Pool Report 19

More Golf

August 17, 1991

To celebrate National Golf Day, the President spent 2 hours, precisely, on the golf course, teeing off at 6:24 a.m. The group, in addition to the President: pro Ken Raynor, George W., and Tom Schiefer, a friend of George W. The press office has copy of PGA handout on National Golf Day--a charity event in which golfers, with adjusted handicaps, try to beat a mark of 71 set by professional golfer Greg Norman.

Herewith, an approximate transcript, from the first tee:

Question: What does National Golf Day mean to you?

Bush: "An awful lot--being able to take on Greg Norman. We're going head on head with Greg out there. The only question is we don't know whether Greg allows mulligans....some of you would know what that means."

Raynor: "This will be a special day out here for us because we're going to shoot 71 or less, a new incentive here."

(Pooler's Note: no word, of course, whether Bush succeeded. He did not volunteer his score when he finished.)

Bush: "Shark, you're in for serious trouble here."

Question: Will you veto the DC appropriations bill because of abortion?

Bush: "There'll be no surprises on that. White shark. Greg Norman."

(At this point, various issue-related questions were met with a running monologue from the President: "White shark. Greg Norman. Taking him on, Greg Norman. It's Golf Day, so we're taking on Greg Norman. From Australia. He shot a 71 and we're going to try to challenge him with our handicap.")

Finally, a question got through: When you talk about demonstrators who are excessive, damaging their cause, are you talking about Wichita?

Bush: "I think breaking the law is excessive. That's what I think. Of course everybody's entitled to" day in court. "Some of the people have been convicted. So I disapprove of that" (meaning, disapproval of disruption, not convictions). "And I disapprove of throwing blood. I don't like interrupting people's speeches. I think that's probably protected under the First Amendment, but I think it hurts the cause, whatever the cause is. I don't think people like just plain rudeness. I think people come to a convention or hear somebody speak, whether it is the President or somebody else, wondering what he has to say."

(Questioner here tried to interject, but the President continued:)

"And people that just come and try to get themselves on the news, for example, have some protest, that's fine. But when you hurt somebody else's rights, that's what I disagree about."

Question: Why not use the bully pulpit to tell folks in Wichita that threaten a federal judge and family--

Bush: "I've been perfectly prepared to say all along....that I disapprove of breaking the law. Certainly threatening a federal judge or threatening a President or threatening somebody else is probably within the rights of fair speech, free speech, and I expect a court might hold that, but I don't think it's good. I don't think it helps the cause, whether the cause is anti-abortion or pro-abortion, or whether it's AIDS, whatever it is. And so what I'm saying is the American people get turned off by the excesses, the denial of the rights of others, for example."

Question: Do you subscribe to the 'big tent' theory of Lee Atwater, and is abortion going to be a campaign issue?

Bush: "I've always subscribed to the big tent theory. I know that some think that one issue or another is going to determine all the elections. I've never subscribed to that. There is no evidence to support it. I think the issues all cut two ways. Now we're off to take on the white shark. Shark? Get ready."

The teeing-off process was marked by the usual chatter: George W. hits what was apparently considered a mediocre drive, and the President says, "I don't think the white shark needs to be too worried about that one." The next one is better, and the President says, "You got home with that." On Schieffer's drive, the President says, "Oh, shark. In trouble."

On the 18th, the President's six-foot-plus putt missed the hole by inches, prompting from him a loud, pained, "Oh, sh....oot. Golly. Darn."

Indefatigable pool, taking the opening, asked about Yakovlev's departure from the Soviet Communist Party. There was no surprise in that at all. We discussed all that when we were over there," the President said.

Next activity: Boating at 10 a.m. Afternoon plans unavailable.
