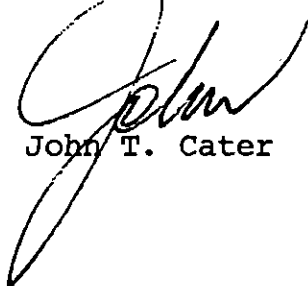

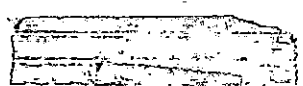

What follows are some general observations about presidential campaigns and, particularly, your re-election campaign next year. Most may be obvious, but I think they are important.

First, many of the important strategic questions cannot be answered at this point because the events which will determine them simply haven't happened yet. They will depend on the general condition and mood of the country, the economy, the Democratic nominee and cumulative effects of the events that occur between now and next Fall.

Your poll numbers have been unprecedented the first three years, and your re-election looks (at this point) to be relatively easy. However, we have learned political conditions can change rapidly. Even if you are in the same political shape a year from now that you are in today, you should have the best campaign possible. If you organize and conduct the best campaign possible based on the assumption of having a tough race, anything less will be a bonus.

One thing that is of some concern is that with a field of no-names, whoever emerges will get a real ride from the press next Spring and Summer. We saw this with Dukakis and I would expect it would be even more so this year given the press' desire to see a strong Democratic candidate and a strong challenge to you.

Also, it is important to remember that while there are some important precedents and lessons from previous incumbent campaigns, '92 is not '72, '76, '84 or '88 but a new year with unique candidates and unique issues. There are, however, some points about presidential campaigns that I can make from my own experience, that are relevant.

The relationship between the White House and the campaign is critical. There is a classic built-in management problem of two operations being involved in many of the same functions. While it is impossible to eliminate all of the problems that will come up, they can be minimized by establishing the proper management structure and process at the beginning. Each have their own independent and unique functions, but they have to exchange information and cooperate on the several functions, particularly scheduling and communications. There is nothing more important to the campaign than where you go and what you say.

All the successful campaigns which I have been involved in, have had the strategy developed and have been run by a relatively small core group of four to six people. In the case of incumbents, this has to include people from both the White House staff, particularly the Chief of Staff, and the campaign. The relationship of these people to you and to each other is very important. If they can each bring something to the table, work together, and trust each other, it eliminates a myriad of problems and makes for a much more effective campaign. There is a concept in business management

called a "Network of Trust" which means is particularly important to a campaign because of its public nature. It is divisive and time-consuming to deal with internal conspiracies and who did what to whom in the newspapers.

At the same time, some one person ultimately has to be in charge. I don't think anything can be run effectively without one strong leader with the authority and responsibility to do so. This is particularly true in an incumbent Presidential campaign because there is such a person in the White House, the Chief of Staff, and there needs to be a counterpart in the campaign to work with the Chief of Staff on a day-to-day or basis. While all of the senior people in the White House and campaign need to be able to talk to each other, there needs to be a final point of review with the Chief of Staff and Campaign Chairman.

Campaigns are like all other endeavors in that if you get the best people in the right jobs, the end results will be positive. My suggestion is that the leadership of the campaign could be a General Chairman, a Chairman and a Campaign Manager (although that may get a little close to having three people for two jobs). The two key leadership jobs in the campaign should divide functions around the campaign, with the Chairman being responsible for the campaign strategy and overall policy decisions, and the Manager being responsible for running the headquarters and implementing the campaign plan. Then let them put together a team of the best people available for the functional roles.

There seems to be a pent-up demand for campaign organization and activity, particularly on the part of those who want to be involved in the process. My view is there is no need for you to do much of anything in a public or campaign way for the next several months except to help raise the money, continue to be a good President and probably travel more, focusing on some domestic issues and particular groups. This needs to be planned with an eye to a central message for next year and to an electoral strategy. For the most part, I don't see a strong reason for you to become an active candidate until late next Spring or early Summer and not become a full-blown candidate until the convention.

What is needed is for someone (or two or three) to have the authority to do some organizational planning, give some direction to people in those states with early deadlines, and make whatever political decisions arise. Virtually none of this needs to be done in public.

There are nine states where there has to be some action by you or a committee this year in order for you to be on the ballot. The most significant of these is Illinois where the delegates file on December 17th. It is the only state where the delegates file with your name attached, and because of the size of the delegation it will take the Edgar people some time to put together a slate. They will need some guidance in October and November, particularly with Phyllis Schlafley active there.

Someone will need to deal with the incumbent Republican governors either before or at the December 7-10 RGA meeting in Salt Lake City, particularly since we are raising money in their states.

Other things that need to be attended to in the last quarter of this year include:

- Legal research by the RNC on the filing dates and requirements for all fifty states.
- Drafting of a campaign budget.
- Beginning organizational and staffing plans for the campaign.
- Identification of headquarters space and have ready to open late this year or early next year coincidental with your announcement.
- Decisions on the Standing Committees for the convention which I believe have to be appointed by the Chairman at the January RNC meeting.
- Some basic polling and voter research to be done this Fall.

Here are some preliminary thoughts, many of which you have heard, on the message or central theme for at least the early part of next year.

First, and most important, is for you and your campaign to control the agenda and set, to the degree possible, the criteria voters use to make their decision. This was one of the things that we were most successful with in 1988. Most swing voters vote for the candidate, not the candidate's position on any particular issue, ideology, platform, or set of specific promises. The personal qualities and the style of leadership of the candidates are all important. Obviously there are some single-issue voters but not many and, in fact, less than there were ten or fifteen years ago. There will be very few single-issue voters in 1992 unless there is some singular overriding problem facing the country, which is not the case at this time.

