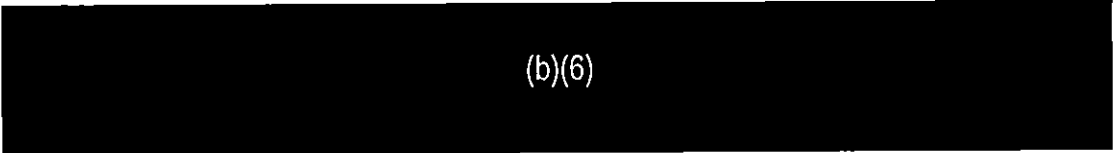

Purpose

To continue the dialogue with Prime Minister Lubbers on the Uruguay Round.

Background

Prime Minister Lubbers is planning to call you this afternoon to give his reaction to your letter of November 25 on the Uruguay Round. While your letter restated our position on agriculture, you did offer new thoughts on market access and intellectual property rights, and promised more detailed proposals on services.

We understand that Lubbers will say that our position on the remaining points at issue in agriculture is unacceptable to the EC, i.e. that the EC cannot accept that all the reduction in export subsidies be taken in tonnage and that there be no rebalancing. He may reiterate the EC proposal of 2/3 - 1/3 split between volume and budgetary reductions, with some rebalancing (i.e. reduction in our corn gluten exports to the EC).

On agriculture, I believe you should hear Lubbers out, tell him you are disappointed in the EC reaction, and say that you thought you were being responsive to Lubbers' request that we show flexibility in the other areas in order to give Lubbers some room to maneuver on agriculture.

On services, market access and intellectual property, you should ask Lubbers if he has any reaction to our proposed solutions.

RECOMMENDATION

That you use points at Tab A when Lubbers calls you on the Uruguay Round.

## The B List

Well, I didn't make the list. Did you? According to a special report on CNN, the government has a secret list of people who will succeed to the presidency in case of nuclear war. The official list prescribed by law and the Constitution—call it the A List—begins with the vice president and descends through the Speaker of the House, the President pro tem of the Senate, and fourteen Cabinet officers, ending with the secretary of veterans affairs in seventeenth place.

But there is apparently another list, a B List, that begins with No. 18 and runs who knows how far. According to CNN, it has at times included such people as former United Nations Ambassador Jeane Kirkpatrick, former White House chief of staff Howard Baker, and former CIA Director Richard Helms. All of them refused to comment to CNN, but they are undoubtedly feeling rather smug. In Washington, being secretly in line for the presidency is sure to become the newest status symbol.

According to CNN, the plan to install what it calls "the Doomsday Government" was created by the Reagan administration in 1982 and entrusted to a secret agency with the wonderfully deadpan name "National Program Office." Oliver North was intimately involved, wouldn't you know. "National Program Office" does not sound like the kind of thing Ronald Reagan ought to approve of, though that could be deliberate, to put people off the scent. More satisfactory sci-fi vibes are given off by the actual name of the B List itself: the "Presidential Successor Support System," or "PS-cubed" for short. So far, says CNN, PS-cubed has cost the taxpayers \$8 billion.

The CNN report was most alarmed about the constitutional implications of

a secret line of succession, unknown and unapproved by the body politic. But how worrisome is that? After all, the connection between democracy and the official, non-secret line of succession is pretty attenuated. Or did you consider Manuel Lujan's qualifications for president when you voted for your senator, who voted to confirm him as secretary of ... well, as secretary of whatever he is?

More interesting are the questions of how Ollie North and Company came up with their list of potential presidents, and who is on it. Making lists of names is a favorite occupation of the power-mad. Sometimes these are lists you want to be on, such as those determining who gets invited to a party or who wins a National Medal of Freedom or who gets selected as the ABC "Person of the Week." Sometimes they are lists you'd just as soon not be on, for example, who cleans up the kitchen or who has to testify before the House Un-American Activities Committee or who gets executed by Stalin. But the list-maker can take pleasure in either type. Whether for good or evil, the opportunity to exert power by inclusion and exclusion is the same.

I suppose being on the list of who gets to become president of the United States after a nuclear holocaust lies somewhere in between the two categories in terms of desirability. It's like a party you wish to have it known you were invited to but are not particularly eager to attend. Or maybe it's like not being invited to the party itself but being told you can come around the next day and eat the leftovers.

