On Friday, Mrs. Bush and Mrs. Gorbachev will fly to Wellesley College in Massachusetts, with both scheduled to speak at the commencement ceremonies and perhaps to take a side trip to Boston.

Gorbachev and Bush will meet again Friday and will sign several agreements, including a chemical warfare treaty and other documents denoting closer ties. Whether a trade treaty, which has been completed, will be signed remains up in the air.

After the White House signing ceremonies, Gorbachev will return to the Soviet Embassy where he and his wife will host a return dinner in honor of the Bushes. Caviar and vodka will be on the menu.

Reed said at 9:30 a.m. Saturday, the Bushes and Gorbachevs will fly to Camp David for a "family day" in which casual attire will be the order as the leaders engage in talks on some of the touchiest East-West problems.

Gorbachev will return to Washington Saturday night.

Bush and Gorbachev will make joint statements Sunday in the East Room of the White House and hold a nationally televised news conference at 10 a.m.

Reed said Gorbachev was offered an array of possible activities in the United States and he chose to go to Minneapolis Sunday afternoon to meet with agribusiness leaders.

He will then fly to San Francisco, where he will have breakfast Monday with former President Ronald Reagan, with whom he had four summits.

In San Francisco, Gorbachev also will meet with the local Chamber of Commerce and get a view of the Pacific before traveling home to Moscow later that day, June 4.

Officials said Soviet advance planners had hoped to stage an outdoor rally in Minneapolis but they were dissuaded when reminded that the Midwest is heavily populated with Lithuanians and ethnics from other Baltic states who are expected to demonstrate against the Kremlin leader.

Meanwhile, Washington is sprucing up for the visit.

Reed said there will be a 55-car motorcade for Gorbachev, including several U.S. and Soviet security cars, and "I'm telling everyone to walk" in view of the traffic grids expected while the Soviet president is in Washington.

Most of Gorbachev's traveling party will stay at the Madison Hotel, which has been temporarily designated an embassy to keep the pickets 100 feet away.

A multi-sports complex at George Washington University has been transformed into a massive press room where more than 1,000 telephones, computers, video and other equipment for instant communications have been installed _ along with new carpeting _ to accommodate hundreds of reporters, cameramen and technicians.

Bush Voices Memorial Day Hopes for Peace

KENNEBUNKPORT, Maine (AP) — President Bush joined in the singing of "Let There Be Peace on Earth" at a Memorial Day service after church Sunday and voiced hope that this week's summit will bring that goal closer.

Bush and his wife, Barbara, worshipped with 150 others at the First Congregational Church and afterwards joined parishioners in praying for peace at an outdoor monument to a local son, Terry Drown, killed in Vietnam in 1969.

Bush was relaxing this weekend at his oceanfront home here as he prepares to welcome Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev to the White House on Thursday.

Asked if he had a message to the nation on this weekend when America's war dead are remembered, the president said, "Simply respect for those that gave their lives" and "recognition that ... the world's getting smaller."

"I think everybody, regardless of their faith and background, aspires to see a world of peace. ... That's what this little service is about and certainly that's what this summit coming up with Gorbachev is about," he said.

Inside the spare but striking white clapboard church, the Rev. Patricia Adams spoke of the changes Bush alluded to.

"Our world is getting smaller every year," said the minister.

"We have begun to learn that we can live together despite our differences. We don't have to be clones. Different ideologies, different ideas, different dreams can co-exist quite happily."

The Bushes, who are Episcopalians, have attended the Congregational church before, usually during visits here in the spring, winter or fall. The Episcopal church, St. Ann's, has not yet opened for the summer.

Every pew was packed on a brilliant, sunny morning, and two fans on the 18-foot-high ceiling did little to keep the room from becoming warm. After weeks of rain, the coastal area has basked in three bright days since Bush arrived Friday.

The minister called it "the first official weekend of summer" and offered a word of welcome to "the Washington branch of our family."

Bush stood to introduce Transportation Secretary Samuel Skinner and a few others in his party.

When the minister solicited prayers for the sick, Bush's son, Marvin, mentioned Lee Atwater, the ailing Republican party chairman.

