Memo to the President
from Charley Bartlett

En route back from Guatemala the other night, Bernie Aronson was so eloquent about the importance of oil and its price to these third world nations that I asked him to put it down on paper. You hit the subject in your talk Wednesday night but I think it may at some point, perhaps in the State-of, deserve some elaboration.

Jan. 19, 1991

Some say this is a dispute about oil. Those who do fundamentally misunderstand the enormous stake that peoples and nations throughout the world have in the outcome of this struggle. Go to Africa or Latin America or Asia. The poorest, most vulnerable people there have suffered the most from the devastating effects on their economies caused by the rapid rise in oil prices brought on by the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait. That price rise could not have come at a worse time for the fragile economies of the developing world struggling to emerge from a decade of lost growth, debt, and dashed opportunities. And none more than the new democracies. Courageous people from Poland to Nicaragua who secured their freedom this past year after decades of struggle and sacrifice have watched their fragile new economies battered by the rise in oil prices. What is at stake for many is the survival of their newborn democracies.

When George Bush Played Softball for Shell

Good arm, good field, good hit say his teammates; that is, those that remember the mostly quiet and unassuming young man

Hilton Ladner still remembers the day that the tall, lanky stranger with a Yankee accent showed on the practice field. "We were organizing the softball team and not many of us knew each other," says Ladner, who was then a petroleum geologist in Shell's Exploration Department in Midland. Ladner said his team had had a couple of practices when one day a fellow walked up with his glove.

"Can I try out?" he asked.

"What position do you play?" Ladner asked.

"The outfield," he replied. Then he hastened to add, "I want you to know that I don't work for Shell."

"That's OK," Ladner said. "If you're good enough, we'll overlook that."

"Well, he was *darn* good!," Ladner says. "He could throw and catch and hit. He had what it takes to be a good ball-player. We knew absolutely nothing about his background, but we wanted him on the team."

The lanky stranger turned out to be George Bush, who's better known today as the president of the United States. For two summers, 1950 and 1951, Bush played the outfield on Shell's softball team. The son of a Connecticut congressman, a Navy bomber pilot and the former captain of the Yale baseball team, Bush had come to Midland to, in his own words, "learn the oil business and make money."

Midland had billed itself as the Oil Capital of Texas since the '20s and for good reason: it sat directly above the Permian Basin, one of the largest deposits of oil in the world. During the post-war oil rush, the town was crawling with speculators and scouts, geologists and engineers. Competition among the oil companies was fierce as they scrambled for leases and sank wells in the dry, dusty landscape.

One way that the competition played itself out was on the ball field. Each company had its own team, and rivalries sprang up as quickly as gushers. Because there weren't many employees available to play, news of tryouts often spread by word of mouth. That's how Bush ended up at the Shell practice field.

"We had enough people for the team, but we were weak

in a few spots," Ladner recalls. Ladner, who today works as an independent geologist in Jackson, Mississippi, had played ball all his life including while in the Naval Air Corps. He was the team's catcher and a good judge of talent. When he saw Bush try out, he immediately encouraged the manager, L. H. Moncrief, to sign him up.

"He was so good it was obvious," Ladner says. "Of course we didn't know that he had played on the ballteam in college. We didn't know *anything* about him, and he didn't tell us much about himself, either. He was the nicest, most humblest person you could ever know."

Bush's baseball hero was Lou Gehrig, and he followed in his hero's footsteps by playing first base on the Yale team in college. Although he never got the chance to meet Gehrig, one of the biggest moments of his 1948 season came when Gehrig's teammate, Babe Ruth, came to New Haven to give the university library the manuscript of his autobiography; as team captain, Bush took part in the pre-game ceremonies and accepted the manuscript on behalf of the university. That same season the Elis won the NCAA Eastern regional championship for the second year in a row and made it to the finals of the College World Series, where they lost to the University of Southern California.

One day Ladner was sitting next to Bush on the bench between innings. Bush leaned over and said, "Hilton, what do you do for Shell?"

"I'm a geologist in the Exploration Department," he said.

"Yes, I know. but what is it *specifically* that you do?"

"We work up geological prospects and recommend them to management for leasing and drilling," Ladner said. Although he had never inquired into Bush's private life, his curiosity finally got the better of him. "What do *you* do, George?" he asked.

"Oh, I just kind of scout around the rigs and buy some oil leases," Bush replied.

"Are you an oil scout?" Ladner asked.

"Yeah, I guess I am."

"Who do you work for?" Ladner pressed on.

"I just do it on my own," Bush said.

"Are you an independent scout?"

"I guess I am," Bush said with a smile.

Bush's best friend on the team was Joe Chappell, a power-hitting first baseman. Chappell, now retired and living in Midland, worked for Shell as a draftsman in the Land Department. "George didn't talk a lot, but he wasn't shy. We had both played baseball in college so we compared those experiences. Beyond that, the only thing I knew was that he owned a little independent oil company."

No one on the team knew any more than that. In fact, Bush's teammates had no idea who he was. He drove a red

Studebaker coupe and lived in a small house — 847 square feet — on East Maple Street. All the houses had the same floor plan, but because the developer knew that Texans were individualists, he placed the houses in different positions on each lot and painted each one a different luminous color; hence the neighborhood was known as "Easter Egg Row."

Bush had formed his own oil development company with John Overbey in late 1950; Overbey lived across the street from Bush on Easter Egg Row and the two talked endlessly about oil deals. A few years later, Bush would form Zapata Oil Company with Hugh and Bill Liedtke, two transplanted Oklahomans who bought and sold oil leases. Zapata, which was named after the Marlon Brando movie, *Viva Zapata!*, was the forerunner of Pennzoil, a major player in the oil industry today.