Reagan's commitment to keeping the federal government going under any circumstance is touching. You would have thought that, for a true conservative, one of the bright spots of a nuclear holocaust would be the cessation of the government. Sort of the ultimate in term limits. Is a list of seventeen successors to the president not long enough? That is exactly the sort of bureaucratic mentality Reagan claimed to oppose.

In its report CNN interviewed a source identified only as "Bob." Bob was said to be "knowledgeable." And according to Bob, "In some cases, it may be necessary to even go outside of the active current government to bring in that expertise in a period of crisis." Good old Bob has stumbled onto the perennial dream of good-government types: that, in a crisis, the nation will reach out to Father Theodore Hesburgh (or is it Lee Iacocca? Felix Rohatyn? George Will? Magic Johnson?) to take command. What a pity it will take a nuclear catastrophe to

bring America to its senses.

CNN does not report how long the B list is. But clearly there is no logical stopping point. If seventeen successors to the president are insufficient, so are thirty-four or sixty-eight or 136. To do this thing right, the National Program Office would have to rank the entire population from one to 250 million in terms of each person's qualifications to be president. It's not easy. Sure, it starts out a snap. But after you've slotted Bill Moyers in No. 1 and Willie Horton in No. 250,000,000 (and no furlough even then), you still have to face that vast middle ground. Does my Aunt Evelyn come before or after your Uncle Benny? Does Madonna outrank Arthur Schlesinger Jr.? And don't forget yourself, Ollie. You squeeze right in there between Pee-wee Herman and Orrin Hatch.

In *The New York Times*, Duke law professor William van Alstyne points out another problem with the B List. Since it's secret, how will you prove that your number has come up? It would be like winning the lottery but losing the ticket. As the *Times* states the dilemma: "Who ... would believe an obscure figure claiming to be president under a top-secret plan no one had ever heard of?" For myself, I wouldn't even believe Jeane Kirkpatrick or Howard Baker.

Obviously the solution is to make the list public. And, just to be sure, we should tattoo every American citizen with his or her Presidential Succession Number (PSN). That way, survivors stumbling through the wreckage of American civilization would merely have to compare numbers to know who should take orders from whom.

As nuclear war becomes a more distant possibility, though, the real significance of the B List is here and now. For prestige, there's been nothing like it since Nixon's Enemies List. In fact, this is the Enemies List in reverse. It can be only a matter of time before lobbyists are offering to get your name on the presidential succession list and p.r. firms are offering to promote your presence on it, whether truthfully or not.

Come to think of it, I may have been hasty in admitting that I am not on the list. Keep in mind that that may have been disinformation. Naturally, anyone who is on such a list would be required to pretend otherwise, whereas anyone left off would be sorely tempted to bluff. Be nice to me and I'll make you ambassador to Afghanistan. After a nuclear war, that could be one of the more desirable postings.

**I. ISSUE**

Delay in completion of surface transportation legislation is having serious economic consequences around the country. Commitments for new projects are now \$1 billion below the level would expect at this point in the fiscal year. Some states are particularly hard hit without new authorizations. For example, Missouri has placed all new road and bridge projects on hold until new legislation is enacted; Virginia has had to defer advertisement for bids on \$68 million worth of projects; and the State of Washington has delayed three major Interstate Completion projects with a total cost of \$85 million. This is an illustrative but not an inclusive list of the severe economic impact that the current delay of reauthorization has caused. After all, \$47 million per day -- \$1.4 billion per month -- is being collected from highway users but not being put back into the spending stream.

Currently, the states have only \$5.8 billion of the \$16.8 billion that should be available for obligation under the FY 92 Appropriations Act because of Congressional failure to reauthorize the highway program. This constraint, and the uncertainty over the ultimate shape of the program, has caused the states to fall about \$1 billion behind in commitments to new highway projects from where we would expect them to be if the program had been reauthorized on time. That translates into the potential loss of some 60,000 jobs over the next several months. A short-term extension will not resolve the uncertainty and, therefore, will not restore a normal pattern of commitments to new projects.

**II. SUMMARY**

After a series of meetings this week and last, I believe that the conferees may not be able to complete action on a surface transportation reauthorization bill before

anticipated adjournment on Tuesday, November 26, 1991 (although Senator Mitchell was quoted as saying that the Senate would not adjourn without completing a surface bill). Progress has been made on a number of issues, but the difficulties of reconciling the House and Senate state-by-state apportionments (and attendant minimum allocation costs) as well as disagreements over other issues (demonstration projects and reimbursement proposals) continue to frustrate final resolution of the legislation.

