SUBJECT: Response to Boston Globe Inquiry

The Washington Bureau Chief of the Boston Globe has written me requesting information for a story he is doing on whether there is a possible link between Administration decision-making and Prescott's activities. A copy of his letter is attached. After consulting with the Press Office, I propose to send the attached reply, if that is agreeable to you.

The reporter is writing for the Sunday paper, so my response would need to reach him by tomorrow.

It may be worth noting that in talking to Alixe Glen, the reporter suggested that his story would focus most on the possibility that foreign companies may try to exploit relatives of U.S. officials, rather than on intentional abuses by the relatives themselves.

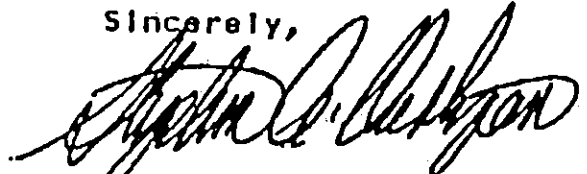
I have been asked by editors to look into the question of whether there is a possible link between business ventures of Prescott Bush and President Bush's policy-making. I appreciate your consideration as I am trying to do as fair and comprehensive job of reporting as possible.

As you know, there have been questions raised in the press as to whether Prescott Bush's involvement in several ventures in China has played any role in President Bush's decision-making on issues involving China. In December, several newspapers, including The Globe, published articles quoting Marlin Fitzwater's denial of any such linkage as well as his assertion that neither the President nor Prescott Bush were aware of any connection between Prescott Bush's venture with the Asset Management, International Financing and Settlement, Ltd., and the sale of two Hughes satellites, then under proposal. At that time, I made phone calls to you and Amy L. Schwartz but was unable to reach either of you.

If possible, I would like to know whether that specific business venture or any other ones involving Prescott Bush had ever been reviewed by your office to make sure it did not impinge on federal government ethics' standards. More broadly, I would like to know whether your office had discussed with President Bush, his staff or his family members the issue of there being potential conflicts, real or perceived, between the President's decision-making and business interests engaged in by his siblings or other relatives.

Again, I appreciate your assistance in this matter, and please feel free to call me at your earliest possible convenience.

Dear Mr. Kurkjian:

I am writing in response to your letter of January 25 requesting information for a story about whether there is a possible link between Administration policy and business ventures of Prescott Bush. I can assure you unequivocally that no such link exists.

President Bush is dedicated to ensuring that his Administration operates with the highest standards of integrity. Toward that end, early in the Administration, American diplomatic personnel were specifically reminded of their duty to be fair and even-handed in their dealings with American business interests and to avoid any conduct that could even create an appearance of favoritism. A copy of the Secretary of State's cable is attached. As you will see, it specifically notes the President's request that personnel be "particularly sensitive to avoid giving any appearance of preferential treatment to American investment projects abroad with which any member of the Bush family is involved"

You also asked whether members of the President's family have sought guidance from my office in order to ensure that their proposed business ventures and other activities did not create a perceived or actual conflict of interest. Although it would not be appropriate for me to reveal information about specific contacts with the President's family, I can say, as a general matter, that I have discussed conflict-of-interest considerations with members of the President's family, both during this Administration and previously. Individual family members have also sought guidance on specific situations on a number of occasions.

In this day and age, individuals assuming Federal positions frequently have to divest themselves of assets or undertake other special conflict-of-interest measures. President Bush has placed all of his assets in a blind trust -- though there is no legal requirement that he do so. Although there is no comparable method for sequestering himself from his family, the President is

committed to ensuring that the Administration does not provide special treatment or advantage to any of his relatives.

When we spoke, I mentioned a letter on this subject that I had sent during the last Administration. As you know, records from the prior Administration are now at the Archives, and although we have requested retrieval of the letter, Archive staff have not yet located it. It seemed more important to respond to you now in order to meet your story deadline than to wait for the letter to be located.

