We are proud to see our flag waving majestically over the sports stadium, as we stand and sing the Star Spangled Banner. Our hearts swell and our throats lump when we hear "Taps" played on Memorial Day, or watch our country's athletes race around an olympic stadium with a large American flag in-hand. These displays of prideful emotion are, however, short-lived...the National Anthem ends and the games begin; "Taps" cease ringing through the air, and the picnic is underway; the runner has completed his triumphant last lap, and the events continue. All the proud Americans have settled back into the day's events, seldom giving thought to America and what it gives its citizens.

Think, for a moment...Americans are so fortunate to be able to spend time at sporting events or wherever, without having to think or be concerned about the political ramifications surrounding the event, or about attending or not attending. We do what's right for us. We have fun and live for ourselves and our families. How many other nation's citizens can boast that fact?

I've had the good fortune of being able to hop on a 747 and fly to nearly every state in the union. 

MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRESIDENT

SUBJECT: MEETING WITH INDEPENDENT PETROLEUM PRODUCERS

Yesterday, I visited Tyler, Abilene, and Wichita Falls, Texas, to meet with independent petroleum producers. The purpose of the visit was to inform them of your efforts to develop a comprehensive energy strategy and pass legislation to implement certain parts of that strategy. I also went to hear their concerns regarding the industry and their perceptions about your efforts on their behalf.

I can report that you have many friends in Texas who are afraid that the health of the petroleum industry is not as important to the Federal Government as that of the automotive industry. They believe that there is such desperation in the oil patch that anyone who offers simple solutions to the complex problems they face will win their hearts (like Perot). As you know, there are those who are ready to offer sound bite-sized solutions which will not work.

Those with whom I talked have a better understanding of your approach; i.e., by increasing the demand for natural gas, improving petroleum technology transfer to them through the National Technology Initiative, and removing stifling regulations (like treating salt water drilling fluids as hazardous waste), we can make their business more profitable.

They are unanimous in their support of your effort to provide relief from the punitive Alternative Minimum Tax. They oppose the House-passed 5-year limit on this relief. I assured them of your support for the Senate Finance Committee's unrestricted relief...this tax is singularly unfair and should not be reimposed.

They are also unanimously opposed to the House-passed limitation on the rights of producing States to proration their production (the Markey-Scheuer Anti-Prorationing Amendment). I hope strong opposition by the Administration will prevent a similar amendment from being adopted in the Senate.

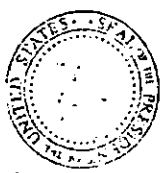

SUBJECT: Weekly Legislative Report

Key Activity, Week of June 29

- o **Freedom Support Act.** Late Thursday evening, the Senate passed your Freedom Support Act, authorizing the U.S. contribution to the \$24 billion multilateral aid package for the former Soviet republics. The vote was 76-20. Timing of House floor action remains uncertain.
- o **Unemployment insurance.** On Thursday, conferees arrived at an acceptable compromise on legislation extending emergency unemployment benefits through March 6, 1993. Both houses then passed the conference report by wide margins. The bill contains sufficient revenue offsets for the cost of the expanded benefits, which exceed \$5 billion over five years.
- o **Enterprise Zones and tax provisions.** Also on Thursday, the House passed, 356-55, an urban aid/revenue package, with all but 6 Republicans supporting the bill. The measure includes a compromise proposal that creates 50 Enterprise Zones (half rural, half urban) and provides a capital gains tax cut for investments in those zones. Other major provisions include: \$2.5 billion for the Weed & Seed program, extension of several politically popular tax credit provisions, repeal of the 10% luxury tax, and passive loss relief for the real estate industry. While a number of problems remain with the bill, we have characterized it as a positive and important step forward, on which we hope to be working intensively with the Senate when they return from recess.
- o **Balanced budget.** The Senate spent most of this week in sometimes partisan and bitter debate on Balanced Budget Amendment proposals. Two efforts at obtaining cloture failed, 56-39. As a result, the issue was dropped; and, under a unanimous consent agreement, the Senate will not return to any Balanced Budget Amendment proposals for the remainder of this Congress.

The Senate then passed, 77-19, the underlying GSE bill, which would establish a new oversight office at HUD to regulate the affairs of government-sponsored enterprises.

- o **Treasury/Postal Appropriations.** On Wednesday, the House passed the Treasury/Postal appropriations bill, 237-166. The House defeated, 183-236, a McDade (R-PA) amendment to restore funds for the Vice President's Council on **Competitiveness**. We believe the vote reflects sufficient strength to sustain a veto on this issue. On the same bill, the House passed, 330-87, a Wise (D-WV) amendment cutting \$18 million from the budget for the Executive Office of the President, an amount proponents argued is roughly comparable to the cut the House took last week in its Legislative Appropriations bill.
- o **Price-fixing.** In a surprising defeat for House Judiciary Committee Chairman Jack Brooks (D-TX), the House refused to adopt the conference report on the Resale Price Maintenance bill, 175-225. The bill, which carried a senior advisors veto threat, would have made it easier for retailers to bring price-fixing claims against manufacturers.
- o **Abortion.** The Freedom of Choice Act, which proponents characterize as a statutory codification of Roe v. Wade, was favorably reported last week by the House Judiciary Committee (20-13) and the Senate Labor Committee (12-5). Both committees adopted modifications that will not alter your senior advisors' veto recommendation. The bill is currently expected to reach the floor of both houses before the Republican convention. We believe we will be able to demonstrate veto strength in both houses, but probably not enough votes to block consideration in the Senate.

Key Upcoming Activity

- o **Calendar.** The Senate will be in recess until the week of July 20, after the Democratic Convention. The House will be in session Tuesday through Thursday of next week and then will also recess until the week of July 20.
- o **Trade.** On Wednesday, the House is expected to take up Chairman Rostenkowski's trade bill, which includes a renewal of the expired Super 301 provision. Although improved in committee, the bill still contains many objectionable provisions. Ambassador Hills would recommend veto.
- o **Higher education.** Next week, the House will also take up the conference report on the Higher Education bill, which passed the Senate by voice vote this week. As a result of modifications made by conferees, including cutting a direct student loan program by half, the Administration has indicated support for the conference report.

Other Significant Congressional Activity**Week of June 29**

- o **Agriculture Appropriations.** On Tuesday, the House passed the Agriculture Appropriations bill, 312-99. On a key vote, the House rejected, 78-333, a Glickman (D-KS) proposal to cut in half the \$70 million in the bill for your **Enterprise for the Americas Initiative**.
- o **Defense Appropriations.** On Thursday, the House passed the DOD Appropriations bill, 328-94. Key amendments proposing further cuts in SDI and the B-2 Bomber were defeated.
- o **Telecommunications.** On Wednesday, the House Judiciary Committee favorably reported, 24-9, legislation sponsored by Chairman Jack Brooks (D-TX) that would slow the entry of regional Bell telephone companies into new businesses. Your senior advisors would recommend veto.
- o **RCRA.** On Thursday, the House Energy & Commerce Committee favorably reported, 27-15, legislation reauthorizing the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, the principal law regulating the disposal of hazardous and solid waste. Despite some improvements in markup, the Administration continues to have strong objections to the bill.
- o **China MFN.** On Thursday, the House Ways & Means Committee reported, by voice vote, a Pease (D-NJ)/Pelosi (D-CA) bill that would revoke Most Favored Nation treatment for goods from Chinese state-owned enterprises if a variety of human rights, trade, and weapons proliferation conditions are not met. This bill, along with a previously reported Solomon (R-NY) resolution that would revoke China's MFN treatment outright, are expected to reach the House floor before the Republican Convention.
- o **START.** On Thursday, the Senate Foreign Relations Committee completed action on the START Treaty, which must still be approved by the Armed Services and Intelligence committees.
- o **Superconducting Super Collider.** The Senate Energy Committee and Energy Appropriations Subcommittee held a joint hearing on the SSC. Witnesses included several of the scientists with whom you met on Tuesday. Appropriations action is expected the week of July 20, with Senate floor action possible the following week.

- o **V-22 Osprey.** On Thursday, Secretary Cheney met with a group of Members to resolve the impasse over whether to move forward with the V-22 tiltrotor aircraft for the Marine Corps. Secretary Cheney announced that he intends to release the FY '92 and '93 funds for advanced technology and operational demonstrations for the V-22.

- o **Nominations.** On Thursday, the Senate confirmed 18 nominations approved earlier that day by the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, most of them career ambassadors, and 19 nominees approved by the Labor Committee. Several other nominations approved by the Labor, Foreign Relations, and Armed Services committees (including David Addington to be DOD General Counsel) were held up, probably because of an unrelated dispute over judicial nominees.