A massive mahogany organ with pipes painted gold stretched almost to the ceiling at the front of the church. The six-member choir sang hymns and patriotic airs.

The entire congregation marched outside to the strains of "O Beautiful for Spacious Skies" to the monument across the street.

Marshall Bush, 3, sat at her grandparents' feet beside the granite marker, dangling her foot skyward for Mrs. Bush to tie a shoe during the singing of "Let There Be Peace on Earth."

Then Bush shook hands all around and headed for his limousine,

telling the minister, "I think we'll push on and clear the roadway."

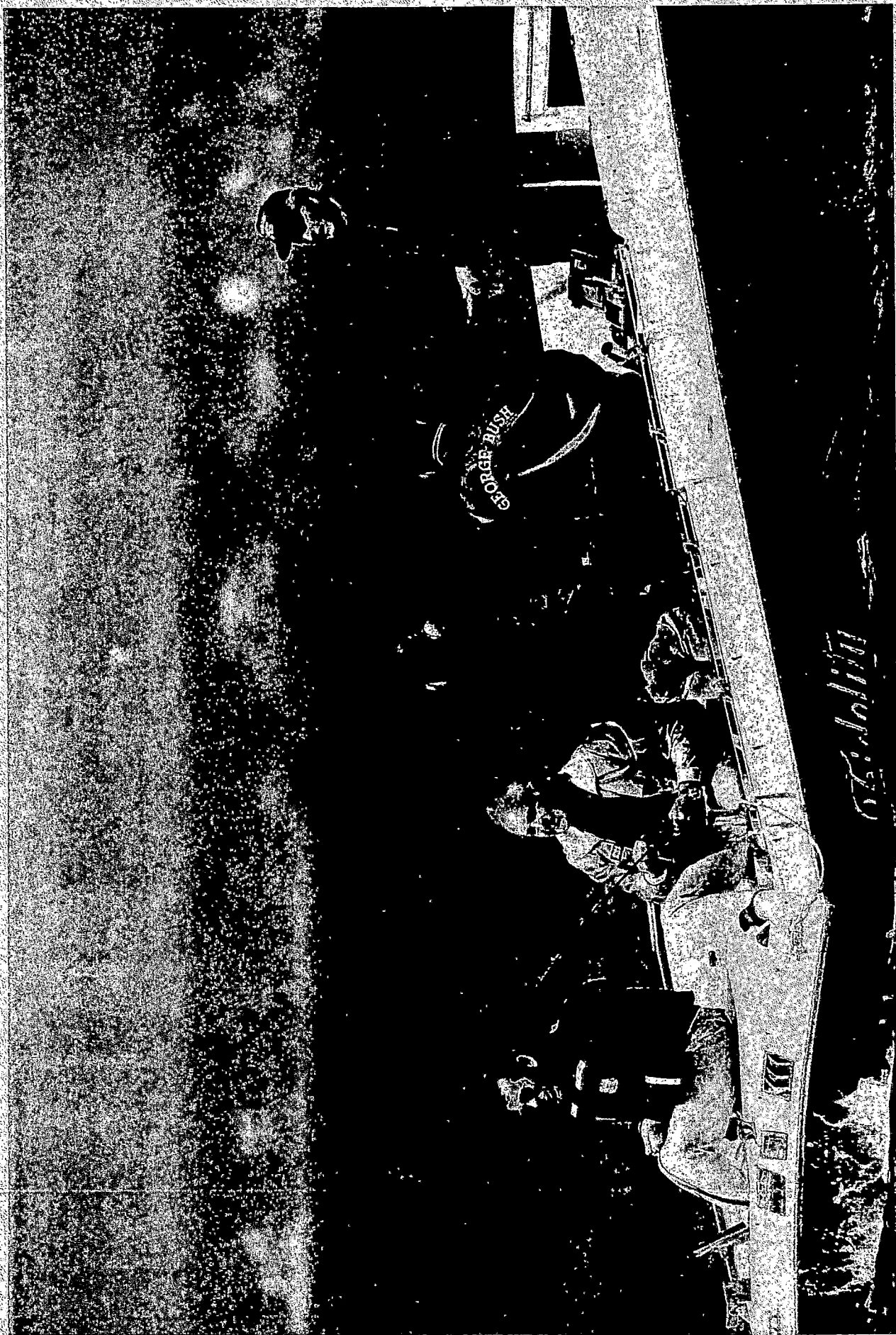

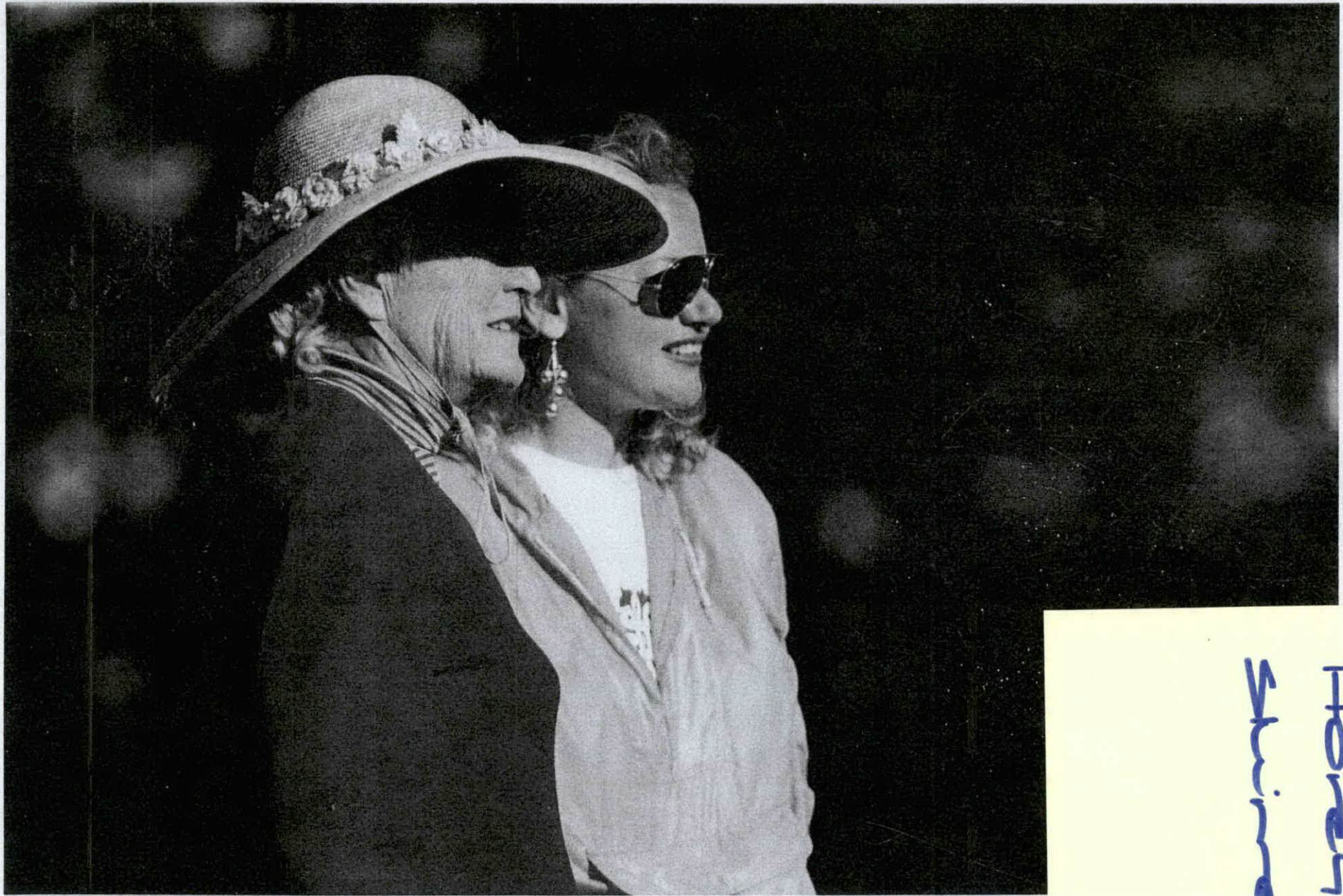