I hope this information has been helpful.

FOR YOUR INAUGURAL MEETING WITH THE MEMBERS OF THE
PRESIDENT'S COUNCIL OF ADVISORS ON SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY (PCAST)
FEBRUARY 3, 1990 - CAMP DAVID, MARYLAND

- O PCAST is a little different from most of the groups that advise me: you bring the perspective of the private sector to bear on issues involving science and technology (and it won't surprise you to hear me say that most public policy issues involve S&T at some point).

- O I am assuming you will all feel comfortable in speaking freely in our meetings -- and that you will not be uncomfortable when we also speak freely. You are an important resource for us. We want to know what you think on the issues; but we also would like to be able to use you to help us think through possible solutions that occur to us -- to use you as a sounding board. I hope very much that this morning's meeting will be a step toward developing the mutual trust that we will need if our work together is to succeed.

O My Administration will be resolving many issues over the coming years where your counsel will be important. From the brief menu that you and Allan generated, I have selected three for discussion here at our first meeting:

- Science, Technology and Economic Growth;
- Math and Science Education; and
- The Environment and Global Change.

I have a few remarks I want to make on each of these, as we take them up in turn. But first, I know, Dan, that you had a chance to meet the members yesterday, and have sworn them in -- do you have any comments that you would like to make? I'm sure, too, that John and Allan will have remarks.

**SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS
FOR THE THREE SELECTED ISSUES FOR DISCUSSION**

-- **Science, Technology and Economic Growth**

Continuing strength and R&D support for Science and Technology are essential for national security and economic growth; support for Science and Technology is a critical part of this Administration's investment in our future.

Defining an appropriate role for the Federal Government in assisting to maintain our national economic growth has a very high priority right now.

I do not intend to adopt any sort of 'Industrial Policy' where the Government essentially picks the winners and losers within the private sector.

There are, however, many areas where the Federal Government can be effective, far short of interfering in production processes and commercialization of products.

Today, let's focus on ideas for new activities that could result in a significant strengthening of our nation's economic growth.

-- Science and Mathematics Education

I know that we have a very paradoxical situation in our nation's educational enterprise. We set the world's standards for graduate training, but our pre-college education is a national disgrace.

The situation is so serious that last fall -- for only the third time in this century -- I convened a Governors' Summit to discuss possible approaches and solutions.

My Administration and I are actively working to follow up on activities planned at the Summit, but I want help on new activities that will help our school systems, especially in areas related to mathematics and science education.

I have emphasized that I want to be the 'Education President' because during my term I intend to lay the foundations to ensure excellence across the board in education, starting with pre-school and kindergarten. It is critical to start this now because of the length of time it will take to see the results.

What are your thoughts?

-- The Environment and Global Change

Global change has become a top political issue throughout the world.

The United States will undertake those activities necessary to ensure that we are not causing irreparable harm to the environment. But, all of our policies are going to be based on sound scientific evidence and sound economic understanding.

If there is an untapped reservoir of data or expertise available in the private sector, I want to know about it and make sure that such information is incorporated in our planning process.

Through our participation in the United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change -- and I will be hosting a plenary meeting of this international group here in Washington next week -- and the activities of the Domestic Policy Council Working Group on Global Climate Change that Allan chairs, I believe that we have made a substantial start in putting together a coherent national policy, but I would like to know how you view what we have done and whether you believe we are handling the issue adequately.

