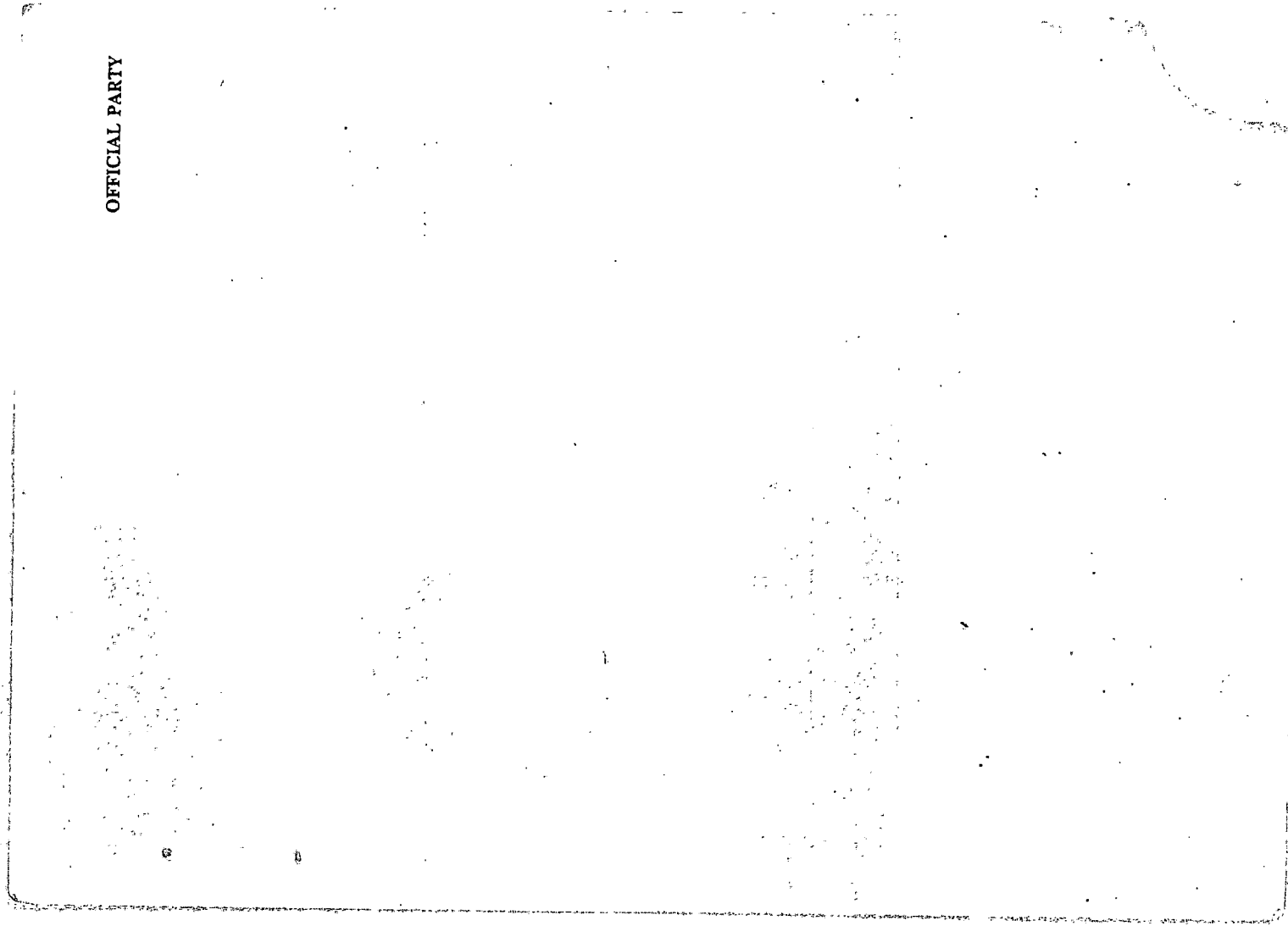

The two Marine Wreath Escorts will give the Wreath to the Detail Leader, turn and salute THE PRESIDENT. THE PRESIDENT will take the Wreath from the Detail Leader, then all Marines will withdraw and stand watch at the Memorial. THE PRESIDENT places the Wreath in the middle of other flowers and memorials left in front of the Memorial by members of the Jewish Community. After placing the Wreath, THE PRESIDENT and Mrs. Bush honor the Memorial with a Moment of Silence. (Note: On the wall of the Memorial, there is a plaque, in English, that describes the 300,000 Jews that were boarded on trains at the Umschlagplatz depot. THE PRESIDENT may want to acknowledge this