Hungarians learning to live in newly democratic society

It was supposed to be a picnic on the Austrian-Hungarian border for youths of three countries, an outing that would celebrate the birthday of St. Stephen, the first Christian king of Hungary.

But a few picnic organizers knew there was another reason, far more political than festive.

On Aug. 20, 1989, hundreds of young people from Austria, Hungary and East Germany gathered on the border to celebrate. At one point, they formed a huge circle to dance.

Through that circle an estimated 5,000 East German men, women and children, vacationing in Hungary, fled across the border to freedom in Austria.

Denes Csengey, a member of the Hungarian Parliament, feels that incident opened the floodgates for refugees from East Germany and, eventually, helped kick down the Iron Curtain that dropped over Eastern Europe after World War II.

"News of this event traveled like wildfire to East Germany," Csengey said during a visit here last week. "After that, almost immediately, they came (through Hungary) by the thousands."

Csengey, 38, is one of the nine founding members of the Hungarian Democratic Forum, the ruling party in a coalition government. His party organized the picnic, and

Csengey said he was one of the few who knew what would happen on the border that day.

"For two hours, we did a circle dance that basically did away with the effectiveness of the border," Csengey said through an interpreter. Edith K. Lauer of Shaker Heights.

"Discreetly, we advised the Germans vacationing in Hungary this was going to take place," he said. "The (Hungarian) border guards had given permission for the picnic. Once all those people were there, hundreds or thousands, the Germans who were vacationing started marching through with their suitcases. It was too late (for the guards) to do anything."

Like so many people in other countries, Hungarians were shocked by the swiftness of democratic reform that swept through Eastern Europe last year.

"It was an unbelievable change and a tremendous surprise," Csengey said. "When Christmas of 1989 was celebrated in Eastern Europe, none of the dictators were (still) in existence. A year before, no one in their wildest imagination could have foretold that."

Csengey, a writer and author, was in the United States on a speaking tour, telling groups of Hungarian-Americans what has been going on in Hungary during the rapid political changes. Lauer, a native Hungarian and director of special events for the Hungarian Human Rights Foundation, helped bring Csengey to Cleveland.

Now that Hungarians have political freedom, they must determine responsibility for former political crimes and rehabilitate those who were innocently persecuted under the communist regime, he said.

Economically, Csengey said: "There is totally free export, free import and 75% of the prices have been set by market forces, not dictated by the government. The problem is almost 95% of production is still under state ownership."

"The big task ahead is to change this to 70% (of production) being in private hands and 30% in state ownership," he said. That, plus get a handle on inflation that is running at 26% this year.

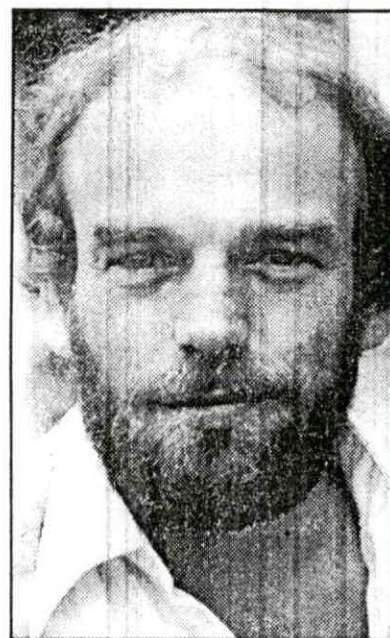
Csengey summed up a wish list that the government in Budapest would like from Washington:

- Help and guidance as Hungary goes from being a member of the Warsaw Pact to becoming an integrated member of the European Common Market.

- A tie between U.S. trade benefits and other assistance and a country's observance of the rights of minorities. Csengey's concern is for Hungarians in Yugoslavia, Czechoslovakia and especially Romania, where an estimated 2.5 million Hungarians live in Transylvania.

- Joint economic ventures with American business in Hungary, where there is a highly trained labor force available at lower wages than in Western Europe.

Csengey used a joke to help

explain how his country, and presumably others, is trying to handle its new freedoms:

Imagine, he said, that you are in a mental institution and patients are trying to escape. They figure the way over a large fence is to get long sticks and vault to freedom. So one night they send a scout to see if it's possible.

"The man comes back in total confusion," Csengey says. "He says, 'My God, there's a big problem here. They've taken down the fence. Now what do we do?'"
