Dear Mr. Kennedy:

I read with distress your comments reported in the attached clip from our News Summary.

I can categorically assure you that I never was in Paris as claimed by the rumormongers. I can also categorically assure you that I have no information direct or indirect of any contact with Iranians relating to this hostage question.

I am disappointed that you would feel I might have been a participant in a scheme to keep any American held hostage. I emphatically deny any such complicity.

One of the sad things about public life is you have to suffer attacks on your character, on your honor.

I can readily understand your concern when allegations are made like those made by Mr. Sick. A proposition so fundamentally immoral would certainly concern anyone. Please accept my word that I know nothing about anyone else's involvement in such an insidious plot, and I know for a fact that I had no contact such as those being alleged by Mr. Sick.

I wish you all the best and I hope this has laid to rest some of your understandable concerns.

EX-IRANIAN HOSTAGE SAYS BUSH DENIAL OF DEAL DOESN'T CONVINCE HIM

FORT LAUDERDALE -- One former Iranian hostage said Wednesday that President Bush's "very limp denial" left him more convinced than ever that the presidential campaign of Ronald Reagan enticed Iranian officials to continue holding the hostages until after the 1980 election....

Moorhead Kennedy...said Bush's denial emphasized only that Bush personally was not involved, but left open the question of whether the deal took place. "If there was nothing to this story," Kennedy said, "the President would have said, 'Number one, there is nothing to this story. Number two, we have investigated our archives and files and found nothing to support such a story. And number three, we welcome a full investigation.'" Kennedy spoke from New York City, where he is a Republican Party deputy district leader.

OUTLOOK ON OVERHAULING FOREIGN AID: LITTLE CHANCE

President Bush's request for an overhaul of the foreign aid program that would override congressional restrictions on aid disbursements appears to have little chance of passage on Capitol Hill, according to Administration and congressional sources....

Administration officials say the ideas emanating from Capitol Hill would produce legislation worse than the existing law; congressional sources reply that what Bush really wants is what one called "unfettered discretion to tilt foreign aid more and more toward military rather than development assistance without any checks from Congress." For that reason, the sources said, Congress clearly intends to rebuff Bush's request, formally submitted last month, that it surrender much of its power to "earmark" aid.

CHINA LASHES OUT AT U.S. PRESSURE ON HUMAN RIGHTS

BEIJING -- China lashed out at the U.S. Thursday for exerting pressure over human rights, saying nothing could change China's policies -- not even the threat of losing trade privileges worth billions of dollars. A visibly angered Foreign Ministry spokesman, Wu Jianmin, told a news briefing that attempts in Washington to link extension of China's MFN status to its human rights record would not work.... "We do not want to see the deterioration of Sino-U.S. relations but this does not depend entirely on China," he said. "If such a situation does occur it is nothing to be afraid of. China is prepared for it."

In addition, the Vietnamese government has agreed to offer translators and access to government records, a Kerry spokesman said.

Iran Denies Hostage Deal With Reagan

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) - The Iranian diplomat who negotiated the release of American hostages in Tehran denies that Iran delayed the release to help the candidacy of Ronald Reagan in 1980, Iran's official news agency reported Saturday.

Behzad Nabavi was quoted by the Islamic Republic News Agency as saying that Iran had tried but failed to resolve the matter before the presidential election in which Reagan defeated the incumbent, Jimmy Carter.

Nabavi said that negotiations bogged down a month before the election, because of fears on the U.S. side that Iran's conditions for the release would become a campaign issue.

Gary Sick, who was on the staff of Carter's National Security Council, charged in an April 15 column in the New York Times that Reagan campaign staffers made a deal with the Iranians to hold up the hostages' release until after the election.

Sick said the Reagan people agreed to arrange arms shipments from Israel to Iran in return for the delay. Arms supplies were critical to Iran during its 1980-88 war with Iraq.

All those involved in the Reagan campaign, including President Bush, have denied any effort was made to delay the hostages' release.