plaque.) THE PRESIDENT and Mrs. Bush then proceed over to a small group of Jewish Community Representatives (8) for an informal discussion on the Umschlagplatz and the horrors of being shipped by train to concentration camps, the Warsaw Ghetto and the current Jewish political situation in Poland. 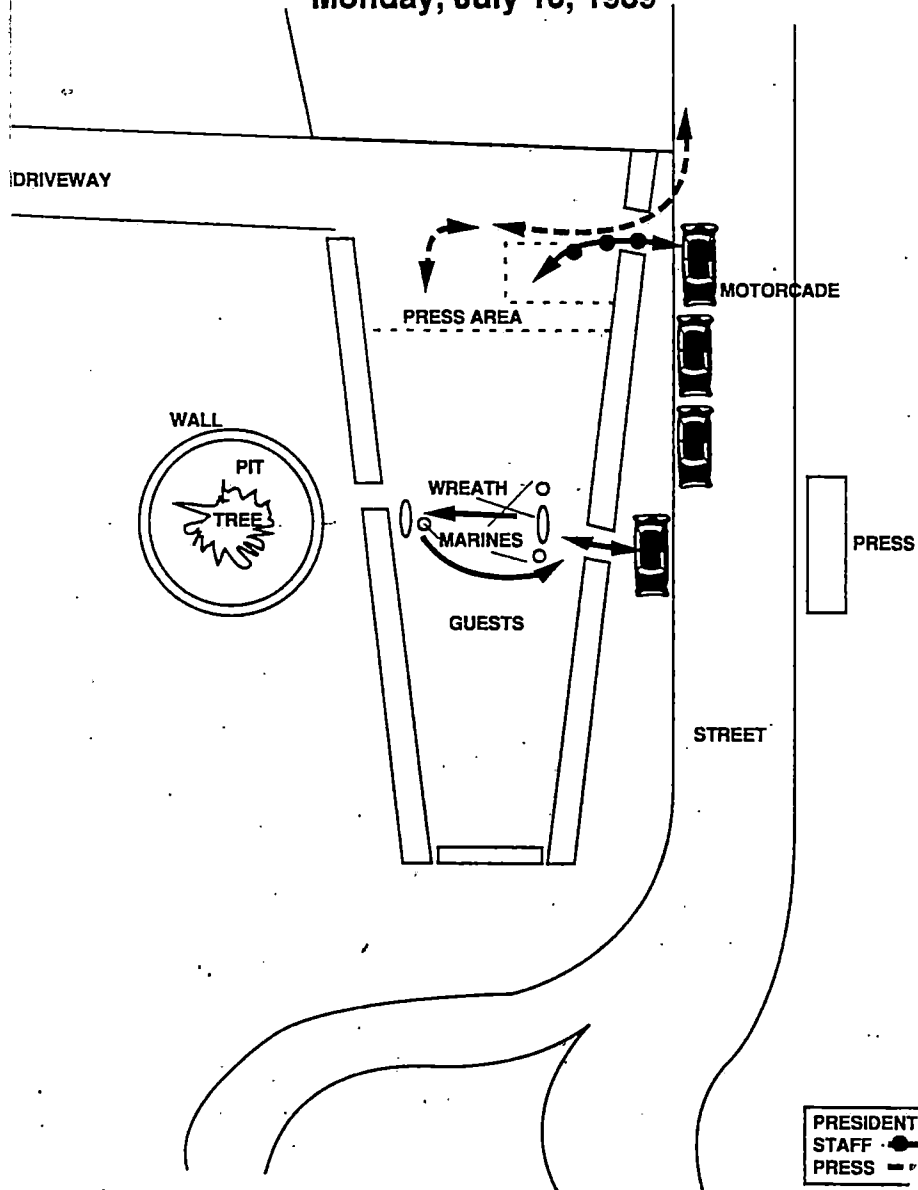

The Eighteenth Century Organ was made by Jan Wulf of Orneta for the last Cistercian Abbott, Janusz Rybinski. The organ has wooden suns and stars which revolve when the organ is played, as well as angels which raise their trumpets. The mechanism which automates these figures is now run by electricity. Originally, however, the mechanism was run by seven people with bellows.

