The NYT reported yesterday that the U.S. will seek to take the lead on a broad agenda of environmental issues at an international conclave in Paris next week. The story indicated that you will soon review a draft declaration that calls for measures to help developing countries preserve natural resources and avoid deterioration of their ecological systems. It further suggested that "in special cases" the U.S. would support efforts to reduce the foreign debt of developing countries in return for efforts in those countries to protect the environment.

I really hope you give this debt-for-nature swaps program a boost. To date these exchanges have generally involved conservation groups and have been very modest in scale. Commercial banks have been nervous about participating, so there's a real opportunity for the U.S. and other creditor governments, under your leadership, to allow portions of their bilateral debt to be restructured into local currency payments to support new, country level environmental trust funds to protect and manage neutral resources.

The U.S. alone has \$6.7 billion in bilateral development assistance loans to South America, and other governments of North America, Europe, Japan and Latin American countries all hold substantial amounts of bilateral debt with Latin American debtor countries. Currently, Costa Rica, Ecuador and Peru will accept debt for nature swaps through their central banks. Brazil, Argentina, Mexico, Venezuela, Paraguay and Jamaica have legislation pending or under consideration.

The widespread and growing public concern over the environment is well documented, particularly the devastation of rain forests and other resources that threaten the atmosphere. You've already responded with excellent environmental policy statements that do you proud. The Paris conference, however, offers an opportunity to respond positively to specific areas of demonstrated need. You could call for establishment of an international environmental trust fund to receive bilateral government debt, at the same time asking Congress to expand the authority you have (under the Foreign Assistance Act) to forgive loan indebtedness on a case by case basis for least developed countries, so that it includes environmentally important countries as well.

The purpose of the fund would be to preserve Latin America rain forests, reportedly now being destroyed at the rate of 70 acres per minute, largely for lack of management protection due to lack of funds. An intermediary, such as the Inter-American Development Bank, acting as fiduciary agent, would receive debt instruments and disburse local currency to in-country trust funds established for this purpose. A U.S. swaps program, funded at, say, \$200 million, would have an annual budget impact of \$5-20 million, with most estimates closer to \$5 million.

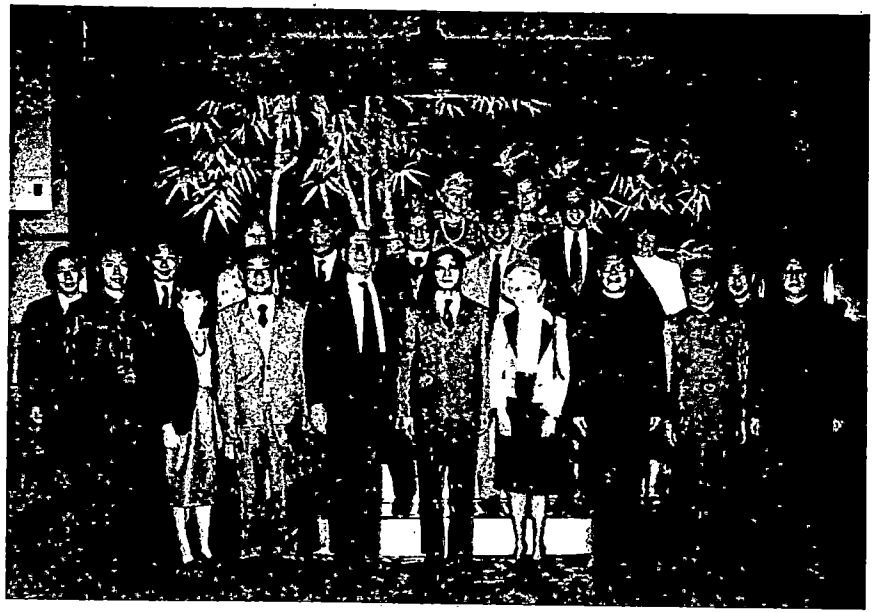
