Dear Don:

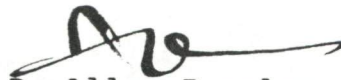
Many thanks for note of congratulations on my new appointment and your invitation to address the January 1990 meeting of the American Astronomical Society meeting here in Washington.
