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'WAIT AND SEE' ON IRAQ
Bush Views Aiding Rebels As Potential Morass

President Bush's decision this week not to help the rebels in Iraq grows out of Bush's reluctance to broaden a U.S. military mission that his advisers have warned could become a messy and protracted occupation, according to administration officials.

Critics outside the government and some doubters at lower levels in the administration contend Bush's policy toward Iraq is a hope, not a policy, rooted in the belief that the Iraqi military will eventually turn against Saddam Hussein. They argue that Bush, by appearing to do little to stop Iraqi forces from massacring Kurdish and Shiite Muslim rebels as well as civilians, is undermining U.S. moral authority in the world and countenancing the deaths of many who had expected American support....

None of the President's top seven advisers have argued that a major effort be undertaken to aid the rebels, according to administration officials, although one official said Vice President Quayle "raised some concerns" about allowing Saddam to continue to use the force he has in suppressing the rebellions.

According to a senior official, Bush believes "Saddam will quash the rebellions and, after the dust settles, the Baath military establishment and other elites will blame him for not only the death and destruction for putting down the rebellion. They will emerge then and install a new leadership and will make the case it is time for new leaders and a new beginning."...

But this official expressed his doubts about such a scenario. "There might not be a coup," he said. "And then the outright civil war will turn into guerrilla wars."

SCHWARZKOPF FLAP RAISES LARGER ISSUE OVER ENDING THE WAR

Did President Bush halt the Gulf war too early, giving Saddam Hussein a chance to regroup and crush Iraqi rebels?...

As Iraqi resistance groups continue fighting heavily armed Republican Guard units loyal to Saddam, Schwarzkopf's remarks have raised an issue that may linger.

"I was surprised that the war ended so quickly," said Peter Rodman, a former NSC official for Bush and Reagan who left the White House last year. "A few months down the road, if Saddam has consolidated his power and starts looking good again, we will regret that we didn't do something more?"...

The Center for Security Policy, a conservative think tank, has urged Bush to renew offensive operations and "liberate Iraq," noting that "innumerable Iraqis are paying the price for yet another in a long series of Western miscalculations about Saddam Hussein's intentions and capabilities."...

With reports flooding in of the swath of bloody violence Saddam is carving through Iraq, Bush eventually may face criticism for standing aside -- particularly in light of his declarations that the U.S. never has intended to hurt the Iraqi people.

"It's a morally reprehensible and self-contradictory position," said Duke University historian Alex Roland.

Iraq, Hitting Hard, Reports Big Gains Against The Kurds

CAIRO -- Iraqi troops loyal to Saddam Hussein began a major attack Thursday on Kurdish rebels who have occupied a vital oil city in northern Iraq for about a week, diplomats in Cairo said.

Late Thursday night, the official Iraqi press said government forces had captured Kirkuk.... Baghdad TV showed film of an Iraqi official touring the city.

Earlier in the day, the Kurdish rebels said they were rushing arms to the city to confront an assault by as many as 150,000 Iraqi soldiers.

They also said food shortages had become a threat to their revolt, and they appealed to the West and the U.N. to send aid to the region and to let them use a half-dozen captured airplanes and helicopters to stiffen their resistance against the Iraqis.

As the Iraqis concentrated their firepower on the Kurdish revolt in the north, pro-Iranian Shiite Muslims who had risen in the south said they had retaken Karbala. But the Shiites said Iraqi helicopters were circling and dropping leaflets warning of an attack.

SADDAM TURNS BIG GUNS ON REBELS

Saddam Hussein, trying to regain control of rebellious pockets in his country, appeared to be massing heavy artillery in the effort, and a U.N. delegation reported that Iraq sought to destroy Kuwait during the 210 days it occupied its tiny neighbor.

Late Thursday, the Iraqi News Agency said government troops had crushed Kurdish rebels in Kirkuk and had retaken the town. There was no independent verification of the report.

A U.N. mission sent to assess humanitarian needs in Kuwait said Thursday that Iraq deliberately tried to "extinguish" the emirate during the seven-month occupation.

