SUBJECT: NATIONAL TELECOMMUNICATIONS

You will recall that the National Telecommunications Advisory Committee (NSTAC) is meeting here on December 13 for its annual session. You have already received a request to try to arrange a brief Presidential visit to this group (October 3).

My point in writing is simply to support that request. As you know, these NSTAC members are captains of industry and even a brief visit from the President on December 13 could pay handsome dividends for him and for all of us who happen to be involved in the national telecommunications question.

SUBJECT: PRESIDENTIAL APPEARANCE AT NSTAC DECEMBER 13, 1990

National Security Telecommunications Advisory Committee (NSTAC) advises the President on National Security Telecommunications issues. It reports to the President through the National Security Council, and the Secretary of Defense provides support under the Federal Advisory Committee Act. NSTAC is established by an Executive Order which allows the President to select not more than 30 representatives of industry. The representatives are usually at the CEO/Chairman/President level.

When LTG Rodgers called on you on September 17, 1990, you indicated you would assist in getting the President to meet with NSTAC this year. ←

Brent Scowcroft is considering this request now (he reviewed it on October 23). It is his responsibility to submit the request. ←

I recommend you:

- emphasize to Brent at the first opportunity the importance of a Presidential appearance this year, and
- also emphasize to Presidential scheduling.
