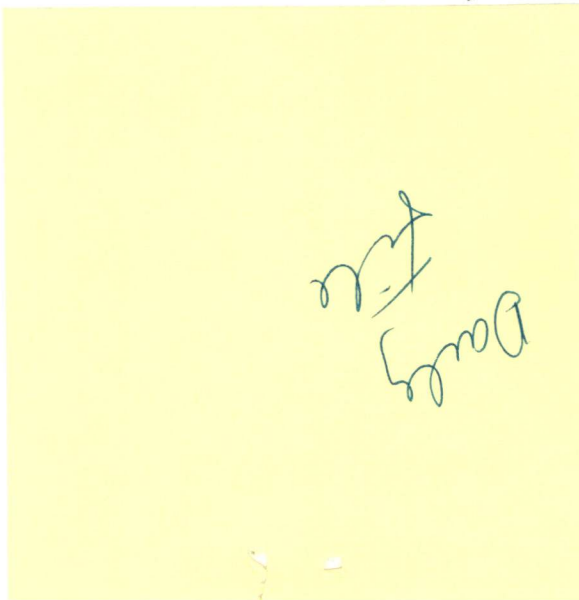

Bush awaits abortion decision

KENNEBUNKPORT, Maine (UPI) — An athletic President Bush maintained his hectic pace of fun and games Sunday while awaiting what may be a landmark Supreme Court decision on abortion.

The high court is expected to issue its ruling Monday, and the White House plans to release a statement shortly afterwards from this seaside village where Bush is spending the Fourth of July holiday.

The president has said he would support a constitutional amendment to ban abortion, but hasn't yet actively pushed for one. Last week, Bush called for and began a nationwide campaign to void another recent Supreme Court ruling — the one that permits desecration of the American flag.

In this resort and fishing village, the fit and trim 65-year-old president has been on the move since arriving late Friday — jogging, golfing, boating, and fishing.

On Sunday, following services at century-old St. Ann's Episcopal Church, Bush added tennis and swimming to what he calls his "five day marathon." Then after nine holes of golf in the early evening, he admitted for the first time, "I'm tired."

But about an hour later, the White House informed reporters that the president will be out again early Monday for his early jog and what is expected to be another full day of activities.

Earlier Sunday, under clear blue skies, he also went to nearby Cape Porpoise aboard his speedboat Fidelity to get lunch — a takeout order of clams and chowder — from Tilly's Shanty.

Bush's appearance was to be a secret, but 30 minutes before his early afternoon arrival word spread and the parking lot and dock were packed with camera-touting tourists and local residents.

"At first we thought it was a hoax," grinned white-haired Odell Henson, who lives next door. "But then more and more people started to show up — and then you guys," several dozen members of the press corps.

President and Mrs. Bush received a big hand from the friendly crowd and then, minutes later, waved good-bye and returned to sea.

The Bushes, along with several members of their family, are spending the holiday at their six-acre summer estate that overlooks the Atlantic.

On Monday night, they plan to host a fireworks display for the community, which has been strained by the daily \$1,500 daily cost to help the Secret Service provide presidential protection.

The town has said this might be the last presidential visit for which its police force will provide security, primarily by helping maintain roadblocks and re-routing traffic, unless it obtains requested federal financial assistance.

White House officials say they are hopeful that a solution can be worked out and it is clear that the community wants an amicable one for their popular presidential neighbor.

Several hundred smiling residents and tourists greeted Bush when he emerged from church Sunday and the president took time to say "hello" and shake hands with many of them.

During the church service, The Rev. Dr. LaMan Bruner, told the congregation, "Our service ... is strengthened by the prayers and presence of the president and his family."

Bush had been pro-choice, but became anti-abortion in 1980 when he agreed to be Ronald Reagan's vice presidential running mate. An administration official Sunday declined to predict what Bush might do if the Supreme Court upholds the legality of abortion.

"We'll have to wait and see what happens," he said.

Bush Enjoying Maine Vacation

KENNEBUNKPORT, Maine (AP) _ President Bush, here to relax spent a long day Sunday in which he jogged, worshipped, played tennis, swam, got carry-out food in his boat, went ocean fishing, played golf, then fished again.

"I'm tired," he said as daylight ended.

The 65-year old president, on the second full day of an extended holiday weekend, made the most of his time to do "fun stuff."

Bush began his marathan sporting day with a 20-minute jog, then attended local church services. Afterwards, he played tennis, swam, piloted his speed boat to pick up take-out seafood, went ocean fishing, played nine holes of golf and cast for striped bass in the Kennebunk River.

