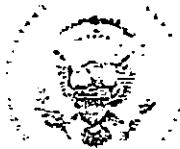

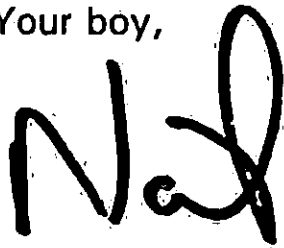

20,000 Pack River Street To Hear Bush Campaign

As if welcoming a conquering hero, an enthusiastic, flag-waving crowd of more than 20,000 people greeted President Bush on Savannah's River Street Sunday, cheering his blasts at Congress and his opponents, and applauding his promise to get the economy moving again.

"We believe that parents — not the government — ought to make the decisions that matter in life," Bush said, such as choosing their children's schools and day care, "not some bureaucracy in Washington, D.C."

"America is first as long as we put the family first."

Bush blamed the "liberals that control the Congress" for derailing his economic plan and told the crowd to tell Congress: "Keep the change and keep your hands out of the taxpayer's wallets."

He pledged to veto any "tax and spend" plan that reaches his desk.

Taking a swipe at Republican challenger Patrick J. Buchanan's "America First" campaign slogan, Bush said his opponents are "peddling protectionism. They're peddling a retreat from economic reality. Look closely. That's not the American flag they're waving — it's the white flag of surrender."

"We don't cut and run in this country. We compete," Bush said. "Never in this nation's long history have we feared our trade with the world."

Quickly, as if they had done it before, they fished through pockets, coats, diaper bags and picnic satchels. They shook them down. They removed cameras from cases, aimed them in the air and, as a last, took a picture.

The people who got in late early or were tall or could sit on someone's shoulders were lucky. So were the parents of band members from high schools in Vicksburg and Hinesville. They were allowed in through

the press gate.

Mary O'Brien wasn't. She showed up early, but was stopped from going down the ramp because she carried a sign that read, "President Bush, John would leaders at earth summit, June 1994, Rio de Janeiro."

"No one with signs — pro or con — is allowed in," police officer L.L. Brown told her.

"You'll have to walk down to Aberdeen Street if you're going to carry your sign."

She didn't.

A few blocks away, closer to the ramp, a young man handed out hand-written, hand-made signs for Bush. They were carried into the rally.

For Dick Lashy, 78, and in a wheelchair, this was the third president he has seen in person. In 1952, he saw President Eisenhower in Chicago and in 1973 he glimpsed President Nixon in Madison, Wis.

"Isn't it great to see all these young people out here?" he said.

At the press stand, the group from the British Broadcasting Company laughed when the Bradwell Institute band played the theme from Monty Python's Flying Circus and said the Bush-Bachman race "has the folks back home intrigued."

A reporter from France stood around in a black turtle-neck sweater, a woman from the Village Voice, in New York said the River Street

crowd was much more enthusiastic than what she saw in Texas and everyone tried to remember what race Gary Winchaker ran.

Waiting patiently, the mostly white crowd strained against the white wooden barricades, heard Dixieland jazz and listened to WJCL's Bill Edwards tell carry jokes. Occasionally a group in front waved small American flags.

Suddenly, after a scurry of activity from men in dark suits, the president and Mrs. Bush bounded out from the VIP tent.

Wearing a red tie and delivering a speech the other reporters said they heard a half-dozen times before, Bush spoke of family, the Dem-

ocratic Congress and John.

When he finished, he took off his eyeglasses, brandished the thumbs-up signal, told the crowd thank you and moved forward to press a little flesh. Then, just when the crowd thought they saw the last of him, Bush appeared on another platform and addressed a group of people who could not see him.

"That would be enough for me, I was voting Republican," Gene Beckinger said.

On Bay Street, another couple stood looking down at the festivities. They were too late to see the president, they said, but they didn't care.

They were from New Hampshire "and we're about presidential out."