"There can be no doubt that a deliberate attempt was made to extinguish Kuwait, its national identity, the pride of its people in their history and achievements," said Undersecretary-General Martti Ahtisaari of Finland, who headed the mission.

BUSH INSIST ON DIPLOMACY AS SADDAM ATTACKS KURDS

The Bush administration refused to become involved in an Iraqi assault against the Kurdish resistance that could be the final arbiter of Saddam Hussein's rule....

Critics of Bush's policy charge that he repeatedly compared Saddam's invasion of Kuwait to Hitler's conquest of Poland to garner public support for a war against Iraq.

But in doing so, they say, he has failed to rescue Iraq from Saddam, as the allies prepared to march into Berlin to rescue a smoldering Germany from Hitler.

"This is not a peacetime assassination of a leader. This is war," said Frank Gaffney, a former Reagan national security aide.

"I think his decision to stop the war was a grave disappointment," he said.

BUSH MAY RELENT ON GUN CURB Reagan's Support Of 'Brady Bill' Seen Swaying President

President Bush Thursday indicated willingness to drop his opposition to a gun control bill now before Congress and negotiate a compromise after former President Reagan appealed for enactment of the legislation "without further delay."

Speaking at a ceremony at George Washington University marking the 10th anniversary of the attempt on his life by John Hinckley, Reagan said the legislation named for his former press secretary, James Brady, and establishing a seven-day waiting period for purchase of handguns is "just plain common sense."

"I am going to say it in clear, unmistakable language: I support the Brady Bill and I urge the Congress to enact it without further delay," Reagan said to a standing ovation from several hundred students and faculty....

The effect of Reagan's remarks were clearly felt in the Bush administration, and prompted officials to say they may be willing to drop opposition to the bill if Congress acts quickly on administration proposals to broaden use of the death penalty and impose harsher penalties for crimes involving guns.

"As a result of the Reagan endorsement, there is a strong inclination to accept a version of Brady in exchange for our crime bill," a senior White House official said....

"Any solution which addresses only the issue of dealership handgun sales while failing to address the wider problems dealt with by the President's comprehensive crime package would shortchange the American people," Attorney General Thornburgh said.

The White House took the former president's remarks as an occasion to indicate its willingness to reconsider the issue, and aides to Bush said he was interested in trading concessions on the handgun bill for congressional action on his anti-crime legislation....

But the administration avoided an outright endorsement. "We don't support the bill in its current form, but a lot may depend on what Congress does with the President's crime bill," White House spokesman Roman Popaduk said....

On hearing of Reagan's endorsement, an official of the NRA looked at the picture of the former President on his desk and said, "Don't do this to me."

ATWATER (Reuter) -- Lee Atwater died of complications from an inoperable brain tumor, the RNC announced. President Bush issued a statement mourning the death of his close political associate, who was 40. "Barbara and I lost a great friend in Lee Atwater," he said. "I valued Lee's counsel and abilities. The Republican Party will miss his energy, vision and leadership," the President added. "Barbara and I give our deepest condolences to Sally, the kids and Lee's parents. We share their grief." The RNC said the funeral would be held in Atwater's home town of Columbia, S.C.

SCHWARZKOPF APOLOGY (Riyadh/Reuter) -- Gen. Schwarzkopf said he apologized to President Bush for comments which suggested he disagreed with the decision to halt the war. "I apologized to the President," he told reporters in Riyadh. "I said I am extremely sorry that a poor choice of words on my part in any way would result in dishonor cast upon you.... I felt really terrible that my words were being used to cast aspersions upon the decisions made by the President or for that matter the military. The President found out that I felt terrible and being the great man he was he called me up to tell me: 'Forget it'," he added.

SOVIET GOVERNMENT/YELTSIN (Moscow/UPI) -- Russian Federation President Yeltsin called for a change of power in the Soviet Union and urged creation of a "coalition government of national conciliation" in his most direct challenge to President Gorbachev. In an address at an emergency session of the Russian Congress of People's Deputies, Yeltsin outlined a 10-point program for transferring power from the central government to the 15 Soviet republics clamoring for more autonomy or outright independence.