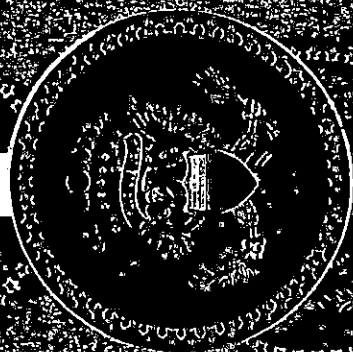

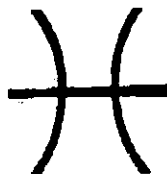

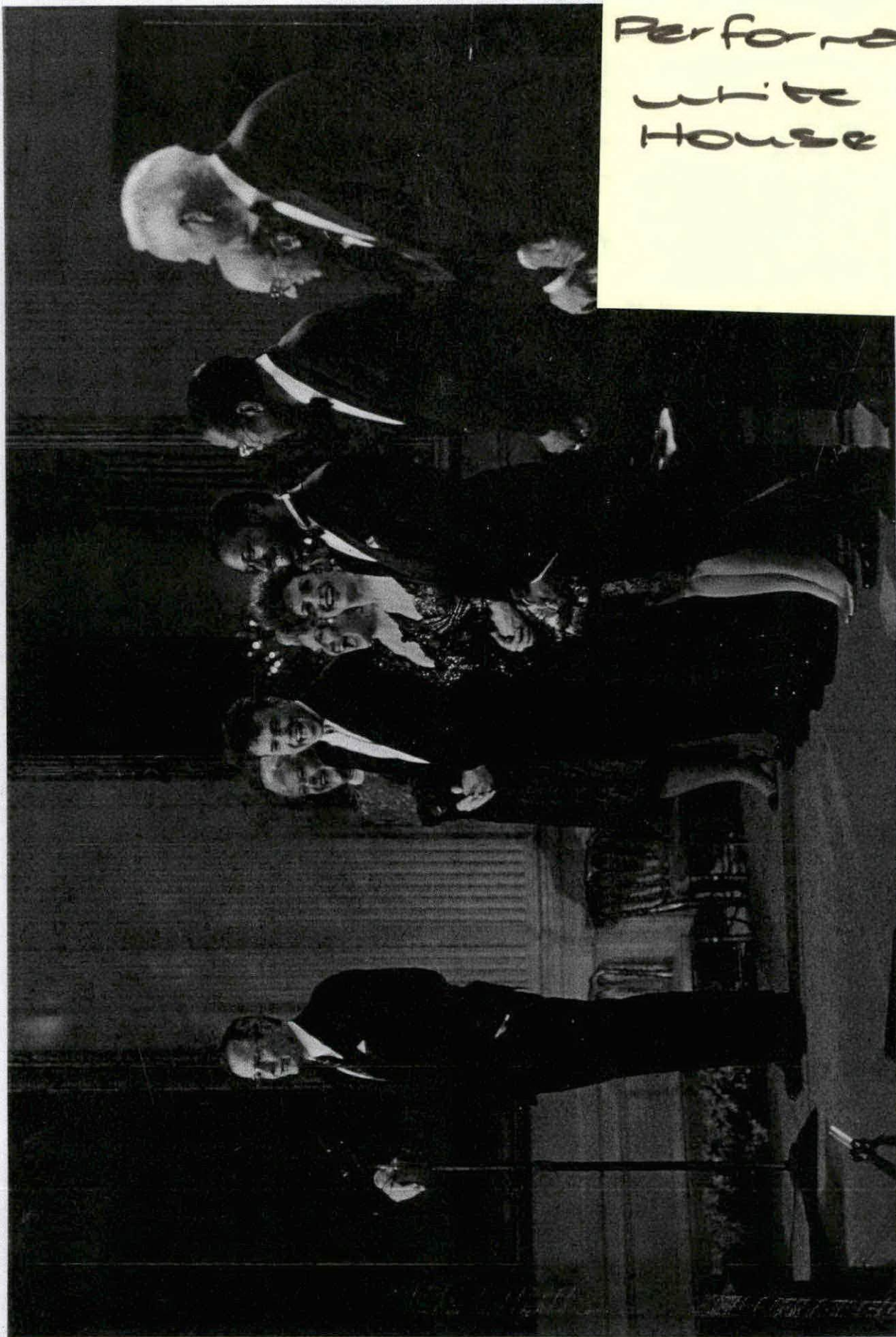