Technology and Tradition Join Hands on Historic Waterfront

When the last of the three presidential limousines pulled away from under the Hyatt Regency, the man in the dark well-tailored suit took off his Ray-Bans, shook his head and watched the big black cars climb the belled ramp.

"That's it for me," he said, wearing a round pin in his lapel that identified him as part of the explosive ordinance disposal team.

"My area is clear."

With at least 20,000 people in the area to see and hear President Bush, it wasn't an easy day for security.

Secret Service personnel — car phone corded behind their necks, microphones tucked in their shirt collars and rectangles pinned on their lapels — watched the crowd, peered where they had room, kept a straight face and talked very little.

They also searched six vehicles and metal scanners at the Boardwalk Street ramp, the only entrance to the

Loan Guarantees Hinge On Settlements, Baker Declares

Secretary of State James Baker's blunt ultimatum to Israel on Monday was the clearest indication yet of the overlap between domestic politics in both Israel and the United States, and the steadily deteriorating relationship between the leaders of the two nations.

In testimony before the House Foreign Operations subcommittee, Mr. Baker indicated that only a total halt in settlements would secure the \$10 billion in U.S. loan guarantees requested by Israel.

That toughening of the U.S. position signaled a harsh fact to

pro-Israel activists in Washington: Political forces in both countries have converged in a way that have played havoc with the assistance desperately needed by Israel to settle tens of thousands of new immigrants, most of whom are from the old Soviet Union.

In addition, those same political forces will probably drag the Middle East peace process, which resumed with a new round of bilateral talks in Washington this week, into a nether world in which real progress is out of the question for now.

Interviewed on Israel Radio, the Israeli ambassador to Washington, Zalman Shoval, said the hard-line White House stand on the loan

guarantees had cast a shadow over the peace talks. The Bush administration, Mr. Shoval said, was forcing Israel to choose between "the safety of our brethren in the Soviet Union now and the safety of Israel tomorrow."

In an even harsher comment, Israeli Health Minister Ehud Olmert charged that the ultimate aim of the Bush White House is to drive Israel back to its pre-1967 borders.

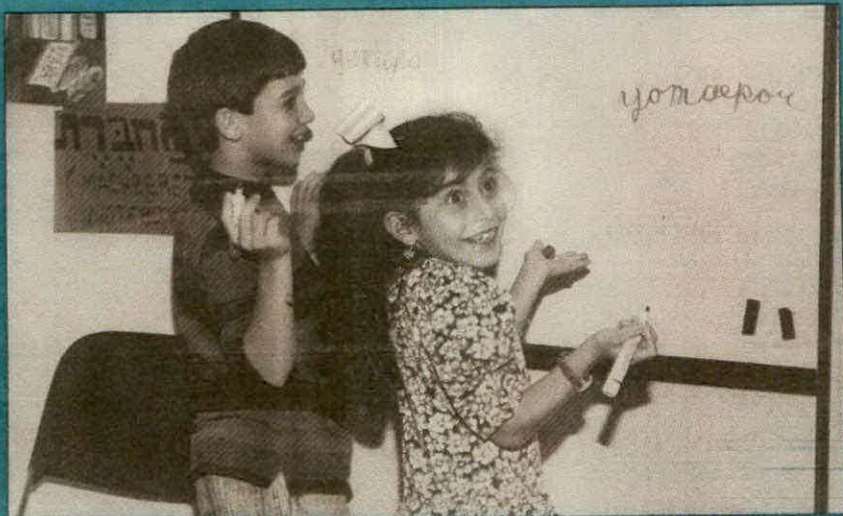
"Every time we are ready to negotiate there is a change in the conditions set by the Americans," he said. "Indeed, I think the ultimate goal of America's policy is to force Israel to agree to withdraw

A peaceful havdalah service to end the Sabbath. Soviet Jewish families enjoying a meal together in their new Atlanta home. A food collection for relatives still in the former Soviet Union. Much desired English classes and job networking. And a little Bible study.

