The Power of One

The White House Story

A Dog, a Dad and, Yes, an Evil Veterinarian

"Beethoven" is no classic, but it's a sunny, energetic children's film with a good notion of what young audiences like. That includes a gruff, lovable Dad (Charles Grodin) who takes a lot of pratfalls, a wide range of mess-minded sight gags and, of course, a shaggy dog story, complete with huge, drooling shaggy dog.

First seen as a cuter-than-cute St. Bernard puppy, the pooch of the title strays into the lives of the Newton family, who are living the 1990's equivalent of a 1950's sitcom dream. Father thinks he knows best, and he certainly thinks the house ought to be clean. So he is staunchly against keeping the puppy when it appears. His idea of a pet is a goldfish or an ant farm, not a St. Bernard.

Naturally, this leads to a funny montage of paw prints and puddles and glimpses of Dad angrily scrubbing the carpet while Mom (Bonnie Hunt) and three dog-loving children (Nicholle Tom, Christopher Castile and Oliver Platt) look on. Finally, the dog is allowed to stay, and named Beethoven after it barks enthusiastically during a rendition of the Fifth Symphony.

Eager to hold young viewers' attention, "Beethoven" includes two different sets of villains: dog-craving lab technicians, led by the evil veterinarian Dr. Varnick (Dean Jones); and a yuppie couple, Brad (David Duchovny) and Brie (Patricia Heaton), who are plotting to take over the air-freshener business run by George Newton (the aforementioned Dad). The last two aren't around for long, but they make fine targets for the dog's pranks, especially after they refer to George as Giorgio.

"Beethoven" depends chiefly on the dog's wide array of stunts, Mr. Grodin's even wider range of slow burns and serviceably lively direc-

tion by Brian Levant, who has definitely come a long way since "Problem Child 2." An enjoyable score by Randy Edelman consists mainly of standard-sounding movie music, but occasionally flirts with the real Bee-

thoven for a bar or two.

"Beethoven" is rated PG (Parental guidance suggested). It includes mild profanity, slight violence and various doggie messes.

A Youngster Against The Power of Apartheid

John G. Avildsen directs the pious South African drama "The Power of One" as if it were "The Anti-Apartheid Kid," chronicling the brave attempts of a little blond, blue-eyed boy named P. K. to fight racial injustice. The battle is waged mostly in terms of toothless platitudes ("a waterfall begins with only one drop of water") and ugly encounters with racist bullies, encounters that Mr. Avildsen prefers shooting in close-up whenever possible. On the affirmative side, the boy's every triumph is accompanied by Johnny Clegg's soaring choral music (and Hans Zimmer's instrumental score).

P. K. (played by three actors of different ages, none of whom especially resemble the others) is introduced as a small, wise child during a shapeless preamble. Typically, this part of the film is edited so unemphatically that it appears to place equal emphasis on the little boy's bed-wetting and the death of his mother. It is half an hour before the excellent Morgan Freeman and Armin Mueller-Stahl enter P. K.'s story as an African prison inmate and the boy's kindly German grandfather, thus giving the film at least some reason to exist.

The grandfather, Doc, has been incarcerated by South African authorities for the duration of World War II, and P. K. follows him to prison. "Inside, everyone was concerned with just one thing — the outcome of the inter-prison boxing championships," P. K. says in voice-over, thereby explaining the presence of Mr. Avildsen ("Rocky" I and V, "The Karate Kid" I, II and II) in these unfamiliar waters. When an older P. K. enrolls in high school (where the vastly overqualified John Gielgud has been cast as his headmaster), another boxing tournament lies in store.

The film's facile treatment of racial issues may be enough to bring back the practice of throwing tomatoes at the screen. Huge throngs of black extras (many played by members of the Masibemunye Bulawayo Choir, a large choral group that provides much of the stirring score) are often seen responding admiringly to the overtures of a lone white boy. At one point, the adolescent P. K. (Simon Fenton) even tries to conduct their

musical efforts, though he demonstrably has no talent.