Despite the frantic pace he kept, Bush always found time for athletics. He helped organize the city Little League, played in a touch football league on Sundays after church, and roamed the outfield for the Shell softball team.

Bert David, who was a Shell geologist in Midland at the time, was the team's star pitcher. "We had a pretty good team," says David, who left the company in 1956 and is now retired and living in Houston. "Bush was our best outfielder. But he had trouble getting his uniform when he first joined the team. He played for a while without a uniform."

Sylvia Cearley, who was a Shell geologist in Midland, remembers seeing Bush around town. "I used to have lunch with a friend of mine who was a secretary for the Liedtke brothers," says Cearley, who retired in 1986 as a senior geologist from Pecten International. "When I would go there to meet her, Bush would sometimes come in to talk to them."

Cearley followed the team — "we all did," she says — and also worked as a reporter for the *Wrangler*, which was a Shell newspaper. Although she didn't cover the softball team, she was dating Ladner at the time; when the team picture appeared in the paper, she kept it. (That picture — with George Bush in the second row — accompanies this story.)

On several occasions, Bush and his wife, Barbara, invited the team over for Coke and cookies. One time, Bush borrowed a shotgun from Ladner to go dove hunting. "I still have that gun," Ladner says proudly.

Ladner left Shell in 1956 and moved to Jackson where he started his own business. He lost touch with Bush until one day when he was walking with a friend through Hobby Airport in Houston. Glancing up, he saw a huge picture of Bush on the wall, announcing him as a candidate for Congress from that district.

Ladner stopped dead in his tracks and said, "I know him!"

His friend said, "He's a real powerful politician around here."

"Him?" Ladner said in disbelief. "Why, he's just a little old scout from Midland!"

One of Ladner's most cherished souvenirs is an old photo of the Shell softball team autographed by Bush. "My wife, Dolly, and I were at a campaign rally in Jackson about four years ago," he says. "She brought the team photo along. When we got the chance to say hello to him, he remembered it and signed it for us. He still comes to town every now and then. The last time he was here I had a brief visit with him, and I reminded him about our days on the softball team together."

To others, the mention of Bush evokes different memories of the summer softball league. "I really had it in for George Bush," jokes John Chitwood, a former Shell draftsman who now lives in Irving, Texas. "He took my place on the team! After he started playing left field, I had to move over and play right field!" *SN*

George Bush kept such a low profile on the Shell softball team that, when contacted for this story, several of his old teammates didn't remember him at all. A few were even astonished to learn that they had once played side-by-side with the chief executive. Sources in the White House Office of Communications couldn't provide much help either; no one on the presidential staff had known Bush 40 years ago. We filled in some of the blanks by referring to Looking Forward, Bush's autobiography co-written with Victor Gold.

Dear Mr. President:

A friend of mine, who is an American citizen of Chaldean extraction, called me earlier today to make a point which I felt is so important that I wanted to pass it on to you immediately.

He was most recently in Iraq from mid-June to the end of August and while trapped there passed as an Iraqi citizen. It is his belief that 95 percent of the Iraqi people and much of the army do not like or support Saddam Hussein and that they view the United States as a moral superpower.

My friend urges that further rhetoric, including rhetoric accompanying an attack, be aimed at the regime of Saddam Hussein. For instance, rather than talking about Iraq vs the world, our rhetoric should be aimed at the regime of Saddam Hussein vs the world. Such a message in Arabic over the Voice of America, as well as in our leaders' remarks, would reinforce the Iraqis' view of us as a liberator instead of an invader.

Put another way, he believes the Iraqi people would not be as willing to fight for Saddam Hussein if they thought the attack was aimed at the regime of Saddam Hussein, but would fight for revenge if they thought the attack was aimed at them.

Subtleties have little place in war time but it is my friend's strong feeling (and I have confidence in his judgment) that messages aimed in Arabic at the Iraqi people could have a very positive effect on our military effort. Finally, he says that the Voice of America in Arabic is listened to by just about everyone at night.

You and those you have chosen to guide you in this perilous and difficult project are very much in our thoughts and prayers as, of course, are our men and women in the armed forces.

STATEMENT BY THE PRESS SECRETARY

CAMP DAVID -- The President met with national security advisers at Camp David for about 2 hours today to review the status of Operation Desert Storm. The group reported that significant military achievements had been recorded. Damage assessments continue.

General Colin Powell, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, reported that although it is early in the conflict, many of the strategic objectives have been achieved, including those related to Iraq's air defense system. The President feels the operation is proceeding according to pace and has been quite successful.

The President continues to be concerned about Iraqi missiles launched against Israel. Iraq is clearly attacking Israel solely for political purposes, to split the coalition.

The President called Israeli Prime Minister Shamir for a second time today at approximately 11:30 a.m. EST to express his appreciation for Israel's restraint in responding to the scud missile attacks. "I understand the anguish of your people and your government," the President said. "We will use every resource possible to suppress and destroy the mobile scuds."

The President thanked the Prime Minister for his personal leadership and cooperation.

Governor Sununu also discussed the National Energy Policy and the State of the Union message with the President. Both are in the final stages of development.

Attendees included the Vice President, Secretary of State Baker, Secretary of Defense Cheney, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs General Powell, Chief of Staff Sununu, NSC Adviser Scowcroft, Deputy Advisor Gates and the Press Secretary.

The President will be joined by Speaker Foley and his wife tomorrow afternoon at Camp David. They will remain overnight. The President's schedule for the weekend remains as announced Friday. He will return to the White House Monday afternoon.
