## I Was With George Bush in Honduras

If you have been reading the newspapers in the past few weeks, you have learned "the fact" that Vice President George Bush went to Honduras in 1985 as a "special emissary" on a "secret mission" to solicit—illegally—Honduran support for the Nicaraguan contras as a quid pro quo for U.S. economic aid for Honduras.

I accompanied the vice president on that trip and was with him during all his meetings with Honduran President Suazo and other leaders. I was involved in the preparation of the presidential letters and oral communications conveyed to President Suazo before that trip. I know what happened in Honduras, and I'm amazed at the quantum leap from what happened to what is being reported today.

1. There was nothing "secret" about the trip; it had been planned for months. Honduras was the third and last Latin American stop after Grenada and Brazil. The public records back this up.

2. There was no quid pro quo, not in Spanish, English or Latin. Vice President Bush and President Suazo talked together for about an hour, which really means a half hour with translations. There were about six U.S. government officials with the vice president, and one or more of them was in earshot the whole time and conducting the necessary translations. The Bush-Suazo conversation was faithfully reported in a detailed memorandum filed shortly after the trip, and that memorandum is in the possession of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee. Here's the essence:

The vice president did what he was good at: he listened sympathetically to the concerns of President Suazo, then he put forward U.S. views and concerns.

President Suazo's understandable concerns centered on a heavily militarized

Nicaraguan neighbor, the presence of armed contras in Honduras (which he couldn't admit publicly at the time) who had lost their U.S. financial support and the generally sad state of the Honduran economy.

The vice president sympathized, reported on the release of the fiscal year '84 congressionally approved foreign military and economic assistance (which President Suazo already knew) and reasserted that if Honduras were attacked, the United States, under the Rio Treaty, would come to its assistance. President Suazo used much of the meeting on a—in this context—separate issue dealing with a (we thought) dormant Honduran/Salvadoran border dispute.

The meeting was serious and friendly, devoid of tension. It was a meeting between two allies who could speak candidly and with respect. There was no hidden agenda.

That's what happened in Honduras.

Two sidebar issues, which have nothing to do with what happened in Honduras, have confused the issue.

First, there is excitement about a series of mostly intra-National Security Council staff memos hyperventilating in pursuit of improper written and oral communications and "special emissaries"—communications that were never communicated and emissaries never emitted. The Reagan-Suazo letter delivered by Ambassador Negroponte prior to the vice president's trip is available to the proper committees and reflects the normal, some say anodyne, communications between heads of government. It contains not even a hint of quid pro quo.

Second, there is the issue of whether the congressional Iran-contra committee received all the documents it should have received. I can't speak to that, but in one form or another, Congress has before it

ample documentation about what really happened in Honduras during the vice president's trip.

In summary, hyperventilation seems to be catching. Hyperventilation in the NSC staff, put in the public record in federal court, has caused hyperventilation in newspaper reporting, which in turn has led to hyperventilation in Congress.

Let me suggest a cure, for columnists, congressmen and staffers alike: breathe deeply and slowly, until a calming sense of reality returns.