Passage of a Surface Transportation Reauthorization bill before Congress recesses is desirable for a number of compelling reasons:

- 1) Delaying reauthorization is costing thousands of jobs -- and the constraints of no reauthorization are a drag on the economy;
- 2) Forcing Congress to act now will maximize the accomplishment of the Administration's programmatic goals -- there is no reason to believe putting final disposition of this bill off until next year will in any way improve the final content of the legislation.
- 3) Failure to enact legislation will defer needed transportation projects to enhance the safety and efficiency of the system.

A short-term (60 day) extension of the current program does not address the immediate economic concerns and it reduces pressure on Congress to complete action in a timeframe that will not jeopardize the summer construction season.

### **III. CONSEQUENCES OF A SHORT-TERM EXTENSION**

The House may offer a short-term extension of the current program -- for 60 to 90 days -- as a stop gap measure to hold the bill over to the second session of the Congress. Senator Moynihan has expressed adamant opposition to any short-term extension.

A short-term extension will not provide the states the necessary certainty and program stability that they need to resume their normal planning, design, and construction programs. A reauthorized surface transportation program is needed if the states are to resume normal patterns of obligating funds for new projects and we are to realize the associated job and other economic benefits. Even though states have more than \$5.8 billion in funds carried over from last year, history argues that states will not fully utilize those funds -- or new funds authorized by a short-term extension.

- o In 1982, when reauthorization was delayed more than three months, the states had obligated only \$1.8 billion by the end of December even though they had \$5.2 billion in carry-over funds and \$4.1 billion in new funds authorized by a short-term extension.

- o In 1987, when reauthorization legislation was delayed more than six months, by the end of March the states had obligated only \$3.8 billion even though they had more than \$6.8 billion in carry-over funds.

There are two primary reasons why states do not fully utilize available funds during a lapse in authorization legislation:

- (1) States want to use their limited obligation authority to advance state priorities; they can best do this only if they know the full range of choices for spending their money. Without new authorization, however, they do not know what their options will be.
- (2) The funds that are available absent reauthorization are restricted to specific categories (urban, secondary, bridge) of projects that do not reflect the states' highest priorities.

A short term extension could address problems by providing flexibility in the use of funds across specific categories. However, this approach would risk creating discord in state relationships with local governments because states would have the discretion to use funds that city and county governments now consider their own.

#### **IV. DISCUSSION OF THE LEGISLATION**

The conferees have been working on reconciling the differences in the House and Senate bills, working through the weekend and most evenings for the past week. Although progress is being made, they may not be able to resolve the central barriers -- namely funding allocations that meet both House and Senate priorities.

**Apportionments:** The same issue that delayed the 1987 highway bill for six months and tied up the floor of the Senate for two weeks earlier this year is again impeding progress in the Conference. The Conferees cannot arrive at a solution that appeases donor states, donee states, and western states. Senator Moynihan has introduced a new wrinkle into the formula fight with his \$4 billion proposal to "reimburse" states that constructed highways at their own expense before 1956 that were later incorporated into the Interstate system. The major beneficiaries of this proposal are New York, New Jersey, Ohio, and Illinois.

**Program Structure:** The Conferees have basically deferred resolution of program structure issues until they reach an accord on the apportionment factors. The House has agreed to work generally within the basic structure put forth by the Senate bill which reduced the number of funding categories. The Senate significantly underfunded the National Highway System, but we have some hope that House efforts to maintain the House level of dedicated funding will succeed which should meet our requirement that the system be adequately maintained. The Conferees are committed to providing the states with increased flexibility with regard to the use of highway funds; they have not gone as far as our proposal with regard to transit funds.

Matching Share: I do not expect progress in increasing the matching requirements as we had proposed -- although we continue to work with the Byrd "level-of-effort" proposal to try to encourage greater state investment in transportation infrastructure.

Transit: The big issues -- operating assistance and earmarking of new start projects -- have not been taken on by the Conferees. They are awaiting resolution of the major highway issues. We continue to work for the Senate freeze at the current cap on operating assistance and to retain the Administration role in determining cost-effective new start projects. These issues will not hold up conclusion of the Conference.