When the 18-year-old P. K. (Stephen Dorff) jogs through a black township, he is treated with similar reverence. The film's black characters are even said to believe P. K. has magical powers, thanks to the hints dropped by Mr. Freeman's Geel Piet, a bald, barefoot prisoner with a disconcertingly servile manner (he refers to P. K. as "Little Boss"). Mr. Freeman's humanity and intelligence are unmistakable, as always, but not even he can rise above the wretchedness of this role. When Geel Piet is forced to eat excrement by a white prison guard, the camera zeroes in for yet another close-up image of humiliation.

"The Power of One," with a screenplay by Robert Mark Kamen based on Bryce Courtenay's novel, must surely be less obvious on the page than it is on screen. The film is often regrettably blunt, as when the story's fascist Afrikaner villains literally drink a toast to apartheid, or when P. K.'s feeble Romeo-and-Juliet romance with the daughter (Fay Masterson) of this Afrikaner family is filmed as if it were "Romeo and Juliet," balcony and all. The film's occasional jarring elements, like the presence of what looks like a nuclear power plant near a black township in the late 1940's, are a welcome diversion.

"The Power of One" is rated PG-13 (Parents strongly cautioned). It includes profanity and graphic violence.

1992 FILM FESTIVAL

INSIDE THE WHITE HOUSE: DOCUMENTARY PERSPECTIVES

To celebrate the 200th anniversary of the White House in 1992, the National Archives and the White House Historical Association will present in Washington, D.C., a ten-week festival, "Inside the White House: Documentary Perspectives." The program will offer films, as well as sound recordings and photographs, that have documented the Executive Mansion--both in terms of its architecture and the lives of its inhabitants. The programs are free on Fridays at Noon in the National Archives Theater (Pennsylvania Avenue entrance).

April 10

"Within These Walls: A Visit to the White House," 1991. This documentary uses rare historical prints, photographs and motion pictures to show the evolution of the White House during the past 200 years. An extensive video tour, supplemented by computer-generated floor plans, completes this succinct and informative video. This program will be introduced by James Rogal, Executive Producer of "Within These Walls." (33 minutes)

April 17

"The White House: Archive Treasures." Bonnie G. Rowen will present a special program of rare motion pictures and photographs of the White House she discovered while researching the film, "Within These Walls" (see April 10). Among the rare items to be presented are an Easter egg roll on the White House lawn at the turn of the century, President Hoover leading his cabinet in outdoor calisthenics, and Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt receiving the Hollywood Victory Caravan in 1942. (60 minutes)

April 24

"FDR and the Fireside Chats." Radio engineer Granville Klink will discuss his experiences in the Roosevelt White House where he assisted the president during his famous "Fireside Chats." Mr. Klink joined WJSV (now WTOP radio) in 1937 and remains with the station to this day. In addition to recorded selections from these broadcasts, we will present two short films about the Roosevelt years: "Inside the White House" (1938) and "Fala" (1943). (60 minutes)

May 1

"President Truman's tour of the White House," 1952. President Truman takes us on a tour of the newly renovated White House in this rare television kinescope. This program would provide the model upon which later television tours would be based. (45 minutes)

May 8

"The White House Story," 1967. In what is perhaps the most comprehensive single film about the White House, this documentary provides us with an anecdotal history of the Executive Mansion from its first occupancy by President John Adams to its thirty-fourth occupant, President Lyndon B. Johnson. (50 minutes)

May 15

"A Tour of the White House with Mrs. John F. Kennedy," 1961. In this Emmy Award-winning program, Mrs. Kennedy discusses the meaning and significance of the White House, by focusing upon some of the historical figures who contributed to its construction and reconstruction. (58 minutes)