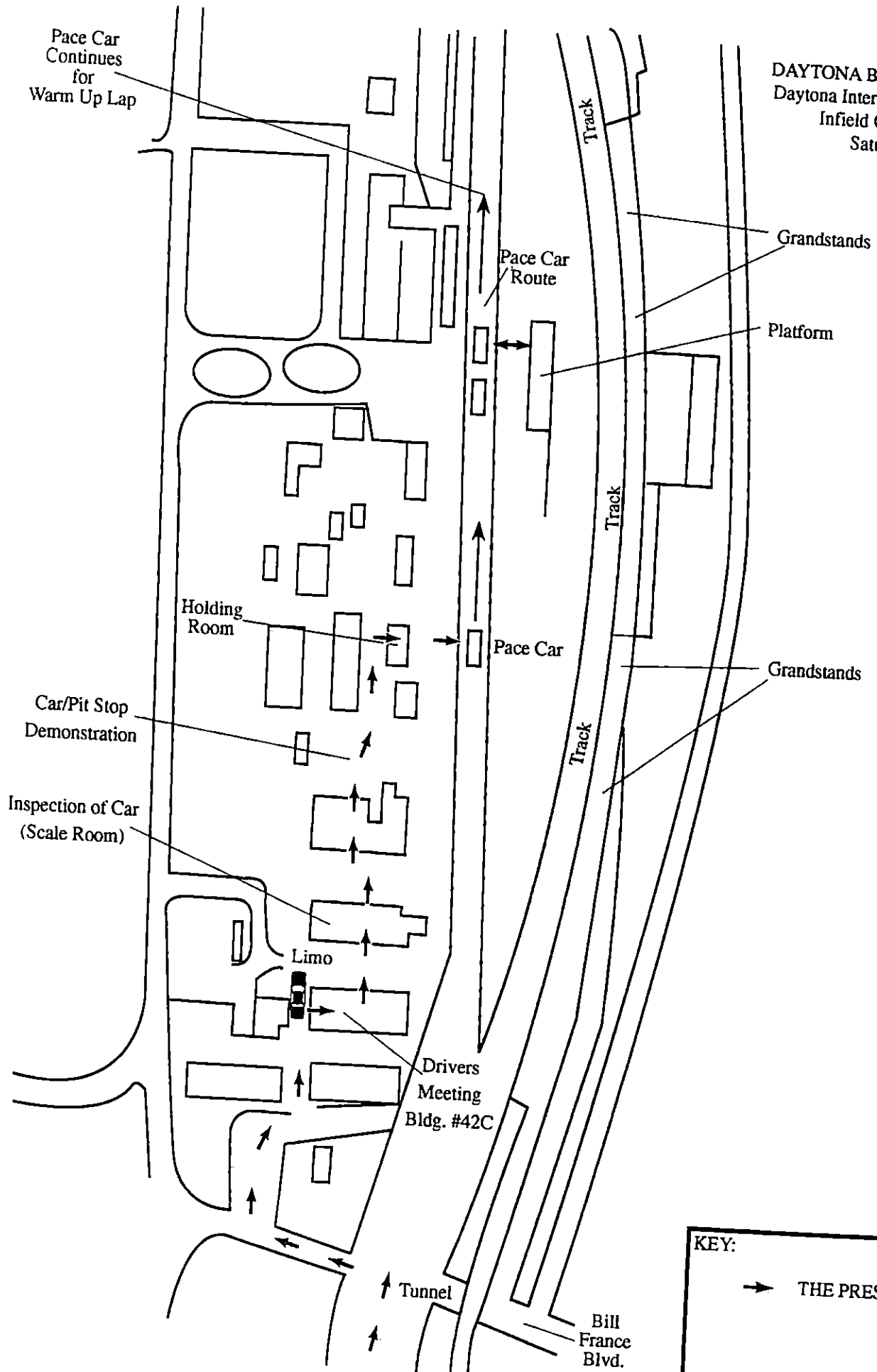

I. Recent Correspondence

Secretary of State Jim Smith (R), State Treasurer Tom Gallagher (R) and Boyton Beach City Clerk Sue Kruse all wrote urging that the U.S. Department of Education use the 1990 Census figures to allocate 1992 Federal Chapter I funds to the states.

State Senator Javier Souto (R-Miami) and State Representative Luis E. Rojas (R-Itialeah) wrote to inform you of the effects of the North American Free Trade Agreement on Florida's agricultural industry, particularly on the potential for Cuban produce to be channeled through Mexico, to the United States.

Coral Springs Mayor Jeanne Mills expressed her concern that increased Federal action and programs were needed in American cities.

Lee County Supervisor of Elections Philinda Young expressed her disapproval of the "Motor-Voter" bill.

II. Discussion

A. Governor Lawton Chiles' State of the State Address

Governor Chiles listed three themes in his State of the State address: change, trust, and faith. While calling for "empowerment of workers" and a decentralization of governmental decision making back into communities, he also called for the largest tax increase in the state's history.

Among other things, the Governor proposed:

-- Investing \$338 million from selected sales tax exemptions and assessments which would increase health care coverage for children and the elderly, including the state's Healthy Start program.

-- Allocating \$215 million to continue efforts to improve the way government delivers services. Part of the program calls for bonuses for state employees that increase productivity.

-- Investing \$130 million in general revenue to ensure public safety. Included are funds to restore 3,100 prison beds that were eliminated last year plus monies for the creation of an additional 3,000 beds.

-- Investing an additional \$600 million for education, including pay raises for teachers and an increase in the enrollment at state universities.

B. Fiscal Year 1993 Budget

On the afternoon of July 1, Governor Chiles signed the state's FY 1993 budget into law, almost a full day after the state's constitutional law deadline had passed.

Florida's FY 1993 budget totals \$31.5 billion, including \$374 million in new taxes. That amount is roughly one-fourth of the \$1.35 billion tax increase that Governor Chiles had originally sought and it almost brought about the third veto of the budget this year.

The budget package also includes \$373 million in supplemental spending above Governor Chiles request. \$242 million of this amount will go for education programs, \$101 million for social service programs, \$14 million for criminal justice, \$7.5 million for beach restoration, and \$7.5 million for general government expenditures.

Please know that Governor Chiles did line-item veto \$14 million in individual expenditures, including \$5 million intended to lure the Pentagon's regional payroll center to Florida.

To reach this final agreement the legislature held 4 special sessions in addition to their 60-day regular session. Governor Chiles vetoed the first two budgets because they did not include any of the \$1.35 billion tax increase he had sought.

C. Unemployment Figures

The latest figures indicate that Florida's unemployment rate was 8.5 percent in June of this year, which is an increase of 1.1 percent from June of 1991. The City of Daytona Beach rate stood at 7.9 percent in April of 1992.

D. Civil Rights

On June 23, 1992, the United States Department of Justice filed a complaint under the Voting Rights Act against the State of Florida to prohibit the implementation of a proposed redistricting plan. According to the Justice Department, the plan for the Florida Senate and House of Representatives would dilute the voting strength of Black and Hispanic citizens in several areas of the state. The Department is currently participating in hearings before a three-judge court in Tallahassee, which is taking testimony on alternatives to the state's proposed plans.

E. Surface Transportation Funding

Florida's FY 1992 apportionment is estimated at \$680.3 million which is up from \$497.8 million in FY 1991. To date, the Department of Transportation has allocated \$450.2 million to the state. The Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act (ISTEA) designates approximately \$4.5 billion for Florida from FY 1992 through FY 1997.

Florida is a "donor" state, having a return rate of about 80 percent on its contributions to the Highway Trust Fund.

F. America 2000

Governor Chiles is verbally committed to the effort but political pressure from the state Democratic party has prevented a formal announcement.

However, fifteen communities in the state have America 2000 programs underway. Daytona Beach is not an America 2000 community.

G. Volusia County Public School System

The City of Daytona Beach is located in Volusia County. Volusia County's school system is recognized as a leader in education reform. It ranks second in the state for the number of microcomputers per student, with 1 for approximately every 5 children. At 92.7 percent, the county graduation rate is the fourth highest in the state.

H. Health Care

On March 24th, Governor Chiles signed into law the Health Care Access Act. The plan provides a process for assuring that all Floridians have access to an affordable basic health care package by December 31, 1994.

The program also includes strategies for promoting voluntary health insurance coverage, insurance reforms, creating a Healthy Communities and Healthy People program, and establishing the Florida Health Services Corporation.

I. Drugs and Crime

Total Federal drug grants to Florida have increased to approximately \$83.1 million in FY 1992, up from \$33.9 million in 1989. Marijuana and cocaine are the drugs of choice in Central Florida and are readily available. In addition, heroin smuggling and abuse have substantially increased in the Daytona Beach area.