The fundamental message should be that you have been an excellent President and are far more experienced and qualified to be President than your opponent. The tone of how the campaign does this and how it sharpens this contrast is important, yet it is something that simply can't be fully determined at this time. It has to be consistent with whatever the mood or conditions are in the country next year and will, to some degree, depend on the Democratic candidate. No campaign can reverse the basic direction of public opinion, we simply have to use the direction that it is going in to our advantage. It is impossible to persuade the country that it is in good shape if it is in bad shape or vice versa.

From polling and focus groups we have done in the past, we know that there are three basic things people like about you as President.

- First, and most simply, they like you personally; like Barbara and like the family. This follows the basic Ailes rule which is most voters will vote for the candidate they like the best.
- Second, you are genuine, real and sincere. You do what you do because you believe it is the right thing for the country and not for some partisan advantage.
- Third, you know how to be President, you conduct yourself in the office like a President should, both stylistically and substantively; and you know how to deal with the major problems that President's have to deal with -- e.g., the Gulf and the break-up of the Soviet Union.

All of these are important because they allow voters to disagree with you on some specific issue or issues but still approve of the way you are handling the job as President.

In addition to the personal dimension, the campaign should emphasize the most unique quality to the job of being President, that is to deal with foreign policy and national security. Nothing is as important as peace, and ultimately how you deal with foreign policy issues has a direct affect on how peaceful and stable a world we live in. The more you can connect foreign policy successes to the life of U.S. citizens, the more those successes will work for you politically.

However, the economy and domestic issues are the most important now and are important in most elections. The "take-care-of-our-own-first" is important and growing. Even as major foreign policy issues dominate the news, the concern over economic and domestic issues has not declined. The fact is the health of the economy will be the critical issue and the one that determines whether you have a tough or relatively easy re-election.

The issues that will dominate the news between now and the end of the year will be determined largely by what is going on in the Congress: civil rights, crime, energy, parental leave, etc. During this time, you need to make three points:

1. Foreign policy and what's going on in the world is important to Americans, and begin to explain why and how.
2. The Democrats seem to be equating domestic policy with federal government spending, which is something that is simply not true.
3. You have a wide range of domestic policy proposals, some of which have been put into place and others that are before the Congress.

Then use the State of the Union to tie together your message for at least the first half, if not all, of next year. It is a place to set the agenda during the Democratic primary season and take away many issues that they will try to use against you. I think the major Democratic theme will be that you've ignored middle America and they will use tax fairness and health care to make this point.

My suggestion, which you've heard several times from me, for a general structure for the State of the Union is as follows:

- Over the past three years, and particularly in the last year, we have created a new world order. We have seen changes within nations and changes in relationships between nations occur faster than anyone could have imagined.
- This new world order can increase the chances for Americans to live in peace and without the threat of nuclear war.

- It has re-established the United States as the leader in the world.
- It has brought freedom, and can bring more freedom to millions more people in the world.

At the same time we are seeing a new world order emerge economically. There is no one in our United States who has not been and is not being affected by the fact that we are now living in a world economy.

It is our ability to succeed in this world economy that will provide our economic growth and will give our children and grandchildren the same opportunities to improve their lives that the generations before them had. Our success in this world economy also can give us the resources and the ability to solve many of the problems we face here at home.

It will not be easy. We have all seen how tough both European and Pacific competitors can be, but it should be clear what we have to do:

- Not withdraw into an isolationist or protectionist mode which has proven in the past to not work and result in real harm to our own economy;
- Not try to emulate or copy the economies of other countries;
- Do those things and follow those principles that have made us the envy of the rest of the world economically and produced the largest, strongest, growing economy in the world for most of our history.

This is the American solution.

The things we need to do to succeed in the new world economy are the same things we need to do to invigorate our domestic economy. Among those are:

- Innovation: We have always, and continue to, lead the world in inventiveness and innovation.
- Entrepreneurship/Small Business
- Produce the best quality items in world
 - Total quality management
- Improve our schools
 - Six goals
- Invest more in R&D, Science and Technology
- Free our schools and workplaces of drugs
- Reform our health care to make it more cost effective

- Make productive those who are not
- Minorities in the inner cities
- Handicapped/disabled
- Senior citizens
- Farmers
- Environment
 - Environmental protection and economic development are compatible, not adversarial/sustainable development

We can lead the world in all of these areas. They are consistent with the American character and if we do this in the 1990s, we will indeed be looked upon as the decade of the American solution.

MEMORANDUM TO THE PRESIDENT
FROM VIC GOLD
SUBJECT : THOMAS CONFIRMATION

I fervently hope that Clarence Thomas is confirmed -- it will be a terrible injustice if he isn't. If, however, that should occur, events will move very quickly, with immediate pressure building as to who will be nominated in Thomas's place.

The purpose of this memorandum is to urge you to consider the course of holding the ninth seat on the Supreme Court open until the American people have had an opportunity to make their voices heard on the constitutional issue of a President's right to make Court appointments with the Senate's advice and consent, but not its obstruction.

Everyone agrees that "the process" is flawed. If so, the flaw lies in the partisan obstruction of the Democratic Senate majority. Let the people decide -- in November, 1992 -- how much power that majority should have in the appointment process.

