STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT

May 14, 1991

Good morning. I am pleased today to nominate Robert Gates to be Director of the Central Intelligence Agency. As most of you know, Bob Gates has served as Deputy National Security Adviser for the last two-and-one-half years. Before that, he had dedicated more than 20 years to the service of the Central Intelligence Agency and the important tasks it performs for our country. It is with this background of professionalism, dedication, and integrity that I am asking the Senate to approve his nomination to be the next Director of Central Intelligence.

He follows in the distinguished footsteps of Bill Webster. I know that Bob will maintain a strong and responsive Central Intelligence Agency that will provide the kind of intelligence America needs to maintain its role as leader of the Free World.

In the last two and one-half years Bob Gates has lent a steady hand to the deliberations of our National Security Council. He has directed the Deputies Committee, a group of inter-agency leaders who, in time of crisis, have met continuously to provide the basic decisions and recommendations that have protected America's security interests. In Panama, Liberia, Operation Desert Storm and a host of other areas, Bob Gates has performed with wisdom and precision in laying out the options for Presidential action.

I know that he will bring these same qualities of insight and judgment to his leadership of the Central Intelligence Agency. I look forward to working with him in the months ahead.

Hurting small and struggling businesses -- The impact of H.R. 5 would fall particularly hard on small and struggling businesses, many of which lack the resources to withstand a production shutdown. Similarly, firms facing a tight labor market, requiring highly skilled workers, or operating in remote areas, would be at the mercy of union demands.

Hiring Permanent Replacements Is Not a Widespread Practice -- No data support such a fundamental change in our nation's labor policy. A 1991 GAO report, prepared at the request of the bill's principal sponsors, found that only three to four percent of strikers are permanently replaced. And those figures do not take into account strikers who are reinstated after the conclusion of the strike.

Finally, controversy surrounding individual strikes -- such as the Eastern and Continental cases -- must not be generalized to support H.R. 5. Isolated cases are not, and should not be, a basis for changing the rules that will serve both sides in a labor-management dispute.

In sum, the Administration strongly opposes the enactment of H.R. 5, and, as I have said before, if this bill were presented to the President, his senior advisers would recommend a veto.

The Office of Management and Budget advises that there is no objection to the submission of this letter and that enactment of H.R. 5 would not be in accord with the program of the President.