May 22

"Being with John F. Kennedy," 1983. The cinema verite style of documentary was made possible with the introduction of portable cameras and sound recording equipment in the late 1950s. For the first time, filmmakers were able to move freely about with their subjects, permitting more immediacy and candor. As presidential candidate and president, John F. Kennedy was impressed with the possibilities of this new form and allowed filmmaker Robert Drew unprecedented access to his presidential campaign and to the White House. Today Mr. Drew will discuss this period of his career and screen "Being with John F. Kennedy," a compilation of the best material filmed--some of which has not been seen before. (100 minutes)

May 29

"Once in a Lifetime," 1967. The White House has occasionally been the site of weddings, of presidents and their immediate families. The major White House event of the 1967 was the wedding of President Johnson's daughter, Lynda. Today, Lynda Johnson Robb will introduce excerpts from "Once in a Lifetime," the official film record of the wedding. (60 minutes)

June 5

"In Performance at the White House." Throughout much of its history, the White House has been a major showcase of popular and classical entertainment. Today, we present some of the best performances of the last three decades from the holdings of the National Archives and WETA-TV. (60 minutes)

June 12

"A Day in the Life of the White House," 1990. This program is an in-depth look at the daily workings of the White House. It not only examines the actions of the President, but also of those around him--and how information is filtered up to him for his attention. Produced by NBC News. (60 minutes)

Hollywood and the White House and *Inside the White House: Documentary Perspectives* film programs are being supported in part by the National Endowment for the Humanities.

NETWORK NEWS REACTION
TO THE PRESIDENT'S OVAL OFFICE ADDRESS

ABC

ABC'S BRIAN ROONEY in Los Angeles concurred with President Bush's assertion that Los Angeles is calmer today than it was last night. He said there are a lot more National Guard troops there now, and there is no opportunity to riot on the scale of last night.

When PETER JENNINGS asked if the relative calm resulted from the President's actions or the exhaustion of the rioters, Rooney responded that the riots had burned themselves out.

MAYOR BRADLEY praised President Bush for doing everything Bradley and civil rights leaders asked the President to do and for taking action to restore peace and order. "(He has done) everything that we've asked him to do and I have been very pleased with his quick response and with his total commitment to bring about peace and order, to restore this tranquility of the streets of Los Angeles."

He said he is pleased with the President's dispatch of federal law enforcement officers and troops, saying the troops, with the police and National Guard, would get the situation under control.

BENJAMIN HOOKS said he thinks the President's done a good job tonight in dealing with the concerns civil rights leaders voiced in their meeting with him today. He was glad to see that the President was going to enforce Title 18.

BILL CLINTON said the President did a good job taking the steps that needed to be taken in this situation. He said if he were president he'd sign the crime bill now pending in Congress and address the issues of health care, education, and economic empowerment to avoid what's happened in Los Angeles over the past two days.

CNN

CNN'S GREG LAMOTT said the President's message tonight will undoubtedly be extremely well received in Los Angeles.

A Dog, a Dad and, Yes, an Evil Veterinarian

"Beethoven" is no classic, but it's a sunny, energetic children's film with a good notion of what young audiences like. That includes a gruff, lovable Dad (Charles Grodin) who takes a lot of pratfalls, a wide range of mess-minded sight gags and, of course, a shaggy dog story, complete with huge, drooling shaggy dog.

First seen as a cuter-than-cute St. Bernard puppy, the pooch of the title strays into the lives of the Newton family, who are living the 1990's equivalent of a 1950's sitcom dream. Father thinks he knows best, and he certainly thinks the house ought to be clean. So he is staunchly against keeping the puppy when it appears. His idea of a pet is a goldfish or an ant farm, not a St. Bernard.

Naturally, this leads to a funny montage of paw prints and puddles and glimpses of Dad angrily scrubbing the carpet while Mom (Bonnie Hunt) and three dog-loving children (Nicholle Tom, Christopher Castile and Oliver Platt) look on. Finally, the dog is allowed to stay, and named Beethoven after it barks enthusiastically during a rendition of the Fifth Symphony.