In short, take the Senate majority's abuse of the process -- and of a good, worthy judge and human being -- to the people as part of the larger democratic process.

Consider:

(1) Any nomination you send forward after the current travesty taking place on Capitol Hill won't come up for confirmation for months -- certainly not before early 1992. The Supreme Court today is functioning on an eight-person basis. It will adjourn in May, 1992 anyway, and not come back until October. Waiting until after the November, 1992 election would not interfere in the functioning of the Court -- and since the Democrats don't appear to be too concerned about filling the ninth seat anyway, who would they be to complain? They're the partisans holding up the process.

Vic Gold Memorandum - 2.

(2) If Clarence Thomas is rejected, the wrong done by the Senate majority should not be taken in a politics-as-usual way. The wound to the man -- and to our system -- should not be quickly covered up by simply forwarding another name, as if to say, "Well, it's too bad what happened to Thomas, but that's history now, so how about this nominee?"

The partisans who wronged Thomas would like nothing better than that -- shoving him into the background while they and the media turned the headlines to someone else you nominate in his place. And since they butchered Thomas's reputation, do you really want to put another qualified person through the dirty, grinding process he went through? The Senate Democratic majority has given every indication that, unless they get the kind of nominee a President Dukakis would have sent to the Hill, they intend to fight a no-holds-barred battle. And they will continue to do this for the next four years -- unless the people are allowed to speak out on behalf of a President's constitutional right to nominate candidates of his choice -- with advice-and-consent, yes, but not with partisan obstructionism!

(3) In sum, there is no urgent need for you to fill the Thurgood Marshall seat, should Judge Thomas be rejected. Whoever would replace Thomas -- assuming the Democratic majority would approve him or her -- wouldn't really have that much time on the Supreme Court bench before the November, 1992 election. A constitutional question has been created -- not of your choosing -- as to a President's power to appoint. Let the people decide, in language the Democratic majority will understand, next November -- let the people judge the Democrats who judged Clarence Thomas, and by their votes vindicate his good name.

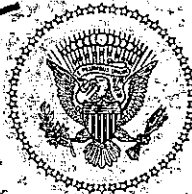

SOUL-SEARCHING TIME FOR SENATE ON EVE OF THOMAS VOTE

(Eds: Retops with vote outlook comments grafs 1-11; edits)

WASHINGTON, Reuter - Clarence Thomas's Supreme Court nomination was back before the Senate for a day of soul-searching Monday, and there were signs he was holding some of the bipartisan support he would need to win a confirmation vote set for Tuesday.

But Sen. John Danforth, Thomas's chief Senate sponsor, said he thought the vote looked too close to call following an extraordinary -- but inconclusive -- inquiry into law professor Anita Hill's sexual harassment charges.

"I rate it as a tossup," said Danforth, R-Mo.

Hours after the Senate Judiciary Committee concluded three days of hearings in the wee hours of Monday, Democrats Dennis DeConcini and Bennett Johnston reaffirmed their own crossover support for Republican President Bush's high-court nominee.

"My hunch is yes, he will be (confirmed), but it won't be near the majority it would have been two weeks ago," said DeConcini of Arizona, a Judiciary Committee member.

DeConcini said the sexual harassment charges leveled by Hill, a University of Oklahoma law professor who worked for Thomas in the government 10 years ago, did not meet the burden of proof needed to convince him they were true.

Johnston of Louisiana agreed.

"My guess is that it (the vote for Thomas) will be in the mid-50s" when the 100-member Senate holds the vote scheduled for 6 p.m. Tuesday, he said.

Such a majority would actually fulfill the most optimistic predictions Thomas's Republican backers were offering a week ago, before the Senate postponed its original confirmation vote amid the furor stirred by Hill's charges.

A spokesman for Georgia Democrat Wyche Fowler said Fowler also continues to support Thomas, but is looking at the record from the weekend.

The committee concluded its marathon weekend hearings at 2 a.m. Monday without offering any innocent or guilty finding. It merely distributed to all 100 senators transcripts of Hill's shocking allegations, Thomas's furious denials and the comments of partisans on each side.

"We were explicitly asked by the Senate not to vote on this matter. It will be left to the Senate," a weary committee Chairman Joseph Biden, D-Del., said as the hearings ended.

"They will have 24 hours to make any judgment they wish ... and determine whether or not what has transpired here the past four days influences their vote one way or the other."

Thomas's prospects were unclear, although some political analysts said they thought the momentum might be in his favor.

Public opinion polls seemed to be leaning that way as well. An ABC News poll released Monday said more Americans were inclined to believe Thomas than Hill and 56 percent now favored his nomination -- the first such majority support since Hill made her sex harassment charges public Oct. 6.

But all that will matter to Thomas, 43, a conservative black federal judge nominated by Republican President Bush, is how the 98 men and two women of the Senate vote.

ABC-TV said Monday it counted only 48 sure votes for Thomas so far, while NBC-TV gave him 46.

Democrats have a 57-43 Senate majority. Thomas was thought to have at least a slight majority including crossover Democratic support before Hill's bombshell charges forced postponement of the original vote scheduled for Oct. 8.

If he is able to keep the 41 Republicans previously counted in his column, Thomas would need nine Democrats to force a 50-50 tie. Then Vice President Dan Quayle could cast the deciding vote for Thomas in his capacity as presiding officer of the Senate.

Several Democrats who had been prepared to vote for Thomas withdrew their support pending completion of the hearings.