Miami is one of the nation's four metropolitan High Intensity Drug Trafficking Areas (HIDTA) because of Florida's significance as a smuggling corridor for Central and South American drugs. In FY 1992, Miami received \$11.9 million in HIDTA funding, which was the largest award to any city in the program.

Over the last few years, the Volusia County Sheriffs Department has seized approximately \$8 million in drug related assets through probable cause arrests along the area's interstate highways. As a result the Volusia County Sheriff, Robert Vogel, has been the subject of several critical front page articles in area newspapers. Recently, a state court ordered the return of \$265,000 seized as part of this program. The Justice Department does not know at this time if the court decision will have any further impact on this program.

Florida has the second highest violent crime rate in the nation--ranking behind only the District of Columbia.

J. DOE's Pinellas Non-Nuclear Production Plant

Operated by the General Electric Company, the Department of Energy's Pinellas plant is primarily responsible for manufacturing non-nuclear components for nuclear weapons.

On December 16, 1991, Secretary Watkins announced a plan to consolidate the Pinellas plant and two other similar plants into one site in Kansas City. The plan will save the taxpayers approximately \$100 million a year.

The Kansas City plant is the preferred site for consolidating most of the non-nuclear activities because consolidation can be achieved there in about half the time and at one third the cost of consolidation at any of the other plants.

Secretary Watkins has ordered an Environmental Assessment (EA) to be conducted in conjunction with his shut-down proposal. Unless the assessment determines a significant environmental impact which would dramatically alter the shut-down, the Pinellas plant is slated to be completely phased out of non-nuclear production operations by the end of FY 1995.

K. Everglades Lawsuit

In 1988, the U.S. Department of Justice initiated litigation against Florida for failure to enforce state water pollution laws. The Department successfully argued that the Everglades National Park and the Loxahatchess National Wildlife Refuge ecosystems were being irreparably damaged by high concentrations of phosphorous and nitrates in the surface water.

A settlement agreement was reached last year between the Federal government, the State of Florida, and the South Florida Management Water Board. The agreement establishes water quality standards for the Everglades National Park and the Loxahatchess National Wildlife Refuge, a timetable for their achievement, and a scientific panel to monitor and evaluate results. The plan also calls for flooding 58 square miles of productive farmland in an effort to create huge

filtering ponds, which would alleviate the phosphorous levels before the water enters the Everglades. Additionally, the agreement requires farmers to reduce phosphorous delivery from their fields by 25 percent. The plan is estimated to cost between \$400-\$600 million.

Agricultural interests, particularly the sugar industry, are livid with the plan. They feel that they are being unfairly saddled with the lion's share of the financial costs. The industry estimates that as many as 15,000 jobs will be eliminated and that two mills will be closed.

L. Exports

State exports have steadily increased over the past five years, reaching \$16 billion in 1990, which is 57 percent above the 1987 level. Florida's businesses primarily export chemical equipment, transportation equipment, computer parts, electrical supplies, and food products. Exports employ approximately 213,000 Floridians.

M. JTPA Programs

Florida has 24 Service Delivery Areas (SDAs) throughout the state. In 1991, total Federal monies to Florida's SDAs amounted to roughly \$139 million and served almost 100,000 people.

N. HUD Funding

The City of Daytona Beach will receive a total of \$983,000 in Federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding in FY 1992. In addition, the city will also receive \$600,000 in HOME program monies.

O. Wetlands

Nearly 30 percent of Florida is considered to be wetlands. This total, 11 million acres, is over 20 percent of all estuarine wetlands in the conterminous United States. These wetlands are considered vital to the support of fisheries and waterfowl in the Gulf of Mexico. However, Florida's population increased 32.7 percent during the 1980's and, as a result, there has been increasing pressure on the wetlands in terms of land and water use. A U.S. Geological Survey study is underway to determine the rate of erosion in the Florida wetlands and what can be done to save them.

1992 POLITICAL OUTLOOK

Florida will be a key battleground in the 1992 Presidential election. Governor Lawton Chiles, Lieutenant Governor Buddy MacKay, and a number of Democrat state legislators endorsed Arkansas Governor Bill Clinton prior to the Florida primary. Those endorsements paid off -- with Clinton winning the Democratic primary handily. Democrat Paul Tsongas was hoping to make Florida his first victory outside of the Northeast, but Clinton's strong organization and regional familiarity were too much for the former Senator to overcome.

On the Republican side, the President posted a strong victory over Pat Buchanan in this critical Super Tuesday state. Buchanan had little organization in Florida, and made only a few campaign trips to the state. The March 10, 1992 Florida primary results are as follows:

The general election campaign in Florida will be hard fought. Bill Clinton has a very strong statewide organization, and will have the support of the Democratic establishment.

On May 19, Florida's Supervisor of Elections, **Dot Joyce**, announced that **Ross Perot** supporters had submitted 230,000 signatures to gain access to the general election ballot for the Texas billionaire. Only 60,312 signatures were necessary. Perot hosted an electronic town hall meeting from Florida on Friday, May 29, which was carried live to five other states on C-Span. Press coverage was very good, and Perot received front page coverage in every Florida daily. Perot supporters claim to have over 30,000 volunteers throughout the state.

The latest state-wide poll on the presidential race was conducted on May 29-31, 1992, by Mason-Dixon. **Ross Perot** lead the President by a 34% to 31% margin, with **Bill Clinton** trailing at 22%. The margin of error for the poll was +/-3.5%.

In addition, the U.S. Senate race is likely to turn out large numbers of Democrats for popular incumbent **Bob Graham**. In February, former Congressman **Bill Grant** announced his intention to challenge **Graham**. **Grant**, a former Democrat, has assembled a strong campaign organization but will have to contend with fellow Republican **Rob Quartel** who recently left the U.S. Department of Transportation to enter the GOP primary. While **Grant** has a slight name identification and organizational advantage, the race is expected to be competitive. The primary will be held on September 1, 1992. The winner will face an incumbent who is popular among Florida voters and very well financed. **Graham** is expected to win re-election.

Florida has one of the strongest BUSH-QUAYLE '92 organizations in the entire country. **Jeb Bush** serves as Chairman of the Florida campaign, with U.S. Senator **Connie Mack** serving as the Honorary Chairman. **Dr. Zack Zachariah** serves as the Bush/Quayle Finance Chairman. Each of the Republican Congressional delegation has agreed to serve as a Co-Chairman, as does Secretary of State **Jim Smith** and Treasurer and Insurance Commissioner **Tom Gallagher**. **Sally Salmon-Harrell** is the Florida BUSH-QUAYLE Executive Director.

Mrs. Quayle visited the state on June 22-23 to attend Victory '92 fundraisers. The President's most recent trip to Florida was in April 1992, when he attended the commencement exercises at International University.

The BUSH-QUAYLE ticket carried Florida with 61% of the vote in the 1988 Presidential election.

REAPPORTIONMENT UPDATE

In October of 1991, the President had a Roosevelt Room meeting with Floridians for Fair Representation, a committee established by the Florida Republican Party to ensure a fair redistricting process. Republican Congressmen **Andy Ireland** and **Tom Lewis** have taken the lead in fundraising for FFR. The current Congressional delegation balance is 10 Republicans to 9 Democrats.

On Friday, May 29, a three judge Federal panel approved 23 new congressional districts. Three of these new seats have been designed to benefit black and Hispanic candidates. These new districts make it probable that Florida will elect its first black Congressman in more than 100 years. On June 23, 1992, the U.S. Attorney's Office in Florida filed suit stating that the current redistricting plan violates the 1965 Voting Rights Act. The suit is pending, requesting that a federal three-judge panel be created to review the current redistricting plan as well as issue an injunction to halt the 1992 primary elections in Florida until the suit is adjudicated. State Democrats have complained that the suit was drawn up by the Justice Department or the Republican National Committee, and is thus merely a political ploy, lacking any concern for minority voting rights.

Florida has had its share of incumbent House members choosing retirement, two Republicans and four Democrats. In early February, incumbent Republican Congressman **Andy Ireland** announced retirement. Ireland cited personal reasons for his decision, deciding that after a longtime career in public service he was ready to spend time with his family. Republican Congressman **Craig James** also announced that he would not seek re-election. On Wednesday, May 27, incumbent Democrat **Dante Fascell** announced he would not seek re-election to Florida's 19th district. The most recent House member to step down is 22 term incumbent Democrat **Charles Bennett**. Bennett made this unexpected announcement on Friday, June 6. His wife had recently suffered a stroke which he claimed as the overriding factor for his decision. Three Republicans have already stepped forward to vie for the 3rd District seat. The remaining retirees are Democrats **Lawrence Smith** and **William Lehman**.