Highway Safety Issues: We expect the Conference to continue to include a series of mandated rulemakings; some of the original unrealistic rulemaking timetables will be adjusted. In addition, they continue to include state seatbelt and helmet usage laws as incentives for special safety grants.

Gas Tax Extension: Both bills require extension of one half of last year's nickel gas tax increase beyond scheduled expiration in 1995. Senate Finance and House Ways and Means Conferees will insist on satisfactory resolution of their program concerns (especially apportionment factors) before they agree to the extension.

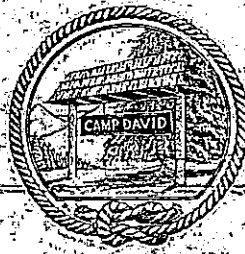
Demonstration Projects: The Senate is currently insisting on a reduction in funding from \$5 billion to \$4 billion for demonstration projects. Western Senators are urging the House to agree to the reduction and to distribute the money to Western state projects. At this point, the House is not willing to negotiate on demonstration projects.

Sub-State Allocation of Highway Obligation Authority: Both bills would, for the first time, allocate a portion of a state's highway obligation authority directly to metropolitan areas bypassing the state government. The effect of the Senate bill is that about half of the Surface Transportation Program funds (the largest category of funds) would be so allocated. The House counteroffer would effectively allocate about 29 percent of comparable funds. We support the House approach, since it means more funds would likely go to the National Highway System.

## **V. RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 1) I recommend that you call a meeting with congressional leaders for Thursday and 1) strongly advocate completing action on this bill before congressional adjournment for the year; and 2) indicate that a short-term extension is not acceptable.
- 2) Further, you should point out the cost of congressional inaction and renew your calls for action on this job-creating legislation in a press conference or other public forum.

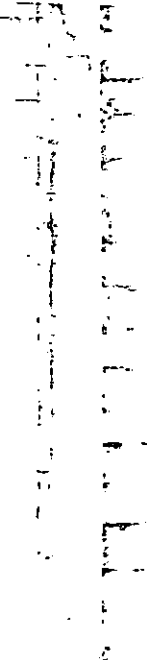
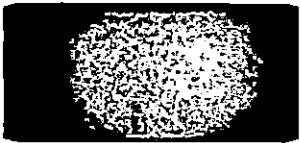

SUBJECT: Regulating the Auto Industry

You asked a simple question. You deserve a simple answer. In his memorandum on the auto industry, Secretary Skinner claimed that "new regulatory requirements, primarily imposed by the Clean Air Act Amendments, already will increase production costs by \$1350 per car and \$1600 per light truck."

You asked if this estimate is true. The simple answer is no, or at least it is very unlikely. Your question, though, is a good one, because it focuses attention on the difficulties of estimating the costs of regulation.

A table outlining the differences in estimates for clean air and safety standards by the Administration (EPA and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration), by Ford Motor (which is where DOT got the estimate used in Secretary Skinner's memo), and by the Motor Vehicle Manufacturers Association is attached.

As the table shows, the differences in estimates are striking. What accounts for these differences? There are no clearcut answers, but some interesting clues.

1. When asked, EPA expressed surprise and was at a loss to explain the industry's higher estimates. The EPA estimates were developed as part of the cost analysis we undertook during the Clean Air Act debate. This was an interagency process chaired by the Council of Economic Advisers.

The Administration estimates are certainly not high, but they do reflect a conscientious effort in which EPA's initial claims were always subject to the scrutiny of others.

2. The Administration's estimates are static with respect to technology. That is, they do not assume new technological breakthroughs that historically have helped keep down such compliance costs.

3. In discussions with some of the auto industry's technical experts they describe two possible reasons for their higher estimates. The first is their assumption that complying with the new requirements may necessitate major vehicle

redesigns in order to accommodate the new control equipment. The second involves higher estimates for R&D expenditures and a belief that meeting these standards will require more sophisticated devices than EPA believes.

4. When pressed, the industry estimators were not eager to discuss precisely how they had arrived at their figures; so it is difficult to know to what extent their estimates are realistic.

5. The cost estimates for passive restraint systems do not result from new regulatory requirements, but reflect the cost to the industry of meeting increasing consumer demand for passenger and driver-side airbags.

6. The difference between NHTSA and Ford's cost estimates for impact resistance can be attributed in part to Ford's inclusion of frontal crash protection costs, which were not included in NHTSA's estimate.