Connecticut Sen. Joseph Lieberman, one of the undecided Democrats, said on NBC-TV's "Today" show:

"To vote for Judge Thomas, I've got to conclude that Anita Hill's allegation did not overcome the benefit of the doubt that most people seem to feel that Judge Thomas deserves."

Bush calls the charges against Thomas a smear and said he is confident his nominee will be approved.

"I'm very pleased with the way the support all across the country is holding strong for Judge Thomas," Bush said at the White House Monday.

The hearings held the attention of the nation over the weekend despite competition from televised football and professional championship baseball games.

Hill claimed Thomas made explicit sexual comments to her after she refused to date him when she was his aid at the Education Department and the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission from 1981-1983.

Thomas categorically denied the charges -- angrily denouncing the whole televised inquiry as "a high-tech lynching for uppity blacks" -- and called Hill a liar.

She took and passed a lie detector test Sunday, but the committee refused to admit it as evidence.

Bush nominated Thomas in July to replace retired liberal Justice Thurgood Marshall, the only black to ever serve on the Supreme Court.

Senators Weighing Contradictory Testimony From Thomas Hearings

EDS: Combines pvs; edits to tighten

WASHINGTON (AP) - Clarence Thomas picked up some critical democratic support today as senators weighed contradictory testimony from three days of spellbinding hearings into allegations of sexual harassment against the Supreme Court nominee.

Democratic Sens. Dennis DeConcini of Arizona and J. Bennett Johnston of Louisiana said the weekend's dramatic hearings had not altered their support of Thomas.

President Bush today cut short his Camp David weekend to lead a stepped up administration effort to save his embattled nomination.

"I am very pleased with the way support all across the country is holding strong for Judge Thomas," Bush said. "It is important to note that among Afro-Americans, black Americans that the support is very strong."

Meanwhile, Thomas' accuser, Anita Hill, met with advisers before returning to Oklahoma. She planned to take her allegations public once more in a news conference at the University of Oklahoma, where she is a law professor.

The Senate was quiet after a weekend of raucous testimony that ended shortly before dawn. The 100 senators who will decide Thomas' fate took the holiday off; they will begin their final debate at 10:30 a.m. EDT Tuesday, leading up to a 6 p.m. vote.

Bush's brief remarks appeared aimed at undecided Southern Democrats who have large black constituencies.

Louisiana's Johnston is an influential voice among this group, and he was the first of 13 Senate Democrats who had earlier endorsed Thomas to announce a post-hearing position on the nomination.

"His life, what he's done, his record, is simply not consist with the charges," Johnston said. "Moreover, the course of conduct of Professor Hill is not consistent with the charges," he said.

DeConcini was the sole Democratic member of the Judiciary Committee to support Thomas in its 7-7 vote on the nomination, and he said today that he still supports the nominee.

"There is not sufficient evidence here," DeConcini said. "It's inconclusive, the whole process, in this senator's judgment, to change my support, so I will vote for Judge Thomas."

Two other Democratic senators, Joseph Lieberman of Connecticut and Richard Shelby of Alabama, said they wanted to review hearing testimony before deciding whether they would withdraw their previously announced support for Thomas.

"I'm as pained and perplexed as the rest of America," Lieberman said on NBC.

Said Shelby, "I haven't changed yet and I might not change."

The White House acknowledged Tuesday's vote would be close. Administration officials were expected to begin working the telephones, with the hard-core effort coming Tuesday when Senate members returned from the Columbus Day holiday.

A flurry of last-minute public opinion polls indicated more Americans are siding with Thomas than with Hill - roughly twice as many people believed Thomas over Hill's accusations of sexual harassment. And poll after poll showed dissatisfaction with the Senate's handling of the controversy.

The Senate Judiciary Committee ended its hearings at 2 a.m. today after a 14-hour Sunday session in which supporters of Thomas and Hill debated whether Thomas was capable of committing the aggressive behavior attributed to him, and whether Hill was capable of making it up.

"I know he did no such thing," said Nancy Elizabeth Fitch, a former assistant to him at the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission. "I trust Judge Thomas completely."

Susan Hoerchner, a workers compensation judge in California who met Hill when both were law students at Yale, recalled a telephone conversation in the early 1980s, when both women were working in Washington.

"She told me that she was being subjected to sexual harassment by her boss, to whom she referred by name. That boss was Clarence Thomas."

Both sides agreed on this, at least: Both Hill and Thomas have been forever damaged by the proceeding.

Sunday's final proceedings were marked by electric moments outside the hearings as well as inside.

To bolster her credibility, Hill voluntarily submitted to a polygraph test independent of the committee. "Ms. Hill is truthful," declared Paul Minor, who used to conduct such tests for the Justice Department. "There was no indication of deception to any of the relevant questions."

Lie detector tests generally are inadmissible in court, but as a strategy to shape public opinion the test was explosive.

The committee also released the transcript of staff interviews with another former employee of Thomas, Angela Wright, who said that he had pressed her to date him and made inappropriate "comments about my anatomy." She said he once asked, "What size are your breasts?"

Wright said Thomas made that comment in 1984, when he was chairman of the EEOC and sworn to enforce federal laws against discrimination and sexual harassment.

"I feel that the Clarence Thomas that I know is quite capable of doing just what Anita Hill alleges," said Wright, now assistant metro editor at The Charlotte (N.C.) Observer.