The hostages were taken in November 1979 after followers of Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini stormed the U.S. Embassy in Tehran. Concern over their plight dominated the rest of Carter's presidency. Some were released in the early days of the crisis, but most were not released until the day Reagan took office on Jan. 20, 1981.

The United States released some Iranian assets in return.

Nabavi, who headed the Iranian negotiating commission, was quoted as saying that Iran had made no attempt to help either Carter or Reagan.

He said Iran wanted to free the hostages in October after the Majlis, Iran's parliament, set a series of conditions. He said the U.S. election delayed the release because Iran's proposals were "not dealt with effectively" by the American side out of fear they would become an election issue.

"We were after mechanisms so that we would be able to get financial guarantees from the U.S. before the release of the spies (the hostages) and our proposal led to a month-long halt in negotiations," Nabavi was quoted as saying.

Sick claimed the deal to delay the release was arranged in meetings between William Casey, then Reagan's campaign manager and later director of the Central Intelligence Agency, and leading Iranian clerics, including Mehdi Karrubi, now speaker of the Majlis.

Nabavi told IRNA that "Mr. Karrubi played no role in the negotiations."

IRANIAN DENIES TEHRAN OFFICIAL INVOLVED IN U.S. HOSTAGE DEAL
NICOSIA, April 27, Reuter - An Iranian who played a key role in the release of 52 U.S. hostages denied reports that a senior Tehran official struck a deal with Ronald Reagan's election campaign manager to delay their freedom.

Former White House aide Gary Sick said he had learned a secret deal was discussed during two 1980 meetings in Madrid between William Casey, who headed Reagan's re-election campaign, and Mehdi Karrubi, a cleric representing Iranian leader Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini.

"Mr Karrubi played no part in the negotiations," Behzad Nabavi, a former Iranian deputy prime minister involved in Algiers accord on the hostages, told the national Iranian news agency IRNA.

Iran released the hostages it held for 444 days on January 20, 1981, the day Reagan was inaugurated as president in succession to Jimmy Carter.

Sick was a member of Carter's administration and on the staff of the National Security Council from August 1976 to 1981.

Sick, who negotiated the release of the hostages, made the remarks in an article published in the New York Times on April 15.

IRNA on Saturday quoted Nabavi as saying: "Whether Carter would have won the presidential election if the issue of the American hostages had been settled is not clear.

"But my personal impression is that Carter preferred them to be released before the presidential elections because he was thinking that it would affect his votes."

Karrubi is now the speaker of the Iranian parliament. Casey became the director of the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency and died in 1987.

As you know, the press has revived the old Richard Brenneke story that when you were a candidate for Vice President in 1980, you allegedly flew to Paris between October 17, 1980 and October 20, 1980, to negotiate a delay in the release of the American hostages in Iran. Please find attached (1) a summary of your whereabouts for those dates (Tab A); and (2) the Secret Service logs on which the summary is based (Tabs B, C, D, and E). A similar summary for October 15 and 16, 1980, will follow as soon as the records are retrieved from Secret Service archives. As you can see, it is plain that you did not fly to Paris during that time, nor did you meet with any representatives of the Iranian government.

The logs have been redacted by the Secret Service. Ron vonLembke of my staff has reviewed unredacted copies of the logs, and can attest that there are no gaps in Secret Service coverage for the period in question.

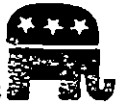

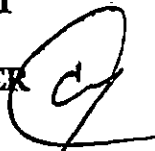

MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRESIDENT

FROM: CLAYTON YEUTTER 

First, thanks to both you and Barbara for making two appearances this week with the Republican Eagles. They really enjoyed what you had to say. Their mood was upbeat, we gave them a first rate program, and their rapport with each other was very good. We're going to try to give that program a shot in the arm in a number of ways so that we boost the retention rate. There has been too much attrition to suit me. It should be easier to retain major donors than attract new ones.