What's wrong with this idyllic picture?

The location of this scene is the Brookhaven Baptist Church in DeKalb County. The English teachers are evangelical Christians and the Bible study is led by a man who believes Jesus is the messiah of the Jewish people.

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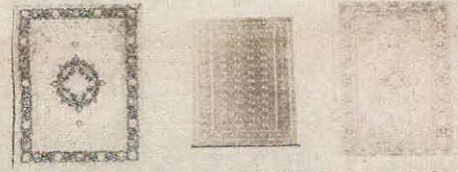

No Regrets

A year after the Gulf War, President Bush says America's goals were met.

One year after the end of the Persian Gulf war, President George Bush doesn't hide his concern at some of the unfinished business of that conflict. He is unhappy that Saddam Hussein is still in power but he rejects any of the criticism that he ended the war too soon.

Mr. Bush remains convinced that the possible existence of biological, chemical and atomic weapons, as well as the use of terrorism, are threats that still need to be eradicated in the region, though he will not comment on reports that the U.S. is waging a war of nerves to oust the Iraqi leader.

In an exclusive interview in the Oval Office, Mr. Bush had positive things to say about Israel, crediting the Jewish state for not retaliating to Iraqi Scud missile attacks during the war and for taking part in the Mideast peace negotiations.

Mr. Bush said that the U.S.-led coalition "could have fallen apart" if Israel had responded to the Iraqi attacks. He also noted that the U.S. should receive credit "for the fact that we have significantly reduced the threat to Israel from a militant, highly armed Saddam Hussein."

"If the threat is still there, we must continue to keep on it until we eliminate that threat which means fulfillment of those [relevant] United Nations resolutions."

Mr. Bush said he was

"absolutely satisfied" with the conduct and outcome of the war.

"We were able to achieve our immediate objectives — namely, expelling Iraq from Kuwait, securing oil resources for the world's economy, and curtailing, in a major way, Iraq's ability to threaten its neighbors."

"In addition, the international community's concerted action underscored the principles that aggression will not be rewarded. Kuwait is now free and enjoying the fruits of freedom. The troops and the commanders were superb and performed in a brilliant manner. They epitomize the highest ideals of the U.S."

Mr. Bush added: "What I am not satisfied about is that Saddam refuses to abide by subsequent resolutions of the United Nations, and refuses to keep his word on doing something about reparations and the environmental damage that he wrought."

Saddam Hussein, he said, is "a menace" and "a bully" who is brutally "tyrannizing his own people."

Whether or not Saddam is removed from power, Mr. Bush believes that the international community should continue to monitor what's going on in Iraq to insure that its weapons of mass destruction — nuclear, biological, chemical and missile — no longer exist and cannot and will not be rebuilt.

"We have to be sure of that," he said, "and the way to be sure is to see that these inspections are fully carried out. Then, Iraq won't have the capability."

Asked about evidence that Saddam Hussein was on the brink of having nuclear weapons, as well as about reports of his determination to use them against Israel and Saudi Arabia, Mr. Bush said, "We debated up to, and during the war, exactly what Saddam's nuclear potential was. There are some differences on that, but we found that the inspections confirm the view that Saddam was getting 'pretty close' to having nuclear weapons. And he is so hostile to Israel, so determined to threaten it and so reckless that I believe he might well have threatened Israel with nuclear weapons. He certainly could have threatened Saudi Arabia with them as well."

The president believes that the success of the Gulf War established a climate in the Mideast which allowed his current peace process to take place, and he says he will continue to facilitate the efforts of all the parties toward peace. "It is however, up to them to overcome centuries of prejudice and conflict and take the steps toward peace," he said. "We took a major step forward when both sides agreed to direct bilateral negotiations, and we stand ready to assist in these efforts."