The committee also released a staff interview with a former co-worker, Rose L. Jourdain, who said Wright told her at the time she was increasingly uneasy about comments on "her figure, her body, her breasts, her legs..." Both Wright and Jourdain were

comments about my anatomy." She said he once asked, "What size are your breasts?"

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At least on the committee, which deadlocked 7-7 on Thomas' confirmation a week ago, it appeared no minds had been changed. No committee vote was required after the latest hearings.

"If they don't believe him, they believe Professor Hill, then he will not be confirmed," Leahy said.

Sen. Strom Thurmond, R-S.C., the ranking Republican on the panel, said flatly: "I think the judge has been vindicated. In my opinion, he'll be confirmed."

An attorney for Hill, Charles Ogletree, said she did not seek to have the lie detector results submitted formally to the committee. But hours later consternated committee Republicans brought it up themselves, attacking its validity.

Sen. Alan Simpson, R-Wyo., denounced the test as "a real bush-league type thing." Sen. Orrin Hatch, R-Utah, called it "highly offensive ... highly political."

Sen. Joseph Biden, D-Del., ruled the test inadmissible. But just by debating it, the results were released to the nation and included in the committee transcript.

"It's not important that it be formally entered in the record," said Sen. Herb Kohl, D-Wis. "We all know."

Hill's four corroborating witnesses were on for six hours, with Democrats using their questioning to offer speeches supporting Hill's credibility - just as Republicans had used their questioning of Thomas to attack Hill's story the day before.

New York attorney John Carr said Hill had told him that her supervisor had "showed an unwanted sexual interest in her." Carr did not identify Thomas by name but said he thought she was referring to Thomas.

She "did not provide exact details, but she did tell me they were sexual in nature," said Carr, who met Hill in 1981 and briefly dated her.

Hill's witnesses were followed by 16 more witnesses who vouched for Thomas' character.

"There is no way he is the man she alleges," said J.C. Alvarez, a former aide to Thomas.

Another Thomas friend, Phyllis Berry Myers, asserted that in her opinion, Hill "had a crush" on Thomas that he did not

SUBJECT: Theodor Geisel

You recently asked us to investigate the possibility of awarding a Presidential medal to Theodor Geisel (Dr. Seuss). We have conducted a brief NEXIS search of recent articles on him and found nothing controversial, although you may be interested to know that in 1984 he wrote a children's book, "The Butter Battle Book," which allegorically treated nuclear deterrence in a critical way. For your reference, the New York Times obituary is attached.

Should you wish to give Mr. Geisel some posthumous recognition, you can award either the Presidential Medal of Freedom (the Nation's highest civilian honor) or the Presidential Citizens' Medal (the second highest honor, awarded only to Americans for lifetime accomplishments in a particular field).

Please let us know what you would like to do. Thank you.

Dr. Seuss, Modern Mother Goose, Dies at 87

Theodor Seuss Geisel, the author and illustrator whose whimsical fantasies written under the pen name Dr. Seuss entertained and instructed millions of children and adults around the world, died in his sleep on Tuesday night at his home in La Jolla, Calif. He was 87 years old.

The exact cause of death was unclear, said Jerry Harrison, who oversees children's books for Random House, Mr. Geisel's longtime publishers. Mr. Harrison said the author had been suffering from an infection of his jawbone that had become acute in recent months.

"We've lost the finest talent in the history of children's books," Mr. Harrison said in a telephone interview, "and we'll probably never see one like him again."

Mr. Geisel's work delighted children

by combining the ridiculous and the logical, generally with a homely moral. "If I start out with the concept of a two-headed animal," he once said, "I must put two hats on his head and two toothbrushes in the bathroom. It's logical insanity."

Mr. Geisel's first book, "And to Think That I Saw It on Mulberry Street," appeared in 1937. It was followed by such classics as "Horton Hatches the Egg" in 1940 and "The Cat in the Hat" in 1957.

Over the years, zany animal characters, names and book titles were the Dr. Seuss trademarks. There was "Yertle the Turtle" (1958), "Fox in Socks" (1965), "Mr. Brown Can Moo! Can You?" (1970) and others too improbable to mention.

But the archetypal Seuss hero, many connoisseurs felt, was Horton, a conscientious pachyderm who was duped by a lazy bird into sitting on her egg. Horton stuck to the job for many weeks, despite dreadful weather and other harassments, saying, "I meant what I said and I said what I meant; an elephant's faithful 100 percent." His virtue was finally rewarded when the egg hatched and out came a creature with a bird's wings and an elephant's head.

Mr. Geisel won the hearts and minds of children "by the sneaky stratagem

of making them laugh," Richard R. Longman wrote in a review in The New York Times. He also charmed adults, especially with "Oh, the Places You'll Go!," a 1990 book he wrote for adult readers as well as children, which has been on The New York Times best-seller list for 79 weeks.

Sales of "Horton Hatches the Egg," "The Cat in the Hat" and other children's books by Mr. Geisel totaled well over 200 million copies, Kathleen Fogarty, the director of publicity for Random House Books for Young Readers, said. She said he had written 48 books in his long career, some of them meant for adults as well as children.

In 1984, he won a special Pulitzer Citation "for his contribution over nearly half a century to the education and enjoyment of America's children and their parents."

Mr. Geisel — he pronounced the name GUYSS-ell — was also the founder and a longtime executive of Beginner Books, a publishing concern bought by Random House. Its books for young children, some by Dr. Seuss, have sold more than 50 million copies and are in school libraries in countries around the world. His books have been translated into 20 languages, Ms. Fogarty said.