STATE PARTY UPDATE

While the Party suffered a number of setbacks in 1990, Chairman **Van Poole**, National Committeewoman **Maryanne Morse**, and National Committeeman **Chester Clem** have been working to make up lost ground. Republicans are presently out-registering Democrats 2:1,

bringing the state-wide Republican vote to nearly 41%. Poole has aggressively recruited legislative candidates in the hopes of taking control of the State Senate, and making major gains in the State Assembly. **Jeb Bush** and Van Poole have recently completed a 4 day, 13 city swing across the state presenting local Republican leaders with the Victory '92 gameplan.

STATE LEGISLATURE

The balance in the Florida State Senate is currently 18 Republicans to 22 Democrats. The balance in the Florida State House is 46 Republicans to 74 Democrats. June 1 marked the first day of a special session for the Florida Legislature to consider a \$2.6 billion tax package introduced by **Gov. Chiles**.

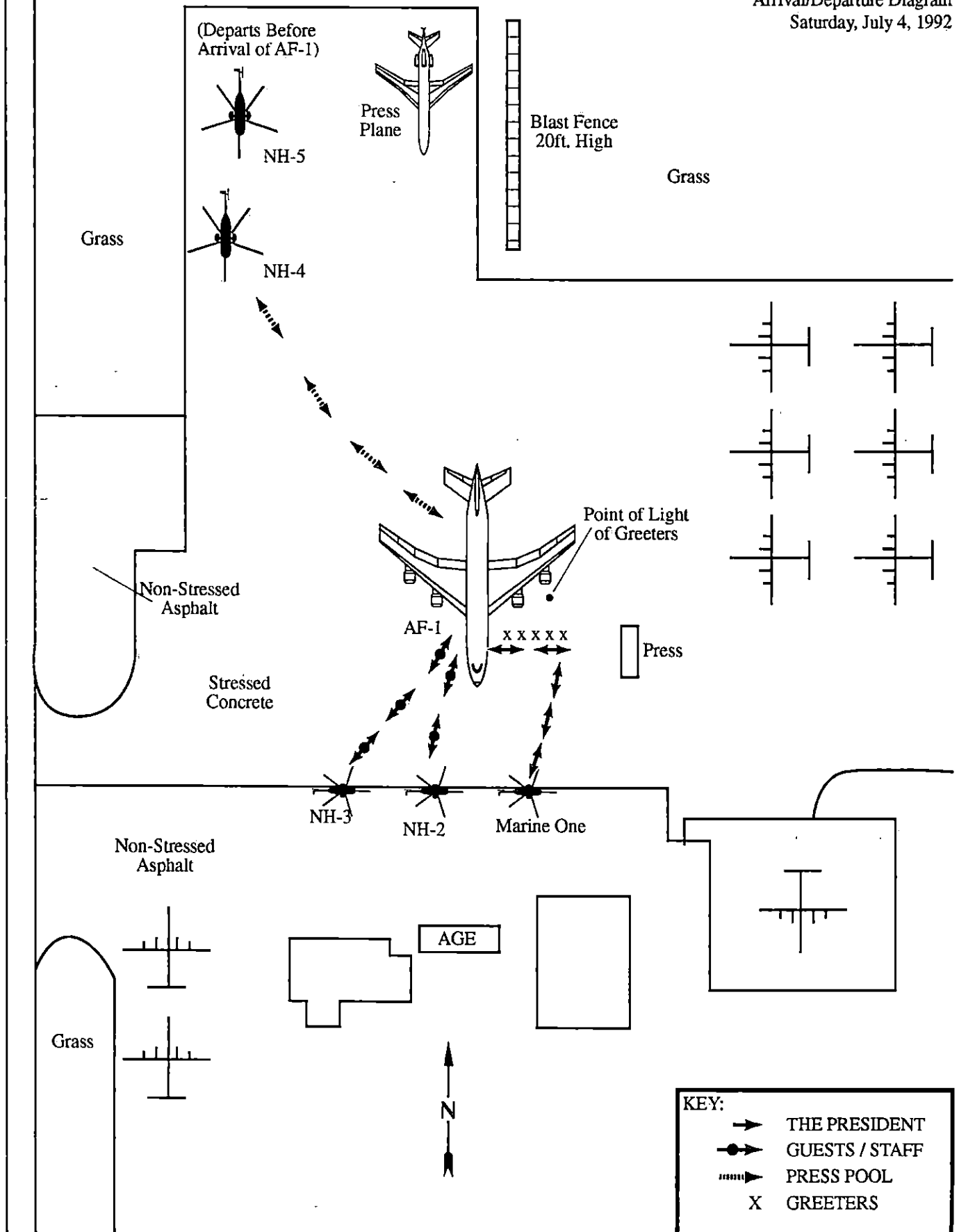

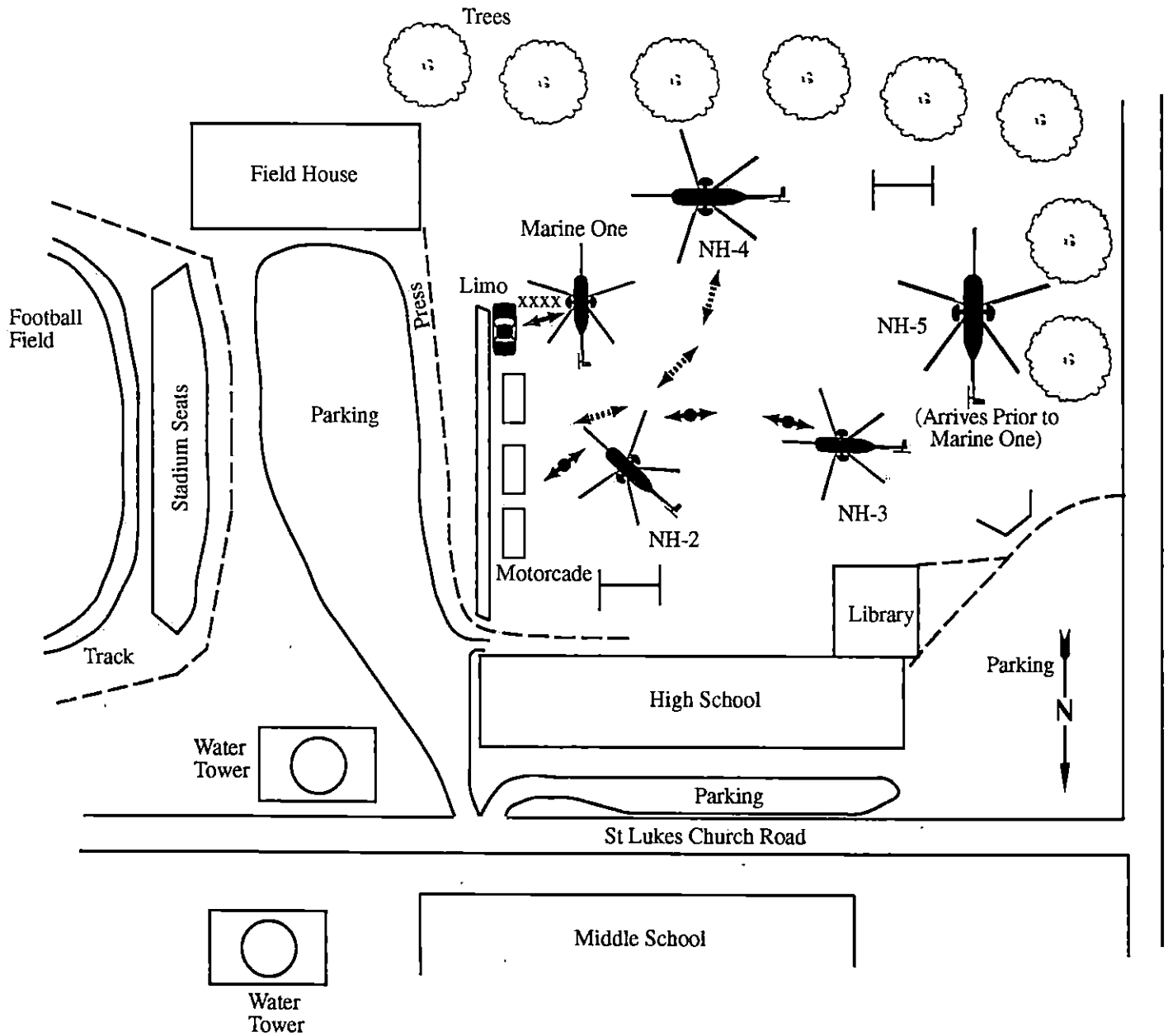

 Saturday, July 4, 1992

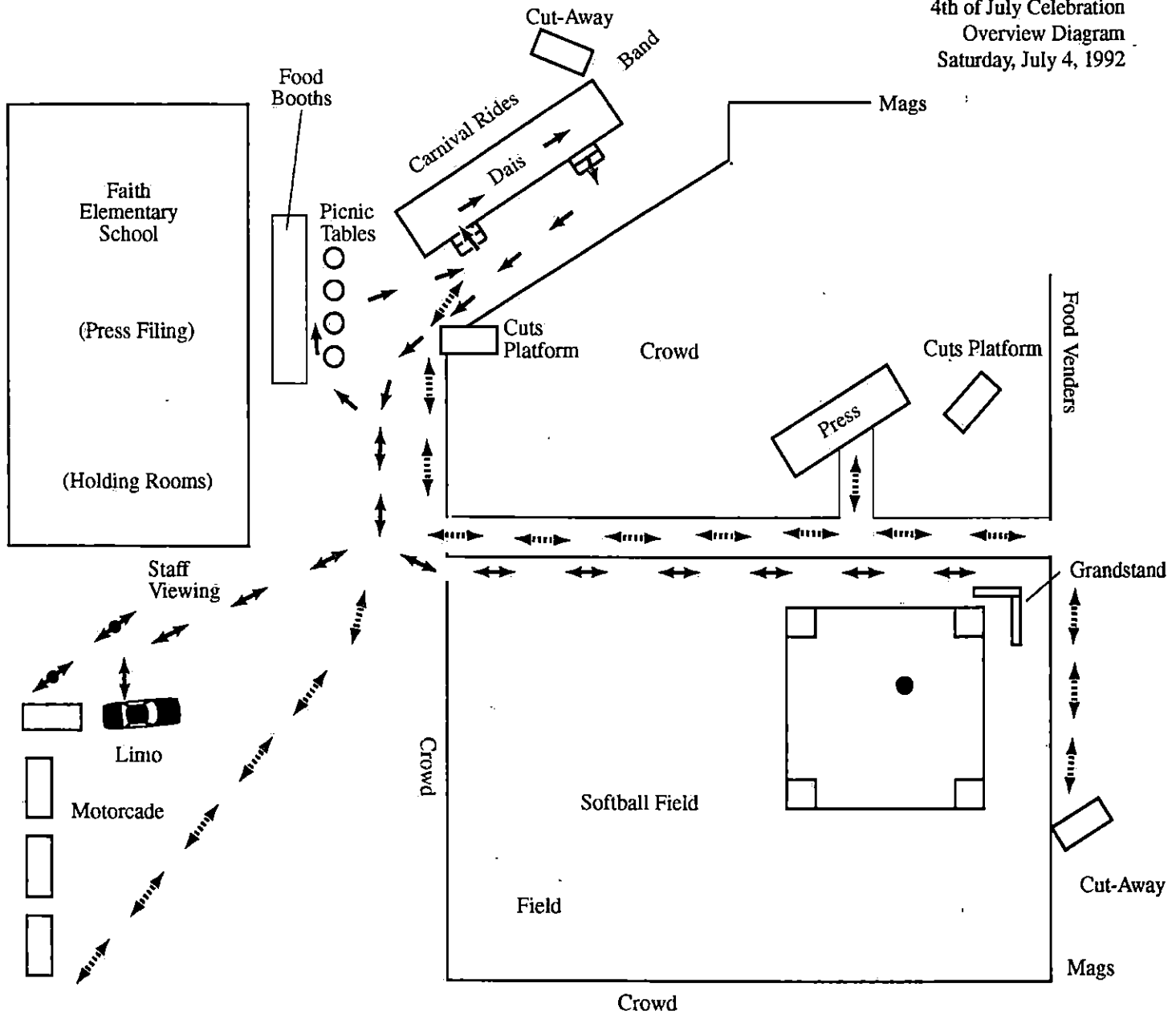

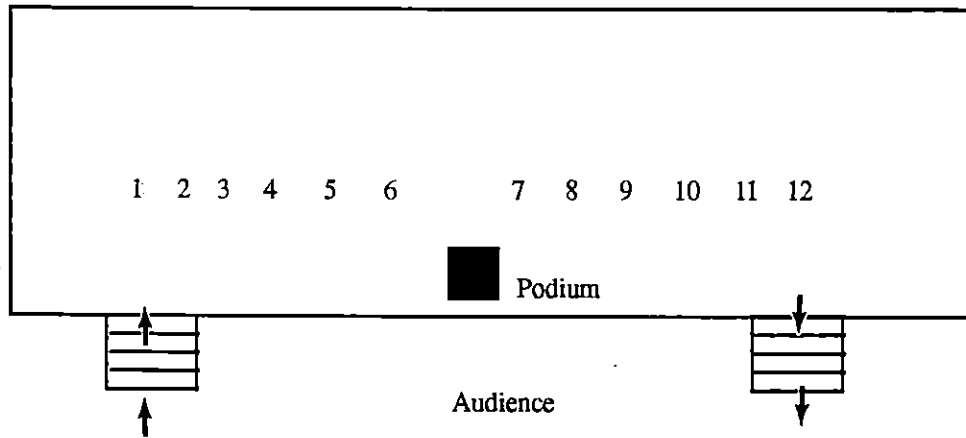

SUBJECT: NORTH CAROLINA

I. Recent Correspondence

Governor Martin wrote recommending the Research Triangle Park area in North Carolina as the site for the Mideast Regional office of the Rural Development Administration.

Governor Martin wrote recommending both William Cobey and Greed Tidwell for appointment to the Board of Directors of the Tennessee Valley Authority.

II. Discussion

A. Faith, North Carolina

The town of Faith, North Carolina has a population of 553. Its 4th of July celebration draws approximately 30,000 attendees a year, and this is the first time a President has accepted the invitation to attend. The nearest large town is Salisbury with a population of 23,087.

B. Economy

1. Unemployment

North Carolina's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate stood at 6.5 percent compared to a national average of 7.8 percent for June 1992. The national average rose .9 percent over the past year and the state average rose .4 percent. Until June, North Carolina has the lowest unemployment rate among the nation's 11 largest states.

2. Balanced Budget

North Carolina has a state constitutional mandate to keep a balanced budget every year. The fiscal year ended at midnight on June 30th without a budget being adopted. Therefore, the State is operating on emergency funding to keep the state government running. Although there is no fiscal emergency in North Carolina, budget negotiators have hit a snag in negotiating certain changes in the budget. The main problem centers on a flat pay raise for state employees who have not had a pay raise in over two years. The legislature has been in all night sessions to come up with a budget. After a July 2nd session, they will not reconvene until Monday, July 6th.