SOVIET TROOPS/MOSCOW (Moscow/AP) -- President Gorbachev removed troops from the streets of Moscow, fulfilling a promise following a mass rally in support of Boris Yeltsin.

WESTERN HOSTAGES/ARAB NEWS AGENCIES (Damascus/Reuter) -- Arab news agencies have launched a campaign for the release of American journalist Terry Anderson and a British reporter also held hostage in Lebanon. The International Committee for the Defense of Journalists, set up by Arab news agencies in London last week, published an appeal for the release of Anderson and John McCarthy.

MUTINY/USS RANGER (Manila/AP) -- The U.S. Navy ordered two sailors to stand trial for allegedly trying to sabotage a carrier in the gulf region to support Saddam Hussein's call for a Muslim holy war against the U.S. Airman Apprentice Abdul Shaheed, 22, of Saint George, S.C., and Seaman Apprentice James Moss, 21, of Marrego, LA, were accused of "urging disloyalty, mutiny, or refusal of duty" while aboard the USS Ranger in January, according to a statement issued at the U.S.-run Subic Bay naval base.

ANDREOTTI RESIGNATION (Rome/Reuter) -- Prime Minister Andreotti told Italy's Senate he was resigning as head of the country's 49th postwar government. Andreotti, 72, said he would go immediately to the Quirinale Palace to offer his resignation to President Cossiga.

CANADIAN PORK IMPORTS/HILLS (Reuter) -- The U.S. said it will challenge a U.S.-Canada trade panel's decision to restrict evidence in a dispute over Canadian pork imports into the U.S. U.S. Trade Representative Hills said in a statement announcing the challenge that "the Administration is strongly committed to protecting the integrity of the trade agreements we sign and to defending U.S. interests under those agreements." Hills acted after 20 senators complained to her about the panel's actions that led to a better deal for Canadian pork exporters and angered U.S. pork sellers.

ECONOMY (AP) -- The government said its chief economic forecasting gauge posted a big 1.1 percent increase in February, reversing course after eight months in which it had been flashing recession warnings. The Commerce Department said the gain in its Index of Leading Economic Indicators was the first since last June and the biggest one-month advance in almost three years.

*** **NEW HOME SALES** (UPI) -- Single-family new home sales surged 16.2 percent to 467,000 in February after falling a revised 12.6 percent in January, the Commerce Department reported. The monthly increase was the largest since March 1986, when sales rose 21 percent, and the first since November.

CHERRY BLOSSOMS/PRESIDENT AND MRS. BUSH (AP) -- President Bush and his wife Barbara took up an early morning stroll to view the city's famous cherry blossoms. "Think we're interfering with your morning walk?" Bush asked one startled couple also out walking under the cherry trees at the Tidal Basin. "What a time to walk," Mrs. Bush exclaimed as raindrops temporarily stopped falling from gray skies. The Bushes stopped and briefly greeted several people. One man congratulated Bush for his success in the war. Bush turned aside the news questions of reporters who accompanied him, saying he was just out to enjoy the trees. When one asked if he had any news on the internal rebellion in Iraq, he paused and gave a mystifying answer: "Seven," he said and then ducked into his limousine to head back to the White House. No one knew what he meant.

EASTER EGG ROLL/VICE PRESIDENT (UPI) -- Vice President and Mrs. Quayle will fill in for President Bush at the annual White House Eastern Egg Roll. This year's egg roll will have a number of special guests, including puppeteer Shari Lewis, members of the Dance Theater of Harlem, Young Dancers of the Washington Ballet, the National Symphony Orchestra Youth Quartet and the Ringling Brothers clowns.