"Adults Are Obsolete Children"

Mr. Geisel began using his middle name as a pen name for his cartoons because he hoped to use his surname as a novelist one day. But when he got around to doing a grown-up book — "The Seven Lady Godivas" in 1939 — the grown-ups did not seem to want to buy his humor, and he went back to writing for children, becoming famous and wealthy.

"I'd rather write for kids," he later

explained. "They're more appreciative; adults are obsolete children, and the hell with them."

When Mr. Geisel was interested or amused, which was very often; his eyes would light up with boyish warmth.

With his lank hair, beaky nose and neat bow ties, he looked rather like the college professor he had originally set out to be. Though he never earned a doctorate, his alma mater, Dartmouth College, gave him an honorary one.

The world of Mr. Geisel's imagination was nourished by his childhood visits to the zoo in Springfield, Mass. He was born in Springfield on March 4, 1904, the son of Theodor R. Geisel, the Superintendent of Parks, and Henrietta Seuss Geisel.

Superintendent Geisel, the son of an émigré German cavalry officer who founded a brewery in Springfield, expanded the zoo and liked to show it off to his son.

In the Cage With the Lions

"I used to hang around there a lot," Mr. Geisel recalled in an interview. "They'd let me in the cage with the small lions and the small tigers, and I got chewed up every once in a while."

After graduating from high school, he majored in English at Dartmouth, where he contributed cartoons to the campus humor magazine, Jack-O'-Lantern, and became its editor. He graduated with a B.A. in 1925. Then followed a year of graduate work in English literature at Lincoln College of Oxford University, after which he spent a year traveling in Europe.

In 1927, Mr. Geisel married Helen Marion Palmer of Orange, N.J., a teacher he had met when they were studying at Oxford. It was she who persuaded him to give up thoughts of teaching and make drawing a career.

'These Fabulous Animals'

"Ted's notebooks were always filled with these fabulous animals," she later recalled. "So I set to work diverting him; here was a man who could draw such pictures; he should be earning a living doing that."

In addition to serving as her husband's business manager and helping edit his books, she wrote children's books under her maiden name.

Mr. Geisel began contributing humorous material to Vanity Fair, Liberty, Judge and other magazines. But when he first became famous, it was for drawing the "Quick Henry, the Flit!" insecticide advertisements.

Mr. Geisel also wrote for the movies. His documentary films "Hitler Lives!" and "Design for Death" won Academy

Awards in 1946 and 1947, and his cartoon short "Gerald McBoing Boing" won an Oscar in 1951. He also designed and produced cartoons for television, including the Peabody Award-winning "How the Grinch Stole Christmas!" and "Horton Hears a Who!"

Among his later books were some on serious topics. In "The Butter Battle Book" (1984), he introduced young readers to the dangers of the nuclear arms race. In 1986, in "You're Only Old Once!" he addressed the problems of old age in a book for grown-ups. Edward Sorel, writing in The New York Times Book Review, said the book was

illustrated with Mr. Geisel's "characteristic verve and imagination." But, he added, "there's something amiss in the blithe assumption that the sort of rhymes which delight a 4-year-old (or an adult reading to a 4-year-old) will still entertain when read alone through bifocals."

Admirers of Mr. Geisel said the universality of "Oh, the Places You'll Go!," which addresses the difficulties of finding one's way through life, accounted for its success last year. The book quickly became a popular graduation present, and more than a million copies are said to have been sold.

After writing the book, Mr. Geisel worked on the screenplay for a planned, feature-movie version. And this July, "Six by Seuss," a one-volume collection of six of his earlier books, was published.

Helen Palmer Geisel died in 1967. She and Mr. Geisel had no children. In 1968, Mr. Geisel married Audrey Stone Dimond, who survives him.

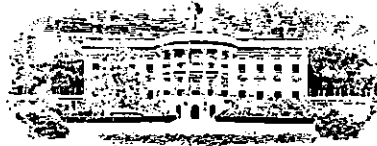

Dear Mr. President:

In my view your actions this week to encourage the extension of credit for worthy borrowers are exactly what is needed to stimulate the economy. At the same time, as you undoubtedly know, the recovery remains extremely fragile. Anecdotal evidence from a variety of industries and across the country continue to be mostly discouraging.

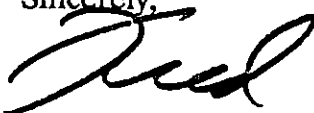
Your actions will have impact but in my view it will take some time for bank and regulator behavior to change and actually effect results. One of the past problems has been that despite policy directions from Nick Brady and from Clarke, the field examiners have not altered from their draconian approach to bank regulation. Hopefully Messrs. Brady, Robson, and Clarke will follow up persistently with regional supervisors and the field to ensure compliance with the new direction.

Beyond the above, I would recommend you continue perceptual and substantive involvement with the economy. One of the real problems is the lack of leadership in the recovery from any one segment. The consumer isn't spending, the auto industry is in duress, and the housing industry can't seem to build up any steam. Consider the following actions:

- ✓ Hold further sessions with the Economic Policy Council. Continue to search for ways to ease the credit crunch.
- ✓ Also focus on consumer spending. You might want to charge the Council with developing a program to stimulate consumer spending, perhaps considering a particular industry such as housing. Emphasis should be on initiatives you can do by executive action, since legislative action will occur too late to provide the desired impetus.
- ✓ Hold further give and take sessions with business and financial leaders, including some smaller company and bank heads from around the country. See what suggestions they may have to enhance the recovery.

