Dear Mr. President:

I want to reaffirm my admiration and support for the outstanding leadership you are providing, not only to our nation but to the international effort, in the Persian Gulf crisis.

The Congress and the American people support the steps you have taken so far, and in my view will continue to do so. I do believe, though, that the recent decisions you have taken to step up the military and diplomatic pressure on Iraq must be matched by a similarly expanded effort to solidify and strengthen the base of popular and Congressional support for your policies.

Some in Congress want to have it both ways: to be on record as supportive of your leadership, but to include in their declarations of support enough qualifications and "asterisks" that they will be able to "jump ship" if the waters start to get rough.

I do not agree with those who have begun to raise the possibility of a formal declaration of war -- in my view, at this point, that would only play into Saddam Hussein's hands, greatly complicate our efforts to retain strong international and UN backing for our strategy, and very possibly greatly confuse the American public.

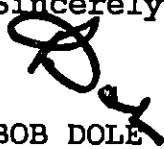
But I do believe the stakes are now so high in the Gulf that before long -- and very probably before the Congress is scheduled to return in January -- we will be at the point where you should ask the Congress to "put up or shut up." Putting the issue squarely before the Congress in some legislative form would simultaneously serve two purposes: (1) if we make the case clearly and strongly, I am convinced we could get a positive vote on a resolution supporting your policies, greatly strengthening your hand; and (2) we could definitively put to rest the issue of Executive-Congressional consultation, cooperation and responsibility-sharing.

There is real risk. Before going to Congress, we must do our homework, to make sure we can win. We must be prepared to really "go to the mat," if necessary, to make sure we do win. We must be united in a determination to avoid being dragged into drawn-out negotiations over the wording of legislation, muddying the impact of our effort or, worse still, turning the whole exercise into a damaging "war powers" debate.

But the rewards of success would be enormous, in terms of the strongest kind of message to our allies and, more important, to Saddam Hussein, of an America -- the President, the Congress and the people -- united in our approach and determined to achieve our goals.

I look forward to discussing this matter with you privately, perhaps in advance of broaching it to the Congressional leadership.