At the Cape Arundel golf course, Bush hopped down the bank of the river with golf pro Ken Raynor and spent a futile half hour fishing from the banks.

He had caught no fish earlier on the ocean either, he said.

Asked if he planned any more activities for the evening, a haggard-looking president said, "No, I'm tired."

Although the focus remained on relaxation, aides said Bush was studying briefing materials for next week's trip to Poland, Hungary and the seven-nation economic summit in Paris.

And the vacation White House, like many others in the country, was eagerly awaiting Monday's expected Supreme Court abortion decision.

Presidential press secretary Marlin Fitzwater said the White House would react to the decision _ whichever way it goes _ early Monday afternoon.

Bush, who supported a woman's right to chose an abortion when he first ran for president in 1980, more recently has favored a constitutional amendment to outlaw the procedure.

Bush began the day with a 6:30 a.m. 20-minute jog along back roads near his six-acre estate on a point jutting out into the Atlantic Ocean.

Later, he attended services at St. Ann's Episcopal Church, which also enjoys a waterfront location.

Bush, his wife Barbara and other members of his family occupied a front pew. Bush helped his ailing 87-year-old mother, Dorothy Walker Bush, down the aisle and into her seat.

The older Mrs. Bush, who lives in Greenwich, Conn., is recovering from a mild stroke she suffered in the spring.

After church, Bush plunged into a crowd of several hundred onlookers who had gathered outside the church, shaking hands and wishing people well.

"I hope we get out there on the water, do some fun stuff," Bush told one person in the crowd.

The crowd of about 200 broke into applause as the first family emerged from the sanctuary. During the service, the Rev. Laman Brunner Jr. declared that the small summer-only congregation had been "strengthened by the prayers and presence of President and Mrs. Bush and their family."

Bush's Dog Is Ugly No More

WASHINGTON (AP) — In the dog-eat-dog world of Washington politics, the publishers of "The Washingtonian" magazine decided Friday to dine on a little crow for calling the presidential pet the ugliest canine in the capital.

"Before you go away for the July 4th weekend, we would like to apologize for picking Millie the ugliest dog in Washington" Editor John A. Limpert said in a letter delivered Friday to the White House. He also sent a gift of dog biscuits to the offended beast.

"You'll be pleased to know that our mail and phone calls are running about 99 to 1 in favor of Millie," he said. "It's clear that our words were unpopular as well as impolite."

President Bush jotted off a note in response: "Not to worry! Millie, you see, likes publicity. ... Arf, arf for the dog biscuits."

Millie, an English springer spaniel whose confinement and delivery of a litter of pups kept Barbara Bush and the rest of the country in suspense earlier this year, was listed in a "Best and Worst" story in the magazine's July issue.

The magazine called Millie the "White House mutt."

Mrs. Bush promised this week that Millie would get the last word in a book the first lady planned to ghostwrite for the pet. Bush called Millie beautiful and said, "I know how Franklin Roosevelt felt with the attack on Fala," his dog.

Limpert said the story was put together by an editor who does not own a dog.

"However, our publisher, Phillip Merrill, and I do have dogs, and we understand very well that they are a lot like children," Limpert said.

"Nobody should be told they have an ugly one of either."

First lady defends dog

WASHINGTON (UPI) — In keeping with the political dictum "don't get mad, get even," Barbara Bush predicted Thursday that her English spaniel Millie will get the last word in a tilt with a magazine that labeled her the ugliest dog in town.

The "ugliest" tag was hung on Millie by The Washingtonian in its current "Best and Worst" issue.

When Zaire's President Mobutu Sese Seko was leaving the White House after a luncheon Thursday, President Bush spotted his wife walking with Millie on the South Lawn and he escorted Mobutu over to say goodbye.

Reporters took the opportunity to ask Mrs. Bush about the assessment of the White House pet. "Ask her, she's writing the book," said Mrs. Bush with a smile. "She'll get the last word."

Mrs. Bush wrote an "autobiography" of her dog C. Fred, and intends to write another opus for Millie.

The magazine says, "The first lady loves her (Millie) and she's a wonderful mother. She has not bitten the president during their showers together. But let's face it: this is a very homely springer spaniel."

The president responded to the knocks on the family dog during an interview with Los Angeles Times reporters Wednesday, saying, "I know you guys don't write the editorials, but our dog was named the ugliest dog in Washington ... and I'd like to see some defense on the West Coast. Imagine picking on a guy's dog."

