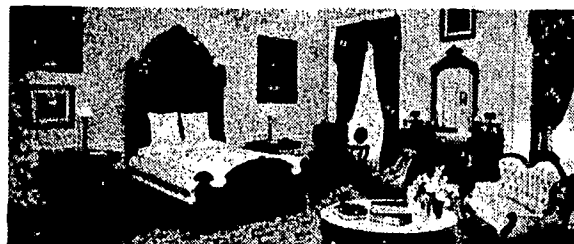
A VISIT TO THE WHITE HOUSE

President and Mrs. Bush welcome Sam Donaldson and Diane Sawyer to the White House living quarters for a tour filled with historical notes and personal comments. These second-floor areas haven't been seen on TV since Jackie Kennedy led Charles Collingwood on a tour of restored rooms in February 1962.

The scheduled itinerary, according to executive producer Richard Kaplan, includes the Lincoln Bedroom, which contains a handwritten copy of the Gettysburg Address; the Queen's Room, quarters for "the most important guests and, of course, the Bush grandchildren"; and the Yellow Oval Room, a living room that leads to the Truman Balcony. "The Bushes," Kaplan says,

"sit out there and watch the tourists go by." Sawyer and Donaldson are also expected to visit the dining room; the hallway "where the Bush grandchildren put up their tents"; and a kitchen. "It's not the kitchen where chefs toil," Kaplan notes, "but it's the kitchen like 'hey honey, can I have a scrambled egg?'" Elsewhere, they'll stop by the horseshoe pit, swimming pool and screening room.

Completing the hour: a "home movie" on "How I Spent My Summer Vacation" in Kennebunkport, Maine; and a "substantive interview" with the First Couple, the content of which, Kaplan says, "really depends on the news" of the week. (Live; 60 min.)

My husband's name is Joseph K. Miller. He was a passenger on Pan Am 103. Today is our 28th wedding anniversary. I have many beautiful memories, but I am crying. Why isn't he here to share them with me?

How can a government - my government - be so insensitive to the feelings of its people? For days and weeks after the bombing, and still today, you and the State Department are saying that terrorists planted the bomb. You say that these terrorists are part of the Hezbollah. You say that you know that these terrorists were responsible for many terrible incidents against innocent people throughout the world and for kidnappings of Americans abroad.

Why is nothing being done to stop these people? Terrorists are at war with all the nations of the world. They are suicidal maniacs controlled by a small handful of other maniacs. How can you dialogue with them? A puppet cannot move unless someone is pulling his strings. Eliminate that someone and the puppet is stilled.

Israel knows that. Israel captured a "puppeteer," and you called it kidnapping. The United States is at war. We did not declare it - the terrorists did, again and again with each act against us. Yet, you do not retaliate, you do not try to stop them.

Please, Mr. President, don't be insensitive to the American people. Don't put them through the torture and anguish that I am going through. Remove the leaders of terrorism. A body cannot move without a head.

Please, Mr. President, make the world a safe place to live in.

Thank you for your lovely handmade card. Your artwork is a wonderful expression of your patriotism.

I appreciate your taking the time to share with me your concerns regarding the Supreme Court's decision on flag burning. While I have the highest respect for the Supreme Court and an individual's right to protest government action, I am nevertheless deeply disturbed by the Court's decision, which, for the first time, recognizes an individual's right to burn the flag. To burn the flag is to dishonor it, and this is simply wrong. In allowing such conduct, we turn our backs on our history; on the ideals of honor, freedom, and justice; and on all those who fought and died to protect our democracy.

I believe that the surest way to preserve these ideals is to support a Constitutional amendment to protect the flag. I have worked closely with Congressional leaders to draft an amendment that gives the Congress and the States a narrow power to prohibit physical desecration of the flag. In my opinion, this proposed amendment also preserves the widest possible range of freedom of expression.

Be assured I understand the sentiments that prompted you to write, and I appreciate having your views on this issue.