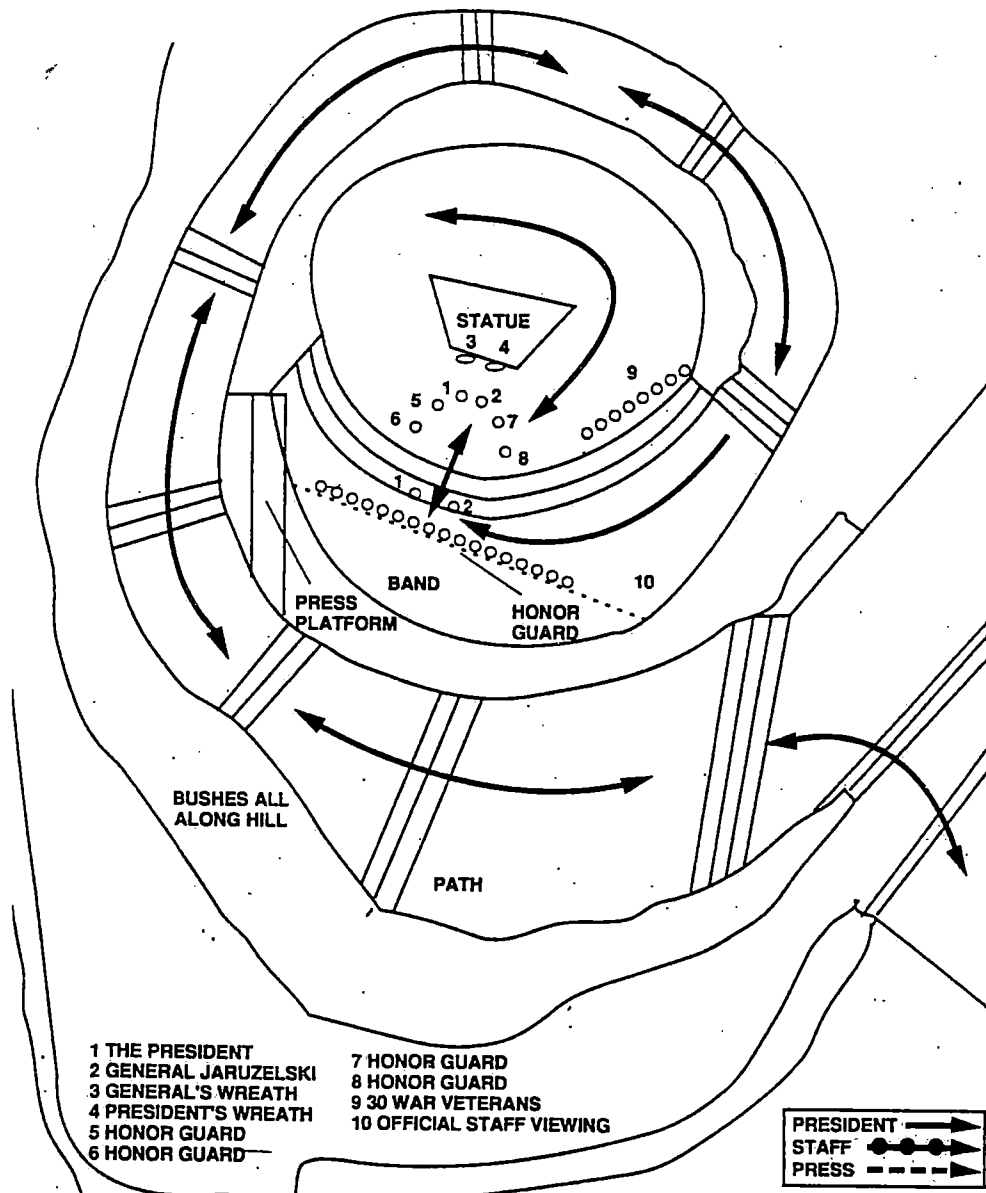