Budget debate dominated the legislature's short session this year. Since Governor Martin took office in 1985, sales tax, income tax, and gasoline taxes have all been raised in some form. The 1992 estimated budget is projected to total \$8.2 billion.

C. Supreme Court Abortion Ruling

The announcement Monday by the Supreme Court has been a top story in the state's media. North Carolina is a liberal state as far as abortion rights are concerned. In 1967, North Carolina was the second state to legalize abortion -- although with many restrictions. In 1973, virtually all abortions in the first 20 weeks of pregnancy were legalized.

Currently there are three restrictive bills on abortion or fetal-related issues in legislative committees. However, there is little chance they will be voted on this session. (N.C.'s General Assembly is currently in "short session" and is trying to wind things up. They meet in "long session" beginning next January).

D. Education

1. America 2000

On September 27, 1991, Secretary Alexander and Governor Martin launched North Carolina 2000, the tenth statewide initiative to join the AMERICA 2000 effort. Since that time, 32 communities across North Carolina have initiated the AMERICA 2000 effort in their areas.

2. GOP Candidate for Education Superintendent

In early June of this year, controversy arose over the education platform of business professor and GOP candidate for education superintendent, Vernon Robinson. Robinson outlined an aggressive school choice platform. Former GOP Governor Jim Holshouser campaigned against Robinson. Governor Martin, a supporter of school choice, urged national Republicans not to support him. Robinson, who would have been the first black education superintendent in the state, lost in a June 2nd primary run-off by a vote of 52-48 percent to moderate Teena Little. Before the primary, GOP members of the N.C. House endorsed Robinson 21-8; subsequently they have voted unanimously to endorse Little in the fall campaign. At the State GOP convention, delegates voted by a margin of more than 2 to 1 to reinstate a plank in the party's platform favoring school choice. (the incumbent Education Superintendent is Democrat Bobby Ethridge).

3. Education Developments

A number of education reforms have been enacted in recent years, including the Better Schools Program and the Annual Report Card requirement to show school system progress.

The State has funded ten school systems for pilot programs that seek to improve system-wide outcomes in instruction, graduation, dropout prevention, etc. Attempts will be made to assist low performing schools and school systems.

