WALKER'S POINT REPORT

The President went boating and fishing at 10:00 this morning and plans to play golf about 3:00 - 3:30 this afternoon. The Pool for the golf outing should form at the Shawmut Inn at 2:30 p.m. The President's plans for this evening are indefinite.

The President got up early this morning, invigorated as always by the sea. He's relaxed and enjoying the weekend.

The President spoke with Secretary Baker this morning to discuss the status of the evacuation of Falasha Jews from Ethiopia. Approximately 85 percent of the Falashas have left Ethiopia and Israel expects to complete the evacuation today. The President is pleased that the process has worked so well and that the Falashas are at last able to return to the Jewish homeland.

We have a lid until 8:00 a.m. Monday morning, May 27, 1991.

POOL REPORT # 2

May 25, 1991

Bush at golf course defends Sununu, says rumors of his demotion are "ridiculous" and "malarkey" and says he can stay as chief of staff as long as he wants the job; expresses pride in Falashas release.

(Theres'a report in U. S. News that Bush is contemplating shifting Sununu to campaign staff or a White House post where he'd have to share power...you need to check yr desk for details)

Bush responds at length and White House is providing transcript.

Here's partial transcript:

Q: You shifting Sununu to campaign staff?

A: I'm not even thinking about campaigning right now.

Q: A possibility?

A: We haven't even thought about what's going to happen. It's too early. I want to postpone that as long as possible. Especially up here. Especially up here.

Q: Report says Sununu being demoted.

A. I hadn't heard any such report. That's pure malarkey, ridiculous and I don't know why somebody would write something like that. You know, one of the tough things about this job is kind of responding to wild rumors. This is such a thing and there's (?) no validity at all so thanks for letting me straighten it out. If there is such (a report), I hadn't even heard it, so

q: lateral move for Sununu?

a:I'm very happy with what he's doing. He's doing a first class job...He's doing a great job on every job that he works on and I have full confidence in him so I don't know where some rumor of that nature would get started.

q:plan to keep on as Chief of Staff?

A: I plan to keep him on as chief of staff as long as he wants to be there.

q: Falashas

A: Let me just say how really pleased I am about the Falashas coming out, the Ethiopian Jews going in, back to Israel. this is an emotional time . it is a wonderful thing that's happened . I'm proud that the United States had a role in it and I personally am emotionally moved by it, having had some role in the first exit of the Falashas from the sudan. But this is, this is a wonderful ...It was a wonderful thing. I had two calls today from American Jewish leaders, leaders of the Jewish community in America and both just very touched by what s happened so its a marvelous thing. I was told by one of them that in the exodus 10 babies were born in the planes...that's something. So, this was a wonderful, wonderful thing.

q: asked Shamir not to settle them in occupied territories?

a: I talked to him yesterday. As a matter of fact, Shamir called me.....What he was calling about, was the role in the falashas and i told him we weren't going to give up on this peace process and he said he hoped we wouldn't and that we must stay involved and we will.

ADDENDUM TO POOL REPORT #2

May 25, 1991

Bush is NOT going out tonight, he said.

Now for Golf and etc. from earlier:

Bush and his partner won the round, the president said. "We win. Victory."

Pressed for the numbers, the president seeming a little tired and voice slightly raspy, declared that the final scores "weren't worth reporting."

It was a leisurely 18 holes, done in about 2 1/2 hours, nowhere near Bush record.

Some poor shots on first hole but "I'm not blaming the thyroid."

He birdies the Par 3, 154-yard third hole and reports, "I haven't had one (birdie) since my thyroid. That was the first one." (N.B. This was the first time he played golf at all since he got sick.)

(A birdie is one under par.)

Early on Bush said at Hole 1: "Remember, we've got new ground rules for the golf. No discussion of issues or important matters like that while at the golf links." He later disregarded this statement entirely.

Asked why he was being so secretive about the Yale trip, Bush replied, "Vacation." (Asked later again about Yale trip, see White House transcript. Bush repeated what he'd said about how he was feeling: "Really good.") After three marginal shots off the first tee, Bush declared jokingly, "I can't stand the tension."

Bush revealed that he has not caught any fish in his first two outings. Asked if he's having a good time, "Yeah, really good."

Remember the rap Bush took on the striped preppy watchband he used to wear as veep? It's B-AAAACK! Black, red and blue stripes.

Bush played Saturday with his uncle Louis Walker, longtime friend and golf partner Spike Heminway and Kenneth Raynor, the pro at the Cape Arundel Golf Club.

His daughter, Doro, was playing behind her dad's foursome.

At the first hole, before taking a swing, Bush joked, "Feel a little awkward. I'm not blaming the thyroid."

With a few raindrops falling, Bush declared, "It's raining. We're playing."

As veteran reporters know, rainy weather is Bush Golf Weather.

Bush's first shot was decent but it landed in a sand trap.

"No. No. Stinks," said Bush. "How many we get to hit off of here?"