On that same front, I had a conversation today with Skip Hove, my fellow Nebraskan who is Vice Chairman of the FDIC. Skip feels that real estate values are now leveling off in the South and Southwest, though not yet in some areas of the East and Northeast. He sees this as encouraging since he believes most (though not all) of the credit crunch is real estate related. Skip agrees with me that by far the healthiest sector of the U.S. economy today is the Midwest.

Thanks for having a conversation with Dick Thornburgh on the Pennsylvania Senate situation. His prospective opponent is credible but by no means outstanding, so Dick should be able to hold that seat easily if he runs. But he'll irritate people in Pennsylvania if he delays too long and appears indecisive. Should Dick not run; the nod may well go to Congressman Tom Ridge even though his name identification is the lowest of the potential Republican candidates.

Our friends in Louisiana are still working hard to avoid having a state convention which would likely endorse someone other than Governor Roemer. And they're still trying to persuade Clyde Holloway to drop out of the gubernatorial race and

concentrate on winning re-election to the Congress. Both endeavors are still below 50-50 in probability, but not impossible. Former Governor Dave Treen has been devoting a lot of time to this, and a note thanking him would be very appropriate.

Dan Cook, another fellow Cornhusker who is Goldman Sachs' top man in Dallas, has just taken on a big fundraising obligation for us. He has been attempting to raise \$1.5 million for our redistricting battles. That would be worth a 10 minute motivational stop in the Oval Office sometime if you can spare it.

Tom Pauken did lead the race for the Congressional contest in Dallas, with Sam Johnson, a state legislator, joining him in the runoff. Pauken took some flak for publicly criticizing you on domestic spending, but he responded by saying that critics failed to appreciate the context of his remarks and that he was really a big fan of George Bush. He would appear to have some unguided missile characteristics!

My impression is that Boyden Gray and his staff did a fine job on the travel controversy, though it is too early to tell whether that will extend the story or cause it to wind down. My guess is the latter because the press is now relegated to working the details, and the American public is not much interested in those.

There are a couple of lessons to be learned from this experience. One is that it almost never pays to be dilatory in providing the facts in such situations. That simply generates suspicion of wrongdoing, and fosters conjecture and innuendo which keep the story alive. It would have been better to have gotten the facts out more quickly in this case, but what has now been done seems responsive.

The second lesson is that one has to be scrupulously careful about travel because it is such a political lightning rod. Perceptions count for more than reality in this area, and we sometimes learn that the hard way.

I took the political pulse of some of our top Republican chairmen, committeemen, and committeewomen this past week and found them optimistic. All said the travel allegations were a negative, though not nearly as big a story as here in D.C. All were more concerned about your health, and about the political impact of that incident on the Vice President. They are very supportive of the Vice President but concerned that he may now be battered even more in the press. Fortunately, that pendulum seems to be swinging a bit to the Vice President's side in recent days. It has required remarkable restraint on his part over the past couple of years not to strike out against the press, but that will pay political dividends for him in years to come. People respect a class act, and the Vice President has been just that.

Finally, I hope you'll ease your schedule a bit. The American people want you strong and healthy for the long pull.

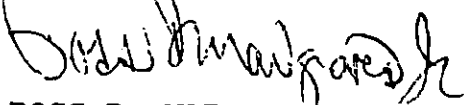

BUT IN A DEPARTURE FROM THE SENTIMENTS EXPRESSED BY HIS COLLEAGUES, DANIEL SAID INSTANCES OF OVERKILL STILL CROP UP AS CERTAIN GROUPS OF REGULATORS MOVE ABOUT THE COUNTRY.