The legislature is currently discussing a proposal to change the governance of the state education system. The proposed changes include having State Board of Education members appointed by the governor. The Board would, in turn, appoint the State Superintendent of Public Instruction who would serve as the Board's executive officer.

E. Drugs

Marijuana is the State's most long-standing drug problem. In 1991, marijuana was North Carolina's leading cash crop -- estimated at a value of \$1.4 billion. North Carolina was ranked fourth nationwide in the amount of harvested marijuana, with approximately 1.3 million pounds grown in 1991.

Operation Marijuana Watch is a joint community and law enforcement effort to stop the production of marijuana in the State. Since the inception of this effort in 1989 under the Department of Crime Control and Public Safety, over two million acres of marijuana have been destroyed.

Crack cocaine is North Carolina's most challenging and disruptive problem for law enforcement personnel. Street-level activity is pervasive in most urban areas of the State. Interstate 85 (through Salisbury) and 95 are major highway trafficking routes linking both rural and urban sites in the State for distribution, as well as linking the State to distribution sources in Washington, D.C., Florida, and New York. There is a prospering traffic by individuals who will buy cocaine or crack inexpensively in New York City or New Jersey and transport it down to North Carolina to sell at a higher price.

The DEA reports that Faith has an assortment of small time local drug dealers trafficking in all types of drugs, but not of the magnitude seen in larger cities. In addition to the New York trade in the State, DEA reports that heroin is being supplied by D.C. traffickers to consumers in the Greensboro area. In an effort to conceal their activities, these traffickers are utilizing young females as "fronts" for their drug operations. These females set up apartments and conceal and traffic in drugs for the major suppliers.

Federal Drug Grants to the State estimated for FY 1993 are \$34.6 million, compared to \$16.0 million for FY 1989.

F. Crime

A federal initiative called *Triggerlock* has been instituted in the State, and the North Carolina Department of Crime Control has been an active participant. *Triggerlock* is an effort by U.S. Attorneys to utilize federal firearm statutes to convict and incarcerate violent habitual offenders. Since its inception in April of 1991, over 6,000 offenders nationwide have been indicted. Gangs are being targeted and a major gang called the Juice Crew, which was operating in High Point, has been entirely disbanded, with all of its members in federal custody.

G. Exports

North Carolina exports to 166 countries. Tobacco is the second largest export product (behind computers and industrial machinery) and accounts for \$1.4 billion in international sales (Secretary Sullivan's anti-smoking crusade is extremely unpopular in the state). Canada is the state's largest trading partner; 18 percent of all exports go to Canada. Exports to Mexico have grown 141 percent since 1987. A total of 163,500 North Carolina workers owe their jobs to exports.

H. Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA)

As you may recall, on September 3, 1991, a fire broke out in a chicken processing facility located in Hamlet, North Carolina. Doors at the Hamlet plant were firmly locked, completely blocking access to all fire exits. This resulted in the deaths of twenty-five employees.

On June 18, the Department of Labor announced that the State provided satisfactory commitments to correct deficiencies in the state's job safety and health program, and that the federal government has therefore deferred withdrawal of federal approval of the state plan, pending fulfillment of those commitments. The deficiencies were noted in an evaluation of the state program ordered by Secretary Martin in the wake of the workplace tragedy at the chicken processing plant.

I. Head Start

In FY 1991, the State appropriated \$1.6 million to Head Start to improve facilities that housed Head Start programs. These funds augmented Federal expenditures allocated to Head Start in the State of North Carolina.

The State Legislature is presently considering a bill to appropriate an additional \$2 million for upgrading the Head Start facilities.

J. Superfund Sites

The National Starch and Chemical Corporation Superfund Site is located on a 465-acre parcel, five miles south of Salisbury. From 1971 to 1978, the company, a manufacturer of textile finishing and specialty chemicals, disposed of approximately 350,000 gallons of corrosive wash water into trenches constructed on a 5-acre tract of land located behind the plant. The groundwater, surface water and sediments are contaminated with heavy metals and volatile organic compounds. The soil is contaminated with volatile organic compounds and lead. The plant is located in a rural area that depends heavily on wells for drinking water.

The above site was added to the Superfund list in 1989. Design of the groundwater clean-up was completed and clean-up action began in 1990. A remedy for soil contamination was selected in 1990. Sampling is currently being conducted to define contamination.

The Bypass 601 Groundwater Contamination site is in an area near Concord where the groundwater is contaminated by multiple sources. The best known is the Martin Scrap Recycling Facility, which disposed of waste acid on the site and used spent battery casings for fill material. The groundwater, soil and surface water are contaminated with heavy metals, including lead and chromium.

The Bypass site was added to the Superfund list in 1986. EPA selected the remedy that entails excavation, consolidation and capping of contaminated soils.

K. Manteo Prospect/Offshore Drilling

The Manteo prospect, forty miles offshore North Carolina, is potentially the largest offshore natural gas field in the United States. The area consists of 21 leases from OCS Sales 56 and 78 and could yield as much as 16 trillion cubic feet of natural gas and 690 million barrels of oil. Mobil Oil Corporation is manager of the unitized leases.

The State has opposed drilling of an exploration well to evaluate the Manteo Prospect. Approval of any activity is dependant on a review by the Environmental Sciences Review Panel which was created under the Oil Pollution Act of 1990. The Panel completed its report and recommended that a set of limited duration socioeconomic studies and expanded bottom surveys be completed before exploration is undertaken.

Representative Walter Jones (D-NC/Coastal Counties), Chairman of House Merchant Marine and Fisheries Committee, attached an amendment to the Energy bill which cancels and buys back the 21 leases that Mobil and its partners hold in the Manteo Prospect.

L. Oregon Inlet Jetties

The Army Corps of Engineers proposes to stabilize Oregon Inlet by constructing jetties at Pea Island National Wildlife Refuge and Cape Hatteras National Seashore. During 1991, the Department of Interior participated with the Corps in the design of the project so that Departmental concerns could be addressed. Both the Corps and Interior agreed that the impacts from the jetties will be significant.

The decision on whether jetties can be constructed as proposed continues to depend on economic, legal, and environmental factors. This project has been historically supported by the Governor and the Congressional Delegation and the recent decision by Secretary Lujan to allow the continuation of environmental studies has caused some concern among the project's supporters.

M. Recent Department of Labor Grants

On June 30th, the Labor Department awarded \$76,500,000 in grants to help combat chronic unemployment and substandard living conditions among migrant and seasonal farmworkers and their families.

On June 19th, Secretary Martin announced that North Carolina will receive \$8 million under the \$500 million provided in the Emergency Supplemental for summer youth jobs.

On May 19th, the Labor Department announced a \$36 million grant to the State for FY 1993 Planning Target for State Administration of Unemployment Insurance. The funds are for state administration and operation of the unemployment insurance program.

On May 10th, Labor awarded a \$421,712 dislocated worker grant to the State. Workers from Gerber Childrenswear in Salisbury were among those to whom funds were provided.

N. Animal Waste Management

Last week a fire broke out in a Smithfield Foods hog processing plant located in Tarheel, North Carolina. The cause of the fire was determined to be the illegal installment of air quality control equipment. It resulted in half a million dollars damage. The cause of the fire has not been made public as of this date. The information will be released early next week.

Smithfield Foods has been issued a permit to discharge treated waste into local waters; however, a permit for air emissions has not been issued.

During 1990, hog operations in North Carolina increased by approximately 26 percent compared to the nationwide estimate of 6 percent. The odor and proper disposal of this animal waste, along with waste generated by poultry and dairy operations, have become a major concern in North Carolina.

The Department of Agriculture's Soil Conservation Service (SCS) is providing technical assistance to the agricultural community in the proper disposal of animal waste.

1992 PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY ACTIVITY

The North Carolina presidential primary was held on Tuesday, May 5, 1992, with the President defeating Pat Buchanan by a 71% to 20% margin, winning all 57 of North Carolina's delegates to the Republican National Convention. The BUSH-QUAYLE campaign did not run any paid media in the state. Buchanan campaigned extensively throughout North Carolina while also running targeted radio advertising in selected media markets. Buchanan had little organization in the state and virtually no support among the GOP establishment. On the Democratic side, Bill Clinton enjoyed a big victory, winning more than 60% of the vote.

The BUSH-QUAYLE ticket carried North Carolina by a 58% to 42% margin in the 1988 Presidential election. North Carolina will have 14 electoral votes in 1992. Governor Jim Martin serves as Chairman of the North Carolina BUSH-QUAYLE campaign, with Senator Jesse Helms serving as Honorary Chairman.

Ross Perot has established an extensive state-wide organization in North Carolina. Perot's petition drive in the Tarheel State was closed on June 17, when his forces submitted 175,000 signature petitions supporting Perot's bid to be placed on the general election ballot. Perot was only required to submit 68,400 signatures by June 27 in order to appear on the November ballot. The State Board of Elections has officially certified Perot's petitions.

