Richards gala adds to coffers

Democratic gubernatorial candidate Ann Richards on Monday added about \$400,000 to her campaign account with a reception and fund-raising dinner featuring U.S. Sen. Sam Nunn of Georgia.

Monday night dinner and a pair of smaller Dallas-area fund-raisers would net Ms. Richards \$500,000 within a month.

About 500 people attended the cocktail reception and dinner at the Hyatt Regency Dallas at Reunion hotel.

Earlier Monday, Ms. Richards formally opened her Dallas County campaign headquarters at 6110 E. Mockingbird Lane, where she took aim at Republican gubernatorial opponent Clayton Williams' proposal to give students vouchers to attend the public or private school of their choice.

"You got the vision," she told several hundred supporters gathered at a headquarters rally. "We pass out vouchers over South Dallas and the principal of the Highland Park school is sitting there on the lawn that school opens and there is a sea of little faces stretching as far as they can see with the little kids holding a voucher in their hand and ready to go to Highland Park

TEXAS ELECTIONS: CAMPAIGN ADS FOR GOVERNOR

RICHARDS BLAMED FOR NEGATIVE TONE

AUSTIN — Republican Clayton Williams will begin airing a new campaign commercial on Tuesday that attempts to place the blame for the negative tone in the Texas governor's race on Democratic foe Ann Richards.

The spot begins with Mr. Williams standing in front of three television monitors.

On one screen is footage of Ms. Richards delivering her keynote speech at the Democratic National Convention in 1988.

On another screen is a scene from Ms. Richards' commercial attacking rivals Jim Mattox and Mark White in the Democratic primary. And on the other monitor is a scene from her commercial attacking Mr. Williams.

Then the scenes on the monitors show pictures of oil rigs and students in universities.

The ad, which was created by the New York media agency Dresner, Sykes, Jordan and Townsend Inc. will be running across the state for an undetermined amount of time.

Williams' campaign consultants on Monday maintained that the new ad was positive, even though it attacks Ms. Richards without using her name.

TEXT OF THE AD



Williams

Ann Richards' voice:
"Poor George . . . he was born with a silver foot in his mouth."

Clayton Williams' voice: "Texans deserve more than another campaign of ridicule and distortion. I'd rather talk about issues that matter.

"Like solving our budget problems without increasing taxes. Like producing more oil in Texas and importing less from the Middle East. And using our universities to attract high-tech jobs to Texas.

"That's the way to make Texas great again."

Responding to the new ad, Mrs. Richards said Mr. Williams' desire to talk about issues is "an incredible statement from a man who has refused to accept a single debate invitation." Mr. Williams has offered to debate Mrs. Richards in their hometowns of Midland and Waco.

ANALYSIS

The commercial reinforces the Williams campaign claim that Ms. Richards ridiculed the president in her keynote speech.

At the time she gave the speech, George Bush was not officially the Republican presidential nominee.

The ad refers to Mr. Williams' recent vow to veto all new taxes if he is elected governor.

That pledge comes in the face of projections by legislative leaders that the state may face at least a \$3 billion tax increase just to maintain the current level of services in the 1991 session.

Mr. Williams has detailed a series of budget cuts, although many legislative observers believe that the cuts are politically unrealistic.

The commercial also notes that the state should produce more oil and lessen the dependence on oil from the Middle East.

Mr. Williams' aides denied that the campaign was trying to make political gains from the crisis in the Persian Gulf.

The Republican has already outlined how the state can produce more oil through use of horizontal drilling techniques.

Some Railroad Commission experts believe that the best way for Texas to produce more oil is to provide more incentives for secondary recovery techniques and for more research on how to get oil that already has been discovered out of the ground.

His campaign consultants conceded that Mr. Williams has yet to offer any specific proposals for using the state's colleges to attract high-tech jobs but added that he soon plans to do so.

"The administration of it would be an absolute nightmare."

In Ms. Richards' speech to supporters, she pledged to be tough on crime, protective of the environment and vigorous about selling Texas outside the state. The largest applause came when she advocated a woman's right to choose whether to have an abortion.

Ms. Richards was introduced at the rally by Attorney General Jim Mattox, whom she defeated in a bitter primary battle. It was the first time Mr. Mattox had introduced Ms. Richards at a political event since

Party convention in Fort Worth.

Ms. Richards' other defeated Democratic primary foe, former Gov. Mark White, was so angered by her campaign attacks in the primary that he has refused to support her candidacy.

Mr. Nunn, who was the guest speaker at Monday night's fund-raiser, recalled Ms. Richards' keynote address to the Democratic National Convention.

"You wowed them in Atlanta, Ga., and I think you could get elected in Georgia today," he said.

In addition to Monday's dinner the Richards campaign has sched-

uled a Sept. 22 fund-raiser sponsored by women lawyers and an Oct. 10 event aimed at young professionals, both in Dallas.

Ms. Richards trails Mr. Williams in raising money for the gubernatorial contest, in large part because the Republican has put \$6.4 million of personal funds into the race.

Campaign reports through July 15, the latest on file with the secretary of state, showed that Mr. Williams had raised \$13.3 million and Ms. Richards had collected \$8.2 million.

"The Democratic candidate traditionally has less financial re-

sources to work with," said Dallas mortgage banker Jess Hay, a sponsor of Monday's fund-raiser. "But that doesn't necessarily mean they can't run a competitive campaign because, in fact, they have done it for many years with less money — and she will do it this year."

Richards campaign consultant Monte Williams acknowledged that Mr. Williams has the lead in fund-raising but contended that the Democratic candidate would match him dollar for dollar to the general election.

"We're right on target," he said.