Academic Heraldry

The history of academic dress reaches far back into the early days of the oldest universities. A statute of 1321 in England required that all "Doctors, Licentiates, and Bachelors" of the University of Coimbra wear gowns. Gowns may have been counted necessary for warmth in the unheated buildings frequented by medieval scholars. Hoods seem to have served to cover the tonsured head until superseded for that purpose by the skull cap. However, representatives of various American colleges and universities adopted a system of academic apparel following a conference at Columbia University in 1895. In 1902 the Regents of the State of New York gave a charter to an organization named the Intercollegiate Bureau of Academic Costume to serve as a source of information and guidance in such matters. In 1932 the American Council on Education authorized the appointment of a committee to approve a code for academic costumes that has been in effect since that year.

Gowns to be used in the colleges and universities have the following characteristics. The gown for the bachelor's degree has pointed sleeves and is designed to be worn closed. The gown for the master's degree has an oblong sleeve and is open at the wrist. The sleeve base hangs down in the traditional manner. The rear part of its oblong shape is square cut, and the front part has an arc cut away. The gown is so designed and supplied with fasteners that it may be worn open or closed. The gown for the doctor's degree has bell-shaped sleeves. It is so designed and supplied with fasteners that it may be worn open or closed.

There are no trimmings for the bachelor's or master's degrees. For the doctor's degree, the gown to be faced down the front with black velvet with three bars of the same across the sleeves; or these facings and crossbars may be of velvet of the color distinctive of the subject to which the degree pertains.

For all academic purposes, the colors associated with the different subjects include some of the following:

Honorary degrees are awarded by colleges and universities in recognition of scholarly or creative attainments or distinguished public service. Since 1860 most honorary degrees have taken the form of doctorates. Presidents, governors and leaders of the judiciary are often honored as well as educators, clergymen and university trustees. Recognition is also accorded authors, artists and leaders in mass communication. Honorary doctorates usually awarded are: doctor of laws, doctor of humane letters, doctor of divinity, doctor of science, doctor of literature, doctor of letters, and doctor of music.

The Commencement Speaker and Honorary Degree Recipient (Doctor of Laws)

**GEORGE HERBERT WALKER BUSH
President of the United States**

On January 20, 1989, George Herbert Walker Bush was sworn in as the Forty-First President of the United States. His distinguished military career, his educational background, and his prior political experience signaled his preparedness for this high office.

At the age of eighteen, Mr. Bush had the distinction of being the youngest pilot in the United States Navy at the time of his enlistment in 1942. While on active duty in the Pacific Theatre during World War II (1942-1945), he received the Distinguished Flying Cross and three Air Medals.

In 1948, Mr. Bush graduated Phi Beta Kappa, with a degree in economics from Yale University. During the years following graduation, he moved to Texas where he worked as a supply salesman and, in 1951, co-founded Bush-Overby Oil Development Company. In 1953, he co-founded Zapata Petroleum Corporation. One year later, he became co-founder and president of Zapata Off-Shore Company, which pioneered in experimental offshore drilling equipment.

Mr. Bush's political career began with his election in 1966 to the United States House of Representatives, where he served two terms. He also served as the United States Ambassador to the United Nations from 1971-1973, and as Chairman of the Republican National Committee from January 1973 to September 1974. Other political positions held by Mr. Bush include Director of Central Intelligence from 1976-1977, and Vice President of the United States under former President Ronald Reagan, from 1981-1989.

President Bush is married to the former Barbara Pierce, and they are the parents of five children: George, Jeb, Neil, Marvin, and Dorothy Bush LeBlond.

Honorary Degree Recipient ATTORNEY FRANKIE MUSE FREEMAN Doctor of Humane Letters

Attorney Frankie M. Freeman is a 1937 graduate of Hampton University. She is also a graduate of Howard University where she received the Juris Doctor degree.