The Perot movement in North Carolina has not been as popular as in other states. The unemployment rate in the state is below 5%, with underemployment in many areas. As a result, the vibrant economy has bolstered the President's popularity.

The latest state-wide polling undertaken in North Carolina on the presidential race was conducted by Mason-Dixon on April 26-28, 1992. President Bush was supported by 39% of those surveyed, opposed to 26% who support Governor Clinton, and 27% who support Ross Perot. The margin of error for the poll was +/-3.5%

1992 U.S. SENATE OUTLOOK

Democrat incumbent U.S. Senator Terry Sanford is seeking re-election to his second term in 1992. Sanford, a former Governor and past President of Duke University, is well known across the state, but is considered one of the most vulnerable incumbents due to his age (75) and liberal voting record. Sanford narrowly defeated appointed Republican Senator Jim Broyhill in 1986 (52% to 48%). Sanford will face GOP nominee Lauch Faircloth, who won a four-candidate primary. Faircloth, a former Democrat and close advisor to former Governor Jim Hunt, is considered a strong challenger to Sanford due to his close ties to Republican Senator Jesse Helms. Helms convinced Faircloth to switch parties 1991 and run for the Senate.

1992 GUBERNATORIAL OUTLOOK

Incumbent Republican Governor Jim Martin is barred from seeking a third term, so he will retire in 1993. Republican Lieutenant Governor Jim Gardner will face off against former Democratic Governor Jim Hunt, who lost the 1984 U.S. Senate race to Senator Jesse Helms. The Helms-Hunt race was the most expensive U.S. Senate race in history (\$26 million spent), and probably the most negative. Both Gardner and Hunt have taken primary opposition, and are focusing on the general election. Many experts believe that this race for Governor could be as nasty as the 1984 Senate race. Gardner is Governor Martin's protege and hand picked successor. Hunt passed up the opportunity to challenge Senator Helms again in 1990, deciding to wait for Martin's retirement. The race is considered very competitive, but many believe Hunt has a slight edge at this point.

STATE GOP UPDATE

The North Carolina Republican Party has been successful in electing Governor Martin to a second term (1988), electing Lieutenant Governor Gardner (1988), and re-electing Senator Helms (1990). The Party has prospered under the strong leadership of Chairman Jack Hawke, and National Committeeman Jack Laughery. Laughery also serves as your BUSH-QUAYLE '92 Regional Finance Chairman.

Both Houses of the North Carolina State Legislature are controlled by the Democrats. The balance in the State Senate is 37 Democrats to 13 Republicans. The State House is composed of 81 Democrats and 39 Republicans. The North Carolina Congressional delegation is composed of 7 Democrats and 4 Republicans.

On May 30, North Carolina Republicans gathered at their state convention in Greensboro, N.C. The main business of the convention was the election of 21 Bush delegates and the election of North Carolina's Republican National Committeeman and National Committeewoman. Jack Laughery, who had surprising opposition, won re-election. Linda Shaw, wife of Senate Minority Leader Bob Shaw, was elected to her first term as National Committeewoman.

Thank you for your kind phone call on Saturday morning. It is always good to talk with you and I appreciated the opportunity to discuss the current election year with you. Again, I was proud of your interview with Barbara Walters.

((This is a picture-postcard holiday. / Little League. Watermelon-eating. Egg toss, and wheelbarrow races. A parade down Main Street. / I was thinking of trying bungee jumping, but Barbara didn't go for it. She said it's okay for a candidate to throw his hat into the ring -- but not his whole body.)) //

We meet today in the State that gave birth to flight -- on the day when the eagle soars proudest of all. We meet in small-town America -- in many ways, the spiritual heart of all America. Several miles up the road lies Salisbury -- home to our friend Liddy Dole and home to Cheerwine. / An hour or so east of here -- that's Siler City, where television's Aunt Bea -- Frances Bavier [BAH-vee-ay] -- is buried. / If Aunt Bea were with us, I wonder if she'd be serving broccoli. //

Not every place in America is like Salisbury or Siler City. But its values can, and should, be -- because the values you hold dear are the values that hold us together. / Later today I leave for Europe -- where I'll be working to advance America's interests and ideals. So let me talk briefly about the values which help liberty stand tall -- and rebuff those who sell America short. /

I begin with faith in family -- and not just the immediate but extended family. / When someone in Faith is sick, neighbors bake casseroles, and lend a hand. When someone in Faith loses his job, neighbors provide support and love. / People in Faith want what all Americans want. Families -- strong and united. Good schools, and safe neighborhoods. A job-creating economy, and a world at peace. /

Go to the Faith Soda Shop / Hairport / or R & I Variety. You'll see values that can achieve these goals. One is faith in self-reliance. You believe in equal rights for all Americans -- not preferential treatment for some. / The next value is a belief in what is good, and what is right. Some regard principles as disposable, like TV dinners. We know: They couldn't be more wrong. / Let others support films and TV programs which mock small-town America. I stand with millions who support your America: There's nothing wrong with a Nation more like Faith, North Carolina. //

From this springs another small-town virtue: We believe America is special because of fidelity to God. / This is a town

of 553 residents. ((Mayor Hampton tells me she keeps track of who's coming and going.)) Yet each Sunday, more than 800 attend services. / Think of that. You show why according to a Gallup Poll, America is the most religious Nation on earth. //

((Perhaps a small boy once best expressed this conviction. "God bless mother and daddy, my brother and sister," his prayer began. He continued, "And, oh God, do take care of yourself -- because if anything happens to you, we're all sunk."))

Just as faith can move mountains, the American people have mountains of faith. I believe the "God who gave us life also gave us liberty." So I call on Congress again to pass a Constitutional Amendment on voluntary prayer -- and I challenge my opponents to support me. I will not rest until we bring the Faith of our Fathers back to our schools. //

Barbara and I were talking earlier to people for whom every day is the Fourth of July. / They don't apologize for the mist in the eye when they hear the Star-Spangled Banner. And they don't apologize for the lump in the throat when, a few blocks away on Gantt Street, in the American Legion Building, they visit a monument dedicated to the veterans -- the living and the dead - - of every American war. /

Here in Faith, memories run long -- just as principles run deep. You know how to answer those who say our magnificent success in "Operation Desert Storm" should be forgotten -- a war in which 76,000 troops were deployed from North Carolina. //

I don't think Saddam Hussein, who might by now have nuclear weapons if it weren't for us, has forgotten it. / I don't think Israel, whose brave people endured Scud missiles, have forgotten it. / Nor have the people of Kuwait, who rejoiced at seeing invaders chased from their country. / And I don't think our victorious fighting forces -- the heroic men and women of "Desert Storm" -- have forgotten it. / Ours is a safer world because America is prepared to do whatever it takes whenever peace is on the line -- and liberty is in the balance.

Today, liberty lives. It lives because we must, and will, maintain a strong defense -- eternal vigilance. / It lives because the dreams of hope, opportunity, and freedom continue to make America the most desired destination in human history. //

President Eisenhower often spoke of "the great and priceless privilege of growing up in a small town." Barbara and I are privileged to be in a small town that proves how right Ike was. /

Ours is a Nation whose best years lie ahead of us. A Nation with faith / family / and most of all, with dreams. May God bless you, and the most wondrous Nation on the face of the earth: The United States of America.

SUBJECT: Schedule Proposal for the President to Participate in a Candlelight Ceremony with the National League of Families of Southeast Asian POW/MIAs

The National League of Families of American Prisoners and Missing in Southeast Asia will hold its 23rd annual meeting July 23-26 in Crystal City, Virginia. As you will recall, we forwarded a recommendation to Mrs. Bush's office that she address the opening session of the meeting on July 24, but unfortunately she will be out of town and is therefore unable to participate. EAP at State is recommending that Deputy Secretary Eagleburger address the opening session instead (Secretary Baker will be out of the country).

The National League has requested that we consider recommending the President's participation in a commemorative candlelight ceremony on Saturday evening, July 25. The ceremony would include an invocation, hymns, scripture reading, remarks by the President if possible, and a roll-call of POW/MIAs by a Senator or Congressman, possibly John McCain or Pete Peterson.

We believe that the President's participation would have a very positive effect on popular appreciation of the Administration's POW/MIA policy. Senate hearings on the POW/MIA issue in late June will likely attract considerable press attention, in part because of the probable participation of senior DOD personnel as well as Ross Perot's June 30 appearance before the Senate Select Committee on POW/MIAs. With this issue moving toward the front burner, we believe it would be well worth the President's time to make an appearance at the National League's annual meeting. The candlelight ceremony seems to us to be the proper setting for a somber, sincere demonstration of the President's commitment to the families of Vietnam POW/MIAs.