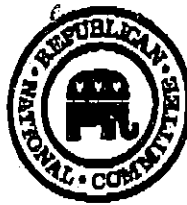

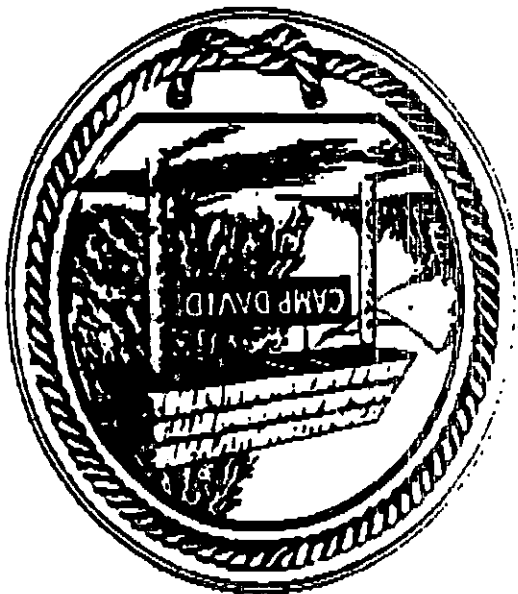

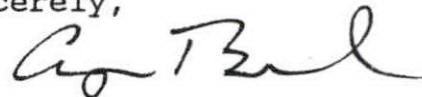

11:00 A.M. NEWS UPDATE

MOSCOW DEMONSTRATIONS (Moscow/AP) -- Mikhail Gorbachev ignored the Russian parliament's objections to his ban on rallies and sent troops and water cannons into city streets where pro-democracy activists promised a huge demonstration. The events threatened to develop into the most serious confrontation between reformers allied with Boris Yeltsin and hardline communist, military and KGB officials lining up behind Gorbachev.

(Moscow/UPI) -- Russian deputies voted to suspend a special session of the republic's legislature to protest the central government's ban on demonstrations and a massive troop presence in central Moscow to quash dissent.

KURDISH REBELS/FOOD (Zakho/AP) -- Kurdish rebel leaders in northern Iraq are pleading for the U.S.-led allies to send food, saying they are more worried about starvation than the government's offensive against them. "The food situation is very serious. We will face starvation if we don't receive supplies within one month," said Jalal Talabani, who heads the Popular Union of Kurdistan rebel group.

KUWAITI GOON SQUADS (Kuwait City/Reuter) -- Kuwait's crown prince threatened to hang young members of the ruling al-Sabah family if they continued to run "goon squads" harassing Palestinians and others, an unidentified Western diplomatic source said.

IRAQI COLUMNIST/SADDAM (Nicosia/Reuter) -- A top Iraqi columnist mounted an unprecedented attack on President Saddam's government, accusing it of black marketeering after its defeat in the war. Mohammed al-Jazaeiri of the ruling Baath Party newspaper al-Thawra said Iraqis could not even afford to buy basic food because of a thriving black market encouraged by the government. "It is not logical that greedy and arbitrary rules of free commerce still apply to our internal market. Some official quarters are selling...with growing recklessness in foreign currencies as if to encourage the black market," he wrote.

CHINESE PRISONERS (Beijing/UPI) -- Premier Li Peng rebuffed a call by two U.S. lawmakers for the release of political prisoners and criticized the U.S. for its "carrot and stick" approach to human rights, the visiting representatives -- Reps. Wolf of Virginia and Smith of New Jersey -- said. Li accepted their letter but told the two that China's leaders "are not in a position to make decisions regarding the judiciary," Wolf told reporters.

BANGLADESH AID/U.S. (Dhaka/Reuter) -- The U.S. has assured Bangladesh's new prime minister, Begum Zia, of continued development assistance, the first such pledge from overseas since she took office last week, the official BSS news agency said.

PERSONAL INCOME (UPI) -- U.S. personal income rose 0.2 percent -- or \$11.6 billion -- in February to an annual rate of \$4.74 trillion, the Commerce Department reported. Spending on automobiles and services pushed consumer spending up 0.6 percent in the month, the largest monthly gain since a 0.8 percent rise in September, the department said.

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11:30 A.M. NEWS UPDATE

ATWATER (Reuter) -- Lee Atwater died of complications from an inoperable brain tumor, the RNC announced. President Bush issued a statement mourning the death of his close political associate, who was 40. "Barbara and I lost a great friend in Lee Atwater," he said. "I valued Lee's counsel and abilities. The Republican Party will miss his energy, vision and leadership," the President added. "Barbara and I give our deepest condolences to Sally, the kids and Lee's parents. We share their grief." The RNC said the funeral would be held in Atwater's home town of Columbia, S.C.

