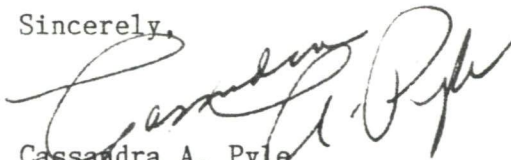
Dear Dr. Bromley:

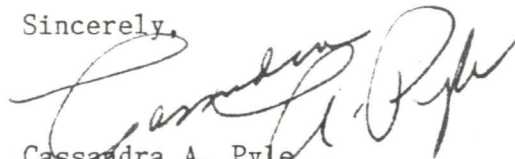

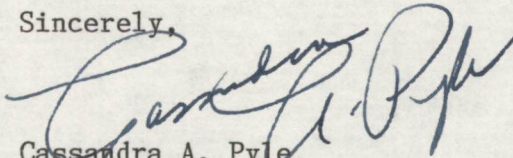
