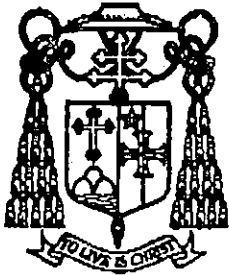

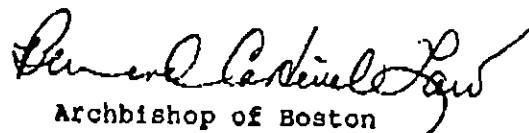
This is to acknowledge with gratitude your letter of January 22nd. I appreciate and admire the care and concern which you have shown in these trying times not only for my letter but for all the issues associated with the decision you have made and with the sometimes contrasting and contradictory views which come from so many quarters.

Please permit me, however, to correct an impression which my letter of January 16, 1991, may have inadvertently given. It is not my position that "all war is wrong -- morally, unforgivably wrong". The conditions which could justify the Allied countries' entry into battle against the aggression of Iraq require a very sober and prudent consideration. I know we agree that the presumption of civilized nations is against recourse to arms. That is the basis for the world community's grievance against Iraq's aggressive and brutal actions. However, there are situations in which the requirements of justice and peace may make armed response a necessity, however regrettably. As a matter of fact, I have written a column for The Pilot, our Archdiocesan weekly, bearing today's date, in which I conclude that the situation in the Persian Gulf justifies the armed involvement of the world community (copy attached).

In that same letter I also referred to the requirements which are incumbent on parties who have entered, presumably with justification, an armed conflict. The moral principles concerning the just conduct of war include, as you know, the demand that lethal force not be used indiscriminately. In this regard, I mentioned that the pursuit of a quick and decisive victory could suggest in the minds of some an indiscriminate use of weapons even against civilian populations. Indeed, I have been most heartened by your own comments, those of Defense Secretary Cheney and General Colin Powell referring to the determined effort of the Allied Forces to avoid such indiscriminate use of lethal force. As I point out in my column mentioned above, the violation of this very principle on the part of Saddam Hussein illustrates clearly the unjustifiable and immoral character of his regime's actions and an absence of good will.

Again assuring you of my prayers for you, for your family, for our Troops and for the Allied Forces in the Persian Gulf as well as their families, and for a just and lasting peace for the region, I am

PILOT COLUMN, JANUARY 25, 1991

What a difference a week makes! Seven days ago I was struggling in my own mind with the options which then appeared to be open to our nation in the face of the United Nations' mandated date for Iraq's unconditional withdrawal from Kuwait.

Since then, we find ourselves at war as part of an allied effort to free Kuwait from its morally unjustifiable occupation and brutalization by Iraqi forces.

Our nation had an unprecedented review of options through the public debate in the Senate and Congress. It is difficult to imagine an idea that was not expressed in the soul searching of that highest legislative forum of the nation.

Given the responsibility that falls to the Chief Executive of a vibrant democracy like our own, President Bush made the decision on January 16 to use military force so that the goals of the United Nations might be fulfilled.

Subsequent actions on the part of the Iraqi leader corroborate the judgement of the President; Iraq's history of violence which includes an eight years' war against Iran, with devastating losses to both sides, the use of chemical weapons against its own Kurdish population, is repeated with the wanton occupation and brutalization of Kuwait, the apparent abuse of allied POWs in violation of the Geneva Conventions, and the inflammatory inciting of world-wide terrorism.

To this sad litany must be added the targeting of civilian populations in Tel Aviv, Riyadh and Dahrn. This in and of itself would be morally reprehensible. Since Israel, however, is not part of the allied military action against Iraq, this unprovoked attack on that nation is even more reprehensible. Iraq's cynical aim is apparently to draw Israel into combat and then to use this as a wedge between Arab and non-Arab nations in the Allied coalition.

While some of us had hoped that more time would have been given to allow Saddam Hussein to come to a change of heart, his subsequent actions would indicate that that was a vain hope, and that a further delay in the use of force could have played to his advantage.

One is forced to conclude that the Allies were faced with a regrettable dilemma: either to let this man continue to wreak his havoc unchecked or to defend the cause of justice with arms. Even as we echo the prayer of Pope Paul VI, "No more war, war never again", with heavy hearts we realize that such a prayer is not fulfilled at the price of granting tyrants and aggressors an open field to achieve unjust ends.

So we pray. We pray for our men and women in uniform, and we pray for all those, on both sides, caught in the fury of battle. We pray for a quick end to armed hostilities. We pray for our President. We pray that Saddam Hussein's efforts to

divide the world into Arab and non-Arab will not succeed. We pray that the Middle East might become the peaceful home of Muslims, Jews and Christians with the rights and just aspirations of all peoples and nations recognized. We pray that the apparently careful effort of the allied forces to spare civilian population centers will not waver in the face of Iraq's morally reprehensible missile attacks on civilian targets in Tel Aviv and elsewhere.

Tuesday I was in Washington, D.C. to pray and march with thousands of persons in support of the right to life of the unborn. Before this day is over, tiny babies will have been put to death through abortion in this nation. This is a violent world. As we rightfully score Saddam Hussein for the way in which he has violated the right to life of thousands upon thousands, we must also acknowledge the awful way in which we have become caught in the web of violence through abortion.

Our prayer, then, extends beyond the war in the Persian Gulf to the violence of abortion and whatever other violence there is which fails to recognize that every human person, from the first moment of conception to the moment of natural death bears the image of God.

Lord, help us to live your peace, your love.