**SHIPYARD MONUMENT

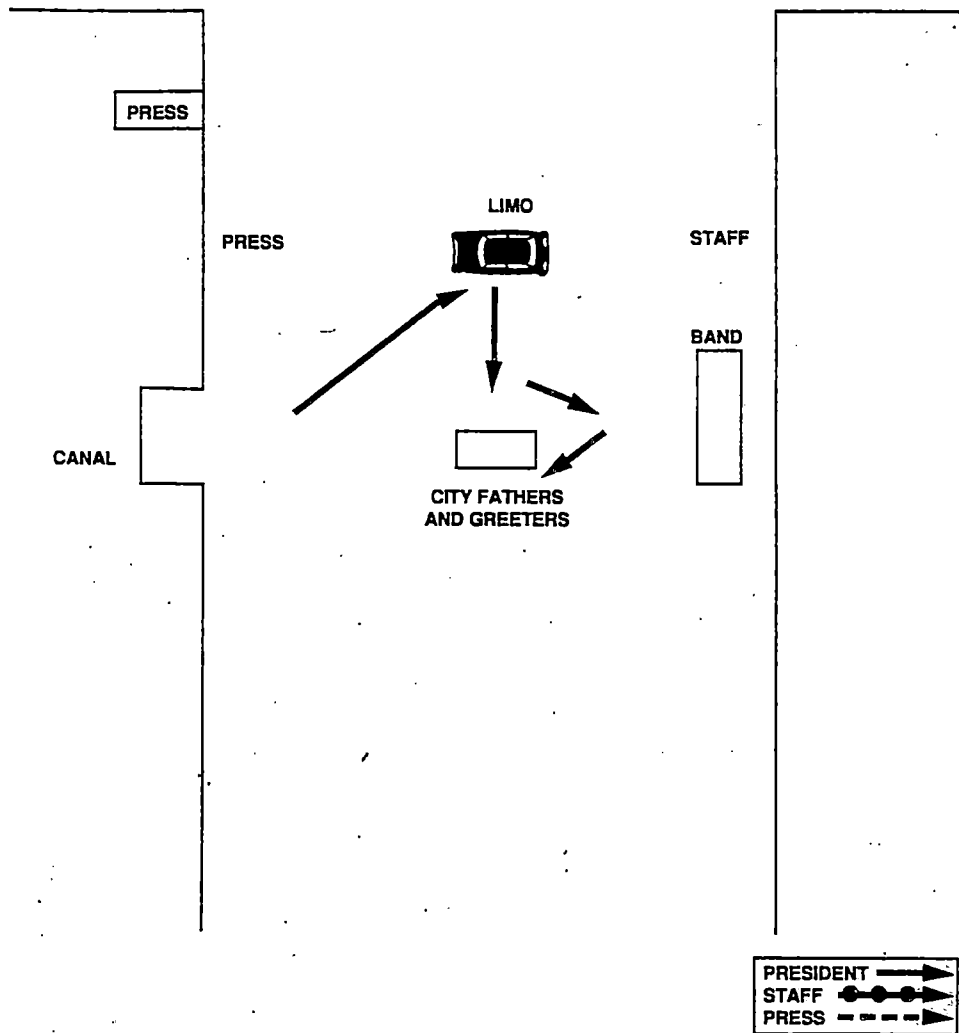

