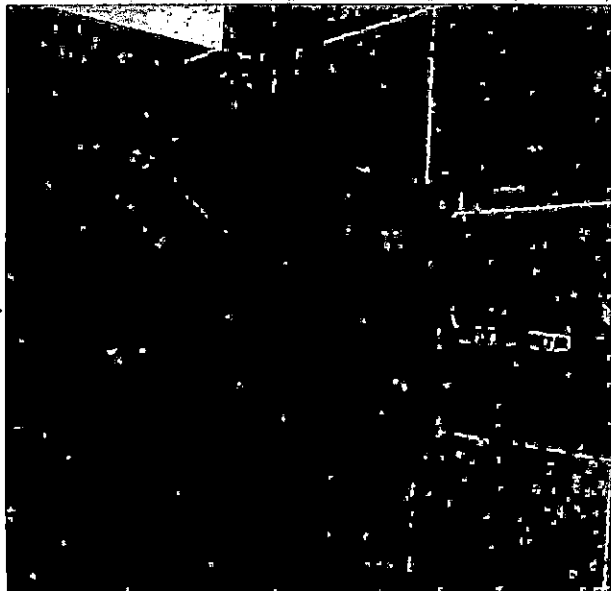
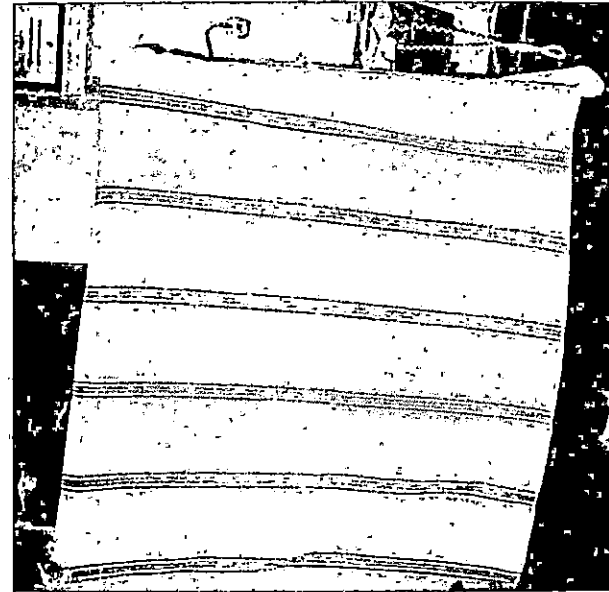

- Our Naval Support Facility on Diego Garcia is vital in maintaining our military presence in the region and is likely to remain so.
- I recognize that our governments have differing perspectives on Diego. While you claim sovereignty, we consider it to be British territory.
- We cannot address the sovereignty question, which we regard as a bilateral matter between Mauritius and the United Kingdom.
- We are confident you will continue to follow a reasonable approach in dealing with the sovereignty question.

I. SETTING

- o Sir Anerood Jugnauth, Mauritius' second Prime Minister since independence, is a soft-spoken, articulate leader who has guided his country's rapid economic development with a steady hand since assuming office in 1982.

It has achieved considerable prosperity within the context of a vigorous multiparty democracy, great ethnic diversity, social stability, and a market-oriented economy dominated by the private sector. Per capita income is expected to reach \$2000 this year.
- o But Mauritius has learned that success has a price. Rapid industrial growth has led to full employment, pressure on wages, and rising inflation.
 - Jugnauth's government now faces the challenge of sustaining the momentum of growth by managing continued industrialization and diversification of manufactured export products.
- o The Prime Minister will point to years of close U.S.-Mauritian relations and his country's adherence to democracy as the basis for increased U.S. aid, especially now as it enters its second phase of industrialization.

II. OBJECTIVES

- o Prime Minister Jugnauth's visit provides an opportunity for the U.S. to showcase a small country's remarkable track record of doing things right politically and economically.

- o You will want to commend Jugnauth for Mauritius' stability, growth and commitment to democracy.
- o We can also use the occasion to recognize Mauritius' potential as a leader in the Indian Ocean region and as a catalyst for regional economic and political development.
- o Jugnauth has high expectations that his visit will yield important political and economic dividends for himself and his government as it prepares to face the voters in the next general elections, which must be held by August 1992.
 - He regards your invitation as a recognition of his enhanced prestige as a leader with international stature.
- o The Prime Minister is likely to appeal for more U.S. economic assistance, making the point that his country's status as one of the few multiparty democracies in Africa deserves support.
- o He may also request increased access to the U.S. market for Mauritius' two major exports, sugar and textiles.
 - You will want to discourage unrealistic Mauritian expectations about U.S. assistance levels and explain our current strategy in the Uruguay Round negotiations.
- o You can thank the Prime Minister for his government's tangible gestures of support for our military presence in the Indian Ocean, emphasizing that our presence serves the interests of not only the states in the region but of the international community as a whole.
 - Jugnauth will likely take this point, but still maintain that our presence on Diego Garcia (over which Mauritius claims sovereignty) should reap more tangible benefits for his country.
 - You will want to deflect this approach by reiterating our policy of deferring to the U.K. on the sovereignty question.

III. STRATEGY

- o Highlight U.S. recognition of Mauritius' vibrant democracy, free press, market-oriented economy, and respect for human rights.
 - Cite Mauritius as a role model for other developing countries.
 - Commend Prime Minister Jugnauth for his and his countrymen's commitment to democratic values, the rule of law and the primacy of the private sector.
- o Convey satisfaction with the excellent state of bilateral relations.
 - Convey your resolve to maintain the relationship as one between friends and sister democracies.
- o Point to U.S. support for Mauritian economic development and industrial diversification through our AID program.
 - Caution that the U.S. will not be able to meet all of Mauritius' requests for assistance, but reassure Jugnauth that we intend to continue our focussed AID program on manpower training and industrial diversification.
- o Endorse Mauritius' constructive role in the region and encourage Jugnauth to enhance that role through such institutions as the Indian Ocean Commission.
- o Thank Jugnauth for making Mauritian ports and airfields accessible to U.S. military ships and aircraft operating in the Indian Ocean.
 - Emphasize that our presence in the region is a force for stability and serves the interests of the entire international community.
 - Seek to deflect Jugnauth's likely pitch that we intervene with the British on Mauritian claims of sovereignty over Diego Garcia.
