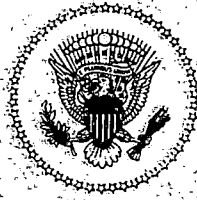

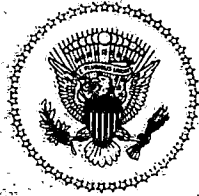

The President extends his appreciation to the following:

December 23

Anchorage Neighborhood Housing Services, of Anchorage, AK. This nonprofit organization, a chapter of Group Neighborhood Housing Services, organizes volunteers to improve homes and revitalize communities in the city of Anchorage. Anchorage Neighborhood Housing Services was founded in 1981 to meet the needs of one impoverished community. Since then it has adopted two other neighborhoods in the area. The organization provides low-interest loans to people to improve their homes and is helping to organize a cooperative facility to provide affordable housing to the needy. Through the "Paint the Town" project, volunteers have helped to paint and make minor repairs to houses in the adopted communities.

December 26

Stephanie Ann Fox, of Milford, DE. Miss Fox, 17, has already made community service a regular part of her life. Last year Miss Fox devoted over 1,100 hours to helping others. She has been active in SPIRIT, a student antidrug organization, in which she speaks and performs for other students to convince them to stay off drugs. She has also helped raise funds for organizations combating epilepsy, Alzheimer's disease, cancer, and spouse abuse.

December 27

Foster Care Youth Independence Project, of Syracuse, NY. This nonprofit organization provides training and guidance to foster youth. The Foster Care Youth Independence Project recruits adult volunteers to serve as mentors to foster youth, ages 14-21, in the Syracuse area. Through this one-to-one relationship with the mentors, the young people gain independent living skills, educational support, and personal guidance.

December 28

Julius Glass, of Forest Hills, NY. Mr. Glass, a retired psychologist, devotes his time and experience to helping the mentally retarded. He volunteers at the Bernard Fineson Developmental Center. Mr. Glass works with the residents of the center, providing counseling, administering diagnostic tests, and helping the staff determine therapy programs. He also trains staff members at the center and confers with them on difficult cases.

December 29

Duke Power Co., of Charlotte, NC. This utility company sponsors an employee volunteer

effort to improve the schools of their community. Through a program called Power in Education, Duke Power encourages its employees to volunteer in area schools. The program includes 2,300 workers, volunteering as tutors and teaching assistants and conducting inspections of school facilities. The management of Duke Power actively encourages employees to volunteer through speeches, an awards program, and most importantly leading by example. To date, over 2,500 schools have been enriched by the contributions of Duke Power employees.

December 30

Pioneer Human Services, of Seattle, WA. This nonprofit organization provides a myriad of services to Seattle's needy population. Pioneer Human Services provides low-cost housing and work opportunities to recovering addicts, but their largest initiative is a food buying service. This enterprise, operated by volunteers, is a warehouse for food banks—taking orders, buying the food at cost, and distributing it to the local programs. In 1988 the service shipped nearly 4½ million pounds of food.

Digest of Other White House Announcements

The following list includes the President's public schedule and other items of general interest announced by the Office of the Press Secretary and not included elsewhere in this issue.

December 24

In the morning, the President placed telephone calls from Camp David, MD, to U.S. military personnel through the Armed Forces Radio Network. He then went to the Pentagon, where he recorded his Christmas message for the U.S. Armed Forces and met with his national security advisers to discuss the situation in Panama. Afterwards, he returned to Camp David to spend Christmas with his family.

December 26

The President met with his national security advisers, to discuss the situations in Panama and Romania.
