This is just a brief note to reinforce my memorandum of last November in which I urged you to consider the possibility of having President Bush accept the invitation of the National Science Teachers Association to be the keynote speaker at their national convention scheduled for March 27-30, 1991.

The Association anticipates between 17,000 and 20,000 people in attendance in Houston in 1990 and last spring had some 15,000 at their convention in Atlanta.

Given the President's joint interests in science education and science and technology as an investment in the future, this, in my opinion, would represent an excellent opportunity and audience for him and an opportunity for a major talk on these topics.