SCHWARZKOPF APOLOGY (Riyadh/Reuter) -- Gen. Schwarzkopf said he apologized to President Bush for comments which suggested he disagreed with the decision to halt the war. "I apologized to the President," he told reporters in Riyadh. "I said I am extremely sorry that a poor choice of words on my part in any way would result in dishonor cast upon you.... I felt really terrible that my words were being used to cast aspersions upon the decisions made by the President or for that matter the military. The President found out that I felt terrible and being the great man he was he called me up to tell me: 'Forget it'," he added.

SOVIET GOVERNMENT/YELTSIN (Moscow/UPI) -- Russian Federation President Yeltsin called for a change of power in the Soviet Union and urged creation of a "coalition government of national conciliation" in his most direct challenge to President Gorbachev. In an address at an emergency session of the Russian Congress of People's Deputies, Yeltsin outlined a 10-point program for transferring power from the central government to the 15 Soviet republics clamoring for more autonomy or outright independence.

SOVIET TROOPS/MOSCOW (Moscow/AP) -- President Gorbachev removed troops from the streets of Moscow, fulfilling a promise following a mass rally in support of Boris Yeltsin.

WESTERN HOSTAGES/ARAB NEWS AGENCIES (Damascus/Reuter) -- Arab news agencies have launched a campaign for the release of American journalist Terry Anderson and a British reporter also held hostage in Lebanon. The International Committee for the Defense of Journalists, set up by Arab news agencies in London last week, published an appeal for the release of Anderson and John McCarthy.

MUTINY/USS RANGER (Manila/AP) -- The U.S. Navy ordered two sailors to stand trial for allegedly trying to sabotage a carrier in the gulf region to support Saddam Hussein's call for a Muslim holy war against the U.S. Airman Apprentice Abdul Shaheed, 22, of Saint George, S.C., and Seaman Apprentice James Moss, 21, of Marrego, LA, were accused of "urging disloyalty, mutiny, or refusal of duty" while aboard the USS Ranger in January, according to a statement issued at the U.S.-run Subic Bay naval base.

ANDREOTTI RESIGNATION (Rome/Reuter) -- Prime Minister Andreotti told Italy's Senate he was resigning as head of the country's 49th postwar government. Andreotti, 72, said he would go immediately to the Quirinale Palace to offer his resignation to President Cossiga.

CANADIAN PORK IMPORTS/HILLS (Reuter) -- The U.S. said it will challenge a U.S.-Canada trade panel's decision to restrict evidence in a dispute over Canadian pork imports into the U.S. U.S. Trade Representative Hills said in a statement announcing the challenge that "the Administration is strongly committed to protecting the integrity of the trade agreements we sign and to defending U.S. interests under those agreements." Hills acted after 20 senators complained to her about the panel's actions that led to a better deal for Canadian pork exporters and angered U.S. pork sellers.

ECONOMY (AP) -- The government said its chief economic forecasting gauge posted a big 1.1 percent increase in February, reversing course after eight months in which it had been flashing recession warnings. The Commerce Department said the gain in its Index of Leading Economic Indicators was the first since last June and the biggest one-month advance in almost three years.

NEW HOME SALES (UPI) -- Single-family new home sales surged 16.2 percent to 467,000 in February after falling a revised 12.6 percent in January, the Commerce Department reported. The monthly increase was the largest since March 1986, when sales rose 21 percent, and the first since November.

CHERRY BLOSSOMS/PRESIDENT AND MRS. BUSH (AP) -- President Bush and his wife Barbara took up an early morning stroll to view the city's famous cherry blossoms. "Think we're interfering with your morning walk?" Bush asked one startled couple also out walking under the cherry trees at the Tidal Basin. "What a time to walk," Mrs. Bush exclaimed as raindrops temporarily stopped falling from gray skies. The Bushes stopped and briefly greeted several people. One man congratulated Bush for his success in the war. Bush turned aside the news questions of reporters who accompanied him, saying he was just out to enjoy the trees. When one asked if he had any news on the internal rebellion in Iraq, he paused and gave a mystifying answer: "Seven," he said and then ducked into his limousine to head back to the White House. No one knew what he meant.