As for any impact on the peace process from his Gulf success, Mr. Bush concludes that the strong leadership role taken by the United States has given him a new-found credibility with all the Mideast countries. "They saw that when we said we would do something, we did it," Mr. Bush noted. "A lot of countries in the Mideast didn't believe we would do that. So we have a credibility unlike anything we have had before. I want to use that credibility to have these peace talks succeed. Israel has been very good about coming to the table, and we're trying to encourage all participants to be forthcoming."

Mr. Bush expressed satisfaction that Iran used its influence to help in the release of the (western) hostages in Lebanon, but he continues to be cautious about prospects for improved relations with the fundamentalist regime in Teheran. He said: "We remain deeply troubled by other aspects of Iranian policy, including continued support for terrorism and its opposition to the Arab-Israeli peace process. We recognize that Iran has an important role to play in the Gulf, and we're open to talks with the leadership in Teheran on the issues that divide our two countries." □

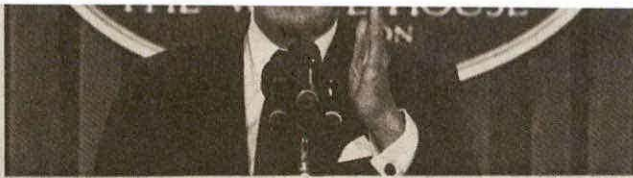

SUPREME COURT AGREES TO REVIEW PENNSYLVANIA LAW

On January 21, the Supreme Court agreed to hear *Planned Parenthood of Southeastern Pennsylvania v. Casey*, the first abortion case to be considered since Justice Clarence Thomas joined the court.

Known as the "Abortion Control Act," the Pennsylvania law requires that women know something about the development of their unborn child as well as alternatives to abortion, a minimal waiting period (24 hours), one parent consent for girls under 18 (with a judicial bypass), commonsensical reporting requirements by abortionists to the state health department, and (in

most instances) that the spouse be notified in advance of the abortion.

For abortion advocates, this presents serious problems. As one senior advisor to a Democratic presidential contender told the *Washington Times*, "If we end up discussing the Pennsylvania statute, we lose. Most parents think they ought to be involved in deciding whether their teen-age daughter has an abortion..."

As a consequence, pro-abortion forces are trying to deflect attention from the statute itself and to persuade the public that if the Court

Congress Leaders To Force Votes on National Pro-Abortion Bill; Speaker Foley Predicts Passage This Year

WASHINGTON (January 30) - The Speaker of the House of Representatives Congressman Tom Foley (D-Wa.), says that if the Supreme Court abandons *Roe v. Wade*, Congress will pass a federal law this year to preserve legal abortion nationwide.

The National Right to Life Committee (NRLC) and pro-life congressional leaders are determined to prove him wrong.

To accomplish that, pro-life activists nationwide must focus public scrutiny on the radical scope of the pro-abortion bill that Foley and other Democratic congressional leaders are pushing - the so-called Freedom of Choice Act (FOCA)

(H.R. 25, S. 25).

In nationally televised remarks on January 28, Foley presented the Democratic Party's "response" to President Bush's State of the Union address. Foley said, "If the Supreme Court removes the guarantee of choice from the Constitution of the United States, this Congress will write it into the laws of the United States."

In remarks at the National Press Club on January 24, Foley said that if *Roe* is overturned, "Congress will most certainly pass national abortion rights legislation and Bush would very likely veto it, setting the stage for an acrimonious fight over and attempt to override the veto," according to a report in the *Seattle Post-Intelligencer*.

The FOCA is the major legislative

priority for NOW, NARAL, and other organizations that oppose any legal limits on abortion. All five major Democratic presidential contenders have endorsed the bill.

It is expected that House and Senate committees will hold hearings on the bill, and perhaps vote on it, before the Supreme Court hands down its decision on Pennsylvania's abortion law. That ruling is most likely to be issued in June or early July.

However, it is unlikely that the bill's sponsors will bring it to the floor of either house until the Supreme Court actually hands down its decision. If, as expected, the Court upholds Pennsylvania's modest law regulating abortion, we
