Upon conclusion of the coffee, THE PRESIDENT and the other guests will be jointly escorted by the King to the ground level foyer for departure.

THE PRESIDENT will depart, in protocol order, en route NATO Headquarters.

THE ROYAL PALACE

The two central buildings were built between 1783 and 1785, under the rule of Charles, Duke of Lorraine, Governor of the General of the Provinces and a member of the family who ruled most of Europe at that time.

Austrian rule over Belgium was soon followed by the French occupation. The Governor's mansion became the Residence of the French "Prefects." Napoleon used the Palace during his stay in Brussels in 1803.

After Napoleon's defeat at Waterloo, Belgium fell under the rule of King William of the Netherlands. Instead of building a new Palace in Brussels, William chose to adapt the former buildings, turning them into a single built fronted by colonnades.

In 1831, the Palace became the Residence of King Leopold, the first King of the Belgians. The Palace did not change much until 1904, when Leopold II enlarged the building and ordered the facade to be rebuilt in Louis XVI style.

Leopold's II's son, Albert, settled in the Palace in 1909. His son, Leopold III, preferred the beauty and serenity of the Laeken Palace located in the north of Brussels, and chose to live and do most of his work from there. The downtown or "Brussels Palace" as it became known, was used for audiences and most affairs of State. King Baudouin has continued this tradition since he assumed the throne in 1951.

In 1562, the whole complex was burned and razed by bandits. The Chateau underwent several reconstructions through the successive centuries. The final reconstruction occurred in 1780, and the property became a national estate in 1956.

The Belgian Government has used the Chateau for governmental reconstruction meetings and other sensitive conferences. NATO and other organizations use the facilities for their own meetings and functions.