7. It is worth noting that these compliance costs will not occur all at once but will be phased in between now and model year 1998.

8. Finally, the Clean Air Act could require additional compliance costs for more stringent tailpipe standards as well as more extensive use of alternative-fueled vehicles if expected improvements in clean air are not achieved.

### **Clean Air Act requirements:**

- Tier I Standards, including CO Cold Start and Improved evaporative emission controls: The new Clean Air Act requires reductions in tailpipe emissions of several pollutants, including hydrocarbons, NOx, and CO. The Act also requires new controls for evaporative hydrocarbon emissions, including running losses that result from vapor leaks from the carburetor and gas lines. The new requirements will be phased-in over model years 1994 to 1995.
- Onboard Diagnostics: The Clean Air Act requires auto manufacturers to install new diagnostic systems to detect the malfunction or deterioration of emissions-related systems. EPA is required to issue these rules in May 1992.
- CFC Requirements: The new statute requires the phase-out of ozone depleting chemicals, including CFCs used in the air conditioning units of vehicles. To meet these requirements, auto manufacturers will have to develop refrigeration units that can operate on CFC substitutes. In some cases, this will mean expanded refrigeration elements in the vehicle.

### **NHTSA Safety Standards**

- Passive restraints: Under Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 208 (MVSS 208), the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) requires all cars to be equipped with passive restraints - either airbags or automatic seat belts - by 1990. Similar rules for light duty trucks will be phased-in between 1995 and 1998. The regulations permit manufacturers to install either airbags or automatic seat belts and all manufacturers are currently in compliance with the standard.

Nevertheless, auto manufacturers will voluntarily install airbags in most new passenger cars over the next few years in order to meet the demands of new car buyers. Ford has included this voluntary, market-driven production cost in its estimate of safety-related compliance costs despite the fact that MVSS 208 does not require installation of airbags in all cars. Ford estimates that the production costs of installing airbags on both the driver's and passenger's side of a car will be approximately \$200 per car; NHTSA's estimate is only slightly lower at \$150 per car. Ford's estimate of \$200-\$300 of additional compliance costs for light duty trucks assumes that manufacturers will install only automatic seat belts, not airbags.

- Impact resistance: NHTSA is phasing-in between 1994 and 1997 a requirement that cars meet tougher safety standards to minimize the risk of side impacts. Light duty trucks will have to meet current passenger car standards in 1994. NHTSA estimates that the production costs of such compliance will be \$50 per car. Ford's estimate of \$150 for impact resistance costs includes not only the cost of complying with the side impact rules but also the costs of greater frontal crash resistance design changes. Some portion of Ford's estimate of \$200 to \$300 of additional compliance costs for light duty trucks reflect the following additional NHTSA requirements:

1992 -- Manual seat belts (front and rear)

1992 -- Front seat head restraints

1994 -- Greater roof strength

1994 -- Center high-mounted brake lights

STATE OF THE DOMESTIC AUTOMOBILE INDUSTRY

I am writing to provide information on the state of the domestic automobile industry. As you recall, you met with executives from General Motors, Ford, and Chrysler in March of this year. Last week I traveled to Detroit, where the top management of each of these companies updated me on the current condition of the industry. The news was very bad. The companies are losing sales, profits, and market share at an alarming rate, with no end in sight. Production cuts are imminent, which will have noticeable negative effects on the economy.

Market demand is weak. Overall U.S. car and light truck sales are languishing at a rate of 12.8 million units annually, well below normal recession levels. Consumer confidence, a key indicator of automobile sales activity, is well below levels seen in a healthy economy and eroding rapidly. Floor traffic in retail auto dealerships has dropped off markedly.

This sluggish demand has forced the automakers to spend large amounts on cash rebates, low-rate financing programs for retail customers, and incentives for fleet customers. Marketing costs for Ford alone will be \$6 billion in 1991, more than double the levels of 1985-1988.

The Big Three are losing money at a rapid rate. So far in 1991, the companies' combined pretax losses on North American operations have reached approximately \$12 billion -- \$8 billion for General Motors, \$2.5 billion for Ford, and \$1.5 billion for Chrysler -- breaking records set in the 1982 recession. Nevertheless, the companies are maintaining high levels of capital spending in order to stay competitive and meet new regulatory requirements.