Eager to hold young viewers' attention, "Beethoven" includes two different sets of villains: dog-craving lab technicians, led by the evil veterinarian Dr. Varnick (Dean Jones); and a yuppie couple, Brad (David Duchovny) and Brie (Patricia Heaton), who are plotting to take over the air-freshener business run by George Newton (the aforementioned Dad). The last two aren't around for long, but they make fine targets for the dog's pranks, especially after they refer to George as Giorglo.

"Beethoven" depends chiefly on the dog's wide array of stunts, Mr. Grodin's even wider range of slow burns and serviceably lively direc-

tion by Brian Levant, who has definitely come a long way since "Problem Child 2." An enjoyable score by Randy Edelman consists mainly of standard-sounding movie music, but occasionally flirts with the real Bee-

thoven for a bar or two.

"Beethoven" is rated PG (Parental guidance suggested). It includes mild profanity, slight violence and various doggie messes.

A Youngster Against The Power of Apartheid

John G. Avildsen directs the pious South African drama "The Power of One" as if it were "The Anti-Apartheid Kid," chronicling the brave attempts of a little blond, blue-eyed boy named P. K. to fight racial injustice. The battle is waged mostly in terms of toothless platitudes ("a waterfall begins with only one drop of water") and ugly encounters with racist bullies, encounters that Mr. Avildsen prefers shooting in close-up whenever possible. On the affirmative side, the boy's every triumph is accompanied by Johnny Clegg's soaring choral music (and Hans Zimmer's instrumental score).

P. K. (played by three actors of different ages, none of whom especially resemble the others) is introduced as a small, wise child during a shapeless preamble. Typically, this part of the film is edited so unemphatically that it appears to place equal emphasis on the little boy's bed-wetting and the death of his mother. It is half an hour before the excellent Morgan Freeman and Armin Mueller-Stahl enter P. K.'s story as an African prison inmate and the boy's kindly German grandfather, thus giving the film at least some reason to exist.

The grandfather, Doc, has been incarcerated by South African authorities for the duration of World War II, and P. K. follows him to prison. "Inside, everyone was concerned with just one thing — the outcome of the inter-prison boxing championships," P. K. says in voice-over, thereby explaining the presence of Mr. Avildsen ("Rocky" I and V, "The Karate Kid" I, II and III) in these unfamiliar waters. When an older P. K. enrolls in high school (where the vastly over-qualified John Gielgud has been cast as his headmaster), another boxing tournament lies in store.

The film's facile treatment of racial issues may be enough to bring back the practice of throwing tomatoes at the screen. Huge throngs of black extras (many played by members of the Masibemunye Bulawayo Choir, a large choral group that provides much of the stirring score) are often seen responding admiringly to the overtures of a lone white boy. At one point, the adolescent P. K. (Simon Fenton) even tries to conduct their

musical efforts, though he demonstrably has no talent.

When the 18-year-old P. K. (Stephen Dorff) jogs through a black township, he is treated with similar reverence. The film's black characters are even said to believe P. K. has magical powers, thanks to the hints dropped by Mr. Freeman's Geel Piet, a bald, barefoot prisoner with a disconcertingly servile manner (he refers to P. K. as "Little Boss"). Mr. Freeman's humanity and intelligence are unmistakable, as always, but not even he can rise above the wretchedness of this role. When Geel Piet is forced to eat excrement by a white prison guard, the camera zeroes in for yet another close-up image of humiliation.

"The Power of One," with a screenplay by Robert Mark Kamen based on Bryce Courtenay's novel, must surely be less obvious on the page than it is on screen. The film is often regrettably blunt, as when the story's fascist Afrikaner villains literally drink a toast to apartheid, or when P. K.'s feeble Romeo-and-Juliet romance with the daughter (Fay Masterson) of this Afrikaner family is filmed as if it were "Romeo and Juliet," balcony and all. The film's occasional jarring elements, like the presence of what looks like a nuclear power plant near a black township in the late 1940's, are a welcome diversion.

