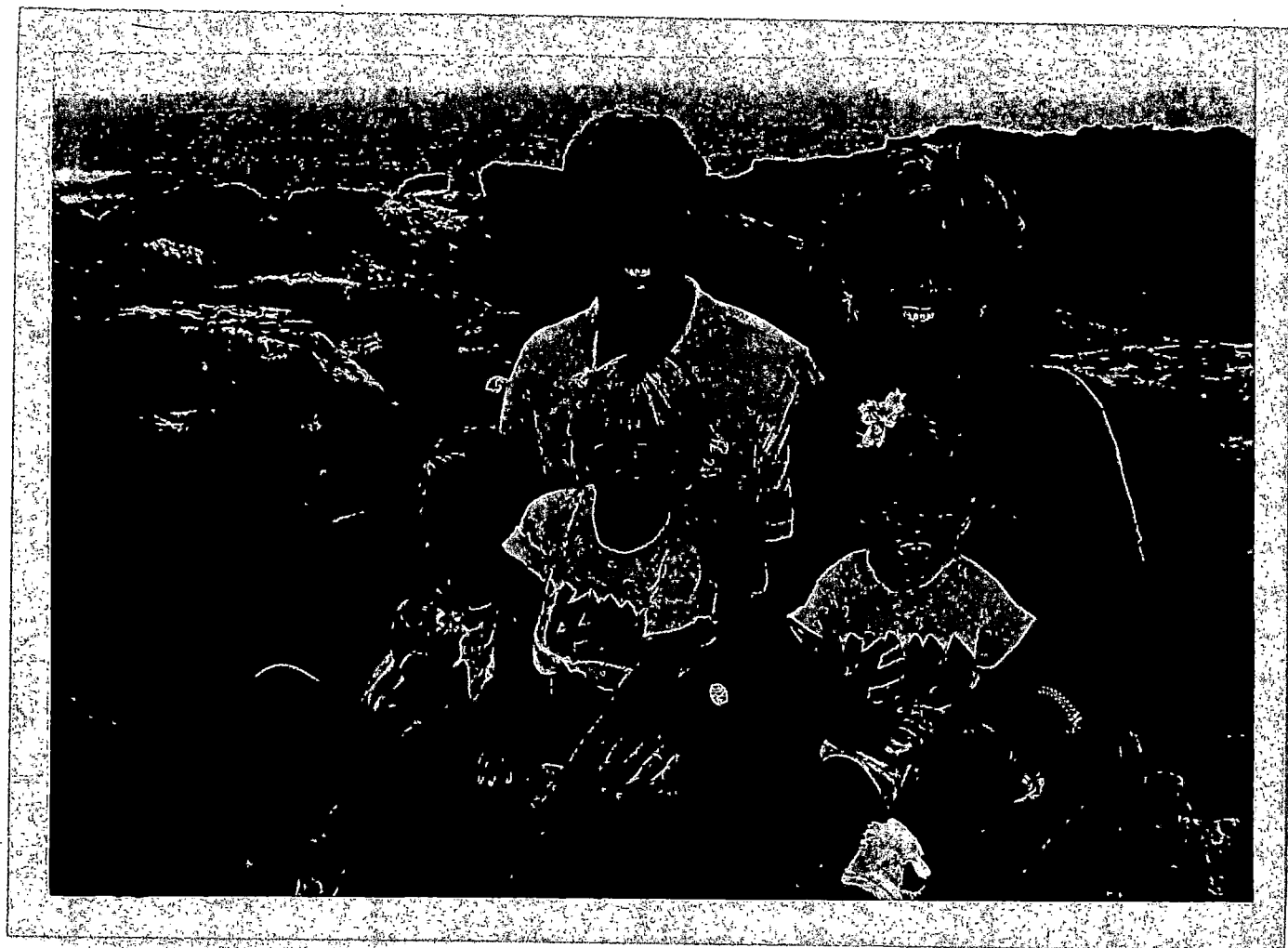

TELEPHONE CONVERSATION WITH
PRESIDENT CARLOS ANDRES PEREZ OF VENEZUELA



- Vice President Quayle has briefed me on your positive approach to the current crisis.
- I appreciate your strong statement of support for maintaining stable world oil supplies during this time of crisis, and your leadership in increasing production and encouraging others to do likewise. Venezuela has lived up to its deserved reputation for taking courageous and statesmanlike positions.
- Saddam Hussein's naked aggression cannot be allowed to stand. The invasion is a fundamental threat to all of us, and I am determined that Iraq will not succeed.
- Our policy has two pillars: the defense of Saudi Arabia, along with other friendly forces, including Arab ones; and a strong, effective sanctions regime, to compel Iraq to leave Kuwait. I see all of this as consistent with the UN Charter and Security Council Resolutions 660, 661, and 662.
- We have had very strong support from all over the world, including NATO, Japan, and Latin America. I am hopeful that the economic sanctions will accomplish their purpose.
- I am very pleased that the Arab countries are cooperating to resist Saddam Hussein's aggression. As you may know, Egypt, Morocco, Bahrain, Oman, Qatar, and the United Arab Emirates have all agreed to send military assistance to Saudi Arabia.