Again, congratulations and compliments on the fine initiative of this week. Your further involvement and leadership will make the difference and ensure the economy does recover.

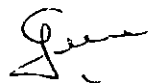

Simon Breaks Up Investment Partnership With Parsky

William E. Simon, the high-profile investor and former Treasury secretary, has abruptly pulled out of his partnership with a longtime colleague, Gerald L. Parsky.

The breakup ends a profitable 5½-year business alliance, best known for its savings-and-loan investments. It stems from intense friction between the two men, according to their friends and associates. "This is very emotional," said one executive at the Simon/Parsky firm, known as WSGP Partners.

In particular, insiders say, tensions flared between Mr. Parsky and various proteges of Mr. Simon at the firm. "The

partners now have different goals," said Preston Martin, another WSGP managing director. Mr. Martin, who was vice chairman of the Federal Reserve Board from 1982 to 1986, said he will resign from WSGP Nov. 30. "I've really agonized over this since I learned Bill was leaving," Mr. Martin said.

The latest move is likely to stir speculation about what new money-making ideas the 63-year-old Mr. Simon may try next. In the 1980s he pulled out of an even more celebrated financial firm that he helped to found, Wesray Capital Corp. At Wesray, Mr. Simon and other investors scored returns as large as 100-1 from investments in leveraged buy-outs of Gibson Greeting Cards Inc. and Avis Rent-a-Car. Mr. Simon's widely publicized profits from Gibson in 1983 helped touch off the leveraged buy-out mania on Wall Street.

Mr. Simon's alliance with Mr. Parsky began in 1986 with vast ambitions. Mr. Simon talked about entering the financial services industry in a big way, both in the U.S. and in various Pacific Rim countries. He and Mr. Parsky bought major stakes in five savings and loan associations, dabbled in real estate and looked into some giant acquisitions that ultimately didn't pan out.

Messrs. Simon and Parsky also attracted a \$100 million investment last year from Tokio Marine & Fire Insurance Co. of Japan, the world's largest casualty insurance company.

Messrs. Simon and Parsky have scored huge profits with investments in First Interstate Bank of Hawaii and Honolulu Federal Savings & Loan. But one of their California thrifts, Western Federal Savings & Loan of Marina del Rey, Calif., posted losses this year.

WSGP insiders said yesterday, though, that the rift between Messrs. Simon and Parsky has little or nothing to do with the firm's financial performance. Rather, they said, the main disputes involve personality clashes and differences over the firm's investment focus.

Mr. Simon confirmed yesterday that he and his two sons have severed ties with WSGP Partners, including his title as co-chairman. "All I can say is that I have withdrawn," he said. "Other than that, I have absolutely no comment."

Mr. Simon's sons are William E. Simon Jr., age 40, and John Peter Simon, 38. The senior Mr. Simon has five daughters as well.

Mr. Parsky, reached in Tokyo, said he and the approximately 30 remaining em-

ployees of WSGP Partners "plan to conduct business as usual." He said he wishes Mr. Simon well and that there aren't any plans to liquidate any of the investments he has made with Mr. Simon.

Explaining his decision to pull out, Mr. Martin said that his expertise is primarily in financial institutions. "They're looking at manufacturing, refining and retailing," Mr. Martin said. "I've had limited experience in those fields."

Also resigning from the partnership is a longtime associate of Mr. Simon, Larry B. Thrall. Mr. Thrall, 50, is vice chairman of several of the WSGP-controlled thrift holding companies and an original participant with Messrs. Simon and Parsky in many investments. Asked why he quit, Mr. Thrall replied: "Bill Simon is a close friend and a great partner, and I wanted to continue my close association with [him] and his family."

Another of WSGP's original four investors, Roy Doumanl, said yesterday that he has moved out of offices in Century City, Calif., that he and Mr. Thrall shared with Mr. Parsky. Mr. Doumanl, 55, wouldn't say more.

In addition to the business turmoil at WSGP, society columnist Liz Smith last

summer reported that Mr. Simon had separated from his wife after a 41-year marriage. Mr. Simon said yesterday that this had "nothing whatsoever" to do with his decision to leave WSGP.

When Mr. Simon pulled out of Wesray, he remained a substantial investor in buy-outs done before he left. There wasn't any rush to liquidate investments. That's likely to be the case this time, too, associates indicated. Mr. Thrall said Mr. Simon and Mr. Parsky are the two largest investors in various WSGP deals, with about a 25% stake each. But Mr. Thrall added that the Simon/Parsky rift "doesn't have any effect" on the ownership of those properties.

In New York, officials of Tokio Marine said they didn't have information on Mr. Simon's plans or any comment on how their investment in WSGP might be affected.

Mr. Simon has built a fortune estimated by Forbes magazine at \$300 million, qualifying him for a place on Forbes's latest list of the 400 richest Americans.

Never bashful, Mr. Simon has cultivated a high profile in recent years as a donor to various universities. For example, there is the William E. Simon Graduate School of Business Administration at the University of Rochester. There is the William E. Simon Center for Economics and Business Administration at Lafayette College. There is a William E. Simon Chair in Political Economy at Lafayette and at Georgetown University. And there is the

William E. and Carol G. Simon Athletic Center at Morristown-Beard School in Morristown, N.J., among other monuments.