"The Power of One" is rated PG-13 (Parents strongly cautioned). It includes profanity and graphic violence.

1992 FILM FESTIVAL

INSIDE THE WHITE HOUSE: DOCUMENTARY PERSPECTIVES

To celebrate the 200th anniversary of the White House in 1992, the National Archives and the White House Historical Association will present in Washington, D.C., a ten-week festival, "Inside the White House: Documentary Perspectives." The program will offer films, as well as sound recordings and photographs, that have documented the Executive Mansion--both in terms of its architecture and the lives of its inhabitants. The programs are free on Fridays at Noon in the National Archives Theater (Pennsylvania Avenue entrance).

April 10

"Within These Walls: A Visit to the White House," 1991. This documentary uses rare historical prints, photographs and motion pictures to show the evolution of the White House during the past 200 years. An extensive video tour, supplemented by computer-generated floor plans, completes this succinct and informative video. This program will be introduced by James Rogal, Executive Producer of "Within These Walls." (33 minutes)

April 17

"The White House: Archive Treasures." Bonnie G. Rowen will present a special program of rare motion pictures and photographs of the White House she discovered while researching the film, "Within These Walls" (see April 10). Among the rare items to be presented are an Easter egg roll on the White House lawn at the turn of the century, President Hoover leading his cabinet in outdoor calisthenics, and Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt receiving the Hollywood Victory Caravan in 1942. (60 minutes)

April 24

"FDR and the Fireside Chats." Radio engineer Granville Klink will discuss his experiences in the Roosevelt White House where he assisted the president during his famous "Fireside Chats." Mr. Klink joined WJSV (now WTOP radio) in 1937 and remains with the station to this day. In addition to recorded selections from these broadcasts, we will present two short films about the Roosevelt years: "Inside the White House" (1938) and "Fala" (1943). (60 minutes)

May 1

"President Truman's tour of the White House," 1952. President Truman takes us on a tour of the newly renovated White House in this rare television kinescope. This program would provide the model upon which later television tours would be based. (45 minutes)

May 8

"The White House Story," 1967. In what is perhaps the most comprehensive single film about the White House, this documentary provides us with an anecdotal history of the Executive Mansion from its first occupancy by President John Adams to its thirty-fourth occupant, President Lyndon B. Johnson. (50 minutes)

May 15

"A Tour of the White House with Mrs. John F. Kennedy," 1961. In this Emmy Award-winning program, Mrs. Kennedy discusses the meaning and significance of the White House, by focusing upon some of the historical figures who contributed to its construction and reconstruction. (58 minutes)

May 22

"Being with John F. Kennedy," 1983. The cinema verite style of documentary was made possible with the introduction of portable cameras and sound recording equipment in the late 1950s. For the first time, filmmakers were able to move freely about with their subjects, permitting more immediacy and candor. As presidential candidate and president, John F. Kennedy was impressed with the possibilities of this new form and allowed filmmaker Robert Drew unprecedented access to his presidential campaign and to the White House. Today Mr. Drew will discuss this period of his career and screen "Being with John F. Kennedy," a compilation of the best material filmed--some of which has not been seen before. (100 minutes)

May 29

"Once in a Lifetime," 1967. The White House has occasionally been the site of weddings, of presidents and their immediate families. The major White House event of the 1967 was the wedding of President Johnson's daughter, Lynda. Today, Lynda Johnson Robb will introduce excerpts from "Once in a Lifetime," the official film record of the wedding. (60 minutes)

