DRAFT STATEMENT

Last night the President, responding to a request from Puerto Rico Governor Rafael Hernandez Colon, directed Defense Secretary Dick Cheney to make Defense Department personnel and equipment available for relief efforts in Puerto Rico following Hurricane Hugo. The troops and equipment, part of the U.S. Army Forces stationed in Puerto Rico, will be used to help restore electricity and water on the island. The action of the President was the first of its kind under a provision of the Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act passed by Congress late last year, which allows prompt federal action following a disaster while a full assessment of the damage is being conducted. That type of assessment is currently underway in Puerto Rico, where personnel from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) will arrive today. A formal request from Governor Colon that Puerto Rico be declared a major disaster area is anticipated within days.

The Department of the Interior yesterday released \$500,000 in emergency assistance funds for the U.S. Virgin Islands. In addition, FEMA personnel late yesterday arrived in St. Croix to conduct a damage assessment for the islands. A formal request for federal assistance from Virgin Islands Governor Alexander Farrelly is anticipated later today. An immediate review of this request and the one from Puerto Rico will be undertaken and all appropriate federal resources will be made available to these islands to aid the residents whose lives have been disrupted by Hurricane Hugo.

EDUCATION SUMMIT GETS A GOOD REPORT CARD WELL IN ADVANCE OF NEXT WEEK'S OPENING BELL

President Bush's education summit with the nation's governors is a week away, but it already is showing results. The mere preparations for the meeting have begun to produce a commitment to set national performance goals for education.

In planning sessions for the Sept. 27-28 summit in Charlottesville, Va., the White House and the National Governors Association have agreed to work together to draft standards for the year 2000. These would include benchmarks for reducing the high school dropout rate, increasing the percentage of students going on to college or post-secondary vocational training, boosting the scores of U.S. students on international math and science tests, and improving the readiness of preschoolers for first grade.

"I don't think you can overstate the political impact of getting the President and the governors to commit themselves to national goals," says Gov. Clinton. Such goals would give schools, parents, students, government and business something to aim for.

DEMOCRATS TO CHALLENGE BUSH AS TIMID Honeymoon Is Over, Party Chief Declares

DNC Chairman Brown said Tuesday that leaders of his party are ready to take a "much more aggressive posture" toward President Bush, challenging his "timidity" on foreign and domestic policies and drawing "a line in the sand" against his effort to cut capital gains taxes.

Responding to suggestions that Democrats' passivity has contributed to Bush's popularity, Brown told a group of reporters, "All new presidents have a honeymoon, but it's time for President Bush's to come to an end."

Brown said his statement represents a "consensus" of Democratic congressional leaders, governors and party officials. It came on the day that Speaker Foley was sharing the spotlight with the President at the Spokane event in the heart of Foley's congressional district, marking the centennial of the state of Washington....

And Wednesday congressional Democrats and governors are scheduled to hold a news conference at Eleanor Roosevelt High School in Greenbelt that is described as a "preemptive strike" on Bush's "education summit" with the nation's governors next week at the University of Virginia.

REPUBLICANS PRESENT ANTI-DRUG PLAN, BOOST SPENDING BY \$800 MILLION

Senate Republicans presented Democrats with a revamped anti-drug proposal Tuesday night that would increase President Bush's proposed spending by about \$800 million, said Sen. Hatfield.

After negotiators for the two parties met, Hatfield said "the ball is sort of in their court now," and Democrats planned to meet Wednesday to consider the GOP proposal.

"They made an offer, and we're going to respond to it," a Democratic source said. But he added that one part of the proposal -- additional selective cuts in discretionary programs -- was "totally unacceptable."

The Republicans proposed a .25 percent across-the-board cut in programs, with some flexibility, coupled with specific spending cuts to achieve the \$800 million increase.

CAPITAL GAINS/GEPHARDT (UPI) -- The partisan battle over a capital gains tax cut heated up Tuesday when Rep. Gephardt accused President Bush of using the tax break to reward rich friends not given ambassadorships. And House Republicans accused Democrats of loading down with extraneous issues the huge revenue and budget savings bill to which the House Ways and Means Committee last week attached the capital gains tax cut.... Gephardt said Bush has been "strangely silent" on his victory last week in the Ways and Means Committee.... "The President has named a lot of his friends to be ambassadors; I guess this capital gains proposal is to take care of those who didn't get named ambassadors," Gephardt said. Asked later if that was a cheap shot at Bush, Gephardt said, "The facts speak for themselves."

MINIMUM WAGE/HOUSE (UPI) -- A House committee, in a new effort to get around President Bush's objections, Tuesday approved a bill to raise the federal minimum wage to \$4.25 an hour within two years and included a training wage for new employees.... However, the bill is not expected to come up for a vote in the House for two or three weeks, giving both sides time to negotiate on a possible compromise.

FRANK CASE/REP. MICHEL (AP) -- The House Republican leader said Tuesday that the Barney Frank case was becoming "a stain upon the House of Representatives" as allies of the embattled Democrat tried to dispel suggestions he was near resignation.... Rep. Michel asserted that [Frank] was benefitting from a double standard that would have dealt more harshly with other members of Congress in similar circumstances. "If I were anyone other than Barney Frank...If I were to have a woman prostitute in my employ for my own self-gratification, I'd be run out of town," Michel said.

HOUSING REFORMS (UPI) -- In its zeal to end abuse in the nation's housing programs, Congress should use a scalpel rather than a meat ax and not be diverted from the critical housing crisis, the National Housing Conference said Tuesday. "While investigation of past program abuse at the Department of Housing and Urban Development is important, the National Housing Conference believes the highest priority of the HUD secretary and Congress should be immediate action to address the critical need for additional low and moderate income housing," said John Simon, president of the conference.

SHOREHAM/NRC (UPI) -- The federal NRC endorsed actions aimed at the eventual decommissioning of the Shoreham nuclear power plant, rebuking the Bush administration's attempts to prevent the plant's closing. In a Sept. 15 letter to Energy Secretary Watkins that was released Tuesday, the commission said it was satisfied with the Long Island Lighting Co.'s activities aimed at decommissioning the Long Island plant.

BOLIVIAN LOAN (UPI) -- The Treasury Department announced Tuesday a \$100 million loan in support of Bolivia's economic reforms. The bridge loan...will cover \$25 million of Bolivia's financial needs until the IMF, the World Bank and bilateral donors provide new loans to the South American country, a Treasury spokesman said.

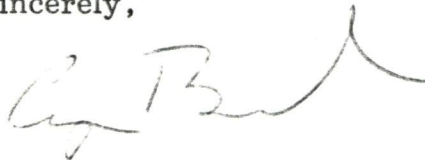

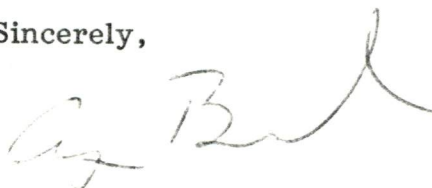

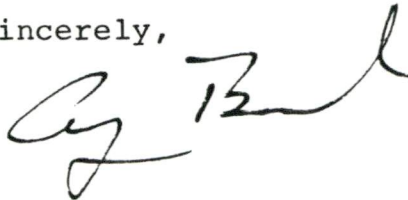