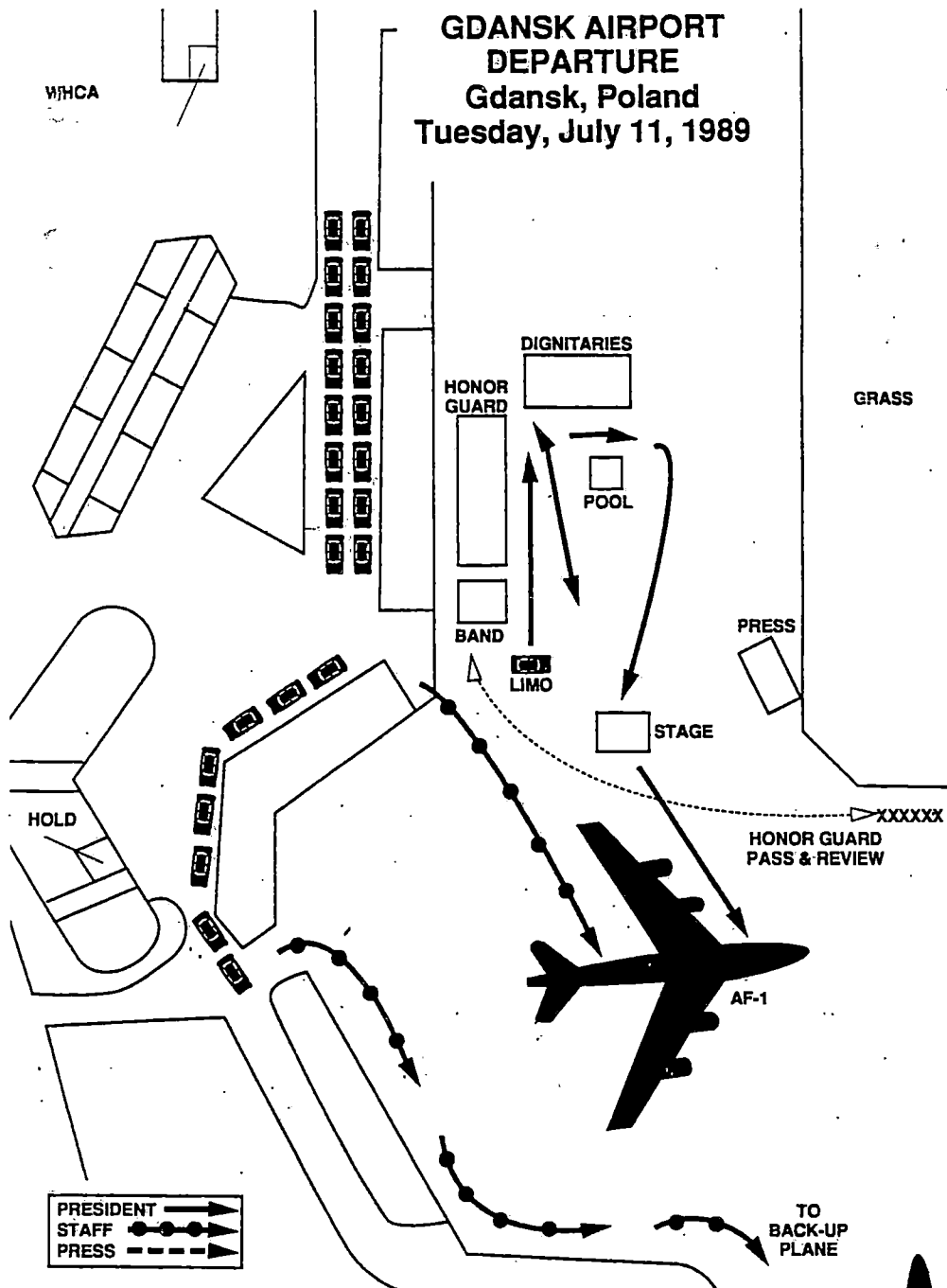


