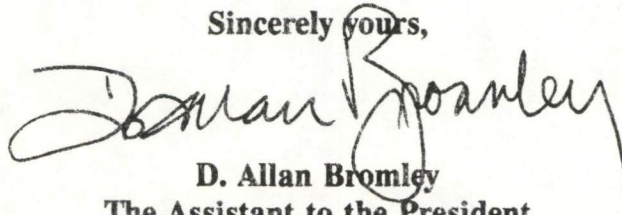

Dear Dr. Bromley,

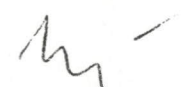
In about a month, on April 1 and 2, I shall be in Washington. This will probably be the first official visit of the Head of the Swiss Federal Department of Home Affairs in Washington.

Science and research policy is an important part of the responsibilities of my Department. Therefore I should like to focus on relevant topics in this field during my visit and to ask you if we could meet at a time of your convenience on April 2. Timely topics might be the technology policy, large scale projects as well as transatlantic cooperation in research. There has certainly been a long standing of fruitful cooperation between the United States of America and Switzerland, even if the governments of both nations have not been heavily involved due to the liberal tradition and spirit that we have in common.

I have been informed that you will attend the OECD conference of research ministers in Paris on March 10 and 11. It would be a pleasure for me to meet you already there. Perhaps we could talk briefly in Paris about the possibilities of our meeting in Washington.

Looking forward to seeing you soon, hopefully in Paris and Washington.