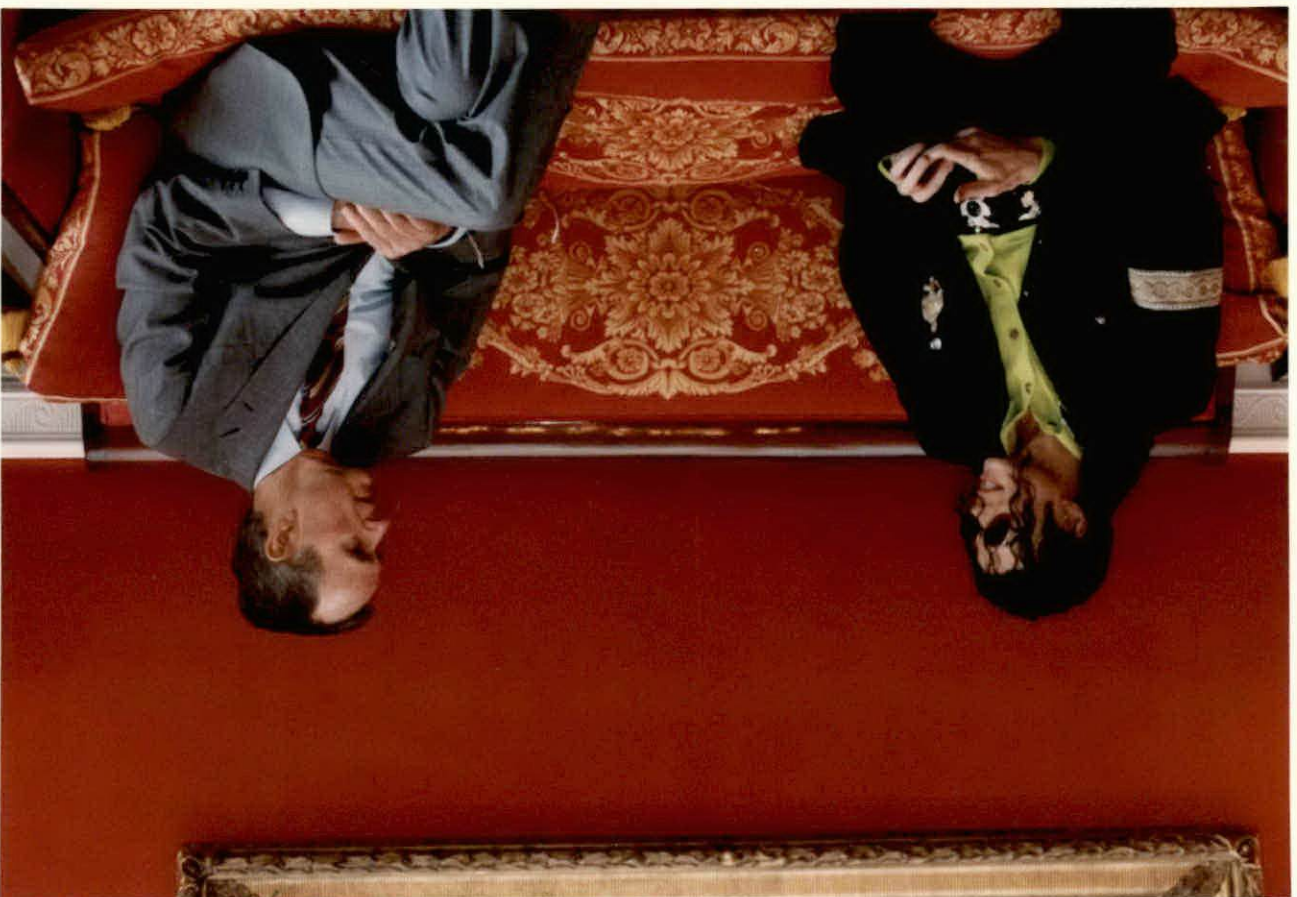
June 5

June 12

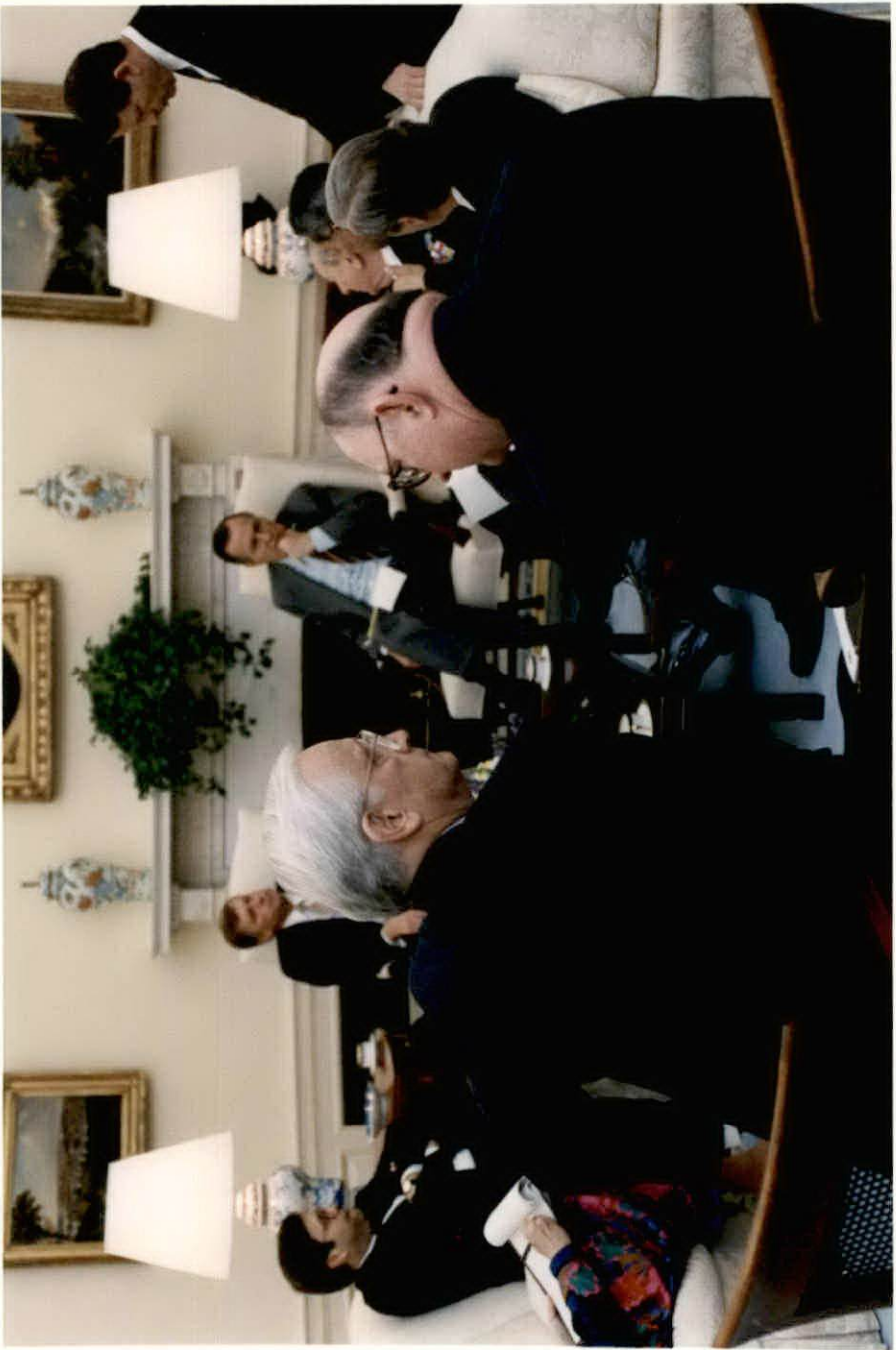