Originally, the companies had anticipated modest sales growth over the next year. Now they are revising their forecasts downward and making sizeable production cuts that will result in further losses. Chrysler already has trimmed 64,000 vehicles from its fourth quarter production schedule. General Motors and Ford have made similar plans.

These production cuts will soon negatively impact on national economic indicators. Most seriously, they will result in layoffs. The ripple effect on dependent businesses may be large.

General Motors, Ford, and Chrysler continue to face intense competition from Japan. The Japanese share of the U.S. car and light truck market has climbed from 20 percent in 1985 to 30 percent in 1991. Today, the Big Three are most concerned about maintaining their position in the markets for full-sized cars, light trucks and minivans -- their principal profitable lines.

On regulation, the carmakers are of course extremely worried about new CAFE requirements that would necessitate expensive design changes or worse yet, the elimination of the larger cars in their fleet. As you know, the Administration has taken a strong stand against radical increases in CAFE. New regulatory requirements, primarily imposed by the Clean Air Act Amendments, already will increase production costs by \$1350 per car and \$1600 per light truck.

We will continue to work with the industry to assist it in these difficult times in any way we can.

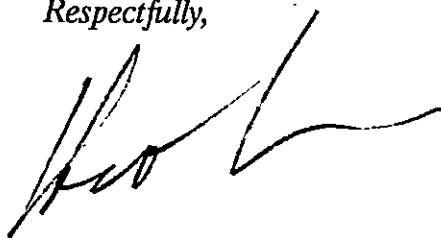

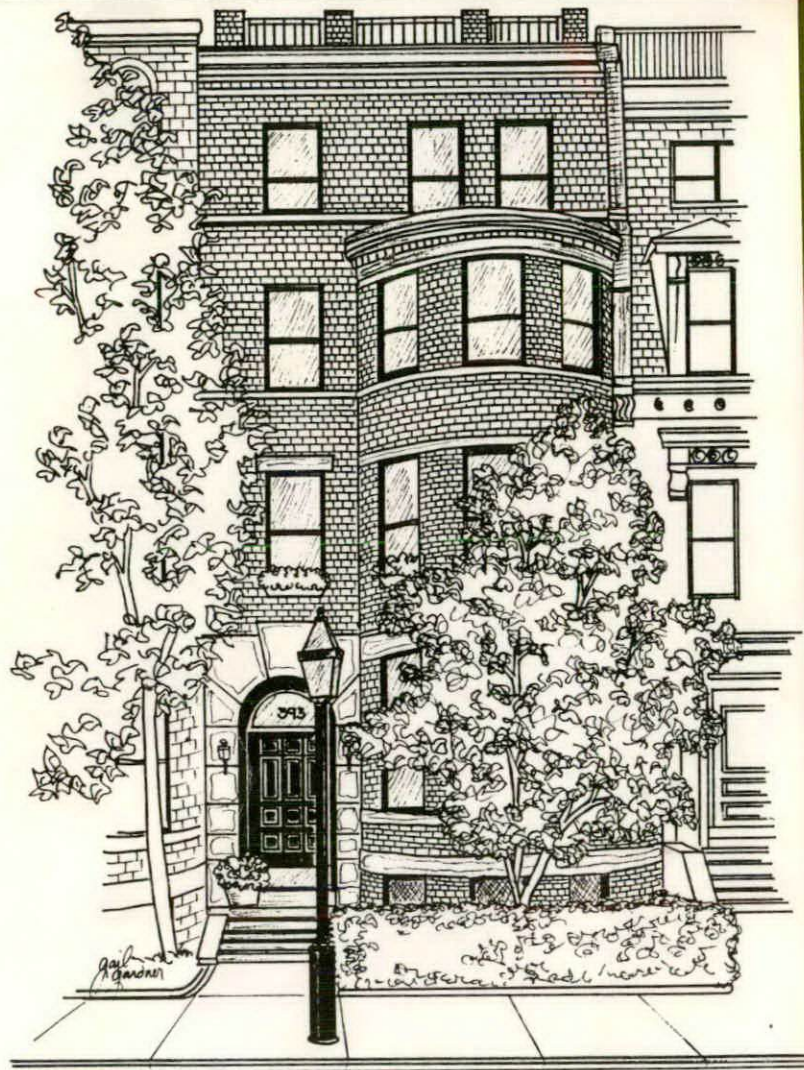