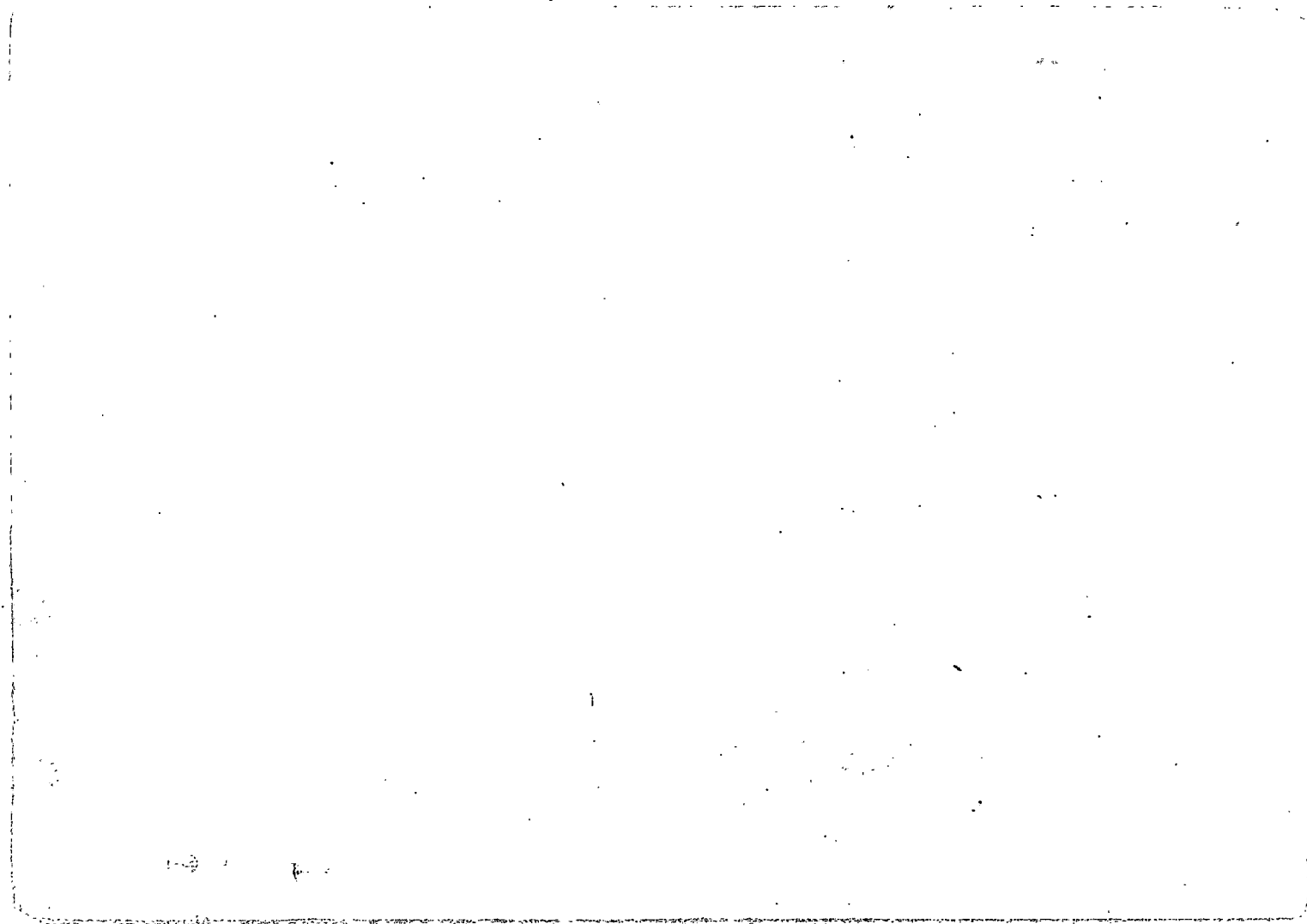