DATE & TIME: Saturday, July 25, 1992, 7:30 p.m.
DURATION: One hour

LOCATION: Stouffer's Concourse Hotel, Crystal City, Virginia.

OUTLINE OF EVENTS: The tentative schedule calls for a prelude by the U.S. Army Chorus, followed by an invocation, scripture readings, a hymn, the President's remarks if he were to attend, a roll call of POW/MIAs delivered by a member of Congress, the lighting of candles, a prayer, then a benediction and postlude.

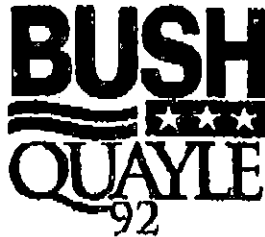


Dear Rose,

Last month, after a long and difficult struggle, the problem was finally worked out in a way that allows companies like Amway the opportunity to remain in Korea and grow there.



Dear Mr. President:

Your leadership during the riots in Los Angeles last week was inspirational and your comments Friday night to the nation struck "all the right notes" in reassuring a most anxious nation.

There is no question in my own mind that what happened in Los Angeles is a defining event for all of us, and the strategies employed by the country in the months ahead to deal with our problems in the inner-cities will be of historic significance.

I have been convinced for some time that the "root causes" and "effects" of illegal drug use among the disadvantaged in the inner-city can only be solved at the community level. We now estimate that there are over 500 community coalitions in the country and the number is growing. These organizations are in various stages of development, but share a common commitment to long-term solutions. They need leadership and financial support for their efforts, but they share a deep conviction that they can solve the seemingly intractable problems they face.

Because your impact was so positive when you spoke to a forum of these coalitions on January 10 in Washington, and because of the recent crisis in Los Angeles I would like to make the following recommendations:

1. Name a Democrat as director of the office of National Drug Control Policy. Even before the Los Angeles crisis it was clear that the public does not want the drug issue politicized. It is now imperative that the drug problem be managed on a bi-partisan basis. Tad Foote is a relative of Adlai Stevenson and married to senator Fulbright's daughter, which should make him attractive to the democratic leadership as well as the rank and file.

Most importantly, he has a proven record in having provided the leadership and management skills required to make the Miami Coalition the most successful in the nation.

2. Announce at the same time a bi-partisan agreement to shift resources of at least 1 billion \$ a year from the supply side to the demand side of the problem. Attached is a one page summary of such a plan recommended by Herb Kleber former Deputy Director Demand Reduction of the Office of National Drug Control Policy. (It is my understanding that this plan was turned down because it wasn't considered politically feasible.)

3. Announce the immediate launch of the new "Drugs Don't Work" workplace program. This is the plan designed by the President's Drug Advisory Council for small and medium size businesses that was discussed at Camp David. This program is based on the successful experience of the "Miami Coalition" as you may remember from your visit to Bradenton, Florida.

It is ready for immediate implementation in 12 states (including California) with a state-by-state roll-out to follow in cooperation with the Chambers of Commerce.

4. Ask the country for "One Million Mentors". The "disconnected" youth in our society need one-to-one relationships that often don't exist because of the break down of the family in our society. Ray Chamber's experience in Newark is the best one example of the extraordinary power of mentoring, and I believe that with a highly visible leader this could be turned into a national program of great significance. I would urge you ask General Schwarzkopf to head up such an effort.

In addition to implementing such a plan in the private sector, General Powell could ask for volunteers from the various armed services, and you could request the same from all the civil services.

(The attached research indicates the majority of all Americans would be willing to help - which means that getting one-million volunteers is a feasible idea.)

To summarize . . .


As you know I have felt for some time that the nation needs you to speak out on the drug problem. The public is confused, skeptical and unformed.

I believe you should tell it like it is . . . report on the extraordinary progress . . . particularly among our youth . . . and at the same time emphasize the serious problems that exist in the country as a result of the large addicted population that we have created over a generation.

I submit this plan in hopes it will provide the basis for a discussion with you regarding the urgency of publicly addressing the drug issue.

I am working with Sam Skinner's office for an appointment as soon as possible the week of May 11.

RECOMMENDED PRESIDENTIAL INITIATIVE

A New Strategy for Reducing the Demand for Drugs

The past several years have shown dramatic successes in the war against drugs. Through the Administration's strategy, significant progress has been made in achieving several important goals. These include disrupting the flow of drugs to the United States, enlisting the support of other nations in breaking up international drug cartels, increasing the effectiveness of law enforcement, and expanding and improving drug prevention and treatment. Now that substantial progress has been made, it is time to reassess the problem of drug use and put forth a bold new strategy that addresses the current situation.

Statistics show that drug use is down and that casual drug use in particular has decreased dramatically. However, such decreases have not been seen in our addicted population either in our working class areas or in our inner cities where hard-core drug use is still a harsh reality. Unless a concerted effort is made to target this population, our nation's cities will be dominated for years to come by drugs and the accompanying crime.

Success in this effort will require leadership by government at all levels and the development of an innovative strategy that combines the best efforts of law enforcement and the prevention and treatment communities. It will also require substantial funding target on the services needed to make a significant and lasting impact on this part of the scourge of drugs.

A \$1 billion new initiative is proposed for this primarily urban area initiative. The majority of these funds would be used to expand the availability of comprehensive treatment programs for the many individuals who can benefit from treatment, but have not had access to it. A significant percentage of these funds would be directed at individuals already in trouble with the criminal justice system in order to have the quickest impact on crime. Another substantial amount would go to pregnant addicts and their children. Some of the remaining funds would be used to expand drug prevention programs that target high risk youth and work at creating drug-free public housing, some would be used to conduct important research on new medications and improved methods for treating drug addiction. In addition, to ensure the success of the strategy, increased funding would be devoted to improving the effectiveness of local law enforcement as it relates to drug connected crime.

If implemented, this initiative could have a tremendous impact on the drug problem that has devastated our urban areas. By taking swift action now, the Administration would make great strides in tackling a serious domestic problem and in demonstrating to the American people its commitment to ensuring that every citizen has the opportunity to lead a productive life that is drug-free.

CONCLUSIONS OF ROPER STUDY

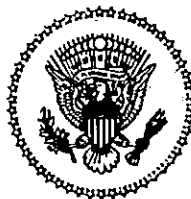
- Americans consider drug abuse one of the most serious social problems. Of 19 issues, drug abuse (35%) was second only to crime and lawlessness (37%) in personal concerns. Moreover, since virtually everyone (97%) believes drug abuse worsens the problems of crime and violence, the two top issues are basically interchangeable. Drug abuse is considered the nation's number one problem among blacks and those with incomes under \$30M/year.

- Over 4/5 (82%) of Americans are "very concerned" about the use of illegal drugs in the U.S. Blacks and parents are even more concerned. There is high recognition that drug usage is seriously affecting our most important social problems:

- In total, over 1/2 of American adults say they would personally spend two hours a week in community activities to reduce drug usage. 17% say they definitely would agree to do so if asked. Blacks (68%) and younger adults (62%) 18-29 are more likely to say they would agree to help.

A national television series which will narrate the story of the Middle East and especially of Israel since World War II is being prepared by former Israeli Foreign Minister Abba Eban for broadcast this fall. The relationship between the United States and Israel will figure very prominently. Eban's last series was watched by a cumulative audience of 30 million Americans in three nationwide broadcasts. Eban would like to either interview The President or have The President tape a statement which would be incorporated in the series.

One of the highlights of the series will be a recorded film with President Truman explaining why he decided to recognize Israel as soon as it was established in May 1948. There are also interviews with former Presidents Nixon and Carter concerning decisions that they took and attitudes that they expressed when in office. Former President Lyndon B. Johnson appears in the film, conferring with Eban before the outbreak of the Six Day War in 1967.

The present text includes the closing Presidential speech at the Madrid Conference earlier this year, but this does not allude specifically to Israel as do the remarks of Truman, Johnson, Nixon and Carter.

Eban wishes to make clear on film that the period between 1989 and 1992 was what he calls "a golden year" in the flow of strength to Israel from the United States. The scope of aid was greater than in any former administration and, in addition, the current administration initiated the annulment of the anti-Zionist resolution, assisted the immigration of Jews from the former USSR and Ethiopia and inaugurated a peace process which brought Israel and the Arab nations into direct negotiation for the first time. Eban would ask The President to explain the reasons that led to these decisions and the prospect for continued cooperation in the future. Eban will explain that this is a versatile and constructive record in which all true friends of Israel in America can rightly take pride.

The premiere presentation of this series will be made to leaders of the Jewish community in late October and it should, in Eban's opinion, eliminate the mistaken idea that there is some serious tension in the relationship.
