SUBJECT: ACTIVITIES UPDATE

1. The PCAST Panel on Science and Technology and National Security has met twice: once for 2 days in Washington, August 5 and 6; and, twice for two days in San Diego, August 19 and 20. Tentative future dates for meetings are: September 26 and 27 in Washington, and December 2 and 3 at Dave Packard's place in California. We may wish to have another meeting late October or early November, depending on progress.
2. The San Diego meeting resulted in a few briefing charts outlining the current ideas for recommendations by the Panel. This is Attachment A. We also generated a back-up paper, structured in parallel to the briefing charts, and based on the most salient discussion points of the meetings (Attachment B). The plan is to modify and evolve these two papers as the panel's work progresses. These papers are prototypes of the final products and you and others can use them to give the Panel inputs and direction. If you agree, I will send copies to Scowcroft, Cheney, and others, and discuss the contents with them. This may be useful preparation for these people before they interact with the Panel (or even afterwards).
3. I was invited by Issues (of the NAS) to write a paper on S&T and National Security, but have put them off for a few months. It would not do to have my paper precede any action taken here in these matters.
4. Should I attend FCCSET on September 11? I would like to do so.
5. I was asked by Defense News what I thought of Atwood directive of August 12 strengthening DDR&E (Attachment C). I took a very positive position, saying it was an important step forward, will be helpful, etc. (Amusingly, I recommended some of the very changes made to Cheney and Atwood two years ago before I was nominated, i.e., DDR&E control of S&T programs and budgets, and DDR&E membership in the Defense Planning and Resources Board. They did not agree to it then. But I did not say this to the press, and don't plan to.)
6. On September 5, I will participate in a panel on critical technologies, chaired by Inman, with Jim Decker, John Lyons, and Al Narath. SUBJECT: What are they and how were they picked. I plan to stick to the (uncontroversial) history. Bill Phillips will be on another panel at the same meeting.