- I also want to thank you for your help in getting positive UN action to help Haiti in its efforts to hold free elections. Vice President Quayle tells me that your leadership has been a large factor in Andean country support for Haiti's request.
- I continue to be very concerned about developments in Nicaragua. The Sandinistas are continuing to help the Salvadoran FMLN guerrillas and to resist President Chamorro's attempts to bring about the kinds of economic reform needed for recovery-- reforms which are difficult, like those you are courageously implementing in Venezuela. I hope you'll continue to assist there.

TOPICS OF DISCUSSION: There are three ways in which Japan should be asked to help in the Persian Gulf crisis: direct participation by sending ships to the Persian Gulf; increased economic assistance to Turkey, Egypt, and Jordan; increased host nation support for U.S. Forces Japan (allowing Japan to assume U.S. costs in Japan thereby allowing us to spend in the Gulf what we would have spent on USFJ).

In the last Persian Gulf crisis Japan contributed assistance to Jordan and Oman and increased its contributions to U.S. Forces Japan. In 1987, it considered, but did not send, a coast guard cutter to the Gulf.

POINTS TO BE MADE FOR TELEPHONE CALL TO
PRIME MINISTER TOSHIKI KAIJU

- I know that you are sending Foreign Minister Nakayama to the Middle East in a few days to express Japan's support for countries in the Gulf, while you remain in Tokyo to manage the overall Japanese response to this crisis.
- I wish to thank you personally for Japan's strong support for the sanctions voted by the U.N. Security Council.
- I have been rallying America's allies to contribute diplomatically, economically, and militarily to ensure that the opposition to Saddam Hussein will be a truly global one.
- Thus far, Great Britain, France, the Netherlands, and Australia have agreed to contribute naval forces under UN Security Council Resolution 661. It looks as if Spain and Italy will do likewise.
- As our most important Pacific ally and the second largest economy in the world, I hope Japan will contribute economically and militarily.
- On the economic side, I would hope that you could extend significant new assistance to the countries making the largest sacrifices: Turkey, Jordan, and Egypt.
- On the military side, I would hope that Japan could pick up a larger share of the costs of U.S. Forces Japan so that we could shift these expenditures to the Persian Gulf.
- Apparently you did this during the last Persian Gulf crisis.
- Also, on the military side, I believe we need to demonstrate Japan's full partnership in international efforts to resolve

this crisis. I strongly believe that we need a direct Japanese contribution to the multinational naval force.

-- I realize this would be a watershed event in the post war history of Japan; however, Japan's inclusion in this effort is needed to protect our common interests and to demonstrate unmistakably that Japan is a full participant in the western alliance.

-- This multinational peacekeeping effort will most likely be coordinated through the United Nations' military staff committee. I hope Japan will participate in these consultations.

-- Although these issues require further consultation, initial ideas involve such tasks as mine sweeping and providing ships to carry equipment from Egypt to Saudi Arabia.

-- However, I would emphasize that the vital point involved here is a commitment by Japan to participate fully in the resolution of this crisis. Otherwise, regardless of how generous Japan might be financially, there will be those who will still say that Japan did not step up to its full international responsibility in the force being formed under Article 51 of the UN Charter and UN Security Council Resolution 661.

TELEPHONE CONVERSATION WITH
PRESIDENT F.W. DE KLERK

- I want to congratulate you and your delegation on the progress which was apparently made in Pretoria on Tuesday.
- It sounds like a breakthrough to me.
- I was especially happy about the suspension of violence, and the end of armed struggle by the ANC. I very strongly urged Mandela to take that step when he was in Washington.
- I also welcome the agreement and release of political prisoners. It sounds like a phased and orderly procedure.
- How do you see the next steps?
- I know there are still plenty of problems. But I am encouraged by this week's events in South Africa. There may be a lot of problems but in you and Mandela, I think there is the statesmanship to deal with these crisis.
- I think you and Mandela have protected and expanded the negotiation process. And that is marvelous.
- We are still looking for an early opportunity to get you to Washington. I hope our problem in the Persian Gulf doesn't complicate things too much.
- Again, my congratulations and best wishes.

In Colo., S&L mess may weigh in at polls

Colorado Democrats pick a Senate nominee Tuesday in a race that will test voters' anger over the savings and loan scandal.

Lawyer Carlos Lucero says he was "very dead" in the campaign until

he began hammering away at the S&L "desperados." He formed his own group of investigators, dubbed "the Untouchables," and targeted Denver's failed Silverado S&L and its best known director, Neil Bush, the president's son.

Polls show Lucero trailing Josie Heath, a former Boulder County commissioner, 28% to 21%, but half the voters are undecided. Heath also assails the "S&L villains," but complains Lucero is a "Johnny-One-Note" who'd "make a great district attorney." While Lucero focuses almost exclusively on S&Ls, Heath is calling for national health insurance.

The winner faces GOP Rep. Hank Brown who recently gave \$9,000 to federal treasury — covering his campaign contributions from S&L interests. Says Lucero: "They checked his pockets, and they jingle when he walks."