During her career Mrs. Freeman was admitted to practice law before courts in Missouri, The District of Columbia, and the Supreme Court of the United States. Her wide range of legal experiences includes a senior partnership with Freeman, Whitfield, Montgomery, Staples and White Law Firm, St. Louis, Missouri; and Assistant Attorney General of Missouri from 1955-1956. In 1979, President Jimmy Carter appointed her the first Inspector General of the Community Services Administration, a position she held until 1981. She was also the first woman to serve on the United States Commission on Civil Rights. Initially appointed by President Lyndon B. Johnson, she served on the Commission for sixteen years under subsequent Presidents Nixon, Ford, and Carter.

Attorney Freeman's other professional experiences include teaching business law at Associated Colleges of Upper New York (now College Center of the Fingerlakes), serving as an adjunct Assistant Professor of Justice for the University of Missouri, and as past National President of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority.

Among her awards and recognitions are the Outstanding Citizen Award from the St. Louis Argus in 1964, the Woman of Achievement Award from the *St. Louis Globe-Democrat* in 1965, the Certificate for Distinguished Service from Links Incorporated in 1973, and the first annual Edna Gelhorn Award from the St. Louis Chapter of the Women's Political Caucus and the National Organization of Women. She was also awarded the Centennial Medallion in recognition of her distinguished career and the Distinguished Alumnus-At-Large award from Hampton University.

Mrs. Freeman is the wife of Shelby T. Freeman, Jr. and the mother of one daughter, Shelbe Patricia Bullock.

Alumni Awards PATRICIA STEVENS FUNDERBURK Outstanding Twenty-Year Award

Ms. Patricia Stevens Funderburk is a 1971 graduate of Hampton University where she received the Bachelor of Arts degree in Speech and Drama. She received the Master of Fine Arts degree with a concentration in acting from Catholic University. She has also studied at the University of Southern California where she is a candidate for the Doctorate of Public Administration degree.

Currently, Ms. Funderburk serves as Director of the Office of Adolescent Pregnancy Programs, a George Bush presidential appointment in the United States Department of Health and Human Services.

Other positions held by Ms. Funderburk include Acting Executive Director of the Southeast Raleigh Community Development Corporation, Director of the Community Economic Development Program, Minority Affairs Director of the North Carolina State Arts Council, and Research Analyst for the Federal Aviation Administration.

Ms. Funderburk had the distinction of being the first African-American to tour with the National Players Classical Acting Company, the country's oldest touring company as it travelled throughout the United States and fifteen foreign countries, including Guam, Germany and China. She was also selected as the first statewide actress-in-residence for the North Carolina public schools. Ms. Funderburk appeared in the Academy Award nominated film "Mississippi Burning", in which a cameo role was written exclusively for her. She has also appeared in numerous industrial films and television commercials.

Ms. Funderburk's service as a volunteer is extensive. She serves on boards of local, state and national organizations for educational, cultural, entrepreneurial, political, and religious activities. She is also an active and supportive member of the Raleigh Chapter of the National Hampton Alumni Association, Inc., and is the recipient of many awards and honors.

Ms. Funderburk is the proud mother of a seventeen year old daughter, Eboni.

ATTORNEY GRANT REYNOLDS Outstanding Alumnus-At-Large Award

Attorney Grant Reynolds attended Hampton Institute, earned his baccalaureate degree at Fenn College, his Bachelor of Divinity degree at Eden Seminary, and his Juris Doctor degree at Columbia University Law School. He subsequently enjoyed extraordinary careers as a minister, civil rights activist, lawyer, and Deputy Administrator for a federal agency.

From 1938 to the end of World War I, he served as pastor of the Mt. Zion Congregational Church in Cleveland, Ohio and as Chaplain in the United States Army where he was instrumental in helping to effect the abolition of segregation in the nation's Armed Forces. In 1947, he assisted in the integration of churches under the jurisdiction of Episcopal Bishop Scarlett of the Diocese of Missouri.

Following the successful private practice of law, during which time he was admitted to practice before the United States Supreme Court, Attorney Reynolds, in 1970, was appointed Assistant Regional Administrator (Region II) of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, with headquarters in New York City. In 1972, he was promoted to the position of Deputy Regional Administrator with jurisdiction and responsibilities covering the states of New York and New Jersey, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, and the territory of the Virgin Islands.