"Hit 'til you're happy," Spike said - twice - mindful that Bush IS the President and that he was going to be Spike's partner this round.

As is his custom, bush took another whack. Before this one he said, "All right, need a little more swing. A little fast."

But this shot was worse than the first, straight but short and low.

"Oh, shucks. Well, stinks," said Bush afterwards. He sounded genuinely put out.

"One more for the warmup factor," suggested Raynor, helpfully.

Spike: "As many as you want."

Bush: "We're not holding anyone up are we?"

So, Bush took a third shot and it was terrible: off to the left and into the nearby brush and heading for the river.

"Oh, God," said Bush, exasperated. "I'll go with the first one."

"I can't stand the tension," Bush joked.

At one point, Raynor said that Bush usually shoots 84, 85 on this part Par 69 course.

"Sure!" Bush challenged him sarcastically. "I won't. You're giving away too much," he said.

At hole 9 (par 5, 480 yards), where pool caught up with Bush, the President bogied with six.

Asked about his game after a marginal shot at Hole 10 (Par 4, 345 yards), Bush said, "feel a little better though. Playing better. You couldn't tell it by that." (He was not talking about his health.)

Fashion note: While the watchband was the highlight, the powder blue golf pants were noteworthy. A cardinal red shirt and tan Kennebunkport Golf Club hat. He had on modified saddle shoes: Brown where the more traditional saddles are white.

Personnel Note: Bill Farish, son of longtime Bush pal Will Farish, was on the links - riding in a golf cart - understudying for his new job as Bush's personal aide.

He will be soon taking over for Air Force Bruce Caughman who is soon leaving after 10 months on the job to resume his Air Force career.

Dear Mr. President:

I am very grateful for your phone call last week. It will be a big help to me in the story about Jack Delaney.

As I gather my materials, however, I have noticed two matters I need to pin down, and I would appreciate it if you could clear them up.

1). I read in previous publications that when neither Jack nor Ted White responded to you on the intercom, you assumed they were dead. But in his new book, Joe Hyams says - without directly quoting you - that you assumed they had bailed out.

2). It was my impression from talking with you that your guess that Delaney was the one who got out was based on the fact that he was nearer to the door. Yesterday, though, I took a close look at your May 2, 1988, letter to a Delaney niece in which you said, "I expect that was Jack, because (White) was flying in the turret," and you went on to mention that White was substituting for Leo Nadeau. This leaves open the interpretation that you thought Delaney more likely to get out, because he was more experienced than White.

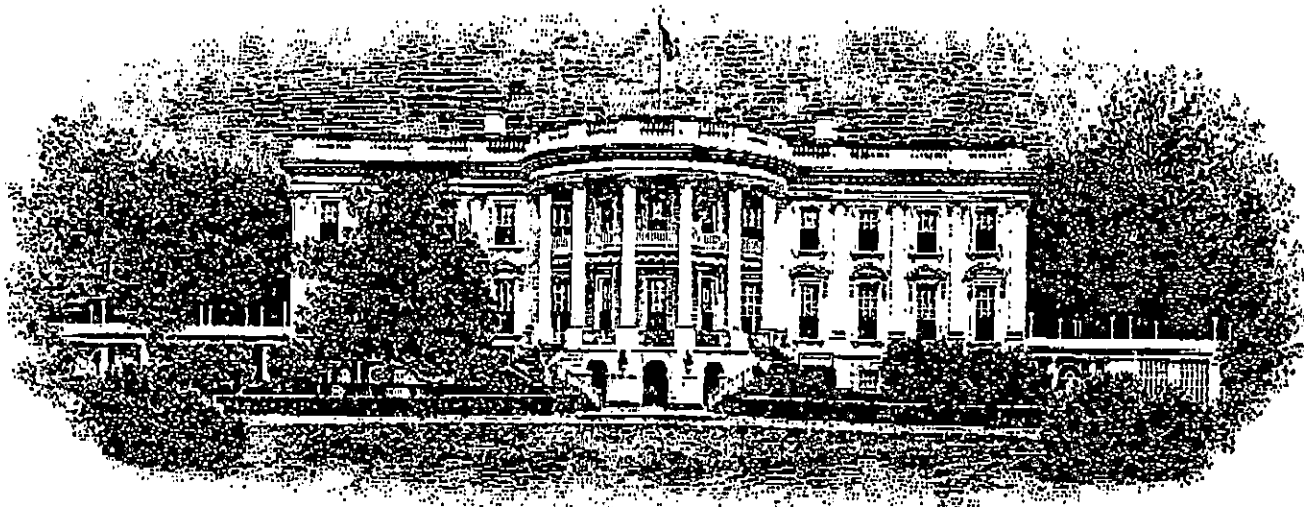

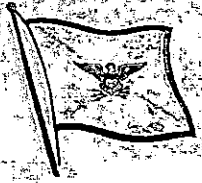
