Hillary Clinton Says Media Shield Bush

Statements in Vanity Fair Interview Question President's Private Life

Hillary Clinton, wife of Democratic presidential front-runner Bill Clinton, charges in a magazine interview that the "establishment" has shielded President Bush from inquiries into rumors of a past extramarital relationship.

In a profile of Hillary Clinton by writer Gail Sheehy in the May edition of *Vanity Fair*, the Arkansas governor's wife said there is a double standard between the news media's treatment of allegations that her husband has had extramarital affairs and rumors about Bush.

"I'm convinced part of it is that the establishment—regardless of party—sticks together," Sheehy quotes Hillary Clinton as saying. "They're gonna circle the wagons."

Last night, Mary Matalin, political director of the Bush-Quayle campaign, dismissed the allegations about Bush as "recycled Democratic trash.... We've been through this. It's been disproven."

In June 1987, George W. Bush, the president's eldest son, told *Newsweek* that he had asked his father whether

he had committed adultery. "The answer to the 'Big A' question is N-O," the magazine quoted the younger Bush as saying.

In the *Vanity Fair* article, Hillary Clinton is quoted as saying that the subject had come up in a conversation she had with Anne Cox Chambers, chairman of Atlanta Newspapers Inc., which publishes the *Atlanta Journal and Constitution*.

Sheehy writes that Clinton said Chambers went into "this long description of, you know, Bush and his carrying on, all of which is apparently well known in Washington."

Chambers, daughter of 1920 Democratic presidential nominee James M.

Cox, was U.S. ambassador to Belgium under President Jimmy Carter.

During the 1988 presidential campaign, Bush was dogged by persistent rumors in Washington that he had had a longtime relationship with an aide, a woman who had worked for him for nearly two decades in the executive branch and continues to hold a mid-level government post. The rumor was never substantiated although various news organizations, including *The Washington Post*, investigated it.

While Bush was vice president, his senior aides attributed the rumor to animosity toward the woman by other staff members, who said she too jealously guarded access to Bush and had

a temperament unsuited to her jobs. Bush, the woman and his staff flatly denied the rumors when confronted by reporters in 1982.

In the 1988 campaign, a top aide to Bush's Democratic competitor, Massachusetts Gov. Michael S. Dukakis, resigned after suggesting to reporters that Bush had had an extramarital relationship.

"I never thought I'd ever say anything good about the Dukakis campaign, but when they made this trashy accusation, the accuser was fired," Matalin said. "I guess Bill [Clinton] can't fire his wife."

In a statement issued by the Clinton campaign late last night, Hillary Clinton said, "I responded to questions that people were asking at the time. Nobody knows better than I do the pain that can be caused by discussing rumors, even in private conversations, and I didn't mean to be hurtful to anyone."

Hillary apologizes about Bush rumor

A contrite Hillary Clinton yesterday apologized for spreading rumors about President Bush's alleged affair with a long-time staffer.

The wife of Democratic presidential candidate Bill Clinton, whose campaign was rocked in January by charges of adultery, said the President and First Lady Barbara Bush should be spared the grilling that the Clintons have endured.

body knows better than how painful discussions of rumors can be. Clinton said carefully measured words when asked about her comments by the Daily News.

"I wouldn't want anybody to see, and I certainly don't want the Bush family, subjected to that," she said after addressing a rally at the College of Saint Rose in Albany.

Clinton's remarks about Bush appear in a lengthy article — "What Hillary Wants" — in the May issue of Vanity Fair, which goes on sale here Wednesday, one day after the local New York primary.

In the article by Gail Sheehy, Clinton rips the press "double standard" for supporting Gennifer Flowers' allegations while ignoring longstanding rumors about Bush's alleged relationship.

"I'm convinced part of it is the Establishment — regardless of party — sticks together. They're gonna circle the wagons on (Bush's) Jennifer and all these other people."

Candidate concurs

The Arkansas governor, who met with Gov. Cuomo yesterday, said he shared his wife's apology.

"I don't think these matters ought to be a part of presidential politics," he said.

Bush's campaign spokesman, Tony Mitchell, yesterday offered this statement:

"We certainly would be pleased if, in fact, the Clintons have drawn the right personal conclusion about the reckless and irresponsible nature of her statements to Vanity Fair.

"We hope this campaign will be properly focused on who has the leadership, the experience, the ability and the character to address the challenges facing the American people."

Clinton suggested yesterday her remarks were off the record but conceded she might be mistaken.

"It was a private conversation," Clinton said. "My point is, even if it were, I should not have responded, and it

was done in the most difficult of times or the experience that Bill and I went through."

Sheehy disputed Clinton's claim that the conversation was private.

According to Sheehy, she went over Clinton's quotes on Bush's alleged affair as recently as March 26 in a final interview.

"I wanted to give her an opportunity to elaborate or correct anything she thought was imprecise," Sheehy told The News. "She recalled it. She looked uncomfortable, but she didn't deny it or ask to change anything."

Sheehy said she couldn't tell whether Clinton wanted to get the Bush rumor out to warn Republicans to back off on questioning her husband's character.

"Whether this was Hillary the wife or Hillary the clever strategist and litigator talking, I couldn't say," said Sheehy.

Democratic consultant Bob Squier, who isn't affiliated with any candidate, said that if the Clintons wanted the issue out, they wouldn't have used a monthly magazine.

"Her comments sound like the kind of frustration one would feel when one is being dealt with unfairly, and that, in fact, is the situation," said Squier. "The bottom line is the Clintons have had to answer the Gennifer question and George Bush has yet to answer the Jennifer question with a J." The Clintons appeared on CBS-TV's "60 Minutes" to respond to Flowers'

allegation of a 12-year affair. The former nightclub singer made the charge in a paid interview with a supermarket tabloid.

Gov. Clinton yesterday said there was no calculated attempt to get out the rumors about Bush.

The high-powered Clinton has been considered perhaps her husband's greatest asset, and at the Albany rally some women wore buttons support-

ing "Hillary's husband."

But the 44-year-old lawyer-activist has also offended women who choose to stay at home with their families.

Responding to Jerry Brown's attacks on her law firm's business dealings with Arkansas, Clinton said she could have chosen to just "stay home and bake cookies and hold teas."

That remark touched a nerve, and outside yesterday's rally several women set up a table to give away cookies and brownies.

One held a sign, "Cookie bakers for Jerry Brown."