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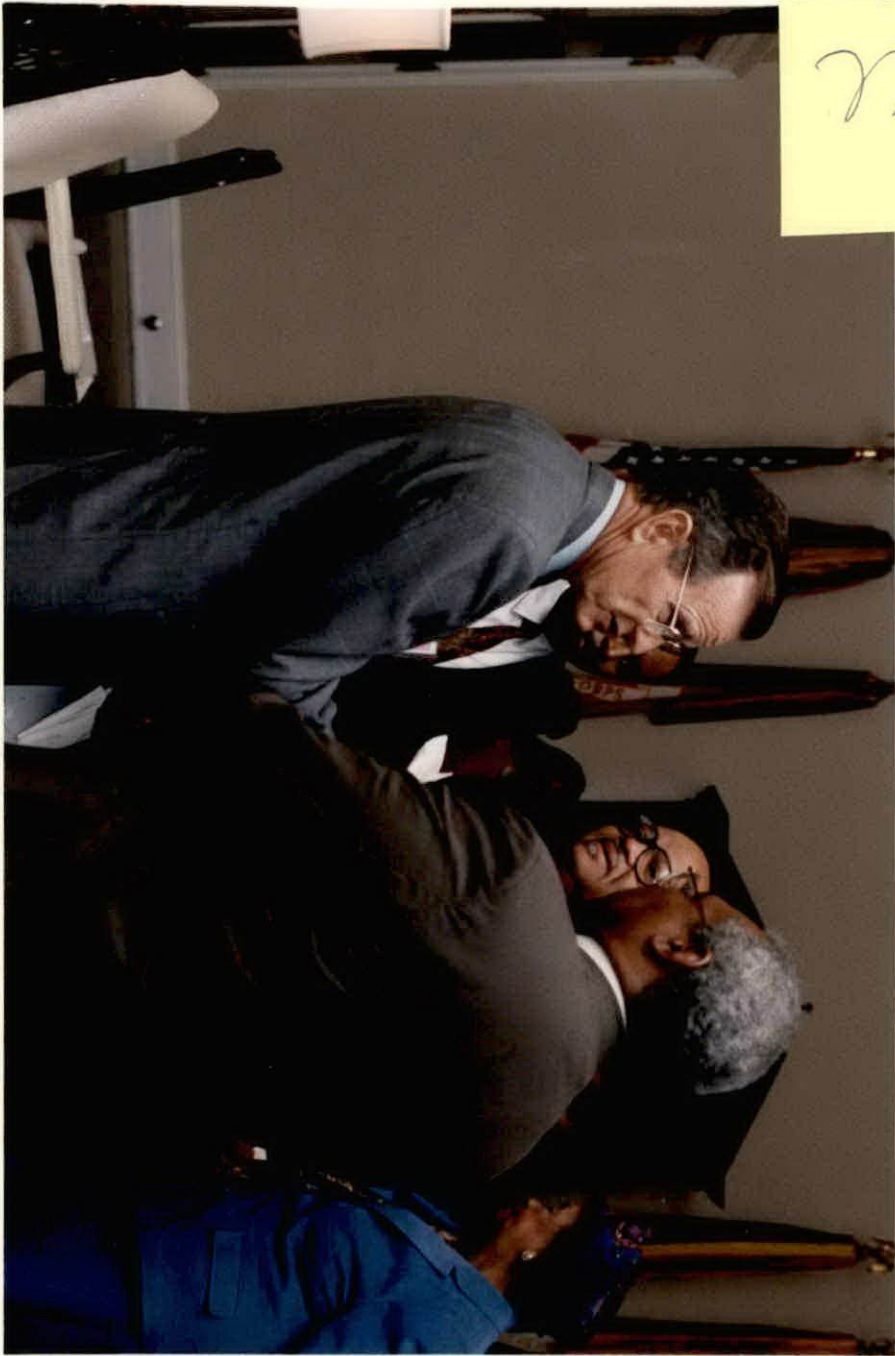

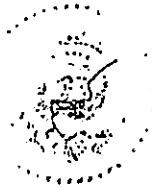
