PRESIDENT BUSH ARRIVES AT GOVERNMENT HOUSE

HAMILTON, BERMUDA

SATURDAY, MARCH 16, 1991

No news. Little color. No spleen.

President Bush arrived by helicopter on the grounds of the Government House under cloudy skies and high winds. The President took a one-minute motorcade ride to the sidewalk leading to the Government House, where he was met by Prime Minister John Major. Both men wore business suits.

The President greeted Major with "How's the weary traveler? Good to see you, Sir." The two then began a two-minute walk up to the Government House. "Are you wiped out?" Bush asked Major as they strolled up the sidewalk.

The two stopped in front of the Government House for a photo with Sir Desmond Langley, the Governor General, and Premier John Swan, and then walked to the side of the house where Bush was greeted by a 15-member Honor Guard clad in black and red uniforms.

Inside the Government House, Bush and Major began their one-on-one meeting. There was a fire in the fireplace. The two chatted during the photo opportunity. "It must be a relief, Sir, for you to have them back home," Major told Bush. Bush asked Major, "Have some of yours come back yet?" "Lots of them have gone back to Scotland or Germany," replied Major.

The President indicated he would not take questions, but when asked whether a meeting in Bermuda with the British Prime Minister would become a regular event, he said, "I don't know about for Bermuda, but it's going to be a frequent thing in my meeting with Prime Minister Major. It's very, very important to the U.S. side, very, very fruitful. We love the setting, but we have to see if the Governor General and the Prime Minister approve and have us back again."

Addendum to last night's Pool Report #11: While he was dining at the Four Ways Restaurant Friday night, others in the restaurant politely allowed the President to eat his dinner in peace. Just before he finished, the piano player struck up "America the Beautiful." Bush then worked the crowd and shook hands in the restaurant to the applause of patrons. He signed a guest book and shook hands with the chef before departing.

TREE PLANTING AND DEPARTURE

No spleen. Just plants.

Those who are botanically inclined will want to know that the trees President Bush and Prime Minister Major planted were Bermuda Palmettoes (*Sabal Bermudana*) as compared with the Sentry Palms (*Howea Fosteriana*) which Bush and Margaret Thatcher planted last year (about 24 feet up the hill from this year's planting site.)

The two showed up wearing dark blue overcoats, which they handed to aides as they picked up their shovels.

"We'll have no time for the press conference," Major said.
"They're more interested in this," Bush replied.

A few shovel-fulls later, the President declared "well, done deal," and rested from his labors. "Very healthy looking beast," Major said, apparently referring to his tree.

The two appeared for their departure at 2:17, walking down a flight of stairs to the motorcade, which took Bush off to the landing zone. As Bush arrived at the helicopter, a light drizzle began to fall on your long-suffering and damp pool. The departure was otherwise uneventful. Near as we know, Bush intends to spend the afternoon on the grounds.