SUNDAY MORNING JOG

The President accompanied by Doro, several agents, Millie, staffers Sean Walsh and Gary Fendler, and a few reporters jogged for roughly 20 minutes beginning at about 6:35 a.m. through a small residential neighborhood about half way between Walker's Point and the Shawmut.

At the outset of the run, the President asked, "Any runners?" As part of a pre-arranged plot to provoke an early morning smile, all the photographers in the pool stepped forward, but they abandoned the idea quickly and stayed behind to watch. Three reporters accompanied the President for most of the run, although one dropped out about half way through.

The President was wearing the same sweat pants - dark blue with an orange, red and yellow rainbow stripe down the leg - that he wore yesterday and a gray and maroon sweatshirt. The run was uneventful although enjoyable.

Your pool is informed by Mr. Fendler that Presidential comments during the run are off the record, but he didn't say anything of substance in any case. At the end of the run the President noted, "the spring in Millie's step," and said that she had recovered her equanimity after the insult inflicted by some of our journalistic colleagues. "She went through a rough period," he said. She also, during the run, rolled a bit on top of a dead seagull, but your pool and Doro chased her away from the bird before she became too fragrant.

At the end of the run the President recommended showers for all.

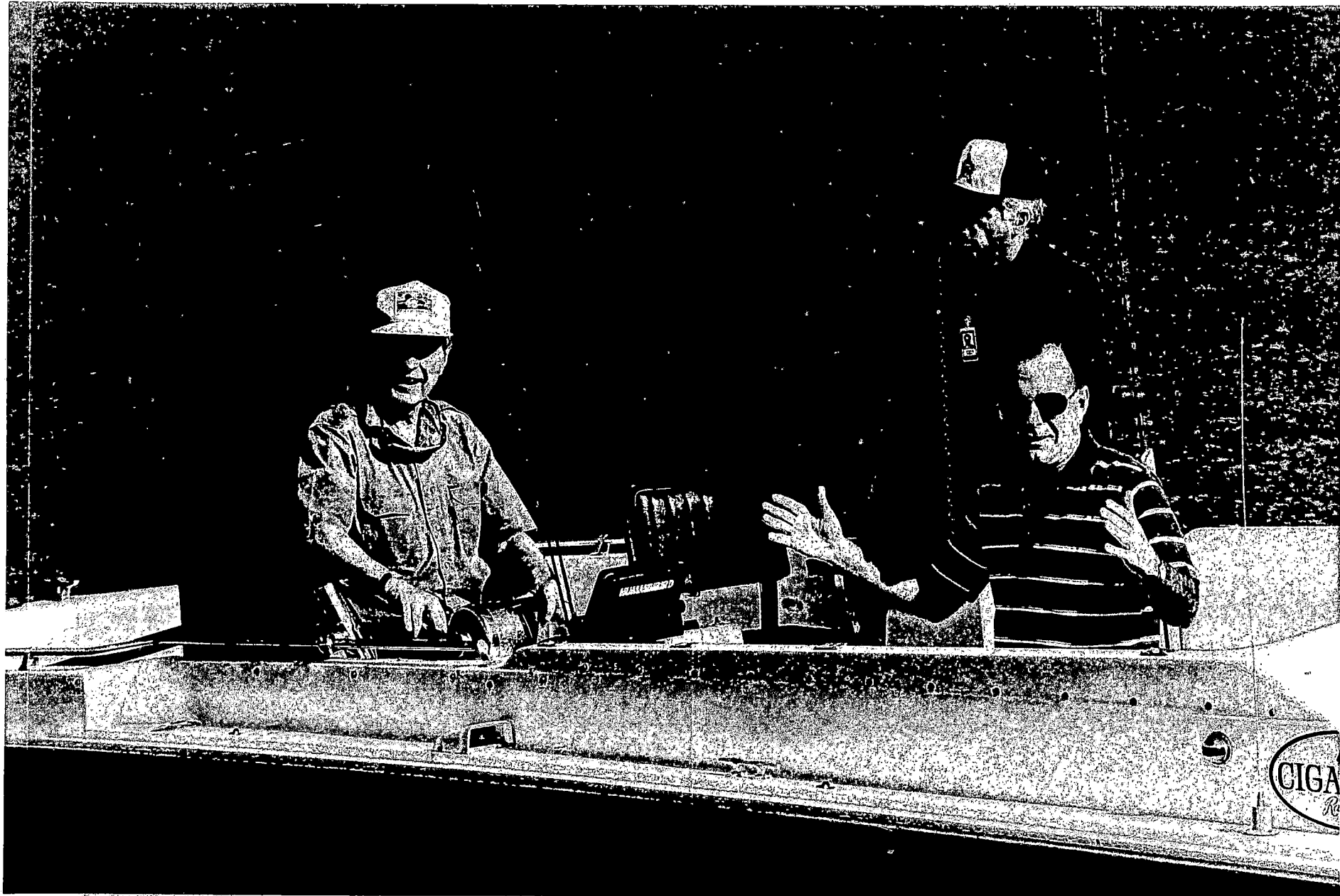

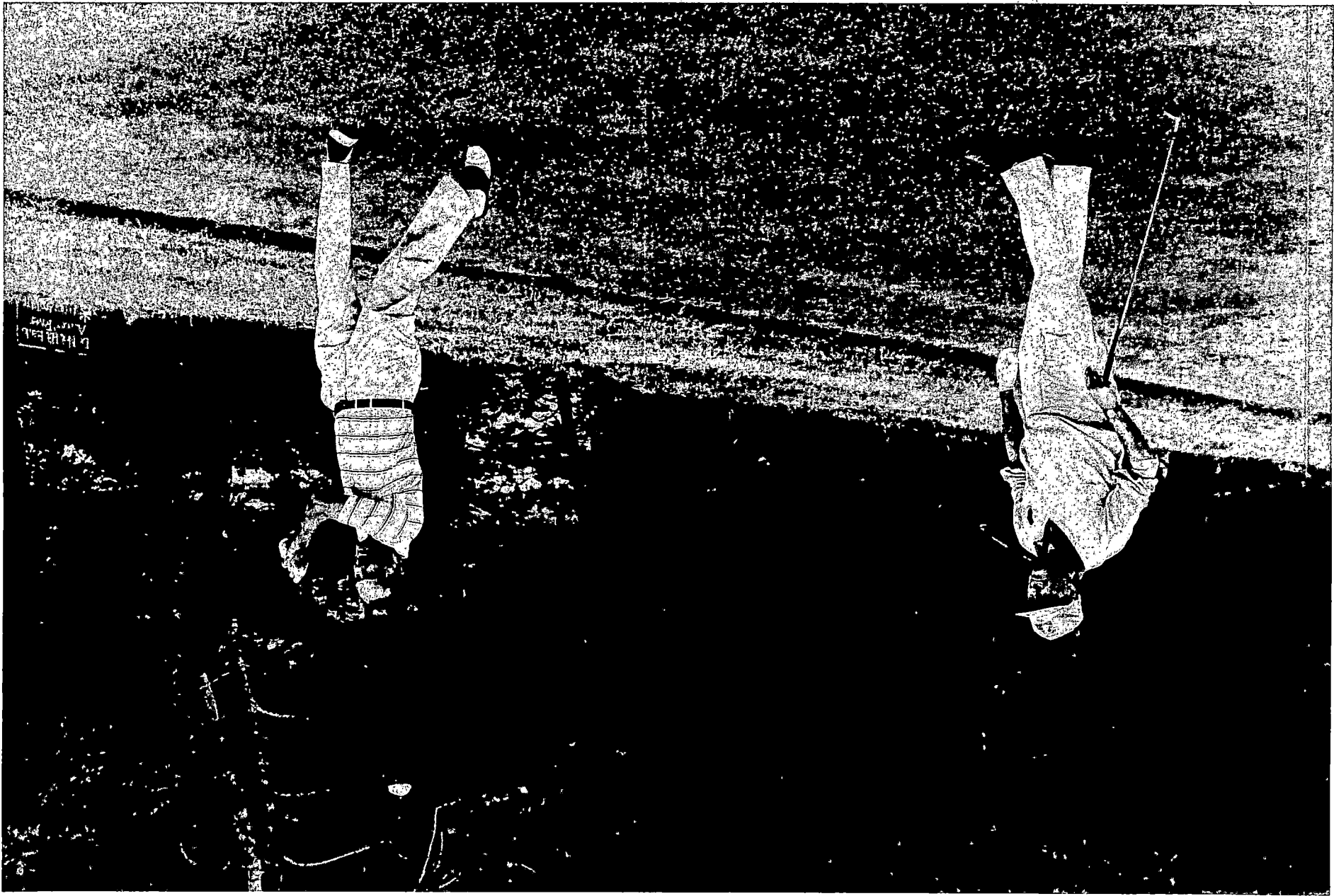