Mr. Simon's 28-page personal biography also includes a six-page list of "current affiliations," including membership on a wide variety of boards. Among other things, he is chairman of the board of trustees of Newark Academy in Livingston, N.J., where he graduated in 1946.

Mr. Simon served in the Army from 1946-1948 and then graduated from Lafayette in 1952, with a degree in government and law. His first Wall Street job was with Union Securities in 1952. He later worked at Weeden & Co. In early 1964, he joined Salomon Brothers & Hutzler, later known as Salomon Brothers. He was named a partner later that year, in charge of the U.S. government and municipal bond departments, and was a member of the executive committee. There has been speculation recently that he might return to Salomon to revive the firm in the aftermath of its bond scandal that brought down its top two officers, John Gutfreund and Tom Strauss.

William R. Salomon, who ran the firm before Mr. Gutfreund, is a longtime admirer of Mr. Simon and says Mr. Simon would be his first choice to run the firm today. Mr. Simon declined to comment.

In 1973, Mr. Simon went to Washington as deputy secretary of the Treasury. He became administrator of the Federal Energy Office later that year and then became Treasury secretary from May 1974 to January 1977. He is the author of two books: "A Time for Truth," published in 1978, and "A Time for Action," in 1980.

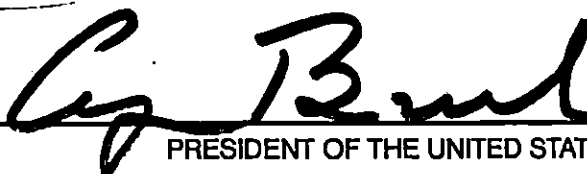

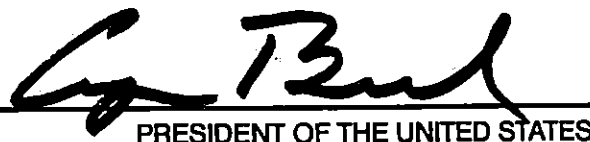

The President today named Dixie Randolph and the King's Messenger Puppeteers, of San Bernardino, California, as the 587th Daily Point of Light for the Nation. Ms. Randolph, 58, provides troubled young men an opportunity to better themselves through making a contribution to those in need.

A victim of neighborhood crime, Ms. Randolph decided that many of the young men involved in criminal activity would straighten up if provided positive alternatives. In 1981, with the help of the Regional Youth Education Facility, a residential facility for delinquent youth, she founded the King's Messenger Puppeteers. Through the program, young men who are residents of the facility travel to local hospitals, schools, and convalescent homes to perform puppet shows.

The King's Messenger Puppeteers provide more than just entertainment. Each show features an inspiring message, focusing on anti-drug and anti-crime themes, patriotism, and friendship. Every young man in the program is dedicated to service to the community. They spend time interacting with elderly persons at local nursing homes after each performance and educating young children on the adverse effects of crime and drugs prior to shows for local youth groups.

Each member of the King's Messenger Puppeteers was at one time involved with gangs, drugs, and related criminal activities. Inspired by Ms. Randolph and their new community involvement, 80 percent of the youth leave gang life after working with the program, and a number of the young men have participated in other volunteer projects or entered college. The average puppeteer donates over 200 volunteer hours to the program.

The President salutes Dixie Randolph and the King's Messenger Puppeteers for their community service efforts and for demonstrating his belief that, "From now on in America, any definition of a successful life must include serving others."

Later, at dinner, **Franklin Murphy**, chairman of the Gallery Trustees, was so busy toasting presidents — including Bush and **Giovanini Spadolini** (president of the Italian Senate) — the Quayles and **Bunny** and **Paul Mellon**, that he completely forgot to mention Queen Sonja at all. She did get some attention, however. She was seated next to the President during dinner.

Lee Annenberg, who with her husband, **Walter**, got a private afternoon tour of the new "Circa 1492: Art in the Age of Exploration" exhibit, reported she'd had dinner the night before with **Sharon** and **Jay Rockefeller**.

"I told him it was a good thing he wasn't running for president," she said. "He needs more time to become nationally known. But in six years, he'd be great."

The evening's most ingenuous exit was made by **Evelyn Lauder**.

"I'm the only one who had the bad manners to take some of the flowers," said Lauder, walking off with four peach roses.

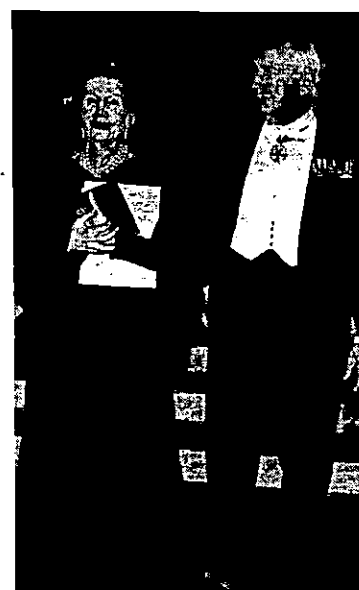

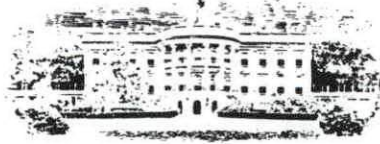

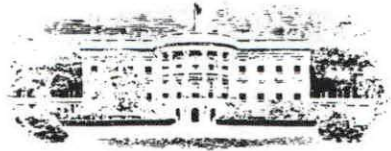
