STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT

Barbara and I were truly saddened to hear that the discovery of Mickey Leland's aircraft revealed that apparently there were no survivors of this tragic accident.

Mickey Leland and the other members of his travelling party, both Americans and Ethiopians, were engaged in a noble cause -- trying to feed the hungry.

I have known, admired and worked with Mickey Leland for many years. His sense of compassion and desire to help those in need has aided millions of people from Houston to Addis Ababa.

Our hearts go out to Alison Leland and to the family and friends of the Congressional staff members, State Department, Agency for International Development and Ethiopian officials who joined Mickey on his important mission and who died with him trying to carry it out. Barbara and I extend our sympathy to the families of all the victims.

The tennis courts were not used.

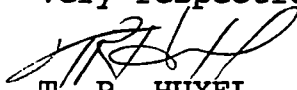

Dear Bar and George:

On June 27th, I wrote and thanked you for the telephone call to Jackie during her stay at New York Hospital. You both know from bitter experience how much such a telephone call means, and how essential and comforting one's good friends are in trying times like these.

Just as important as that first call was the fact that the two of you tracked me down in Pemaquid Harbor after Jackie died. There is an old saying that if you want to get a job done, you pick the busiest person. I can't think of any two busier people than you two wonderful friends and it was a real shot in the arm at a tough time to hear your voices. Incidentally, Julia got a big bang out of speaking to you both. When George said let me talk to one of the kids, I picked her partially because she was the nearest one to where I was sitting and also because she had been with Jackie along with Bob when she so peacefully and therefore so gracefully left us. Julia was able to give you the flavor of those last few minutes and I enjoyed hearing her description to Bar since I had not been there.

Unfortunately, I had gone down to New York for twenty-two hours to try and sell Jackie's Aunt's beautiful Oak Alley Plantation to Wayne Newton, who I think you will recognize as a singing headliner. Jackie had been in wonderful shape that Wednesday morning. She was sitting up in bed looking out over Johns Bay manning the Command Post in her old style. She had to plan the menu for the dinner at our apartment for Wayne and Company; she called the masculine interior decorator who had unconscionably delayed the delivery of some very important pillows that were to be in place on the porch of the guest house that Anne and Tobin Armstrong were to occupy the following day; and she made arrangements with the local veterinarian to have the teeth cleaned of the two Springer Spaniels, who are lucky enough to summer in Maine. One, by the way, is Paddy who is the lover whom Millie spurned! Jackie seemed to be comparatively on the crest of the wave and I figured it was the ideal time to make the short trip. The net of this long story is that I was not there at the end but thanks to the generosity of Wayne Newton with his Jetstar, I did get back up to Pemaquid Harbor very promptly.