Attorney Reynolds has also been a leader and active participant in numerous service organizations, including the Boy Scouts of America, the Northside Center for Child Development, the Westchester County Young Women's Christian Association, and Omega Psi Phi Fraternity. A loyal Hamptonian, Attorney Reynolds recently established a sizable trust with Hampton University as a residual beneficiary. The trust, designated the "Emma Reynolds Scholarship Fund", is named in honor of his mother.

Attorney Reynolds is retired and resides with his wife Lillie in White Plains, New York and in Lauderhill, Florida.

Historical Sketch

When the Hampton Normal and Agricultural Institute opened its doors in April 1868, in the days of Reconstruction, listed as assets were two teachers, fifteen students, little money or equipment, and the faith in its principle of "learning by doing" and "education for life."

The principal was Samuel Chapman Armstrong, a 29-year-old Brevet Brigadier General, son of missionary parents. He had been assigned by the Freedmen's Bureau to help solve the problems of the thousands of former slaves who had gathered behind Union lines on the Virginia peninsula. He founded, with the aid of the American Missionary Association, a school at Hampton to train selected young men and women "who should go out and teach and lead their people, first by example, and in his way to build up an industrial system for the sake not only of self-support and intelligent labor, but also for the sake of character."

Hampton may well be thankful that in the concept of "Education for Life" – including efficiency, character, and usefulness to society – General Armstrong established a standard timeless in its appeal and application. Hampton today finds this concept highly adaptable to the changing conditions of life in this century and the likely challenges of the twenty-first century.

The first conditions for admission were simple: "Sound health, good character, age not less than fourteen years and not more than twenty-five, ability to read and write intelligibly, knowledge of arithmetic through long division, intention to remain throughout the whole course of three years and to become a teacher."

Support in the early days came from philanthropic and religious groups and individuals, from Federal Land-Grant Funds (1872-1920), and numerous other sources. With the help of the Freedmen's Bureau and northern philanthropists, the school was able to erect a classroom building – the Academy, since rebuilt – in 1871. Residence Quarters, however, continued to be a problem, with the men living in army tents for three years and the women living in barracks until the completion of Virginia Hall. Some of the money for this building was raised by the *Hampton Singers*, who toured northern communities.

In 1878, a group of Indians was sent to Hampton to be educated with the help of federal funds. These appropriations were continued until 1912. The Indians continued to attend Hampton until 1923, when Indian schools became more numerous and were equipped well enough for Hampton to discontinue its successful contribution to Indian education.

After his death in 1893, General Armstrong's work was continued and expanded for nearly a quarter-century under the leadership of the late Reverend Hollis B. Frissell. Courses leading to the bachelor's degree were first offered in 1922. Courses at the elementary and secondary level were dropped gradually, and all resources of the institution were applied to education at the college level. Accreditation as a Class "A" College was achieved during the 1932-33 academic year.

In line with its broadening educational program, the college inaugurated graduate courses in 1928. Course work leading to the Master of Arts degree in education was offered during summer school sessions only. Although discontinued in 1949, graduate study was reactivated in 1956, and for the first time was offered during the regular year as well as during summer school. A Division of Graduate Studies was organized in 1956 as the administrative unit to replace the former Division of Summer Extension Study. Then, in October 1967, following a visitation by representatives of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, a new all-institution faculty committee, the Graduate Council, was organized. A Master of Arts in Nursing was added in 1976 and Communication Disorders in 1977. The degree of Master of Science in Biology, Communication Disorders and Nursing was approved for the 1978-79 academic year. The Master of Science in Management and the Master of Business Administration were approved for the 1982-83 academic year. Other majors have since been added.

From humble origins, Hampton University has evolved into a prestigious, nationally acclaimed university that sets *The Standard of Excellence* in education.
